# Bassett News

## **Tonight's Game**

Good evening and welcome to this evening's game in the prestigious Wiltshire Senior Cup, always a competition that I like forward to as it allows us to play other clubs from the County at Steps 2-5 who play in other leagues in a competitive match, rather than just pre-season friendlies.

Tonight we host Westbury United from the south of the county who play in the well run Toolstation Western League and a warm welcome to all the players, management, committee and spectators who have made the journey up north to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground this evening. The two sides met in a pre-season friendly in the summer on the 3G pitch and our visitors ran out 5-0 winners that night and we will be keen to improve on that result here this evening. Indeed, our record against Westbury United over the years is not a good one. In fact, it is pretty atrocious. The two clubs have met 79 times in competitive matches stretching back to 1936-37 with Westbury winning 51 times to our measly 19 with 9 games having been drawn. The result of all 79 matches is included in tonight's programme along with most of the Wootton Bassett Town scorers over the years. When it comes to the Wiltshire Senior Cup we are still seeking that first ever win over our visitors in the competition having lost all previous 6 meetings, the last one being in Season 2012-13 when we lost 3-0. Of our current personnel, only manager Sam Collier has scored against Westbury in a competitive match, firing a hat-trick in our 4-3 defeat in this competition in Season 2010-11. Our last win against Westbury came in the FA Cup in Season 2009-10 when goals from Adam Field, Alex Green and Mitch Wyatt gave us a 3-2 win.

Securing that first win in this competition is going to be tough as Westbury are currently the only unbeaten side in the Toolstation Western League Premier Division having won all 8 of their opening league fixtures. Westbury's only defeats this season have come in the FA Cup and FA Vase. In the FA Cup they got through two qualifying rounds before losing 3-0 to Bitton and in the FA Vase it was a similar story as they again made it through the two qualifying rounds before losing to a late winner on Saturday against Saltash United 2-1 in the First Round Proper. Ironically the FA Cup win earlier in the season had come against Saltash United who are from the South-West Peninsula League.

## **Reading City**

What a great performance and result that was on Saturday against one of the title favourites Reading City. After throwing away a 2-0 lead against the other title favourites 7 days earlier what a contrast on Saturday as we put in a disciplined performance across the whole team for 90 minutes to defeat a very good side in Reading City. In Mitchell Parker they possess one of the top strikers in the league and had former Notts County and Gillingham player Charlie Allen, son of Martin Allen, pulling the strings for them in midfield. On the day we won the game thanks to a solid defensive display when not in possession coupled with some clinical finishing from the top drawer from Brad and Matt. How great it is to see Matt playing at the club where he started out and causing defences the same problems as he did 10 years ago. If only he had come back a bit sooner, he may have given Dip some competition for that 500 appearances record that gets ever closer after another excellent performance on Saturday. Whilst it is difficult to pick a man-of-the match with the whole team playing so well but for me it had to be either Dale Richards or Charlie McCready and in the end I agreed with the Press Officer who opted to give the honour to Dale, despite a silly late booking that earned him the wrath of Sam. Hopefully we can take Saturday's performance into tonight's game and secure that first Wiltshire Senior Cup win over Westbury.

## **Development Side**

A baptism of fire for the new management team of Steve Chadwick and Mike Brewer on Saturday when their first game was a visit to defending champions Kintbury Rangers, With Kintbury having strengthened in recent weeks with the return of last season's top scorer Charlie Allsop the Development Team were on the wrong end of an 8-1 score line, Calum Courtney with our consolation goal. It can only get better from here for Steve and Mike and hopefully they can turn things around quickly ahead of Saturday's Fountain Trophies Cup game against Purton, who will go into the game in a confident mood after their giant-killing win over Bemerton Heath Harlequins, a side two levels higher up in the pyramid, in this competition.





Westbury are playing in the Premier Division of the Toolstation Premier Division for the first time since Season 2001-02 having won Division 1 last season.

They opened life back in the Premier Division with a 3-1 home win over Wellington, Dan Kovacs bagging a brace and Jamie Jordan with the other goal. Kovacs was again amongst the goals in a midweek home win against Shepton Mallet, firing a hat-trick in a 4-2 win, Ricky Hulbert with the other goal.

