## EDITORIAL

**Good evening** and welcome back to Rylands Way for our penultimate FTL Futbol Hellenic League home fixture against **Launton Sports**. What a fantastic performance and result that was away at Purton on Saturday. You could tell that the players were really up for this game, helped I understand by comments made by a Purton player on Facebook. We could easily have been four up at the break and even playing against the wind in the second period, we should have scored when Taz was clean through and should then have been awarded a stonewall penalty. The referee was not helped by his linesman with this decision as the linesman should have had a much clearer view but was not up with play. Given how tight the title race is we must be focused on securing another three points tonight. Elsewhere in the programme I have sought to predict the final outcome in Division One West and in doing this it was completely clear that if we are to secure a top three finish we cannot afford to drop many more, if any, points.

# OPPONENTS HISTORY

## LAUNTON SPORTS FC • CLUB HISTORY

In the old Lord Jersey records Launton Sports are referred to as just Launton.

Over 100 years past (season 1899/00) the club first reached the final of the Lord Jersey Cup. The club first lifted the Jersey Cup in 1912/13, though this was the first of many cup wins in the Jersey Cup. The next win in was in 1919/20 . In 1920/21 Launton shared the Jersey Cup with Steeple Aston after two games which both finished 1-1.

The next season 1921/22 saw the club as finalists in the Jersey cup, though the Jersey Cup was won again in in 1922/23. The clubs' only success in the Oxfordshire Junior Shield came when Launton won the Shield in 1923/24, also winning the Jersey Cup again that season. The Jersey Cup Final was reached by Launton in both 1926/27 and 1927/28, though the club had to wait three seasons before being acclaimed Cup Holders again in 1930/31. Five years later the final was reached in 1935/36 and the cup was won in 1936/37.

With the Lord Jersey League reverting to divisions in the late 1930's, Launton won the Division One Championship in 1939/40. The period after the second world war saw Launton suffer relegation in the Lord Jersey League.

By the early 1950's the club were in the third division, though they did win the Division Three Championship in 1952/53. However later in the decade they were relegated again, having to wait until the 60's to win the championship in 1963/64.



Launton Sports were elected into the Oxfordshire Senior League in 1990/91, achieving early success being acclaimed Division One Champions in 1992/93.

The club remained in the Oxfordshire Senior League until the end of the 2000/01 season, when the club then had a season in limbo.

Launton rejoined the Oxfordshire Senior League at the start of the 2001/02 season and wasted no time in winning their league and lifted the Division One Championship . This was followed by a tremendous Presidents Cup victory in that epic final against Long Crendon .

After finishing third in the Oxfordshire Senior League Premier Division in 2006/7 , the club were elected into the Sport Italia Hellenic League Division One West for the first time in the clubs history for the 2007/8 season. Launton Sports played 2008/9 in Division One East the club has been placed back in the West for the forthcoming campaign .

