Two spectacular goals from Brimscombe's in form front men Mike Beckingham and Lee Pritchard put the Lilywhites on the victory trail in their crucial promotion battle at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground on Saturday.

This match attracted a good crowd and they witnessed a great game of football between the two top teams of the Hellenic League Div One West. Both sides were quick and creative which was surprising in the

muddy conditions underfoot the home side produced the early pressure with Matthew Bown (pictured) prominent Adam Thomas in the Brimscombe goal had to be at his best to prevent an early goal and Ben Pricor showed his alertness with an important clearance off the line in the 12th minute.



The visitors took the lead with a spectacular goal Adam Snook who covered every blade of grass in a man of the match performance produced a great pass inside and Beckingham sped through the Bassett's defence and let fly a great volley that home keeper Domm could only watch disappear past him into the net and Brimscombe were 1-0 up after 20 minutes. Craig Cole could have added a second a great long pass from Ben Pricor found him on the edge of the box but he slipped at the vital time and Domm saved at his feet. On the half hour mark Brimscombe went further ahead and another in form striker was responsible Lee Pritchard ramming in his 17th goal of the season past the bewildered Domm the home side were shell shocked and could have been further in front but Pritchard lost control in the slippery conditions to connect with a Woodfield cross just before the interval.

Wootton Bassett came at Brimscombe with the slight slope to their advantage in the second half and it was Brimscombe's turn to defend both Delaney and Bown went close but Gary Probert marshalled his back four and the expected home onslaught never materialised and Thomas only had a couple of saves to make, it was Brimscombe who threatened a goal

whenever they countered and Craig Cole was unlucky when with only the keeper to beat he chipped a lovely ball that shaved the woodwork. A very satisfying result this for Brimscombe they deserved this victory a great team performance with Adam Snook the man of the match.

Westbury United Website

Westbury, led superbly by defender and captain Paul Beavers, advanced to the Quarter Finals with three goals in 17 second half minutes. Goalkeeper Lewis Porter and striker Nathan Hallett were also in top form whilst the rest of the team all contributed to the performance.

Bassett, riding high in the Hellenic League Division One West, had the better of the opening period with United keeper Lewis Porter making several fine saves from Matt Bown, Steve Yeardeley and Ethan Delaney twice. Other openings were denied by strong work by Beavers, Ryan Baggs and Luke Stanley.

At the other end efforts by the home side were off target with Hallett twice narrowly missing the target, although Matt Mead did force Luke Sharps to make a save.

Hallett put Westbury on the way to victory with an excellent low 30 yard shot on 50 minutes and he then created the second goal on the hour when a bursting run was ended by a fierce challenge and a free kick awarded. Hallett dusted himself off and struck the 20 yard free kick which was blocked and the ball broke to Joe Kirkpatrick who showed good composure to finish from inside the box.

The visitors had a few chances to get back into the game with Bown missing the target and Adam Corcoran having an effort blocked in the six yard box but they were outdone by an audacious Mark Young goal on 67. Young received the ball wide on the right wing and sent a swerving ball at a remarkably acute angle beyond the keeper for a memorable goal.

Firstly I would like to welcome the players, officials and supporters of Wokingham & Emmbrook FC to Ryland's Way. We hope you will enjoy your short stay with us and will join us all for a drink in the bar after the game.

This afternoon we welcome Wokingham & Emmbrook for what be another tough test for us this afternoon. Both teams like to play football and Wokingham are going well in the Premier Division, sitting in 7th place in the table.

Opponents - History

Wokingham & Emmbrook FC • Club History

Wokingham & Emmbrook Football Club was formed in the summer of 2004 by the merger of 2 long established clubs from Wokingham. We are looking to re-establish senior football back in Wokingham after an absence of 5 years, since Wokingham Town moved from their Finchampstead Road ground in 1999. The first team currently ground shares with Bracknell Town FC and plays home matches as Larges Lane Bracknell.



Formed in 1875, Wokingham Town is the 4th oldest club in Berkshire. Starting off in the Ascot & District League they progressed over the years through the local leagues before joining the Metropolitan League, and subsequently transferred to the Delphian League. In 1959 Wokingham were admitted to the Corinthian League, in 1962 the switch was made to the Athenian League, and then to the Isthmian League in 1973.

