Welcome to Carterton

This evening our visitors are Carterton for this first home UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture of Season 2016-17. A warm welcome to all from Carterton who have made the journey to Royal Wootton Bassett for this league fixture, we hope you enjoy your first visit to our new ground and we wish you a safe journey home.

Carterton are back in the Premier Division after a gap of six seasons after winning Division One West last season. In the end they pipped Cheltenham Saracens to the title by just two points with Hook Norton some seven points back in third place. Carterton lost only two league games last season and will be looking to do well on their return to the Premier Division. It will certainly be a tough game for us to open the new season with.

New Season, New Team

Our management team are the same as last season, with just the addition of Martyn Robinson who joins from Highworth Town. Martyn served as physio over the past couple of years at Highworth and is also an experienced coach having spent time with Shrivenham as assistant manager and Swindon Supermarine as Reserve Team Manager. He will certainly strengthen Bassett's young management team. Whilst the management team are virtually unchanged on the playing side our starting line-up tonight is likely to look very much like Highworth Town's side from last season with at least 10 players having joined us from Highworth in the summer. This will certainly strengthen the squad massively and Paul's challenge will be keeping everybody happy with such a large influx of new players. With striker TJ Bohane (25 goals last season) joining Steve Robertson (30 goals last season) we certainly have one of the most potent forward lines in the division. Whenever there is such a heavy change of players it takes time for the supporters to have affinity with the new team but we hope that all the new players make a quick impact in winning over the fans and are all here for many seasons to come, buying in to the club ethos here at Bassett.

Cheltenham Saracens – Common sense prevails but on what basis?

The Non-League scene in the summer has been dominated by the Cinderford Town and Evesham United affair where Cinderford Town were forced by the FA to take promotion to the Southern League Premier Division. After initially deciding they did not want to be promoted the FA decreed that Cinderford must play in the higher level next season despite the club's request to stay in the Southern League South & West Division One. The decision came after Evesham United won their appeal against the decision to move them into the Northern League, a consequence of Cinderford's decision to refuse promotion. The FA Appeal Board decided that the Leagues Committee failed to apply the regulation relevant to clubs being promoted from Step 4 to Step 3 as winners of their division and, in particular, that accepting an application for non-promotion was not an option available to the League Committee. Therefore, the Board exercised their right under Regulation 3.3(2) of the Regulations for Football Association Appeals to "exercise any power that which the body against whose decision the appeal was made could have exercised" and order that the original publication of the Club Allocations on May 12 be reinstated with immediate effect. In my view this is a sensible outcome if the pyramid is to have any integrity. Cinderford have now accepted the decision and taken the promotion place.

After this matter was decided we then the situation in our own league where Cheltenham Saracens, having won promotion from Division One West, lost their management team and the whole of their First Team squad just prior to the season and notified the league they were withdrawing. Faced with losing a long standing member of the league completely the UHlsport Hellenic League worked with Cheltenham and the FA and reached agreement to allow Cheltenham to remain in Division One West. How this decision sits in terms of consistency with the Cinderford position escapes me but it would have been a major blow to the already club starved Hellenic League to have lost another club. Overall allowing Cheltenham to stay down is a pragmatic solution even if not ideal. Club's should not be picking and choosing what division to play in and there will be a few irritated clubs in Division One West who will be somewhat

irritated if Cheltenham were to win Division One West this season but in my view allowing Cheltenham to remain in Division One West was the least worst solution to the issue.

End of Season Awards

The Club's End of Season Presentation event for Season 2015-16 was held on the evening of Friday 6th May. Matt Cheetham and Steve Robertson were crowned as First Team Manager's Player and Players' Player of the Year respectively. The dependable midfielder and prolific forward were the two standout performers for Bassett throughout their Hellenic League Premier Division campaign and were deservedly recognised for their contributions. For Cheetham, his award marked a fantastic first year at Bassett which began on the fringes of Paul Braithwaite's squad. Having been used sparingly as a substitute in the early stages of the season, Cheetham eventually got his first start in his team's thrilling 4-3 FA Vase replay victory against Binfield. And Cheetham answered the call superbly, his consistently high quality displays in the centre of midfield establishing himself as one of the first names on the teamsheet for the rest of the season. A player who likes to keep things simple and never shirks a challenge, he also filled in solidly at centre half when needed. In total he appeared 41 times, scoring once.

Picking up from where he left off at the end of the previous season, the sharpshooting Robertson filled his boots with thirty goals in 38 appearances in all competitions, the majority coming via his lethal left foot. His haul for the season included three hat-tricks - the most impressive of which was arguably that scored in a 4-1 rout of Ascot United – and a dramatic last minute winner away against then-leaders Thatcham Town.

Amber Egerton was a double award winner for the Ladies team, who are finished 5th in the Gloucestershire County Women's League Division One. The team's tough tackling midfielder and vice-captain, who scored twice, picked up both the Manager's Player and Player's Player awards for her side. Also being recognised for the Ladies side as their Most Improved Player of the Year was veteran midfielder Kate Edwards.

