Tonight's Game

Good evening, Happy New Year and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture.

Tonight we meet Shrivenham for the game which was originally scheduled to have taken place on the Christmas weekend on the Bank Holiday. The game on the Bank Holiday was unfortunately called off by Shrivenham who advised they could not raise a side due to Covid in their camp and that they considered it too risky to come to Royal Wootton Bassett. This decision was made despite having over 60 players registered with the league. There is a protocol that has to be followed at our level in the pyramid with regard to gaining permission for postponement due to Covid. Our understanding is that Shrivenham did not provide the required evidence to the league to support the postponement but still refused to play the game and were fined £250 plus costs by the league (a figure picked up from comments they made on Twitter). Whilst a £250 fine is certainly an awful lot of money to a Non-League club at our level, our own club will almost certainly lose a lot more than £250 from the postponement of the Bank Holiday fixture through no fault of our own.

Tonight's gate could well be 100 spectators below that it would have been on that Bank Holiday Monday when we would almost certainly had our biggest league gate of the season. As well as the lost gate receipts, the takings at the kiosk will be substantially lower and the bar takings for the RWSA from what would have been one of the biggest occasions of the season will be dramatically reduced tonight. All of the fine imposed on Shrivenham by the league goes to league funds, none of it comes to us by way of compensation for lost income. We can only recover incurred costs (e.g. food etc) and not lost income.

In the correspondence sent to our club Shrivenham noted they did not want to risk introducing Covid into our clubhouse. However, the club were then quite happy only days later, on the second Bank Holiday, to open their own club for a game which attracted Shrivenham's second largest league attendance of the season, beaten only by the

attendance on the August Bank Holiday when we were the visitors. To see pictures on social media of Shrivenham captain with his arm round a youngster on the pitch when only a few days earlier there had been an alleged big Covid risk in their camp was somewhat galling. Having had such a big fine imposed by the league, the Shrivenham Chairman complained about it on Twitter (hence why we know the amount). It is hard to sympathise, if only we were going to be just £250 down from the postponement, as a conservative estimate, assuming we get a crowd of less than 100 here tonight, I would put the loss of funds to our club from the postponement at an amount of at least £500.

This is now the second programme produced for this fixture and we still await confirmation of whether the cost of producing the first edition to our sponsor will be re-imbursed. Unfortunately what cannot be included in any claim is the time spent forgoing another Sunday producing a programme that it seems should not have been needed. Copies of the original programme are available on the gate tonight along with this programme. Given the statistical information is all now out of date we will only be asking 50p for that particular edition but all contributions will be gratefully received.

Match Reports

With the Bank Holiday postponement, it means five away games since our last home fixture against Hamworthy United and there is a bit of catch-up in tonight's programme with match reports from six games. This includes the hard fought win away at Chipping Sodbury Town and the come from behind draw at Cribbs, as well as the defeats in that FA Vase game and in the league games at Bradford Town, Hereford Lads Club and Westfields. I understand we put in a good performance at Westfields on Saturday and that the final 3-1 score line flattered the title chasing side. Hopefully tonight will see us return to winning ways with Shrivenham just below us in the league table on goal difference. When we met back in August a late winner from Alan Griffin secured all three points for us and it would be sweet to complete the double tonight.

Tonight's Game

Before that August Bank Holiday win we had lost the previous four games against Shrivenham and had not won in five. With a number of our players having played for Shrivenham in recent seasons, and with the Christmas postponement, no doubt tonight's derby game will have that added spice and with just goal difference separating the teams in the table it should be another close game tonight, as is often the case in derby games in any event.

Shrivenham's new management team have certainly turned the side around after a difficult 2020-21 Season that had seen them bottom of the table when the season was brought to an early end due to Covid. This season they have beaten and drawn with the likes of Westbury United and had some other decent results against top sides. As we saw in the earlier meeting they are well organised side, defend well and apart from a couple of games have run most sides close even when not getting any points in games.