Highlights of their achievements include four Berks & Bucks Senior Cup wins, Isthmian League Division One Champions in 1981/2, Premier Division runners up 1989/90, FA Trophy Semi-Finalists in 1987/8, FA Cup 1st Round 1982/3. Wokingham moved from their Finchampstead Road ground in 1999 after more than 90 years there. It was felt that the time was right to come home. Formed in 1936, Emmbrook Sports are one of the oldest clubs in local football. Entering the Reading & District League they remained there until the Reading Football League was formed in 1989. Starting in Division One Kennet, they gained promotion to the Premier Division in 1994/5 and two seasons later took the runners up spot and promotion to the Senior Division.

In our first season as Wokingham and Emmbrook, as the merger 'bedded-in' and the re-structuring took shape, under the guidance of Glenn Duggleby as Manager and Dave Evans as his coach, the 1st team finished in 11th position in the Hellenic League, Division One East. In the season 2005/06 we finished in 3rd place, our highest ever placing in the league, having been in contention for the championship for most of the season, under the experienced guidance of Tony Calvert, as 1st team player-Manager and Dave Evans as his coach. In November 2007 the experienced Allied Counties Manager, Wayne Wanklyn, was appointed. Wayne, a former professional player with Reading F.C. and former Wokingham town 1st team Manager, quickly appointed existing Reserve Team Boss, Roger Herridge as his assistant and Sam Page from the Allied Counties set-up as his coach. Wayne's strategy from the on-set was to develop his talented youth team into the first team squad. The remainder of the season saw a crop of exciting young talent blend in with the more experienced squad and with a little more fortune and experience they could have easily finished a lot higher than their final 13th position. Having won the Reading Senior Cup and finished 4th at the back end of the 2008/2009 season confidence was high that the team would push for promotion. However as the season went on it became apparent that their Cantley Park home would not be developed by the council to support a higher level of football. Despite this setback the young side certainly used their momentum from the previous season to soar to the top of the table in the early months of the season. However, the unseasonable hostile weather proved to derail the team's title hopes. The weather caused a huge backlog of not only league games but also 3 cup trails. All of which ended with no silverware. Despite being pipped to the title by Thame the side showed good focus to overcome their tough fixture list and still secured 2nd spot and promotion.

In 2010 Wayne stepped down as first team manager and the club again looked internally promoting Roger Herridge to First Team Manager and Dan Bateman to Assistant Manager and enjoyed a strong finish to their first season in the HPL finishing 11th.

Season 2011/12 saw more young local players progress through the Allied Counties team into the first team and saw the clubs first matches in the FA Cup in over ten years. A successful season saw the 'Sumas' finish tenth in the league, reach the quarter final of the League Cup and win the Reading Challenge Cup at the Madejski Stadium in May. This season sees more talented local youngsters at the club and the opportunity to improve again on last seasons strong performance.

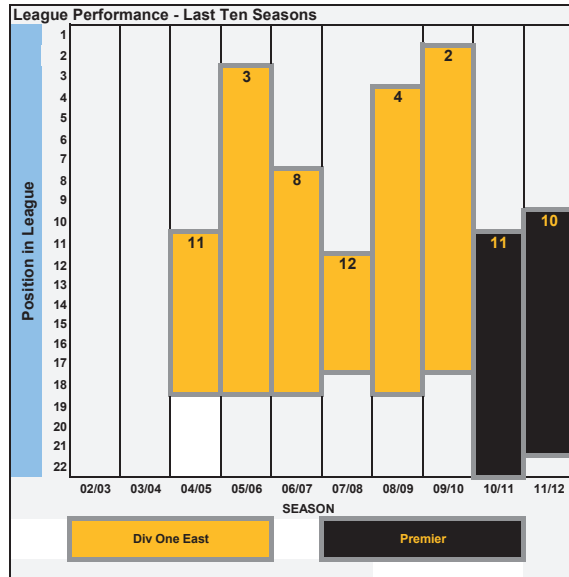
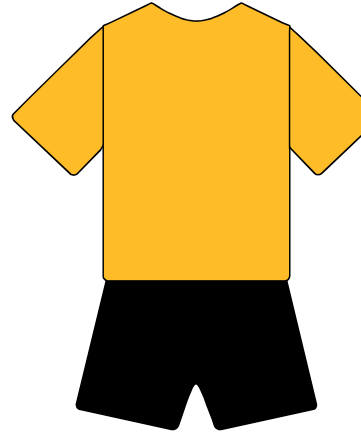