A pair of defenders took the prizes for the Reserves, who ended their Wiltshire League Premier Division campaign in strong form as they ultimately finished eleventh. Hard working full back and captain Ben Brown – a player who always makes the most of his ability – took home the Managers' Player of the Year award, while young centre half Dan Murphy – who was a regular selection for Wiltshire throughout the season too – was voted as Players' Player.

Under 18s 'keeper Jack Gregory, who kept five clean sheets and also scored a freak goal as his side stormed to the Wiltshire Floodlit League North Division title, earned his team's Manager's Player of the Year award. Meanwhile, classy midfielder Martin Sinclair, who made a handful of First Team appearances during the season, was named Players' Player for the Floodlit League side. Under 21s Players' Player of the Year went to Dale Richards. Gordon Reeves was the recipient of the Clubman of the Year trophy, which is presented annually to the volunteer whose efforts have stood out the most during the season. 'Gordy', as he is known around the club, has manned the refreshments kiosk at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground on matchdays throughout the season, and has continued to offer the invaluable assistance he has provided over the years around the ground. His efforts are greatly appreciated by all at the club and he is a worthy winner of the Clubman prize.

Next Here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground

Unless an FA Cup replay is needed after Saturday's visit to Andover the next Uhlsport Hellenic League home game is scheduled for Wednesday 17th August when Thame United will be the visitors to the New Gerard Buxton Ground. Our first scheduled Saturday home fixture in the Premier League is scheduled for Saturday 27th August. On Bank Holiday Monday we make the short trip to Highworth Town and I suspect there might be a big crowd for that one given that most of last season's Highworth side are now with us. At the time of writing fixtures are currently available only until the end of September. Enjoy the game and the start of the new season.

Carterton FC • Club History

Originally formed in 1918 as Carterton FC teams competed in the local Witney and District League with the home pitch being on the Alvescot Road Recreation Ground. Carterton Boys FC was formed in 1972 and amalgamated with the mens sides in 1982 and re-named the club Carterton Town FC. Shortly afterwards a few teams broke away from Town and formed a new club called Carterton Rangers FC In December 2003 the members of both clubs voted to an amalgamation with the new club being officially recognised as Carterton Football Club from the 1st August 2004. This uniting of the clubs offered the people of Carterton the opportunity to play football from 5 years old up until the legs can't take it any more!



The club has been awarded the prestigious FA Charter Standard Development Club and is also the first club in Oxfordshire to be awarded the FA Community Club Award this is due to the hard work of all of the committee and club members.

On October 17th 2012 at a special EGM members voted in favour of disbanding the CFC men's 1st team & vacating the Kilkenny ground/facility. Falling revenues & spiraling costs financially threatened the survival of the club. That evening local business man Tom Amer offered the 1st team & facility a life line and together with a small but dedicated team of volunteers saved the club.

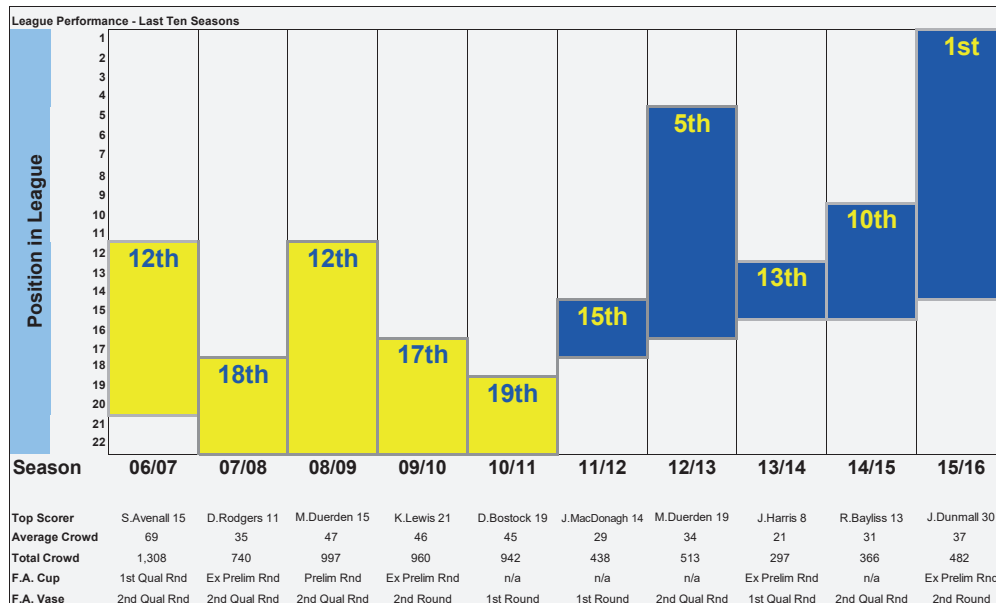

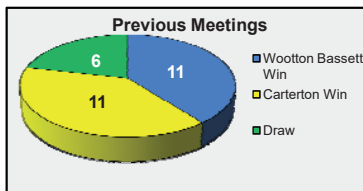
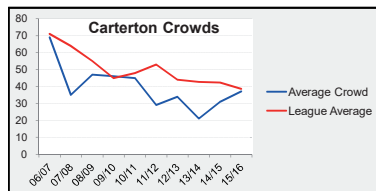

Old Football Revisited

(as first published in Seson 2013-14)

Inspired by the fantastic book "Got, Not Got" by Derrick Hammond and Gary Silke this Season's new feature looks at football related matters from the Editor's long lost youth that are no longer with us. Today it is.....