Westbury met fellow Western League Premier Division side Cribbs in the Extra Preliminary Round of the FA Cup and that man Kovacs was at it again scoring one of the goals in the 3-0 win, the other two coming courtesy of Jamie Jordan and Steve Hulbert.

Pacey youngster Callum Demkiv was signed in the summer from Melksham Town and he scored his first league goals in a Westbury shirt, bagging a brace in a 4-0 away win at Brislington, Waleed Bakali and Ricky Hulbert with the other goals. Demkiv was again amongst the goals as Westbury won 2-1 away at former Hellenic League side Shortwood United.

FA Cup Preliminary Round opponents were Saltash United where goals from Kovacs, and substitutes Josh Ferguson and Francois Allen saw Westbury through to the First Qualifying Round for the first time since 2003-04.

Next up was a trip across the water to the Isle of Wight to play Cowes Sports in the FA Vase where extra time was needed to progress to the next round, 5-3 the final score, two goals for both Callum Demkiv and Ricky Hulbert in this one. The first defeat of the season was suffered in the next game as they crashed 3-0 at fellow Western League side Bitton in the FA Cup.

Yet another cup game, their fourth in a row, saw them make further progress in the FA Vase, this time at the expense of Petersfield Town from the Wessex League who they defeated 3-1 on their own patch.

On their return to league action they maintained their 100% record with another four straight victories. First up a 3-1 away win at Shepton Mallet (so it is not just the Hellenic where you get to play the same opponents twice at the start of the season), two more for Ricky Hulbert in this one. This was followed by another good away win as Westbury left Odd Down with all three points courtesy of a comfortable 4-1 win. In their last home league game they again won seeing off one of the top sides Willand Rovers 3-1, inflicting Willand Rovers one and only defeat in the league so far. In their last league outing a solitary goal from Callum Demkiv gave Westbury a 1-0 at Plymouth Parkway to make it 8 league wins from 8 games.

Saturday saw a rare defeat as they went down for only the second time this season when a late goal ensured Saltash United gained revenge for their FA Cup defeat in the other big FA competition.

## Introduction to Westbury

Westbury is a town in the west of the English county of Wiltshire, most famous for the Westbury White Horse. Westbury is in the far west of Wiltshire, close to the border with Somerset. It lies at the northwestern edge of Salisbury Plain, 18 miles (29 km) southeast of the city of Bath, approximately 5 miles (8.0 km) south of the county town of Trowbridge and 4.5 miles (7.2 km) north of the garrison town of Warminster. Other nearby towns and cities include Frome, Devizes and Salisbury.

## Interesting Facts About Westbury

The most famous landmark of the area is the vastly impressive Westbury White Horse which is both the oldest and largest White Horse in Wiltshire.

The 14th century All Saints Church in Westbury has the third heaviest peal of eight bells in the world and an Erasmus Bible.

Westbury has one of the oldest working Victorian swimming pools in the country, built in 1887 by William Laverton.

The main railway line from London to the west of England runs across Westbury from east to west, and the line between Westbury and Warminster, opened in

1851

In 1890 W. G. Grace played in W. H. Laverton's XI in a cricket match against the Australians at Westbury.

Westbury FC made the Wiltshire Senior Cup final

3 consecutive seasons from 1931-32 to 1933-34 winning it twice.

## **Famous Residents**

The most locally well known resident of Westbury is Abraham Laverton (1819-1889), a wealthy Victorian mill owner, local politician and social benefactor. His legacy lives on in The Laverton, a community centre for the use of the inhabitants of the Town of Westbury. The building is a fine structure, it was designed in the 'Venetian' style by the celebrated architect William Jarvis Stent and is a Grade II listed building.

Westbury United Football Club have a number of players who have gone on to play for professional clubs over the years. The most famous is John Atveo, for whom Bristol City played a presentation game against Westbury and made a donation of £100 when they signed him. Atyeo played over 600 games for Bristol City and scored 359 goals; he also played six times for England in which he netted five goals. He now has a grandstand named after him at City's Ashton Gate ground as well as a street in his home village of Dilton Marsh, a few miles from Westbury.

Another player to go on to play professionally was Reg Smith (Bristol City, Colchester, & Woves).