Development Side

Steve Yeardley's Development side secured an important 1-0 win on Saturday against Trowbridge Town and can move level with league leaders Pewsey Vale if they can win

their game in hand. With the return match against Pewsey coming up in February along with games against Calne Town Reserves and Corsham Town Development, February is going to be a big month in the Development side's quest for the title.

Veterans' Side

Congratulations to our Veterans' side on reaching the final of the Wiltshire FA's Veterans' County Cup by beating favourites Melksham Town, who had included former England C international James Constable in their line-up, on penalties. The final is scheduled for Friday 11th March at Melksham with a 7:45PM kick-off where our opponents will be Bradford Town.

Enjoy the game tonight and hopefully we will see a return to winning ways and three more points as we look to climb the Premier Division title.

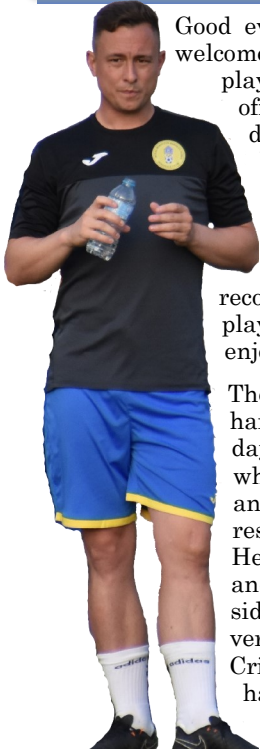

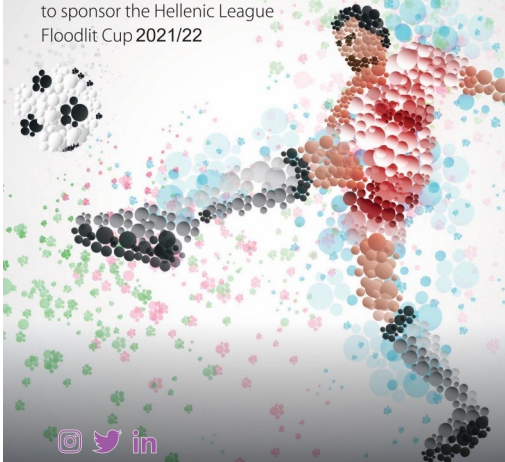

Jamie is an experienced centre midfielder and is a new signing for this season. He is very calm on the ball and has great passing ability.



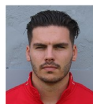
Jonny Davoile – Midfielder

CLUB HISTORY

Shrivenham Football Club was formed in 1900 and just eight years later the infant club became one of the founder members of the North Berks League. Shrivenham Football Club was formed in 1900 and just eight years later the infant club became one of the founder members of the North Berks League. Success in the early years was hard to find however, after winning the Second Division crown at the end of the 1994-95 campaign, two Division One Championships were to follow - in 1997-98 - a season which also included the club winning the Charity Shield, and again in 2000-01, which after completing the required ground improvements, saw the club promoted to UHlsport Hellenic League Division One West at the second time of asking.

With our inaugural Hellenic League season ending with a creditable twelfth placed finish, a period of building began and after gaining some stability in the league, a further title winning season followed in 2004-05 gaining the club promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division after we won the league by a single point in what was unarguably, at the time, the most amazing season the club had ever experienced. A club record breaking eighth place finish was recorded in 2007-08, however a gradual decline began and despite avoiding relegation after finishing bottom of the table in 2012-13, just two seasons later relegation was confirmed after a nineteenth placed finish and a decade of Hellenic Premier League football brought a tough era to an end.

Two seasons of mid-table mediocrity ensued, however the club appointed a new Chairman ahead of the 2017-18 campaign and the introduction of a new management team soon followed as the club began rebuilding its ambitions and the bid to return to the Hellenic Premier Division. That goal was achieved at the first attempt as an amazing 12-game unbeaten run to the end of the campaign, found the club in second place and in an exciting final day which saw promotion rivals Easington Sports in third place, needing a result at home and Shriviv without a fixture. Sports suffered the heartache of defeat against a midtable Letcombe side, and Shriviv clung on to gain promotion.