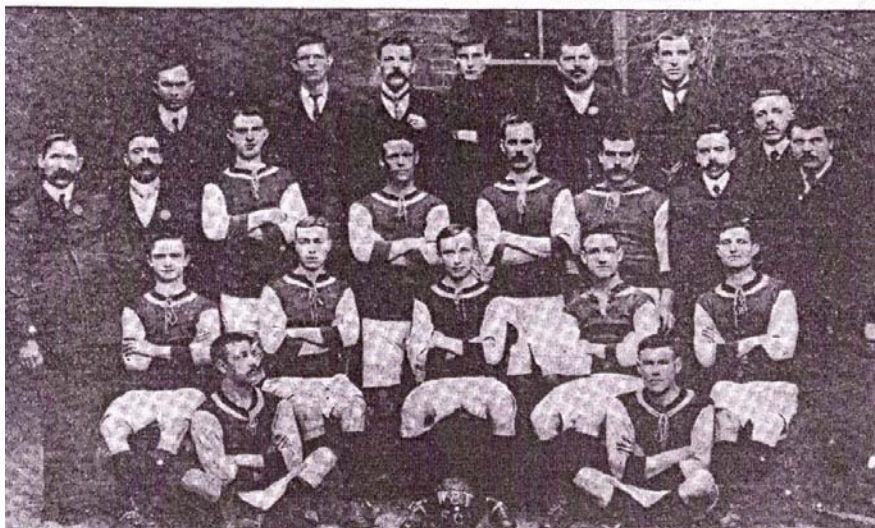

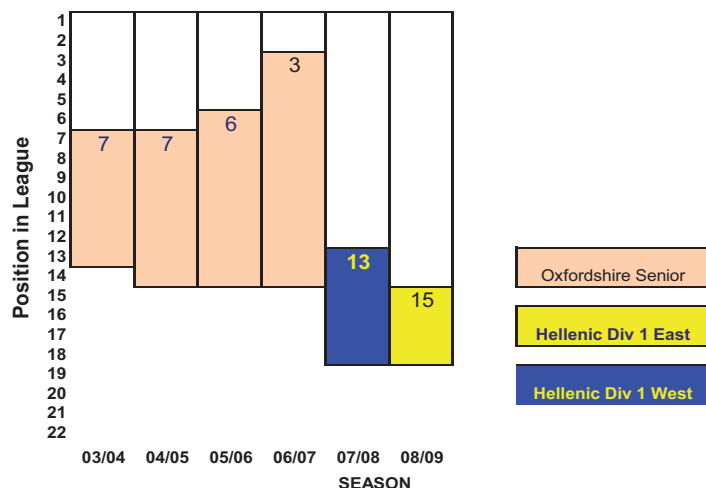

alarmed as a disturbance was feared at the close. So, apparently did Mr. Major [the referee], for when the game ceased he made a bolt for the dressing-room. He was afterwards guarded to the station by members of the Committee and police.

The victory left Bassett three points behind the winners, and four clear of Chippenham Town. Unfortunately for this season, results for the home match against Yeovil and the away contests against Chippenham United and Warminster Town have been difficult to trace.

A 1-0 defeat □ made worse due to two serious injuries suffered by Bassett players, at Haydon Street Workmen, who would go on to make the final, followed in the County Cup. The game was described in the 22<sup>nd</sup> February in the Gazette and Herald as follows:

*These teams met on the Duke of Edinburgh Ground (Swindon) on Saturday, and were represented as follows: Wootton Bassett: Rouse; Robinson and Hawe; Leighfield, Jones and Hutchings; Rodway, Oakley, Haydon, Looker and Fry. Trafford won the toss and Haydon kicked off before about 1,500 spectators. Rodway got away on the left and made tracks for Phillips; he gave nicely to Haydon who tested Phillips in the first minute with a shot, which the latter did well to clear. Hayward got away, and was getting dangerous when Jones nipped in and robbed him, and Oakley got possession and sent in a hot shot, Powell heading away. Shortly afterwards a most regrettable accident occurred. Rodway sent across a beautiful centre, and Looker, attempting to head past Phillips, colliding with him, retiring with a broken collarbone. Immediately afterwards the Swindonians got away with a rush. Turner forced a corner, which was well taken; Coates headed in, but Rouse cleared and the ball going Thomas, the latter shot hard, striking the upright and going into the net. When the whistle blew for half-time Swindon led by a goal to nil.*

*The second half opened with Bassett pressing, Oakley striking the cross-bar with a tremendous shot, Tilley eventually clearing. Again Bassett took up the running; Fry raced away on the right and swung the ball across the centre of the goal mouth, Phillips fell on it, Haydon rushed up and also fell, and in the scrum, the latter had his leg broken, and was at once taken to Hospital. The referee gave a free-kick on the goal line against the Haydon Street men, which proved abortive. Bassett was now left with nine men, and they were playing a splendid game, being all over Haydon Street. Once Oakley got clear through, when he was brought heavily to the ground. Haydon Street played the one back game against nine men, and Fry, when placed nicely with an open goal was given offside. The whistle blew for time soon after, and Haydon Street retired winners by one goal to nil. The spectators encroached on the field of play during the whole of the game and could not be got back, though they were several times appealed to by the referee. Such encroachment is a violation of Rule 7, and Wootton Bassett has protested under that rule against the result of the match.*

The appeal ultimately failed and Bassett then proceeded to draw 1-1 with Frome. By now, they were seven points behind 121<sup>st</sup> R.F.A. with three games in hand. It was back to winning ways with a win by the odd goal in five at Yeovil Casuals, but defeat a week later to the side they were chasing, a convincing one at that, with the match finishing in a 4-1 reverse, practically settled the destination of the Championship.