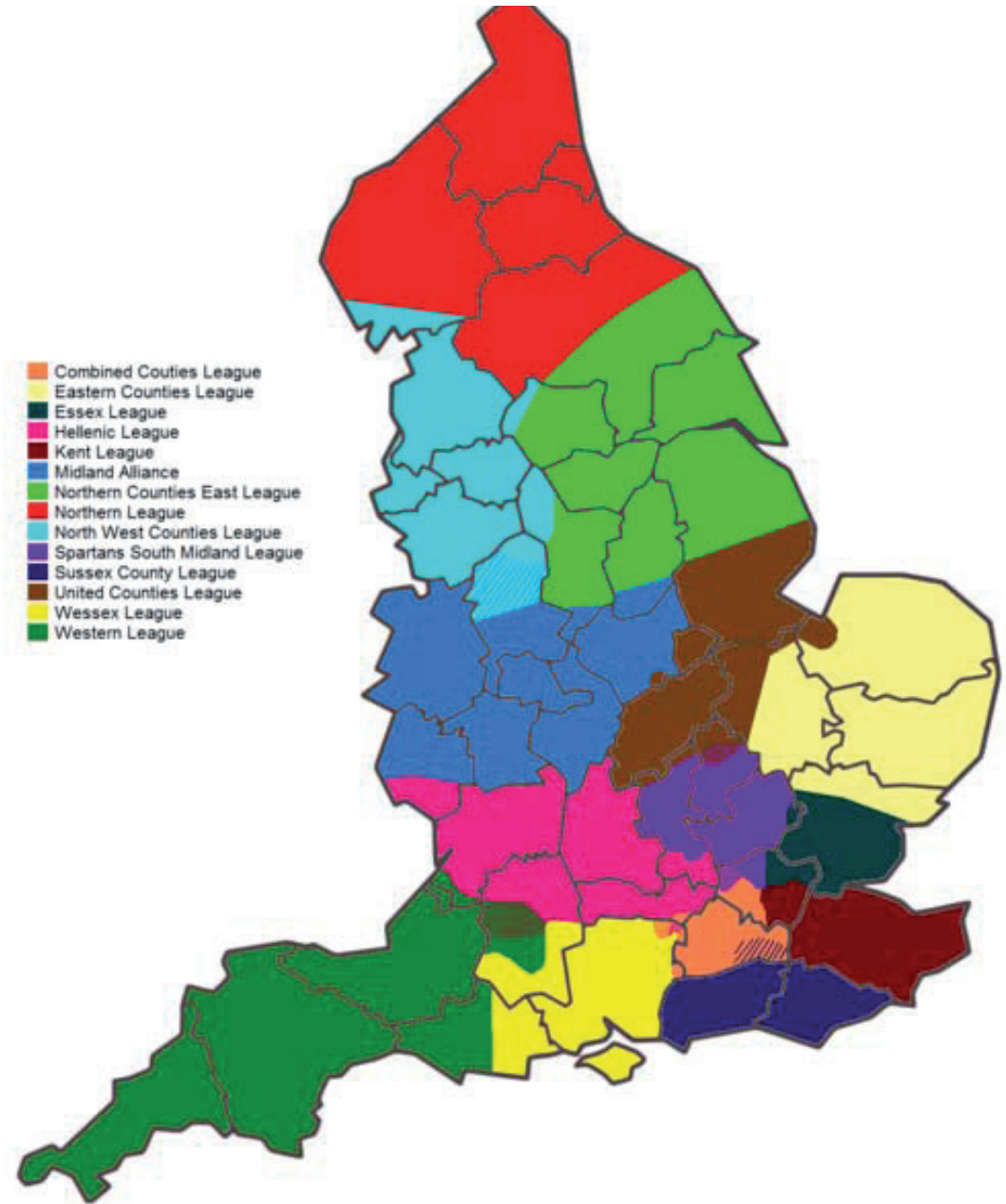

Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

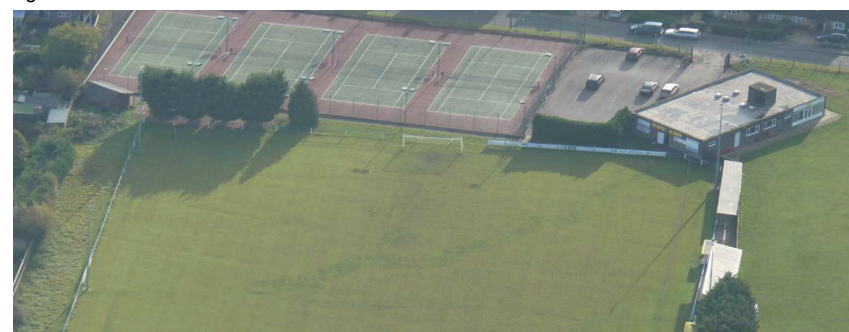


Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed.

The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier, well clear of the relegation positions. However, they found themselves demoted back to Division One West on a ground grading technicality, despite an appeal to the FA against the decision. In the circumstances manager Dave Turner did well last season to steer his side to 5th place after such heartbreak. This season he will attempt to gain promotion back to the Premier in what could be the last full season at Rylands Way as a new ground is built on the Malmesbury Road. Division One West looks very strong this season but Bassett will look to be amongst the challengers.

Wiltshire Senior Cup

The Town have gone on to win the competition nine times, including the first six years of the competition. With their progress in the professional game it is a long time since Swindon Town have competed in the Cup. Wootton Bassett Town's first success in the competition was to come at the turn of the century when they made the final in 1902-03, losing to Warminster Town. Wootton Bassett made the final again the following season doing down to Swindon Town Reserves in the final. It would be 84 years before Wootton Bassett would grace the final of the competition again when in 1987-88 they made the final to this time lose against near neighbours Purton. Wootton Bassett Town finally won the cup in 1998-99 when they defeated Pewsey Vale in the final. This success was repeated two seasons later with a win over Shrewton United. Since this win the best the Bassett faithful have had is a couple of semi-final appearances. Last season Wootton Bassett Town went out in the First Round, losing 4-2 away at Pewsey Vale. The competition was won by Calne Town who defeated Bemerton Heath Harlequins 2-1 in the final to secure their fourth Senior Cup win