The Football Pink



I can remember when Saturday 6.00pm meant wandering over to the newsagents on the Poets Estate to wait with much excitement for the arrival of "The Pink". I would be there with the same old faces, a group of men and boys of all ages, awaiting the arrival of a van from the Adver. The van would arrive, the driver would bring in a bundle of newspapers tied with string, the newsagent would cut the string, often with haste, and the papers would literally fly off the counter. The same scene would have been played out in many newsagents across the Swindon area that night.

The Pink was published every Saturday, coming off the presses straight after the end of the games, all of which would have kicked off at 3pm.

It was the end product of an incredibly efficient operation given the technology of the day. On a good day it would be there spot on 6pm. Remember this was way before the era of the internet, mobile phones and other electronic ways of keeping in touch with football scores that we all take for granted today. In the days of the Pink all you had was either the tele-printer on BBC1 agonisingly tapping out the final scores or the scores on BBC radio's Sports Report at 5pm.

The front page of the Pink gave you a full blow by blow account of Swindon Town's game that day, phoned in from the ground, home or away, by the intrepid reporter. The descriptions of the goals scored were emphasised in heavy type. There were also round-ups of all the other Football League games that had been played, a report on the Reserves game plus also round-ups of a whole series of games played in the Wiltshire area. These would have been phoned in by dedicated followers of the teams in question, with Percy Stone probably being responsible for most of the reports on the games involving Wootton Bassett Town over the years.

Inside the paper was fantastic detailed coverage about local games played the previous week...Swindon and District League, Wiltshire League, Hellenic League and the big one for me The Borough League. I played for Highworth Town youths and when researching the history of Wootton Bassett Town FC found a few goals that I notched for Highworth in the Borough League. As well as reports on the games there were also all the league tables.

It was incredible value for money and one of the highlights of the week for the football fan in the days before the Sky Sports News, Soccer Saturday and the Internet.

Wiltshire Newspapers committed a heinous crime when the Pink was ended in 1978. It did, however, make a re-appearance in the 1990's, although it was not quite the same being produced on a Monday and did not last that long in its new form.

Whilst Swindon had its Pink, there were similar papers up and down the country, Green Un's, Blue Un's and Buffs, any colour as long as it was not white. All these football papers have now gone although the Norwich Pink 'Un and Ipswich Green 'Un do live on as website's. How ironic that the medium which was finally the cause of the death of many of the papers is now the home for the grandchildren of the Norfolk and Suffolk football papers. For those of you who want to re-live those days of the Pink then I would suggest a visit to either the National Newspaper Library in London or Swindon library. The National Newspaper Library has a comprehensive collection of the Pinks going back to 1925. These are the actual newspapers themselves which are held in binders. Unfortunately you now have to order the papers 48 hours in advance as they have to be sent to London from Yorkshire following the closure of the old site at Colindale.

The Swindon library also has a few editions of the Pink but this is a very limited collection. I am told the only other complete collection of the newspapers, other than at the National Newspaper Museum, resides at the Adver offices but unfortunately these are not available to the public.

The Football Pink has been a major source of the information that is now recorded on the Club's website (results, league tables and goal scorers).

Royal Wootton Bassett Town and Carterton have met on 28 occasions previously and it is honours even between the two sides with 11 wins a piece and 6 draws. In recent times it is Bassett that have had the better of things as we are unbeaten in the last 5 games between the sides with 3 wins and 2 draws. The last time the two sides met was back in 2012-13 when a Mark Barnes hat-trick plus two from Sean Terry and one from Matty Bennett secured an easy 6-1 win for Bassett. Terry had bagged a brace also earlier in the season at Carterton as Bassett did the double that season, 3-1 the score in the first meeting of the season.

Carterton have spent the past 5 seasons in Division One West having been relegated from the Premier Division at the end of 2010-11 when they finished 19th in a division of 22 teams. They struggled in their first season at the lower level finishing in 15th place. The following season saw a much improved performance and they finished the season in 5th place. However, the following two seasons were again a struggle as they finished 13th (out of 15) and 10th (again out of 15).

No such trouble last season though as they won the Division One West title to re-claim their place back in the Premier Division, winning 21 of their 26 league games, losing just twice all season.

Carterton also had a good season in the FA Vase in 2015-16 making it through to the Second Round. In the First Qualifying Round they hammered Chinnor 6-0. This was followed by a narrow 2-1 win over Woking based side Westfield from the Combined Counties in the Second Qualifying Round. A 4-1 away win at Bedford Sports in the First Round saw Carterton into the Second Round but their run ended in this round as they went down 1-4 away at Lordswood.