## **Nearest Railway Station**

The nearest railway station is in the town of Westbury itself. The station is managed by Great Western Railway. The station is a major junction, serving the Reading to Taunton line with services to and from Penzance and London Paddington. Wessex Main Line with services to and from Cardiff and Portsmouth. services to Swindon. Heart of Wessex Line providing local services from Bristol Temple Meads to Weymouth, and services to London Waterloo.

## **Nearest Pubs to Ground**

The nearest pubs to the ground are The Ludlow Arms and The Crown Inn. Just a little further up the road is the Horse & Groom that looks to do decent food in search of a prematch meal.



## Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande.

Season 2018-19 sees Sam Collier in charge of the First Team.

Sensing a let off, Reading sought to exert pressure on Bassett. But, with the home side disciplined and sticking to their shape, they continued to lack the necessary end product.

Bassett continued to create opportunities too, though Bohane and Bennett both snatched at shots from advantageous positions and failed to trouble Cavanagh.

With twenty minutes remaining, Reading finally used the wind to their advantage and breached the Bassett defence as Jack Powell set Parker loose, but the forward, attempting to lift his strike over an advancing McCready, sent his effort the wrong side of the post.

Parker, recently called up for an English non-league representative team to play in the Falkland Islands, was proving most troublesome for the visitors, but was having a frustrating day, steering over from a free kick while curling over after demonstrating quick feet to fashion space on the edge of the box.

Then, with two minutes of normal time remaining, Bassett ensured any goal the visitors did muster would be a mere consolation. It was a fantastic move that brought the goal too, beginning with McCready rolling the ball out to right back Cole. Working down the right wing, play was worked to Iggy Ilott who slipped through Lincoln. An excellent turn from the winger got him clear of his man and it appeared as though he would get the goal his performance merited. However Cavanagh kept out his low drive, but could not do enough to prevent Pagliaroli slotting home the rebound.

Despite the outcome of the game now being beyond doubt, Reading – to their credit – continued to try and push forward. They appeared on course to fail to get on the scoresheet though as McCready pulled off a pair of fantastic saves to tip a curling Powell effort and another Parker free kick that was destined for the top corner around the post.

However, they were eventually able to grab a consolation as Allen earned a soft penalty and Parker sent McCready the wrong way.

But it was far too little, far too late, with Bassett having wrapped up a fully deserved and impressive win.

Man of the Match: Dale Richards – aside from the booking he picked up late in the second half, Richards did not put a foot wrong all afternoon at left back. Sound defensively and adroit in possession, he stood out most among a whole team of players whose performances merited at least seven out of ten.

That was on show early on too as Parker curled a free kick from the left edge of the area onto the post in only the fifth minute of a game, whose start was delayed courtesy of the opposition being caught up in heavy traffic.

Bassett eventually made the decisive first breakthrough in what had developed into a midfield battle on the half hour mark. After TJ Bohane had flicked on a Dan Cole throw, the visiting defence failed to clear and the ball dropped perfectly for Pagliaroli, who fired a perfectly executed half volley into the top right hand corner.

The response from Reading was almost immediate as a give-and-go with John Dennis on the edge of the area opened up space in the box for Ben Cook. He drew Charlie McCready off his line and was able to steer a cute shot around the 'keeper, but Dan Cole was perfectly placed to head clear off the line. Left back Rob Gerrard then placed a firmly struck shot from distance narrowly over.

But while Reading were misfiring narrowly, Bassett were in a groove offensively and doubled their advantage four minutes before the break. Pagliaroli played a perfectly weighted pass in behind the visitors' defence and, showing great desire, Matt Bennett shrugged off centre half Alfie Grant to be the first to the ball and arrowed a precise first time left-footed strike into the bottom corner.

It could well have been three prior to half time too, but, rather than squaring for either Bennett or Rob Lincoln who were both in space, Pagliaroli dragged a shot from a tight angle across goal after Steve Yeardley had initiated a counter attack.

Still, it was a superb position to be in at the break. However, playing against the wind in the second half, there was going to be plenty of hard work to do in order to guarantee the points.

Bassett's job could well have been made easier three minutes after the restart though. Winning another header, this time to flick on a Dale Richards free kick, Bohane teed up an unmarked Mark James at the far post. But his first shot was repelled by Ed Cavanagh in the Reading goal, before Bennett's follow up and another James attempt at goal were brilliantly blocked on the line by Matt Hancock.