17th November saw six games in the 2nd Round of the Wilts Senior Cup played. Biggest score of the day was at Corsham Town where the home side put 12 goals past Amesbury Town without reply. Westbury Utd knocked Wootton Bassett Town out thanks to goals from Joe Kirkpatrick, Nathan Hallett and Mark Young. Shrewton Utd hit two without reply away at Pewsey Vale and Bradford Town scored the only goal at the game at home to Trowbridge Town, the last representative from the Wilts League. Melksham Town won by the odd goal in 3 against Highworth Town, whilst Cricklade Town were 3-1 winners away at Laverstock and Ford and are the only remaining representative of the Hellenic League. In the next round they are away to Shrewton, Melksham host Bradford Town, Westbury are home to the winners of the Bemerton/Calne game and Corsham home to either Devizes or Downton.

Match reports



Clinical Brimscombe Lay a Marker

Rylands Way, 10th November 2012

Two moments of quality and the race at the top of Hellenic League Division One West finally became clearer. Unfortunately for Wootton Bassett Town, they were on the receiving end, their 2-0 loss against Brimscombe and Thrupp allowing the Gloucestershire side to stake out a three point lead.

The game hinged on an eight minute period midway through the first half. Bassett could arguably claim to have had the better of the opening exchanges, but it was the visitors who capitalised on their chances and altered the game's complexion.

They took the lead in some style too. Lee Pritchard's lofted pass was inch perfect, much to the frustration of Shaun Carter, who failed narrowly to get a head on the ball. The Bassett defender was still in a reasonable position to snuff out the danger. But Mike Beckingham ensured that would not happen thanks to a genius first touch. With the outside of the boot, the centre forward flicked the ball over Carter, and then kept his composure, steering past James Domm.

Brimscombe's ruthless efficiency was demonstrated further by the game's next two opportunities. Shortly after conceding, Bassett found themselves deep in opposition territory. From the right wing, Tom Dingle crossed in for Mark Barnes, who had peeled away from his marker at the far post. However, Bassett's leading marksmen snatched at his header from ten yards and failed to trouble 'keeper Adam Thomas.