Last season's top scorer was Jack Dunmall who hit 30 goals but he has moved on to join Kidlington as last year's UHlsport Hellenic League champions start their adventure in the Evo-Stik League Southern Division Central.

Player Profile - Season 2016-17

Aaron Maximen (midfielder)



Maximen is a tough tackling midfielder, who possesses a great engine and a knack of scoring goals. While imposing given his size, he nevertheless has a great touch and is adept at bringing others into the game.

He initially made his name with Cricklade Town where he played primarily as a centre forward. In his first season at Stones Lane in 2009/10, he appeared 16 times, scoring three goals, including the decisive strike in a 2-1 victory against Bassett that ended Dave Turner's side's sixteen game unbeaten run.

Four goals in eleven appearances to start the 2010/11 campaign earned the attentions of Hellenic Premier Division Shrevenham, who signed Maximen late in the year. He made an

immediate impression, scoring on his debut to earn a point at Old Woodstock Town before going on to score three more before the end of the season.

His first full season at Shrevenham was an impressive one as he netted ten times – good enough to be his side's second top scorer – in 40 games.

Maximen followed manager John Fisher to Highworth Town at the start of the 2012/13 season. Although the Worthians struggled in the league, Maximen continued to be amongst the goals, netting twelve times in 44 games. He again scored against Bassett, though his early header was not enough to prevent a 3-1 defeat in the FA Cup.

His goal tally reduced a season later, with seven in 45 appearances as he began to play in a deeper role in midfield.

Maximen then played a key role in Highworth's run to the FA Vase semi-final, featuring in all but three games. Overall he scored five times in 43 games during the season. Then he scored eight goals in 33 appearances for the Worthians last season.

Maximen, who joins from Highworth Town, is a tough tackling midfielder, who possesses a great engine and a knack of scoring goals. 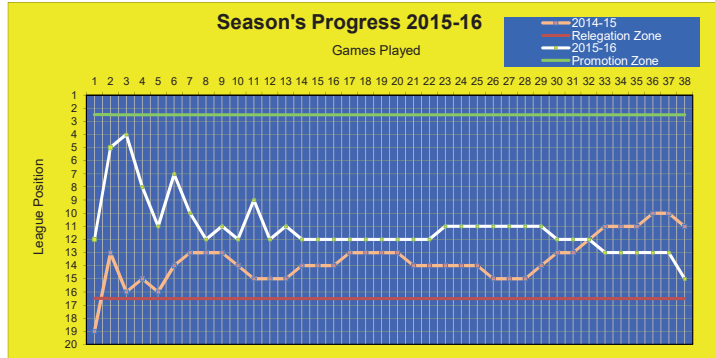

Last season's Wiltshire Senior Cup Final saw Melksham Town cause an upset. Melksham won the competition by defeating Steve Claridge's Salisbury 2-0 in the final. This did, however, mean that oyal Wootton Bassett Town went out against the eventual winners with Melksham having defeated Bassett at the quarter final stage. 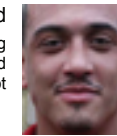

Away Travel Season 2016-17

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35. Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II.



After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed.

The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 only to be immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 and promotion back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and in 1987-88 they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06. Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivensham Dave tragically passed away.



















With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year groundshare with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year at Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and a record points total. Last season saw the club return home playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name, Bassett finished 15th in the Premier Division. With some top summer signings the Club are looking for a much higher finish this season.













The table below shows the addresses of all the grounds we will be visiting this coming 2016-17 Season. This season we have 3 new teams in Burnham, Carterton and Henley. The table below includes the postcode to enter into your Sat Nav. A rough estimate of the distance from Royal Wootton Bassett is also shown. This season we have 74 less miles of travel in total (it could have been 164 more if North Greenford had come into the Hellenic and Cheltenham had not stayed down) but the average journey has increased by just over a mile.

Total away travel = **1,732** miles (2015-16: 1,806 miles)























Match Reports

First Team Pre-season Games

Royal Wootton Bassett Town brushed aside New College, defeating the student side 5-1 as they finalised their pre-season preparations. Paul Braithwaite's team were too strong for their opponents, scoring through an own goal, an Aaron Maximen penalty and strikes from Steve Robertson, TJ Bohane and defender Nathan Hawkins.

The victory came two days after a 2-2 draw against Stonehouse Town of the Gloucestershire County League. Bassett had held a 2-0 advantage at the interval courtesy of a pair of Steve Yeardley goals. However, Stonehouse, former opponents of Bassett when both sides were in the Wiltshire League, fought back with two unanswered second half strikes.