A 4-2 home win over Melksham made sure Bassett kept up with Chippenham in the race for second. Their draw with Frome and loss to near neighbours Chippenham United then guaranteed Bassett the runners-up spot. With this wrapped up, it could have been expected of Bassett that they would take the foot off the pedal in their last two games. This though was not the case. Firstly, Bradford Town, champions a season prior, were beaten 2-1, before Trowbridge Town were defeated by the same score. Both wins came on the road, and the latter match was hugely eventful, through no fault of Bassett, as the report from the May 3<sup>rd</sup> edition of the Gazette and Herald highlights:

*The game was marred by an unpleasant incident. Shortly after the interval the Trowbridge linesman (G. Joles) appealed for a penalty against Wootton Bassett, and though corroborated by the Wootton Bassett linesman and the bulk of the spectators, was promptly ordered off by the referee, a fresh linesman having to be procured. The crowd demonstrated its strong disapproval by hooting the referee, the indignation being increased when, some fifteen minutes before the final whistle blew, a goal scored by Long, which appeared to be legitimate, was disallowed on the plea of offside. The officials of the Trowbridge club became*

## Saunders pair ends Bassett's slippery slide

Rylands Way, 1<sup>st</sup> March 2008 v Launton Sports (Won 3-1)

**It's been a while, but finally Wootton Bassett Town are moving in the right direction in terms of their league position.**

Over a period of 12 league matches, there wasn't any respite as they slipped from 13<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> without any small peaks in between.

Their 3-1 win over Launton Sports, coupled with Malmesbury Vics losing and Clanfield's idleness, moved them two spots up to 14<sup>th</sup> as Paul Burke's try to claw their way back up to mid table and a respectable league position.

And it was a quick start that featured two goals in the first 13 minutes that propelled Bassett to victory over their Oxfordshire opponents.

Captain Steve Yeardley struck first with less than three minutes on the clock. Paul Patel whipped in a free kick from the right side, and Yeardley was there at the far post to head in from 10 yards.

Richie Saunders followed his act ten minutes later, but not after fine build up play between two of the side's youngest members.

Danny Heath set Phil Tearle free down the right, and the forward cut inside his man with ease before delivering a perfectly placed left foot cross. Saunders raced in and stretched himself enough to make connection with the ball and volley home past Danny Clifford, who was beaten well to the ball.

Just as Bassett appeared to be imposing their dominance on the game though, they went and gifted Launton a relatively soft goal. A poor clearance from Heath and slack marking from Jonny Aitkenhead made it easy for Danny Green, who was able to shoot across Sean Purcell into the bottom right corner.

With just over half an hour gone, a fine one-two between John Magani and Tearle opened up the Launton defence as Magani found himself through. However, Clifford parried away his effort from 12 yards and Heath's headed rebound was scrambled away by a defender.

The two goal lead was finally restored four minutes before the break though. Saunders bagged his eighth of the year, but it really is Clifford who should be thanked.

Stu Hemsley sent a poor free kick from the halfway line straight at the keeper, but he couldn't hold onto the ball. Saunders reacted first and pounced on the loose ball to poke home from six yards.

Launton have conceded heavily on their travels, and that trend looked to continue in the second half.

Ten minutes after the restart, Aitkenhead picked out Tearle with a fine ball over the top, which left the latter with only Clifford to beat. However, his low drive from the edge of the area was tipped around the post.