## Our Visitors History

## **WESTBURY UNITED CLUB HISTORY**

#### In the beginnning.



The club started in 1920 with the amalgamation of two local sides. Westbury Old Comrades FC had just won promotion to the First Division of the Wiltshire County League and to strengthen the side they joined forces with a local junior side, Westbury Great Western Railway XI. Together they became Westbury United Football Club.

In its first season the club finished third from bottom of the county league and after struggling throughout the 1920s, went on to great success in the 1930s.

#### At Meadow Lane



In the 1930s Westbury won everything possible in Wiltshire football and in 1936 also reached the first-round proper of the FA Cup. They were led by a magnificent player called Billy Pearce, who captained the Wiltshire county side throughout the decade. Also in the side at the time was a prolific goalscorer called Bill Butler, who scored more than eighty senior goals in one season (including thirty in a month!).

The club then purchased and moved to its present ground in Meadow Lane, at a cost of £475 for the four-acre site. The very first game played on what was then the Jubilee Playing Field was against Bristol City and a crowd of around 4000 attended.

#### Recent Years

In recent years the Club has, with the help of the Football Stadia Improvement Fund, been able to replace the drainage system on the pitch as well as erect fencing around the ground and a wall around the pitch. Following several seasons in the 2000s where the aim of promotion to the Toolstation Premier League wasn't achieved, long standing manager Paul Brickley stood down and there were six seasons of struggle from 2010/11 till 2015/16 under various managers, with the team finishing in the bottom three every time.

Matthew Bright took over as Chairman in November 2014, installing Shaun Gardner as 1st team manager. Bright aims to make the club more family orientated and make Westbury United the centre of the local community. The club now have a strong link with the local youth football club, Westbury Youth FC, which provides a pathway for youth footballers. Gardner's team finished the 2014/2015 season bottom of the league table but avoided relegation. In September 2015, Gardner resigned as first team manager. His assistant manager, James Goddard, was appointed as his successor after three games in temporary charge. Westbury finished the 2015/16 season in 20th position.

Season 2016/17 started with them winning half of their games up until the middle of November, followed by a run of nine games with only one win and one draw. Morale amongst the players was low and the officers of the club were concerned Westbury would be involved in another relegation battle; the decision was made to relieve James Goddard from his duties at the club after a home defeat by Chippenham Park, at that time a relegation rival. Westbury's reserve manager, Marc Lanfear, stepped in to lead the first team whilst a new manager was sought. He was assisted for those two matches by Nathan Hallett-Young; they won both of their games against two of the top three teams in the division.

Father and son, Neil and Joe Kirkpatrick, were appointment joint managers on 1 February 2017. They suffered defeat in their first three league games in charge, but after that they over-saw a five-league game winning streak, the first time Westbury United achieved this since 2009.

Westbury started the 2017/18 season with three teams: the first team competing in the Toolstation Western League Division One, the Reserves competing in the Wiltshire Senior League and the Development Team in the Trowbridge and District League.

The Kirkpatrick's had attracted a strong group of players and Westbury started the season amongst the favourites to be promoted. They started the season well, staying unbeaten for the first 13 league games, winning 8 and drawing 5. Chairman Matt Bright stepped down in early October to spend more time with his family, and Secretary Greg Coulson was elected to become Chairman at a Special General Meeting in early November. The club won the First Division and secured promotion to the Premier Division. They managed to score more points (95, previous best 91), score more goals (97, previous best 95) and concede the least goals (29, previous best 39) in the club's history.







## Fairford Town break home duck in Hellenic Premier

FAIRFORD Town recorded their first home Hellenic League Premier Division win of the season on Saturday, lifting Jody Bevan's side to 14th.

Dan Bailey bagged a second-half brace while Robbie James, Charlie Bailey and Jon Thomas were also on target as Fairford recorded a comfortable five-goal victory against sixth-placed Holmer Green

After losing four and drawing two of their opening six games, the performance understandably delighted Bevan - who now has a two-week break in the league to hone his side's shape and

Bevan said: "We were fantastic all round, it was a great performance from start until finish.

"It's a result that's been coming. It's a great result for the club - the players, coaching staff and everyone connected.

"We haven't had too many good nights as such, but on Saturday we could enjoy ourselves.