In their previous game a late Connor Waldon strike saw Swindon Supermarine snatch a 2-1 victory. In a competitive contest that saw both teams create a number of chances, Paul Braithwaite's team looked set to grab a draw against their Southern League Division One South and West opponents after TJ Bohane's powerful header from Ryan King's corner had got them on level terms midway through the second half. However, Waldon punished Bassett for failing to successfully clear from a corner in the game's dying stages, as he fired in on the turn from just inside the box. Supermarine had earlier taken the lead through Josh Parsons, who stabbed home from close range following good work down the left hand side from full back Ryan Morgan. They were then guilty of squandering a number of fine chances in the opening period, while Bassett came close through Dan Bailey, who twice hit the woodwork.

The narrow loss to Supermarine followed a 3-1 defeat in their second warm up match against Oxford City Nomads in the Jim Newman Memorial Trophy at Clanfield. Against their Hellenic League Premier Division rivals, Bassett fell into a 2-0 deficit before Steve Robertson got a goal back. However, the Nomads re-established their two goal advantage late on to move into the semi finals of the prestigious pre-season tournament.

Defeat against Nomads had followed a strong showing in Bassett's pre-season opener away at Purton. New signing TJ Bohane scored twice as Bassett secured a convincing 4-1 victory at the Red House. Bassett fell behind after Aaron Maximen conceded a penalty, but Tom Cole got the visitors on level terms, heading in from a Bradley Clark free kick. Another Clarke set piece fashioned a second as Bohane headed it in before the forward bagged his second of the game and Bassett's third. Midfielder Steve May then further padded the score.

Reserves Pre-Season Games

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Reserves' pre-season preparations have so far been a success, with eleven goals scored in two games. They thrashed Purton Reserves 6-1 in their opener. Rich Clark netted four, while Jack Allan and Shaun Terry also scored. Bassett then defeated Malmesbury Victoria Development 5-3. Ryan Thomas led the way with a hat-trick as Steve Yeardley and Jake Matthews chipped in with further goals.

Against Lydiard Millicent, the Reserves found themselves in a 3-0 hole, but clawed their way back to draw level thanks to strikes from Jack Clifton and Jake Matthews as well as an own goal. However, Lydiard scored on the break late on to secure a win by the odd goal in seven.

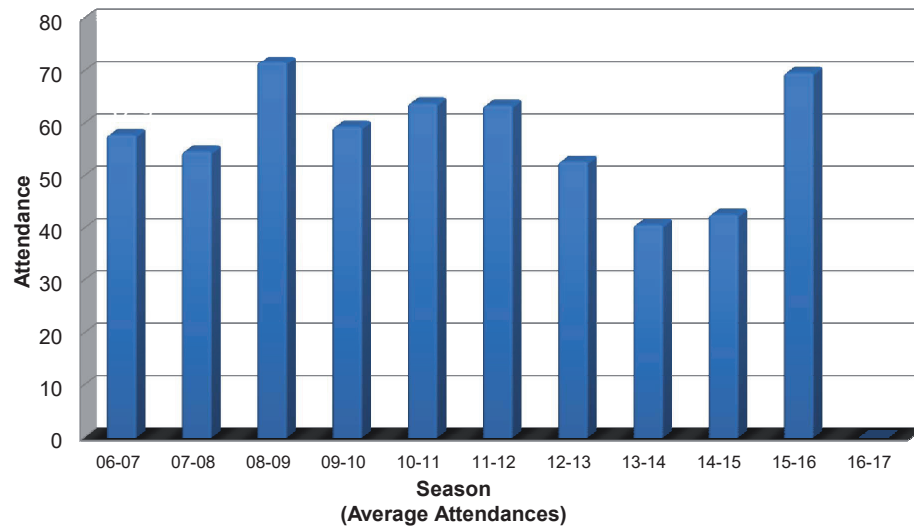

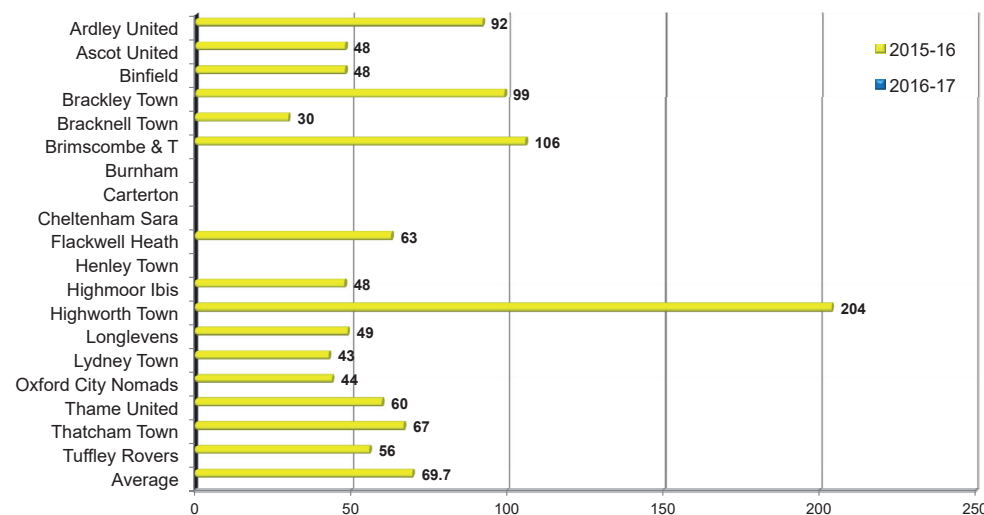

My Summer Holiday in Highworth (A Manager's Diary)