The creator of that chance for Tearle would only last fifteen minutes longer on the pitch. Aitkenhead had received a caution for taking a swipe at the heels of Green in the first half and followed this up by receiving a second yellow for a slightly late challenge.

Despite being at a numerical disadvantage, Bassett held out for the remainder of the game. Their opponents were only able to grind out two chances of note, both from long range, as Matt Jenkins blazed over before substitute Paul Anderson forced Purcell to palm away to safety.

The best chance of the final stages fell to the hosts with 15 minutes left. After good work down the left, John Magani picked out Tearle with his cross.

The youngster cut the ball onto his left foot before delicately chipping the ball towards the bottom left corner, however the woodwork prevented Bassett from grabbing a fourth and him from getting on the scoresheet.

**Scoop's Man of the Match: Phil Tearle had a fine game playing on the right side of the front three. His perfectly placed cross enabled Saunders to net his first and he continued to supply good deliveries throughout the course of the match. His recent string of performances has justified Paul Burke's show of faith in him.**

**Scoop Rating: 7/10** □ **Aside from the goal conceded and the red card for Jonny Aitkenhead, this was a performance that has to have pleased the manager. Bassett finally looked comfortable defending a lead and really could have had more than the three they produced.**

## Dave Turner

The win put Bassett three points clear of 121<sup>st</sup> R.F.A. (Trowbridge) with both having played ten games. Chippenham Town were by now in third, four points behind with two matches in hand. It was Chippenham, who they were to meet as 1905 became 1906, and in a huge match, Bassett were to come out on top by the odd goal in five.

The 1906 General Election was the focus of the Gazette and Herald for the first couple of weeks of January, but fortunately the Swindon Evening Advertiser picked up the slack. It was not good news for Bassett, however, as they were defeated 2-1 at 121<sup>st</sup> R.F.A., the soldiers coming out on top by two goals to one in a game that saw the visiting side miss a penalty that would have sealed a point.

January also saw Bassett face the distraction of the County Cup. The second round saw them drawn against 21<sup>st</sup> R.F.A. Bulford. However, had Chippenham Town been bothered to fulfil their opening round fixture, they would likely have been facing County League opposition. As it was, Bulford were beaten, with the Gazette and Herald describing the game as *little better than a gallop between a race horse and a donkey*. The fact Bassett scored eight suggests this was true, but Bulford's strikeforce had themselves a decent day, netting three times.

Thanks to their involvement in cup action, Bassett had slipped to third, but held a game in hand over Chippenham and 121<sup>st</sup> R.F.A. The return to league action saw them slip up though, as Devizes held their visitors to a 2-2 draw. The February 15<sup>th</sup> 1906 edition of the Gazette and Herald carried the following report:

*At the time appointed for the match to commence the weather was of the most wretched disposition, but it did not deter some of the Towns most ardent supporters from journeying to Quakers Walk to see the return fixture between the two clubs, even some of the gentler sex. When the teams lined out it was seen Devizes was defending the town end goal. Play commenced in a downpour of rain, a strong wind blowing across the field. Wootton Bassett went off with a rush and for some ten or fifteen minutes kept Devizes on the defensive, Hampton having to clear on more than one occasion. Gradually, however, the Town forced Bassett back, and about half-way through the first half after the ball had been bobbing about in front of goal from one forward to another, Hayward steered it past Rouse. This success and the cheers of its supporters stimulated the Town team, and for the remainder of the half Wootton Bassett was practically penned in its own quarters.*

*On resuming, the visitors set the pace, their left wing making several dangerous rushes, though on more than one occasion their efforts were spoilt by infringing the offside rule. After about fifteen minutes play, the spectators were treated to one of the quickest exhibitions of goal getting ever seen on the ground. Rushing down, Hampton was defeated, thus putting the teams on level terms. No sooner was the ball kicked off again, when one of the Bassett forwards, getting possession at least twenty yards out, let drive, the ball dropping close by Hamptons right-hand post. He tried to save, but the heavy and sodden ball appeared to slip through his arms, struck the post, and dropped just inside the line, putting Wootton Bassett two up in as many minutes. This seemed to take it out of the Town players for a time, but with a quarter of an hour to play, and in answer to the earnest appeal of their supporters, they resumed the aggressive. On one occasion, the Towns centre got possession and was making tracks for what looked a certain goal; kicking the ball a little too hard, however, Rouse rushed out and managed to clear with scarcely half a yard to spare. Devizes continued to press, and Hillier succeeded in drawing level a few minutes before time, the final whistle blowing with the score 2-2. Rouse, who is quite a young fellow, was frequently applauded for the cool and masterly manner in which he defended his charge.*