"We've not got a league game now for a couple of weeks, and we knew a win would put us several places up the league table. We can now relax a little bit from the league, but really we've got ourselves out of trouble.

"We had a terrible start to the campaign where we underachieved, and the last few weeks have gone a long way to rectify it."

Fairford's improvement on the pitch prompted Bevan to underline the importance of not letting standards slip.

Trips to Virginia Water, Longlevens and Windsor provide Town with three potentially tough consecutive away fixtures in the next month - games which Bevan doesn't plan on leaving without reward.

He said: "We've set our standards now, and I don't want to be in a situation where we're looking over our shoulder in the table again.

"We should be looking onwards and aim to do as well as we possibly can.

"We've got a couple of cup games now, and there's some real competition for team places

"That gives players a chance to make their case, and I've got a genuinely good group of

"The atmosphere in the changing room after the game was excellent, and long may that continue."

Elsewhere in the Hellenic Premier Division, Sam Collier's Royal Wootton Bassett ran out 3-1 winners at home to Reading City, Brad Pagliaroli twice and Matt Bennett on target.

In Division One West, New College Swindon were downed 7-0 by Thornbury while Malmesbury Victoria made FA Vase progress after beating Roman Glass St George 2-0, Shane Bumphrey and Joe Tranter on target.

## Featured Article from inews

With so many home games this week the usual Non-League Paper article is replaced by an article from the excellent I News, The Essential Daily Briefing, which can be found at www.inews.co.uk

When it started in 2010, Non-League Day was essentially a Facebook event that went viral. Now, eight years later, it is a staple of the football calendar backed by clubs from the top flight and throughout the Football League. Working in conjunction with the FA, Supporters Direct, Kick It Out and The Football Supporters' Federation among others, volunteers and organisers have been credited with helping to bring non-league football back into the national consciousness. Not only

have they got more fans through turnstiles and given a much-needed boost to non-league finances, they have helped to revitalise an alternative world where the tickets are cheap, dogs count as spectators, beers can be consumed in view of the pitch – without causing complete societal breakdown, amazingly – and fans turn up to support their local team. Asked about the origins of Non-League Day, founder James Doe traces the initial inspiration back to a match that few would have marked out as a historic occasion. "I was down in Devon watching QPR in a pre-season friendly at a club called Tavistock Town," James tells i. "When I went down there, it was being advertised all over town and was actually massive for the local team. There were adverts on road signs, on buses, everywhere, and the ground was packed. It was clear that the money raised from that match would go a long way to keeping the club going for the whole season. That just made me think what a positive impact getting loads of extra fans going to games has for these teams, because their budgets are tiny." This was at a time when money was arguably even tighter for community clubs, with the recent non-league renaissance not quite underway and a tough economic climate suffocating many. "A week or so later I went to watch a non-league game in London, at Harrow Borough." James goes on. "They were fundraising for floodlight bulbs. I was quite shocked by that, because they were a fairly big non-league team and I thought that would be a fairly routine cost, but that obviously wasn't the case. It wasn't long after the financial crash and, when I dug around, I found out there were quite a few teams who were in trouble, whose finances were ailing and things like that. "It was one day, not long after that, the idea popped into my head: 'We need to get more fans into grounds'. I noticed there was an international break coming up, so the Premier League and the Championship would have the weekend off, and there would be all these extra fans who would be without a game on the Saturday."

From there, Non-League Day became a Facebook event with a handful of attendees. Gradually, more and more people showed interest to the point that it spiralled well beyond James' close friend group. Six weeks later, on the first ever Non-League Day, the effect reverberated through the lower echelons of the league pyramid. "The crowd went up in the top four levels of non-league football by about 12 per cent," says James. "So that's how it started." While James was keen to bring fans to non-league, he also decided to take a different tack to some of the grassroots football movements which had gone before him. While the 'against modern football' ethos is an understandable reaction to Europe's top leagues becoming increasingly corporate — the prioritisation of television audiences over match going fans, high ticket prices, the erosion of community values and so on — taking a confrontational stance against the Premier League and Football League didn't seem like the best strategy for growing Non-League Day and gaining traction with the public. "Non-League Day is very much a celebration of all that's good about non-league," says James. "It's not in any way a protest against the Premier League, against satellite television or anything like that. It's been a very conscious decision, so we can try to work with everybody and bring everybody together. That's kind of the idea with non-league games, that it's fine to support other teams as well. So Non-League Day is sort of like a bridge, from non-league to the Premier League and everything in between."