Saturday 02 July 2016 - Braithwaite raids neighbours as squad begins to take shape

Preseason preparations may be just two weeks old, but Royal Wootton Bassett Town manager Paul Braithwaite has already started the process of significantly strengthening his squad ahead of the 2016-17 Hellenic League Premier Division campaign. The Bassett boss has retained the services of both of last year's player of the year award winners, with midfielder Matt Cheetham and thirty goal frontman Steve Robertson both committing for another campaign. They are joined from last year's squad by defenders Adam Corcoran and Nathan Hawkins and midfielder Steve Olphert. Between them the quintet combined to make 198 appearances during the 2015-16 season and will be expected to compete to form a strengthened spine throughout the team this time around. They were joined in putting pen to paper by four players who helped Highworth Town finish in a strong seventh place a season ago.

Headlining the four recruits from the Worthians is prolific forward TJ Bohane, who has scored 79 Hellenic Premier Division goals over the course of the past three seasons. Bohane, who featured for Bassett's Under 18 Floodlit League side in 2004-05, brings Southern League experience as well, having featured at step four for both Shortwood United and Swindon Supermarine. The partnership he'll form with Robertson promises to be a formidable one and should help see Bassett's attack improve upon the 50 league goals it mustered last season. Defensively, Bassett will be bolstered by the returns of Jonny Aitkenhead and Lee Bowen to the club. The former, a product of Bassett's youth system, was last with the club in 2013-14, while the latter was a member of Dave Turner's promotion winning squad a year earlier. Both are versatile players, with Aitkenhead more than comfortable at any position along the backline and Bowen capable of performing in midfield if required to move forward from his favoured full back slot. 'Keeper Garry Eggleton, another player who played for Bassett's Under 18s in the past, has also been snatched away from The Elms. A solid shot-stopper, Eggleton made eight appearances for Highworth last season and will be looking to make the number one jersey at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground his own.

Tuesday 05 July 2016 - Four more commit

Among Royal Wootton Bassett Town's latest quartet of signings are three familiar faces and one old friend, who returns to the club where his journey in football began. Young defender Dan Comer and midfielders Dan Bailey and Tyler Sheppard have all been retained from last year's squad, while pacey attacking midfielder Josh Shama, a former member of Bassett's youth section, has also signed. Full back Comer enjoyed a stellar first season in senior football at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground. Arguably the team's most consistent player throughout the course of the year, he made 46 appearances, contributing two goals, both of which came in a 2-0 home win against Thame United. The skilful Bailey will be entering his third season with the club. Scorer of 19 goals in his first campaign with Bassett, he contributed seven goals from midfield last term, including dramatic late winners at home against Ardley United and Brimscombe and Thrupp. Meanwhile, Sheppard, a physical, hard-working wideman who is also capable of leading the line, will be beginning his fourth campaign with Bassett. Initially signed by Jeff Roberts, he netted twice in sixteen appearances in 2015/16. It's been a number of years since Shama has pulled on a Bassett shirt. Beginning with the club as an under nine, he was a member of a highly talented side, which also included Aaron Oakley. Shama's qualities were evident from a young age, and he was picked up by Reading. After a number of years with the Royals' academy, he narrowly missed out on a professional contract at the Madejski Stadium, but was snapped up by Oxford United. While with the Us, he spent time out on loan at Farnborough and Banbury United before being released in the summer of 2015. Last season Shama spent time at Cypriot Second Division side Nikos & Sokratis Erimis and Southern League Mangotsfield United. These four signings continue the process of building a stronger, more competitive squad. And manager Paul Braithwaite is expecting to secure the signatures of a few more key players in the coming days too.

Saturday 09 July 2016 - Edmondson return highlights latest recruits

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's recruitment drive continued in earnest this week, with Paul Braithwaite securing the signatures of four more former Highworth Town players. Leading that group is centre half Liam Edmondson, who made 193 appearances for Bassett in a five season spell between 2008 and 2013 that saw him twice help secure promotion from Hellenic League Division One West. A strong, consistent performer who is also a threat at the other end of the pitch at set plays, Edmondson initially moved to Shrivenham early in the 2013-14 season, before moving to the Elms part way through the 2014-15 campaign. He is joined by 'keeper Kurtis Sharkey and midfielders Aaron Maximen and Lee Beale. Sharkey, an experienced Hellenic League shot-stopper, played 32 times for the Worthians in 2015-16 and will battle Garry Eggleton for the number one jersey. He had a brief spell with Bassett two seasons ago, playing five times. Maximen, meanwhile, will add presence in midfield. A quality distributor of the ball, who is also capable of chipping in with important goals when required, he featured 40 times last season, scoring four goals.