## Season 1905-06 Forty-five Minutes From Broadway

### What was going on in the world

Albert Einstein published the Theory of Relativity and made famous the equation  $E=MC^2$ . Meanwhile William Kellogg was busy inventing his cornflakes. On 18<sup>th</sup> April a large earthquake hits San Francisco and the four days of fires that follows causes even greater damage. Liverpool are champions of Division One, finishing four points ahead of Preston North End. A new club called Chelsea join Division Two and finish 3<sup>rd</sup> behind Manchester United. Small Heath change their name to Birmingham and Everton win the FA Cup, defeating Newcastle United 1-0.

Quite simply there was only one direction in which Wootton Bassett Town's fortunes could go following their disastrous 1904-05 campaign. And there seemed to be a slight sense of optimism around the club, which was reflected in the Gazette and Heralds season preview, published in the August 31<sup>st</sup> 1905 edition of the paper:

*Wootton Bassett hopes to take things more seriously next season, and it will need to do so to meet with success; it sent out more teams short of the orthodox number last season than all the rest of the clubs in the League. Players must be loyal to their club and the clubs officers; and the temptation to go and see a match on Swindon Towns ground when their team is due to play a Wilts League match must not be yielded to. If it is, the result will be as disastrous as last year, when the team did nothing. The Club has not so many irons in the fire this season, and with better attention given to those competitions for which the Club is entered, it may do itself credit.*

The season certainly began well with a huge 6-0 home win over Warminster Town, described as *the surprise of the day*. A week later, the lengthy journey to Frome Town was anything but fruitless as Bassett won by four goals to nil. It was three wins out of three following a narrow 1-0 home victory against Devizes Town, who according to the typically partisan Gazette and Herald, which was published in Devizes, were the better team throughout. The games winner came from the penalty spot.

Bassett dropped their first point of the season away to Melksham Town, who held the visitors to a 2-2 draw. They were back to winning ways a week later with a 2-0 win away at Bath City, who at that point had still failed to register a point before Trowbridge Town were beaten 4-1. However, October finished on a losing note as the trip to Chippenham Town ended in a 3-0 defeat. Still, Bassett remained top, three points ahead of Chippenham, who did have two games in hand.

This defeat seemed to sting Bassett as they were only able to muster a point at home to Chippenham United, the game finishing 2-2. However, a week later unbeaten Bradford Town were defeated by the odd goal in three. A three week long period without a fixture then ensued, but when the club returned to action they showed little rust, downing Bath City 2-0 in the eventful return fixture at home. The December 21<sup>st</sup> edition of the Gazette and Herald carried the following report:

*The League leaders entertained Bath City at Wootton Bassett, and although the home team sustained its reputation and was slightly better throughout, the actual fight for supremacy was desperate. Bath was late in arriving, as the result of which the closing stages were dragged out in semi-darkness, though it was fortunate that the winning team was forcing the pace at this juncture. Had a punctual start been made the game would have ended at four o'clock and as the officially appointed referee (Mr. Jones of Swindon) had to leave by a train just afterwards, the fag end of the game was played under the jurisdiction of Mr. E. R. Wallis, the Secretary of the local club, who, however, is also a member of the County association. It was necessary to give a penalty against Bath in the closing moments, such decisions are distasteful under such circumstances, even to the officiating referee. Wootton Bassett scored from the penalty; it gave it the second goal by which (to nil) it won.*