At the other end, Brimscombe hotshot Lee Pritchard made certain that he would not put a fine chance to waste. Bassett were caught out by a quick free kick routine that saw Adam Snook whip a testing cross

into the box, which Liam Edmondson could only partially clear. Pritchard took control on the left edge of the box. Being so right-footed it was obvious he would look to cut inside. The home defence allowed him to do so, and after sniffing out an opening, Pritchard fired the leather into the top corner.

It was a case of two shots, two goals. Brimscombe's afternoon was going swimmingly.

For Bassett, on the other hand, it had been a trying day. It began well, but could have been better as Richie Saunders – in his first game since transferring from Highworth Town – saw a snatched effort hacked off the line. The visitors were maintaining possession better early on, but Bassett seemed to be creating the better chances as Matt Bown saw a powerful shot tipped over by Thomas.

Then came Beckingham's hammer blow. From that moment, Brimscombe were the more incisive, winning the majority of second balls and thus were the more threatening of the two teams and it was some relief for Bassett when half time came.

Two goals behind, something had to be changed to alter the course of the match. Matt Bennett therefore was brought on for Dingle, with Ethan Delaney switching from centre forward to right wing to allow Bennett to play alongside Barnes.

Before the substitute could get into the game, Brimscombe came close to guaranteeing the three points. Snook headed a Ben Pricor corner over despite being unmarked at the far post.

Bassett almost halved the deficit just before the hour when pressure from Barnes forced a skewed clearance from James Tubb. Looking to put out for a throw in, Tubb instead sliced the ball over the head of 'keeper Thomas, who could only look on in trepidation as an own goal from his teammate appeared likely. Fortunately for the visitors an awkward bounce just

inside the six yard box was enough to divert the ball over.

Desperate for his team to find the back of the net, Dave Turner sacrificed a defender midway through the period as Aaron Dainton replaced Craig Bowden. However, throwing extra men forward almost cost the hosts as Craig Cole's lob landed just outside the left post after the ball had been given away in midfield and quickly chucked into the space behind the Bassett defence.

In the closing stages Delaney saw a cross-cum-shot tipped onto the bar, while Saunders headed wide from close range following an Edmondson cross. To cap a frustrating day, not even a consolation goal could be found.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Richie Saunders – showed glimpses of what he will add to the Bassett midfield. Saunders chipped in to do the dirty work when Brimscombe were applying pressure and provided a threatening outlet going forward.

Scoop Rating: 5/10 – Brimscombe's victory was a deserved one as they made their chances pay. Bassett dug deep to get back into the match, but were short on ideas when it came to breaking down a stubborn visiting defence and lost too many second balls.

It is clear to see that a number of clubs, those above the red line, have not had a particularly auspicious first three months and must work to improve the playing record of their players and team management, or suffer the financial penalties decided by the HL Management Board, in some cases.

Conversely some member clubs are to be congratulated on their record so far especially Abingdon Town, Ardley United and Wantage Town in the Premier Division and AFC Hinksey, Chalfont Wasps, Easington Sports and Woodley Town in Division One who have received only a single 'Respect' caution this season. An excellent standard has been set by these clubs that must be retained for the remainder of the season to receive the rewards their present conduct deserves.