Monday 25 July 2016 - New signing Davoile appointed first team captain

Royal Wootton Bassett Town manager Paul Braithwaite has appointed recent signing Jon Davoile as first team captain for the 2016-17 season. The classy central midfielder, who is another player joining the club from Highworth Town, is an experienced leader, having previously skippered the Worthians and Larkhall Athletic. Davoile was twice a Western League winner with Larkhall and was captain when they secured the Western League Premier Division and Les Phillips Cup double in 2013-14. Commenting on Davoile's appointment, Braithwaite said: "Having captained Larkhall and Highworth, Jon is well known by myself and Greener (assistant manager Chris Green) and we are sure he will lead the group well and continue in a long line of great first team captains at the club." Davoile will be assisted by defender Jonny Aitkenhead and reigning Manager's Player of the Year Matt Cheatham, who have been appointed as first team vice-captains by the Bassett boss. "Jonny, being a Bassett boy who came from the youth system, fits the bill well to continue the culture of the club of having local players involved," Braithwaite remarked. "He's well respected and liked by all his teammates, which is important too." "With Matt, we felt it was fitting to reward him after his great first season with Bassett. He's made great strides since joining, has a great attitude and as a management team, we consider him to be a future captain in the long term." The Bassett boss was also boosted last week when midfielder Steve May and full back Dale Richards put pen to paper. May, a combative midfielder with a good passing range, has spent the majority of his Hellenic League career with Purton. Meanwhile, Richards, another youth section product, is entering his third season with Bassett. Quick, energetic and with a fine left foot, he has appeared 80 times since making his debut at the start of the 2014-15 campaign, scoring three goals.

Sunday 31 July 2016 - Yeardley and King the latest to sign

Club stalwart Steve Yeardley and central midfiedler Ryan King are the latest players to put pen to paper and sign for Royal Wootton Bassett Town as manager Paul Braithwaite makes the final additions to his first team squad ahead of Wednesday's season opener against Carterton. The 31-year-old Yeardley surpassed the 400 appearance mark for Bassett in style last season, scoring from the spot in a 3-0 victory against Oxford City Nomads to bring up the landmark. Having played with a foot injury for the majority of the previous season, the defender underwent foot surgery part way through the 2015-16 campaign. However, he was quick to return and managed 22 appearances in all, scoring five goals. He even donned the goalkeeper's jersey three times as a result of two sending offs and an injury to Curtis Meare. That means Yeardley has now played 405 times for the first team since his debut in 2002. During that time he has contributed 61 goals - a remarkable feat for a player who has spent the majority of his time in a Bassett shirt at the back. 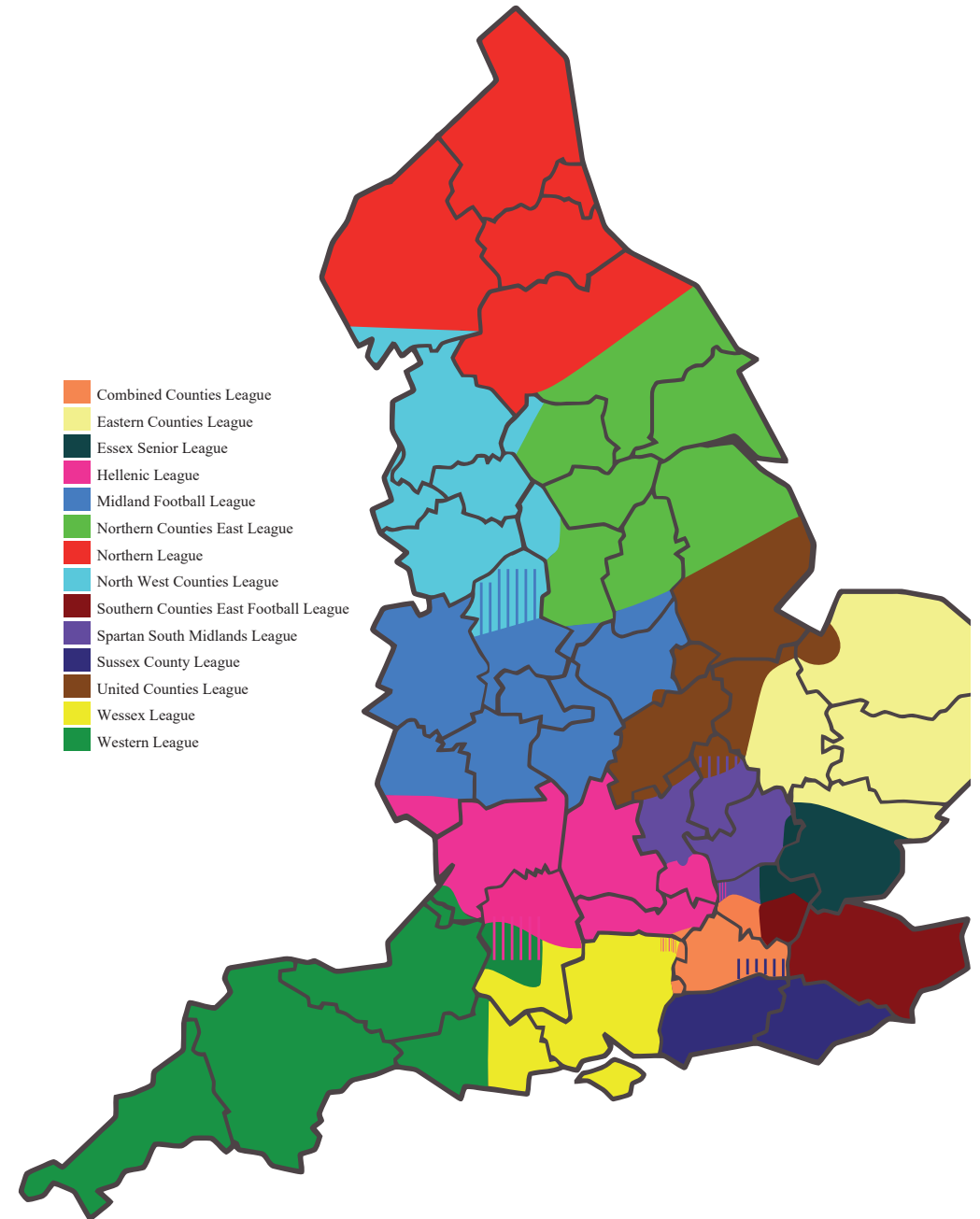

