## Cricklade Town FC • Club History

Cricklade Town FC was formed in 1897 playing Sunday Football up at the local Primary School.

Having played a lot of the early years in the Sundays Leagues and Cirencester & District Leagues, Cricklade moved into the Wiltshire League in the late 1980's, after a very successful campaign in the 2001, Cricklade were unfortunate not to gain promotion to the Hellenic League, due to the ground criteria. A move that eventually did happen in 2005, when coming 3rd in the Wiltshire Premier.

## Jon Haines



Jon Haines is the highest placed goalkeeper in my Top 50. Having been on the books of Everton as a youngster Jon Haines clearly was an outstanding goalkeeper. Haines was to make one appearance for the Club in Season 2004-5 at home against Carterton. Manager Paul Burke persuaded him to join Wootton Bassett full time from Shrivvenham at the start of the Season 2005-6. Haines was outstanding in the first 10 games of the season but was to be seriously injured in the 10<sup>th</sup> game, an FA Cup encounter against Christchurch which saw him hospitalised. Jon was finally able to return to the side in February after 4.5 months out and played all but one game to the end of the season making 26 appearances in total. Returned at the start of the following season when he was to play in 7 of the opening fixtures before quitting and being replaced by Adam Miller and then some guy called James Domm. If Jon is not playing still all I can say is what a waste of talent as he was the best keeper I have seen at Wootton Bassett.

## Paul Davis



Paul "PD" Davis falls into the WBTFC legend status having been a member of the County Cup winning sides of 1998-99 and 2000-01. Paul had first joined Wootton Bassett Town as a 16 year old in Season 1991-92 having played 8 games for a Wootton Bassett Sports side managed by yours truly. I still remember the day when Mick Woolford came to watch us at the Comp and quickly followed in with the 7 day notice of approach. I knew PD would go onto great things as in my End of Season Presentation Evening programme for the Sports in my unofficial awards section I noted the "Biggest Disappointment of the Season" as "Losing Paul Davis" to Wootton Bassett Town! Paul was still playing for the Club in the 10 years covered by this Top 50 making his final appearances in Season 2006-7 some 15 years after his debut for the Club. Played for the Reserves before finally retiring and then taking over the management of the Reserves for a spell. Still a regular at Rylands where he remains a true Club legend.

## Sam Collier



Sam Collier was brought to Wootton Bassett Town by Dave Turner. Son of former player Mark Collier, Sam started his life at Wootton Bassett as a defender having sent some time out with an injury. Asked to play up front one night when Bassett were struggling and has never looked back since. Made 37 appearances in Season 2009-10, his first with the Club, and finished the season as top scorer on 22 goals. The following season he made a massive 51 appearances and again finished the season as top scorer with 26 goals, averaging over a goal every other game. The following season played just 7 games before departing to Southern League Abingdon Town but did manage a further 6 goals from those 7 games taking his total goals tally to 54 in little over two seasons. Now playing at Cirencester Town in the Southern League with Sam Packer, a player who also had followed him to Abingdon.

His talents show no sign of waning as Bassett press hard for the Division One West title. Brimscombe & Thrupp made hard work of securing a point at home to Lambourn Sports who at one point led 2-0 with goals from Mark Bone and Adam Drake. Adam Snook rescued a point for Brimscombe with two goals in the last ten minutes. Carterton proved they are a match for anyone in the Division on their day with a comprehensive 5-1 defeat of Hook Norton. Jason Francis with two, Sam Farr, Jamie McDonagh and Mark Norridge all scored for Carterton with Ben Tew replying for Hook Norton. 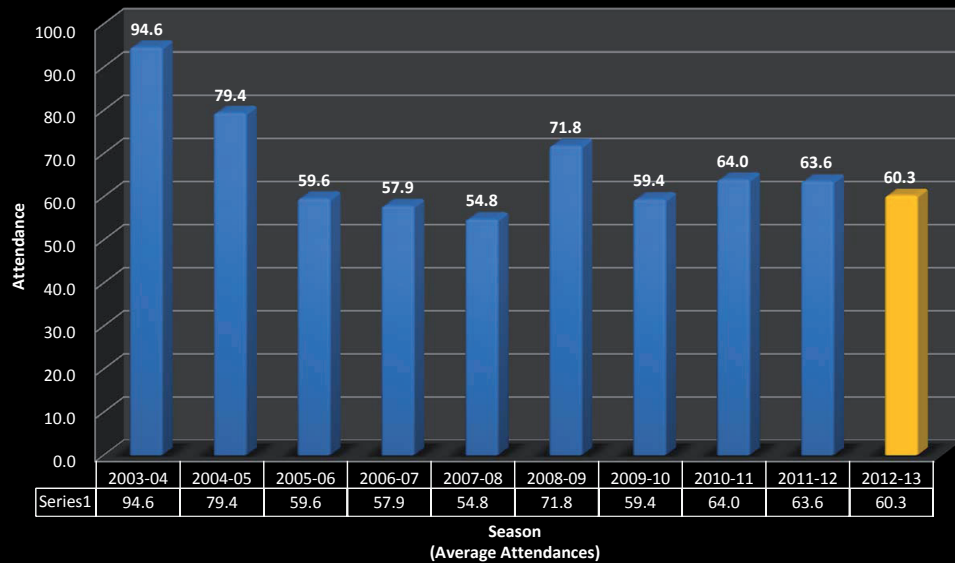