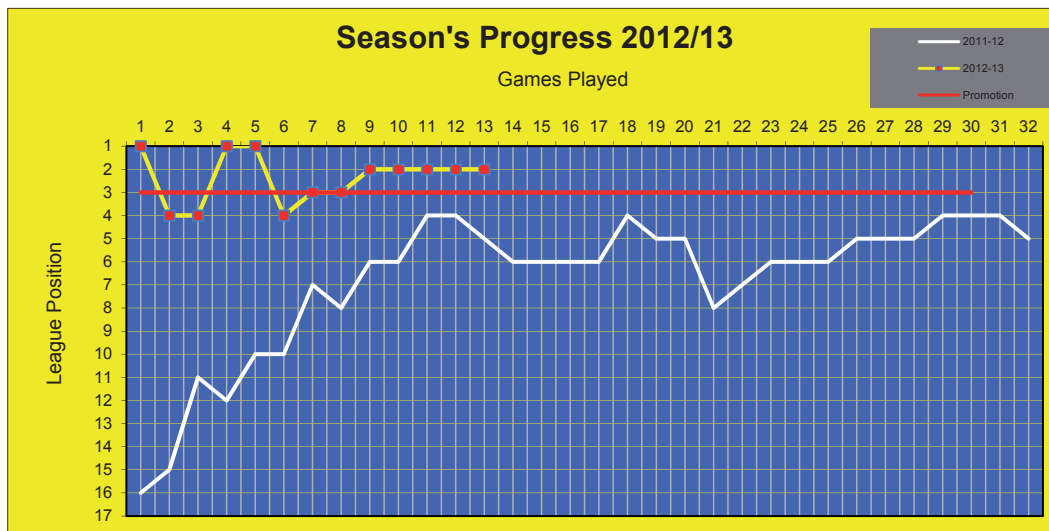

James Turner (midfield)

A hard working centre-midfielder, Turner is a Cirencester Academy graduate and was an integral part of their youth side, which made it to the third round proper of the FA Youth Cup two seasons ago where they lost by a single goal to Sunderland at The Stadium of Light. Meaningless England Game?

THERE ARE many who will have labelled England's friendly in Sweden last Wednesday night as meaningless.

When international football doesn't return until next February – and even the Three Lions' next game is a friendly against Brazil – it is tempting to wonder what Roy Hodgson will really get out of it.

By the time England travel to take on the might of San Marino in March form, injuries and availability will no doubt be drastically different.

But this is a rather short-sighted view. Try telling the likes of Carl Jenkinson that this week's trip to Scandinavia is a waste of time.

The young Arsenal defender was with the England team for the first time. Just two years ago he was on loan from Charlton in the Blue Square Bet South with Welling and the Blue Square Bet Premier with Eastbourne Borough.

Players from Football League clubs may turn their nose up at a couple of months in the muck and nettles of Non-League.

The lower reaches outside of the League has been described as the place dreams go to die.

That may be true for some players who let their perception of their surroundings bring them down.

But it doesn't have to be the end. Jenkinson shows what can be achieved – and he's not the only one.

England keeper Joe Hart made his debut in the Conference for Shrewsbury. Chris Smalling, although not in this squad, was rehabilitated at Maidstone United after his release from Millwall.

And another success story is Gary Hooper, who last month walked out in one of football's greatest cathedrals – Camp Nou.

Striker Hooper didn't make it off the bench when Grays beat Woking in the 2006 FA Trophy final, although he did play in their triumph the year before.

There can be no doubt the 24-year-old's grounding in Non-League is helping his goal glut north of the border with Celtic.

He's a big part of their side, playing in the Champions League at places like Barcelona, although he missed the Bhoys' incredible win over the mesmeric Barca last week through injury, and is tipped to get the England nod soon.

Footballers have big dreams growing up. No one goes to bed at night when they are five-years-old imagining playing Non-League football. Try Champions League finals and World Cups.

But those who find their football hasn't quite taken the path of their childhood fantasies can keep dreaming. Who knows, one day they might get to play for England in a 'meaningless' friendly.

IF PROPOSALS for three-up, three-down between the Conference Premier and Football League do ever get the go-ahead from the League Two chairmen, (turkeys voting for Christmas comes to mind), then can we look forward to increased promotion spots further down the Pyramid?

At the moment Steps 1-4 see two teams promoted. A champion and one via the nail biting play-offs.

But imagine this: Three-up from the two Step 2 leagues – meaning six would be dumped out of the top tier each May.

Then we'll go three-up from the three Step 3 leagues – nine teams would be relegated from Step 2, raising the tantalising prospect of a North v South loser-loses-all relegation play-off!

Then onto Step 4 – still with me? – where a grand total of 18 clubs would go up the ladder across the six divisions with, once again, six down from each league above.

It stays fairly straightforward until we start talking about 42 clubs rising from Step 5!

Pie in the sky yes, but it would certainly bring a whole new meaning to a relegation six-pointer..