Season preview: Fighting for a place in unfamiliar territory

After a summer squad overhaul, the 2016-17 Hellenic League Premier Division campaign sees Royal Wootton Bassett Town journey into uncharted territory.

Never in their nine previous seasons within the Hellenic's top tier have Bassett been billed as one of the teams to beat.

Previously any great expectations have revolved around securing a finish in the obscurity of mid-table, while the majority of their adventures in the division have seen Bassett tipped as one of the sides destined to be engaged in a dogfight against the drop.

Indeed, prior to the ultimately doomed 2004-05 campaign, the league bulletin went so far as to label the club as 'perennial strugglers'.

Now though the sentiment is different: Paul Braithwaite's successful recruitment drive, which has seen him raid near neighbours Highworth Town for key members of their FA Vase semi-final side from two seasons ago, has led to Bassett being tipped by some to be in the frame for honours come the denouement next April.

The additions of the prolific TJ Bohane, dynamic midfielders Bradley Clark, Jon Davoile and Aaron Maximen, battle hardened defenders Jonny Aitkenhead and Liam Edmondson, and experienced 'keepers Kurtis Sharkey and Garry Eggleton have dramatically boosted the quality of player at their new boss' disposal.

Also new to the mix are central midfield pair Ryan King and Steve May, exciting winger Josh Shama and dependable full backs Lee Bowen and Lee Beale.

And with the majority of last year's team so far remaining at the club - the only notable losses have been young 'keeper Curtis Meare and tricky midfielder Harvey Scholes, who have been tempted eastwards by 2015-16 runners-up Thatcham Town - there is remarkable strength in depth within the squad.

Keeping all of those players happy and determining which constitute his strongest team are going to be delicate tasks for Braithwaite. But they are arguably good problems to have to deal with. And the fierce competition for places can only serve to spur on the players, none of whom can afford to become complacent.

In order to live up to expectations though, all will have to hit the ground running.

With a pair of games against promoted sides to kick off the season, Bassett have been afforded an opportunity to do just that.

The fixtures against Carterton and Henley Town will no doubt be tough. Yet considering both opponents are new to the division for this year, a target of two wins from these contests is reasonable and would hopefully help set a marker for the rest of the campaign.

Pre-season results have been something of a mixed bag: healthy wins against Purton (4-1) and New College (5-1), a frustrating draw with Stonehouse Town (2-2), a narrow defeat against Southern League Swindon Supermarine (1-2) and a chastening reverse against league rivals Oxford City Nomads in the Jim Newman Memorial Trophy (1-3). Nonetheless the added quality has been evident.

What's certain is that there can be no allowance for letting linger any memories of last season's miserable finish to the season, which yielded just three points from the final eleven matches and saw Bassett ultimately slip to 15th place.

Strengthened, reinvigorated and with a point to prove, it's the top end of the table where Braithwaite's side will be aiming for this time around.

As unfamiliar as it will be for Bassett to aspire to such lofty heights, here's hoping they can reach them.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's first team programme has been rated as the best in all of English non-league football in the 2015-16 Soccer Club Swap Shop Programme Awards.

This outstanding achievement is testament to the work put into compiling the programme. The club also owes a huge debt of gratitude to long-time club sponsor Cats Solutions, who continue to print the programme.

Bassett's programme has steadily climbed the non league rankings. Voted as the 50th best in 2011-12, it rose to 20th spot a year later, before finishing 19th in 2013-14 and 12th last year. 2014-15 was also the first season in which the programme won the prize for the best in the Hellenic League Premier Division, having overhauled the efforts of Bracknell Town and Binfield.