Premier League and Football League clubs have, to their credit, helped to publicise Non-League Day, with many directing fans to local fixtures ahead of the 2018 edition this weekend. While the FA were slow to get on board initially, they too have thrown their weight behind the event at a time when the powers that be seem to have belatedly recognised the importance of the grassroots game. "It's important for people to realise that non-league teams are the bedrock of football in this country," says James. Whether through their youth teams, community outreach or penchant for unearthing undiscovered gems, non-league sides are crucial to the health of English football and their fortunes are directly linked to its success. Still, for James, it is surreal to see how big Non-League Day has become. Martin Tyler is a national ambassador, the event is now coordinated by a dedicated core of volunteers, and non-league clubs up and down the country mark it with pomp, ceremony and often 'pay what you like' ticket deals. "I guess the watershed moment I always remember was back in 2014, when I went to a game at Dulwich Hamlet and they had really thrown the kitchen sink at promoting the day," says James. "The average crowd had gone from about 500 or 600 to almost 3,000, and it was like: 'Wow'. "I was there, I kept looking around and seeing this absolutely packed stadium. It's amazing what can be achieved if you really put your mind to it."

# From The development Side

# From The development Side

## 13th October 2018

With the Wiltshire Senior Cup reducing the number of league fixtures for this weekend to four there were still a number of key games affecting both the top and bottom of the table, with both Kintbury Rangers and Melksham Town Res knowing that a win might take them top of the table.

For Kintbury to go top they needed to win and hope that Melksham dropped points at Westbury. Kintbury did what they themselves needed to do by smashing eight goals past Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development at the Recreation Ground. A clinical first half performance saw Kintbury score five times before the break, Fabio Pinto led the way with a brace, with Charlie Allsop, Shaun Thorp and George Smith also netting. Royal Wootton Bassett managed one in response through Calum Courtney to make it 5-1 at the break. Kintbury took their foot off the gas a little bit in the second half but still managed to score three more with Charlie Allsop, Shaun Thorp and George Smith all getting their second of the game. As a result, Shaun Thorp moved onto 15 goals at the top of the goal scoring chart for the league.

Melksham Town Reserves had a tough looking fixture against a Westbury United Reserves side who had gone unbeaten in their previous seven games, the last three which had all been won. In a highly competitive game the only goal of the game came in the first half courtesy of Melksham's Leigh Rogers, ten days after firing a hat-trick against Trowbridge in Melksham's last game he scored the goal which sent Melksham to the top of the table. So, despite their impressive win, Kintbury had to settle for second spot, one point behind but with a game in hand.

Shrewton United, who had received the news in the week that manager Scott Young was stepping down after four years at the helm, went into their match against Trowbridge Town with caretaker manager Joe Sheldrake in charge. He got off to a winning start as Shrewton ended their recent disappointing run as goals from Craig Lewis and Charlie Utterson secured a 2-1 win, Jordan Cullis with the Trowbridge Town goal. Shrewton remain in fourth place but the win lifted them to within two points of previous leaders Wroughton in third place.

At the other end of the table both Devizes Town Res and Pewsey Vale Development went into their game on the back of seven games without a win. Games between the two sides are usually tight affairs, last seasons two matches between the sides had seen just one goal scored and when the two met a few weeks back it had again finished 0-0, so another tight game was expected and so it proved. The match was decided right at the death when Kieron Kiff scored the only goal of the game following good set up play from youngster William Garrett.

Five sides were scheduled to be in Wiltshire Senior Cup First Round action but the game between Football ID and Marlborough Town was called off by when Football ID late Friday night when they pulled out of the competition with a large number of their players dual signed with one of the Chippenham sides also in the competition.

In the two ties that did get played, the big shock of the day was at the Red House where Purton met Sydenhams Wessex League Premier Division side Bemerton Heath Harlequins and defeated their higher league opposition courtesy of a 1-0 win. Purton's hero was Daren Regis who came on as a substitute to score his first goal for the club and send his side through to the second round. This win means that the league is now guaranteed at least four sides in the last sixteen as Purton join Marlborough Town, Trowbridge Town and Cricklade Town in the Second Round.