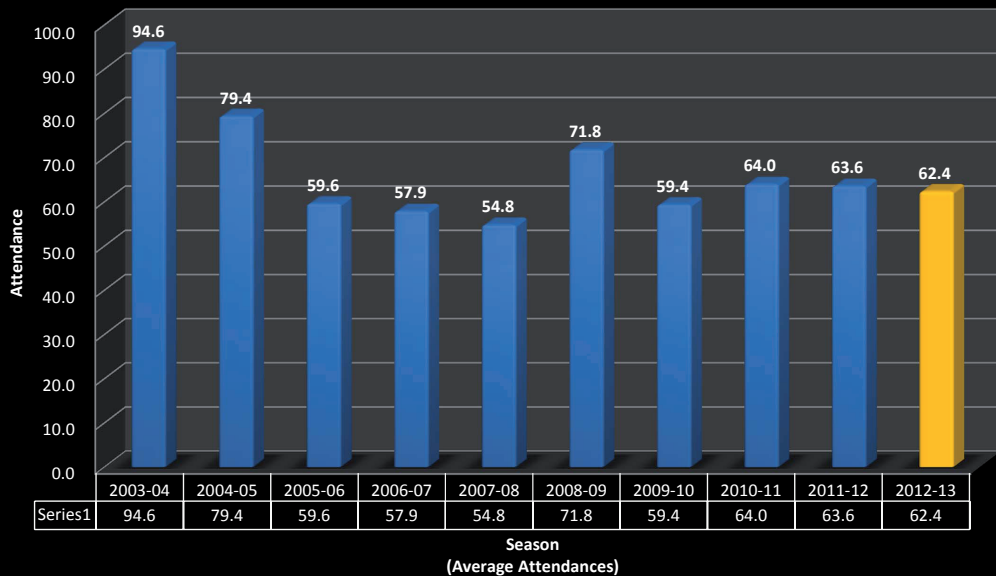

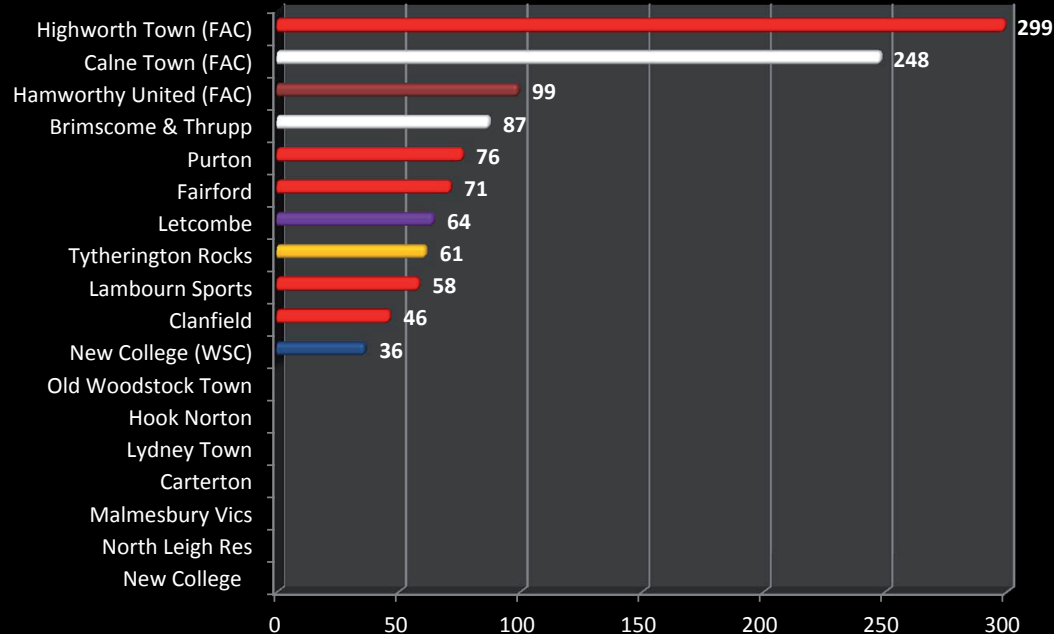

Sumas Squeezed by Bassetts Discipline and Grit

Larges Lane, 15th March 2011

Courtesy of one of their best performances of the season so far, Wootton Bassett Town earned a hugely welcome point as they held in-form Wokingham and Emmbrook, who thumped Highworth Town 6-1 on Saturday despite playing away from home, to a scoreless draw. Had it not been for the crossbar denying Craig Bowden with minutes remaining, they would have left Berkshire with all three points, which they would have been good value for.