The rebuilding was set to continue, however pre-Christmas the club looked odds on favourites to be fighting relegation, before an amazing turn of fortune saw the side go on a seventeen-game unbeaten run, during which time the picked up fifteen wins and two draws, and catapulted the club up to a new record finish of fifth, come the end of the season, 2019-20 saw the side in 4th position in the standings when the season was curtailed early due to the Covid-19 pandemic and the off season saw manager Gareth Davies step down in order to take a break from the game and Chris Hurley was appointed as his successor shortly before the season was due to start.

With a makeshift squad, the club endured a difficult start but despite being in bottom spot by the time the season came to a halt due to the Covid pandemic, new faces had begun to arrive and things were looking up once again, however by the time preseason arrived a lack of First XI players at the opening training session brought back memories of the previous campaign, and in a bid to continue moving forwards, Chris Hurley saw his time at Barrington Park come to a close. The club have now recruited the management duo of Robin Broadbank and Daniel Broadbank for the 2021-22.

Given how they controlled most of the game, Sam Collier may have waited longer than he would have wanted to see his side finally break the deadlock in their derby visit to Shrivenham. But the Royal Wootton Bassett Town manager will be delighted that his team eventually did find the net as they secured a 1-0 win and completed a fine Bank Holiday double.

Alan Griffin was again the man who provided the goods when it mattered most, heading in from Tom Moore's cross with just minutes to spare for his sixth of the season and his second match-winning goal in the space of 48 hours. In truth it gave Bassett a derby win that, on the balance of chances created, they more than deserved. But a lack of composure in front of goal as well as some fine last ditch defending from the hosts meant that the outcome remained uncertain right until the end.

It had been one way traffic during the first half with Shrivenham setting out a very defensive stall. Yet the visitors were unable to make their pressure count. Midway through the period a pair of chances arrived in quick succession, with Griffin denied by a brilliant goalline block and Matt Bennett firing over from the edge of the area. Then on the half hour mark Griffin teed up Bennett but another last gap block cleared the danger.

It was more of the same early in the second period. Ten minutes after the restart Bennett's pace allowed him to accelerate in behind the Shrivenham defence but his ball across the face of goal had just a bit too much pace meaning Griffin was unable to get on the end of what would have been a tap in. Eventually the hosts got a foothold into the game. And on the hour they came close to taking the lead but Eddie Cavanagh kept the scores deadlocked with a great save to guide the ball around the post. The resulting corner then saw Shrivenham go close again.

While those opportunities served as a wake up call, things soon got nervier for Bassett when they were temporarily reduced to ten men with Dave Bampton sent to the sin bin. But Bassett successfully saw out the ten minutes they were forced to play short-handed before reasserting the dominance they earlier enjoyed.

With time winding down, Griffin placed a header narrowly over from a Bennett cross when he should really have done better. He quickly made amends for that miss though. The move that led to the goal was impressive too. 'Keeper Cavanagh caught Shrivenham off guard with a quick kick sprayed out to the wing. Moore was the recipient and he delivered a fine cross which Griffin, outmuscling his marker, climbed to meet and the veteran flicked a header home. Better late than never, it was what Bassett deserved - and a goal that also brought to an end a run of four straight league losses against Shrivenham.