Cricklade made it through to the Second Round by defeating Ludgershall Sports in an all Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League tie. The two sides had drawn 1-1 recently in the league at Ludgershall but this time Cricklade made sure of progress through to the next round with a convincing performance. Devan Bryan led the way firing a hat-trick to take him to 13 for the season, the other goals coming from Dave Coleman, Elliott Corp and Reece Gilliver in a 6-0 win.

Chippenham Town had a disappointing defeat on Saturday doing down 2-1 at home to a Dartford side who were below them in the table but moved level on points with Chippenham as a result of the win. The winning goal came from an unlikely source with Dartford keeper Deren Ibrahim scoring with a 70 yard free-kick which caught in the strong wind and floated over the head of the unfortunate Brad House in the Chippenham goal. Dartford had gone in front on 24 minutes but Chippenham equalised a minute before the break when Yan Klukowski's low cross was knocked in by Nat Jarvis. As well as scoring the winning goal Deren Ibrahim kept Chippenham out at the other end as they sought that elusive equlaiser earning the Dartford keeper the man of the match award at the end of the game. Chippenham remain in 11th place after an encouraging start to their second season at this level.

Salisbury continued their good start to the season at Step 3 with a fine 4-1 away win at Chesham United to move into 8<sup>th</sup> place in the table following last season's promotion. The other promoted side Swindon Supermarine are finding life at this level slightly tougher and have yet to really find their feet. On Saturday they picked up a very useful point though at home against the league leaders Weymouth. However, they remain in the relegation positions despite this excellent result but with two games in hand will be hoping to move up the table when they get to play these matches. They can actually count themselves unlucky not to get their first league win at home after missing a hatful of opportunities against high-flying Weymouth. Former Swindon Town player Jerel Ifil, who played for Supermarine against us in a pre-season friendly, made his league debut for Supermarine having finally signed in the week. Conor McDonagh put Supermarine in front with a powerful header from Bradley Gray's cross but an error at the back allowed Weymouth back into the game, Calvin Brooks heading over Marine keeper Kevin Sawyer, a player who had helped us out of a goalkeeping crisis when we had met Flackwell earlier in the season. Supermarine then had plenty of chances to take all three points but it was not to be.

At Step 4 hats off to both Highworth Town and Melksham Town who continue to do well in their first season at this level. On Saturday, whilst Melksham were winning 3-2 away in the FA Trophy at Slimbridge, Highworth were in league action against high-flying Evesham Town. Goals from Callum Parsons and Ashley Edenborough put Highworth 2-0 up before Evesham pulled back two goals to level. Former Bassett player Rory Sproule put Highworth back in front and then Tourmani Sidibe restored the Worthians two goal advantage. However, for the second time in the match Evesham scored twice to draw back level, the equaliser coming in the final minute of the game to make it 4-4. The point lifted Highworth into 6th place, outside the play-off places on goal difference only. Melksham sit one place behind in 7th, their goals in their cup win coming from a Jon Davies penalty. Luke Ballinger and Neikell Plumber.

At Step 5 whilst we were securing our fine win over Reading City, Bemerton Heath Harlequins from the Wessex League were suffering a big shock losing 1-0 away at Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League side Purton. Purton's hero was Daren Regis who came on as a substitute to score his first goal for the club and send his side through to the second round. Today's opponents Westbury also lost going down to a late winner at Saltash United in the FA Vase, 2-1 the score here. In the Western League Bradford Town, with Wayne Thorne taking charge for the first time, won 3-1 away at Wellington. The win was helped by Wellington having a man sent off as Bradford made the xtra man count, and the win lifted Bradford Town into 5<sup>th</sup> place in the table.

At Step 6, New College's dreadful start to the season continued in the Uhlsport Hellenic League Division One West as they lost 7-0 at Thornbury Town. Pewsey Vale picked up a useful point following a 0-0 draw with Newent Town. Malmesbury Victoria caused a shock when they won 2-0 away at Western League Premier Division side Roman St. George in the FA Vase. ## Headline: Comfortable but uninspiring match

The Bassett defence, and in particular Peter York, playing in an unfamiliar full-back position, dealt happily with all that Corsham could muster. 