It is these kind of results and performances on the road that Dave Turners side have struggled to achieve so far this season, which is arguably all that separates them from the Satsumas, who were also promoted last season. Although the determination and desire to get a result has always been there, more often than not a lapse in concentration and break down in discipline has cost them dear. Not on this night though. The hosts chances were limited thanks to a consummate all round performance. In spite of going up against a five man midfield for most of the match, Bassetts midfield four hustled and harried Wokinghams playmakers throughout the course of the game, breaking up their attempts to get the ball on the deck and play pretty football. Up front, Sam Collier, Tom Dingle and wingers Ethan Delaney and Matt Bown, were thorns in the home sides defence, who did not have such an easy day as they did against the Worthians. Most of all though, Bassetts back four were supreme. Neither Liam Edmundson nor Shaun Carter at centre half fell for the trap set by Wokingham, who played just one forward throughout, while full backs Richie Carter and Mark McMeeking were commanding in the air and confident going forward. They did survive one scare early on though when one of Larges Lanes notorious bobbles deceived keeper Dominic Teague, allowing Luke Lee a shot at an open goal. However, a despairing dive from Shaun Carter did just enough to deflect the ball wide for a corner. Both teams matched each other blow for blow as a midfield battle developed. And when rare opportunities appeared for either side, they were merely half chances. Midway through the period Dean Thomas rolled his marker brilliantly before firing on the turn from the edge of the area, but Teague comfortably held Ten minutes before half time, Bassetts best opening of the half came as Delaney, who was in imperious form, cut in from the left and wriggled his way past two defenders. The ball sat up perfectly for him 25 yards out, and his firmly struck effort went narrowly wide of the left hand post. Shortly after a beautiful touch from Dingle following a Matt Boucher cross-field ball presented the recent signing with an opening, but his shot from a tight angle in the right hand side of the box was parried away to safety by Stuart Harris.

Seconds after the restart, a Boucher free kick from the deep was not dealt with by the home defence, who allowed it to bounce across the face of goal, the ball narrowly avoiding nestling in the bottom right corner. As legs and minds tired, the match opened up. Yet at a time when usually at their most vulnerable, Bassett held the fort valiantly, surrendering just the one clear cut chance in the middle section of the second period. That fell in the 71st minute to the tricky Sam Whiting, who weaved his way the visitors midfield, before seeing an initial effort blocked. Edmundson could only produce a half clearance, the ball falling once more to Whiting, but after surging into the box, he could not find the requisite power to fire past the assured Teague. The introduction of Bowden for fellow youngster Delaney could have been perceived as a negative response from Turner as the clock wound down, but the substitute almost won the visitors the match with three minutes to go. Pushing for a victory, Wokingham had sent a further man up front, opting for a three man defence. And the gaps this left in the channels were taken advantage of. Bowden set Collier free down the left, further stretching the Sumas, and he met the forwards inch-perfect cross with a firm header from ten yards out that had Harris beaten. However, the balls trajectory was slightly too high, and struck the crossbar. The rebound fell invitingly for fellow sub Adam Topping, but a heavy first touch from the Wiltshire under-18 player allowed the hosts defence to recover, and his snap shot was deflected just wide. Injury time saw Sam Duffelen fire across goal and wide for the hosts, while Collier sent a shot on the turn narrowly over as neither side were capable of breaking the stalemate.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Shaun Carter, in fine form at centre back, saving Bassett from falling behind early with a goalline clearance, while helping nullify a side who had racked up nine goals in their previous two games with disciplined defending.

Scoop Rating: 8/10, it may appear to be a high mark for a game which was drawn rather than won, but this was an outstanding, complete performance against a side whose form has been extremely good this season. From front to back, there was not one player who did not impress. Heres hoping this continues.

In his foreword for the latest edition of the superb Non League Club Directory, produced by the equally-excellent Mike and Tony Williams, Tyler commented: "Wherever you live there is a non-league club round the corner at which you can find camaraderie, community spirit and entertaining football."

Well said that man.

In recent years attendances at many non-league grounds have actually increased and hopefully more and more football fans will continue to take in a game at their local club from time to time. Non-league football truly is the antidote to the sterilisation of the modern game many supporters have become increasingly disillusioned with.