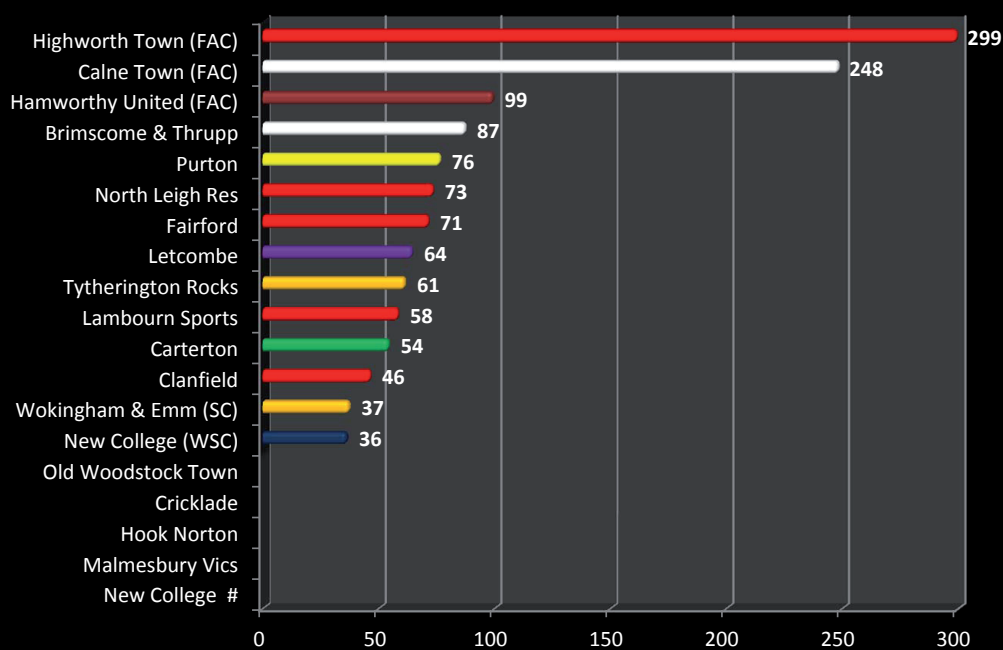




**WBTFC Average Home League Attendances**

## Throwaway Bassett spared embarrassment

Stones Lane, 13<sup>th</sup> September 2008 v Cricklade, Won 5-3

**Dave Turner was once again seething with his Bassett side for failing to play a full 90 minutes, despite them putting five past Cricklade Town, securing a much needed league victory.**

And the Bassett boss was certainly in the right to do so as he saw his side throwaway a four goal lead in the final twenty five minutes, allowing Cricklade to come within a goal of tying the game before a Steve Yeardley penalty put the game to bed with four minutes to go.

However, the game should have been dead after Ryan Banks added the fourth just before the hour mark. Even before that point the score should have reached cricket-like proportions were it not for some poor finishing coupled with a fine display in between the sticks by Elliott Jackson.

Sean Terry got the ball rolling with under three minutes gone as he narrowly beat the offside trap before firing in at the second attempt after initially being denied by Jackson.

Buoyed with the confidence produced by the early goal, Bassett proceeded to batter their opposition, but failed to find the net again until half an hour was on the clock.

During that fruitless spell, Yeardley and Craig Shand both produced the best of Jackson; Liam Edmundson – impressive in his first start at right back – provided sumptuous crosses that travelled across the face of goal without being turned in; and Terry twice failed to hit the target despite being in a favourable position.

It was left to Richie Carter to double the advantage as he gambled first to the ball after Jackson failed to hang onto a Lee Moulton corner, prodding home from close range.

The 'keeper made up twice for his gaffe though before the break, denying both Terry and Shand with composed saves despite having the odds stacked against him after the two forwards continued to frequently get past the last man with ease.

A minute before half time though Terry was able to grab his second thanks to man of the match Lee Moulton. The youngster had a fine game, providing numerous testing crosses from his left wing position as well as deft through balls that cut open the defence.

It was the latter which afforded Terry another one-on-one opportunity and this time he made no mistake with a true striker's finish.

Just before the hour, Banks put away his first of the season, slotting home with a first time shot after Terry unselfishly cut the ball back from the byline. At first the ball evaded its intended target – substitute Harry Hambridge – but Banks cleverly continued his run to ensure the ball was put away.

Things quickly turned ugly though, partly thanks to an enforced change following an injury to Shaun Carter, which prompted Turner to shuffle things about and go with a back three.

Almost immediately Bassett were caught short at the back and forced into conceding a free kick, which found its way onto the bar and off the back of an unfortunate Stewart Thompson. In a mad scramble for the ball Richard Blankley was able to get there first to poke the ball just over the line.

Then with ten minutes to go the ball was carelessly given away in midfield and, after a surging run, Sam Reason was brought down in the box by Richie Carter. The midfielder stepped up to the spot and emphatically fired home against his former club.

Two minutes later, Moulton was caught out by a cross-field ball allowing Paul O'Connell the time to apply a superb finish from 15 yards, much to the anger of the Bassett bench.

But Terry was felled in the box shortly after and Yeardley made no mistake from 12 yards, ending his recent drought from that distance.

**Man of the Match: Lee Moulton – extremely impressive out on the left wing as he linked up well with the front two, supplying them with countless quality balls.**

**Scoop Rating: 6/10 – Bassett were dominant but should never have let a four goal lead be reduced to just a single one. A performance like that next week would no doubt result in elimination from the FA Vase, which is something nobody at the club wants.**