# MATCH REPORTS

## 2-1 to the inbreds!

The Red House, 27<sup>th</sup> March 2010

**So came the cry of the Wootton Bassett Town dressing room after a fantastic victory over near neighbours Purton in an enthralling derby match.**

The hosts were certainly riled at the ribbing they received in the immediate aftermath of this pivotal match judging by the way in which a number of their side rushed out of their changing room to confront the Bassett players. But Purton can only have themselves to blame as it was one of their fraternity, defender James Townsend, who ignited the war of words with a message on Facebook in the week regarding how he intended to deal with Bassett frontman Sam Collier that can only be described as childish and pathetic. However, by placing a target on Colliers back, Purton neglected to pay due attention to the visitors talented midfield. And it was stunning first half strikes from two of that quartet, James Turner, who has developed a knack for scoring screamers against the Red House outfit, and Ryan Banks, that proved to be the difference; Johnny Cooles composed finished late on ultimately was academic.

Purton were nowhere near at the races in the opening period, which Bassett dominated. Despite notching twice though, the game could well have been over as a contest by the time referee Whelan blew his whistle for the break as Collier and strike partner Craig Shand both fluffed relatively simple chances.

Turner and Banks did make their mark though. On 26 minutes Banks did brilliantly to keep Matty Bowns switch in play, and after a fortuitous bounce off Michael Lees shin he set off down the left before squaring. Shand brilliantly used his body to shield the ball into the path of Turner, who smashed home into the top right corner from all of 30 yards. It is fair to say he could not have struck the ball any sweeter.

Twelve minutes later the lead was doubled. Banks flicked on a long punt from keeper Stewart Thompson onto Collier. The winger then peeled away from his man and volleyed home from a similar range after a perfectly weighted chest down from his teammate.

The games balance of power shifted in favour of Purton after the restart though, thanks in part to the loss of Jon Holloway at the back for Bassett and the introduction by the hosts of Paul Day, who reignited an anaemic attack.

Still, it could have been three for the visitors almost immediately after plays resumption. Bowns dink over the last man set free Terry Adams, and he rounded the onrushing Johnny Cowley. However in doing so he made it almost impossible to score from an extremely acute angle and instead was forced to cut back for Shand. This allowed the home sides keeper time to scramble back and he was able to produce a fine save from the forwards powerful effort.

On the hour, a dipping long range effort from Coole forced Thompson into action and the keeper did brilliantly to acrobatically tip over off his back foot.

He could do little to prevent the deficit being halved though with eighteen minutes remaining. Scott Campbells corner was not dealt with properly, and the captain Coole danced around two defenders before firing into the back of the net from just inside the area.

The visitors rode their luck as the clock wound down. Day found only the top of the net with just Thompson to beat whilst an injury time corner bounced around the box before a powerful effort was blocked on the line. With a twist of irony, it was Purton midfielder Marcus Hall, who began the season at Rylands Way, that found himself in the wrong place at the wrong time to preserve Bassetts three points.

It would have been harsh for the visitors to have been denied the spoils though as Dave Turners side produced a performance of immense character and determination. Purton on the other hand will have to stew and eat their words.

**Scoops Man of the Match: James Turner** □ opened the scoring with an unstoppable effort and was superb in the centre of midfield alongside Terry Adams, thwarting Marcus Hall and Johnny Coole from pulling the strings.

**Scoop Rating: 8/10** □ although creaking after Coole halved the deficit, the character of this Bassett side was demonstrated by the manner in which they refused to crack. Dominant in the first half, the three points could easily have been in the bag by half time.