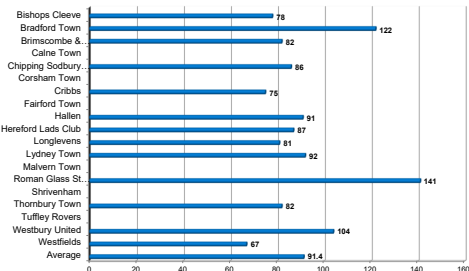

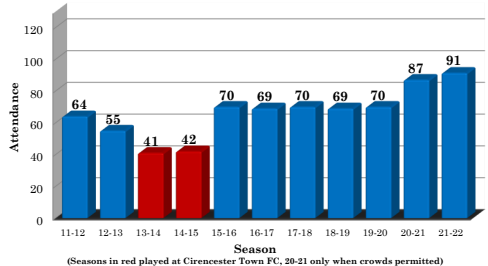

ESSENTIAL READING FOR FOLLOWERS OF THE NATIONAL GAME



THEY say that football and politics should never mix – just ask the officials at Chester FC this week.

In a bizarre twist to start the new year, the National League North Blues have been dragged into a Covid border war with both English and Welsh governments claiming authority on its jurisdiction.

As you may know, the club's Deva Stadium straddles the English/Welsh border but although Chester is an English football club, based in an English city and playing in an English league, the ground, although owned by Cheshire West and Cheshire Council is, apparently, governed by Welsh regulations.

This week, the Blues were presented with a joint letter from North Wales Police and Flintshire County Council informing them of potential Welsh Coronavirus Regulations breaches for their home games against AFC Fylde on December 28 and AFC Telford United on January 2.

As a result, the club have now informed supporters that further potential breaches could be brought if it continued to play home fixtures with crowds while the current restrictions in Wales are in place. Strict new rules mean that live sport in the country can only be attended by 50 people, as the likes of Wrexham and Merthyr Town are, as it stands, having to abide by.

Chester chiefs are currently seeking legal advice but, ultimately, it could mean Chester having to play homes games behind closed doors until Welsh regulations are eased or lifted.

For Chester, playing to an empty Deva Stadium isn't an option, as vice-chairman Jim Green warned.

"I think all parties need to take a step back, reflect and take some more legal advice," he

said. "The implications of this decision and outcome are very significant.

"It's not viable for us to play without fans in the stadium so it's going to need some cool heads and common-sense thinking."

What a bizarre situation this is. Pubs and clubs remain open and supporters are still free to pile onto coaches and cross the border to watch their away games.

In theory, Chester could erect a big screen in their car park and let thousands of fans attend to watch a game being played yards away.

The situation all makes for a very frustrating situation, with the Blues seeking legal advice to confirm their stance.

Chester have clearly been caught in some serious crossfire here as the British nations try to learn to live with Covid without having to shut down entirely.

For everyone's sake though, I just hope that common sense prevails and Chester are left alone to carry on safely as normal, without being used as a political football for parliamentary bigwigs .

First Team Match Report

Saturday 11th December 2021
Royal Wootton Bassett Town 1
Hamworthy United 3

FA Vase Third Round

Royal Wootton Bassett Town were unable to extend their record-setting Buildbase FA Vase run any further as Sam Collier's side fell to a 3-1 home defeat against Hamworthy United in a tense third round encounter.

While matching their opponents for most of the game, Bassett were ultimately left to rue a series of excellent chances that went begging. And at the other end Hamworthy ruthlessly punished Bassett for two instances of slack play either side of half time before being gifted a third that killed off any hopes the home side had of progressing to the last 32.

On balance Hamworthy were worth their win. But Collier and his players will feel that their opponents were there for the taking.

Indeed, Bassett expertly executed their game plan for the opening 44 minutes of the game and appeared on course to take a deserved lead into the break. And it was an advantage that could have been greater than just the one goal. Yet a failure to take the other opportunities they fashioned and a lapse in concentration in the final minute of the half meant they went into the break all square.

Seeking to negate the impact of Hamworthy's high press, Bassett adopted a more direct approach than usual. That almost paid dividends within the game's opening 180 seconds when Matt Bennett controlled Will Davidson's ball out from the back before a give-and-go with strike partner John Mills set him free in behind a laggard Hamworthy backline. However,

when presented with just 'keeper Shane Murphy to beat, Bennett dragged wide across the face of goal.