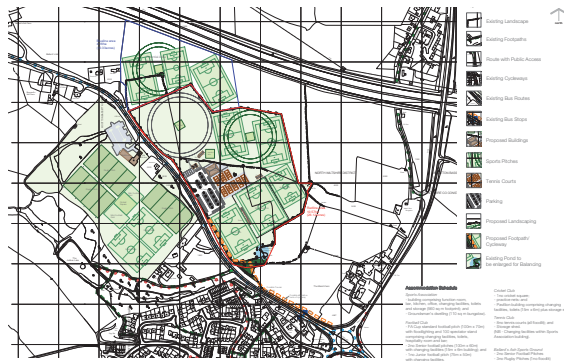

## Back in business

Rylands Way, 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2010

**It may not have come as a result of a vintage Wootton Bassett Town performance, but the significance of their 4-2 triumph over struggling Winterbourne United should not be downplayed.**

Having failed to win three straight home games against weaker opposition, Bassetts promotion prospects looked as though they were fading fast. But in arresting that slump, and with a few favours thrown in from the teams surrounding them in the quest for a spot in the Hellenic Premier Division, Dave Turners side are back on track for an elusive top three finish.

Not only that, but the long awaited victory provides a much needed confidence boost heading into a tricky spell that sees Bassett face fellow title chasers Purton and Slimbridge, with a visit from basement side Launton Sports sandwiching those games.

Sam Collier was the main goal getter on the night, bagging another brace, but it was two goals in quick succession midway through the second half that sealed the three points for the hosts on a testing evening.

Craig Shand provided the first of those, neatly sidestepping Dafyd Jones to tap home after reacting quickest to a spill from the visiting keeper before Terry Adams wrapped things up with a sublime 25 yard drive that nestled in the bottom right corner.

Despite a dominant start to the match, the first minute saw Winterbourne having to clear off the line after a perfectly delivered corner, Bassett went behind just after the half hour mark when slack defending once again was the teams undoing.

Mark Brookers long throw was not dealt with properly, the clearance falling straight back to him, and he was able to deliver an inch perfect cross from the left that James Maidstone smartly volleyed home after easily losing the attentions of his marker.

This seemed to take the wind out of Bassetts sails and it appeared as though they would be heading into the break a goal down against a team who had created just the one chance in the opening half and played some of the most uninspiring football seen at Rylands Way for many a year.

However, Sam Collier, a man who has been on a mission since moving up front, had other ideas. He was denied two minutes before half time when, after neat interplay between Adams and Ryan Banks, he was able to roll his marker but could only hit straight at Jones from ten yards.

Yet his effort under a minute later was unstoppable. He was somewhat fortunate to see the ball fall at his feet after a poorly hit free kick from Bown was sliced in his direction by a visiting defender.

But Bassetts top marksman still had plenty of work to do. After making his marker look silly once again and cutting inside onto his weaker right foot he curled the ball into the top right corner, leaving Jones no chance whatsoever.

After surviving a scare shortly after the restart when Jimmy Potts broke loose and cut back for Dale Emery, who could only fire over, Collier put the hosts ahead. Following patient build up play around the Winterbourne area, Adams produced an exquisite reverse pass that the forward latched onto having narrowly beat the offside trap. He then coolly rounded Jones before tapping in.

Seemingly in the ascendancy once more, wasteful play saw the deficit eradicated just before the hour. Guilty of overplaying in midfield, the home side were caught out by a quick break. And after Jon Holloways sliced clearance fell straight to an unmarked Potts there was only ever going to be one outcome as he raced through to score.

It seemed as though Bassett were yet again on course to underwhelm, and luck seemed to have departed them in the 66<sup>th</sup> minute when twice the visitors were able to hack the ball off the line after another troublesome Bown corner.

But three minutes later they had the lead once more. James Turner's fizzing shot from the edge of the area could only be parried, allowing Shand to jump in and score. Moments later Adams made it four with his long-range strike, a strike more than worthy of sealing the points.

There was a late scare when Potts was afforded too much space, but his powerful shot from a tight angle was parried wide by Stewart Thompson, who, apart from having to twice pick the ball out of his net, was seldom tested throughout the match.

**Scoops Man of the Match: Craig Bowden** □ a phenomenal performance from the youngster at right back. Committed in the tackle, Bowden won virtually every ball he went for on the night and was composed as ever on the ball, linking up well with Matty Bown.

**Scoop Rating: 6/10** □ not the performance of the season, but it was enough to clinch a much needed three points. The conditions on the evening were less than ideal, leading to the match not being one for the purists.