Hamworthy initially appeared unable to settle into any real rhythm, though they were able to twice threaten on the break from Bassett corners. A necessary, professional foul from Gio Wrona on the halfway line snuffed out one while Cam Munn eventually dragged wide from another.

But aside from those moments, Bassett appeared the most composed side. And on 23 minutes they exploited Hamworthy's vulnerabilities in defence to take the lead. Mills played a delightful ball into the pocket of space behind left back Chris Clarke to set Bennett free for a second time. After beating down on goal, Bennett saw his effort parried by an onrushing Murphy. However, the 'keeper was unable to get enough on the ball to push it away to safety and Tommy Ouldrige was on hand to tuck away the rebound.

The goal unsettled the visitors even more - and Bennett was soon presented with two further openings to extend Bassett's advantage.

After Davidson intercepted a stray pass and played the ball forward to Bennett, the Bassett man rolled Connor Cocklin with ease before placing narrowly wide of the right post from the edge of the area. Three minutes later, he raced onto Gio Wrona's through pass into the right channel and clipped a powerful shot past an advancing Murphy from the edge of the area only to see his effort again glide inches wide.

Hamworthy were certainly fortunate not to have faced an even greater deficit. Having rode their luck, they proceeded to capitalise on some soft defending with seconds left on the clock to equalise.

Bassett failed to pressure Clarke, allowing the left back to advance towards the edge of the area with the ball. His inside pass was then not properly cut out, allowing Max Wilcock to pick up the pieces and curl low into the bottom corner with a skidding 20-yard strike.

It was to prove a pivotal goal.

Shifting momentum in their favour, it provided Hamworthy the spark that they needed. They subsequently started the second half on the front foot, playing with intent.

Wilcock almost added another within sixty seconds of the restart as he sent a powerful drive over from a dangerous position just outside the area. Munn then cut in from the right side before sending a low curler narrowly wide of the left post.

They soon enough struck for the second time - doing so on 56 minutes and punishing Bassett for sloppy play. The hosts had possession of the ball in midfield but a wayward Sam Morris pass allowed Hamworthy to break, with only a saving tackle from Davidson denying the visitors. The defender was only able to force a corner though. Eddie Hodge floated the set piece into the six-yard area where 'keeper Eddie Cavanagh was able to get a part of the ball - but it was not enough to punch away from danger and Jack Lovell snapped up the chance to bundle in a header from close range.

Wilcock had the ball in the net again on the hour mark but his effort was ruled out for a handball offence.

Bassett, seemingly starting to fray, then were presented with a golden opportunity to level things up. Again though it passed them by. After jumping on an underhit clearance from Murphy, Ouldrige quickly passed inside to Bennett who split the defence with a through ball to Mills. The forward had just Murphy to beat but his left foot attempt was too close to Murphy, who produced a clutch save, tipping around the post.

Another critical moment in the game, that miss proved costly.

Within seven minutes Bassett were 3-1 down. It was a goal which 'keeper Cavanagh will want to forget quickly too. Hodge swung in a seemingly innocuous free kick from the deep on the left. But, biting on the run of Lovell, Cavanagh froze on the spot, allowing the ball to sail into the bottom corner untouched.

That goal sapped the life out of Bassett. The best they could muster as they sought to chase the game in the final quarter hour was when Macauley Dodson steered over from 15 yards after a Mills free kick delivery dropped for the defender.

Instead, the hosts spent much of the rest of the game chasing the ball as Hamworthy methodically wound the clock down. Munn was even close to adding a fourth, only to be denied at point blank range by Cavanagh.

Bassett had nothing left to give. It had been a brave display and Hamworthy had been forced to work hard - and ride their luck - to claim their win. Ultimately though not taking the gilt-edged chances when they fell Bassett's way and Hamworthy's ruthlessness proved decisive.

After such a strong effort and having had the opportunities that they did, Bassett will justifiably be asking themselves 'what if?'. However, as painful a defeat as this may be, all involved with this year's Vase run can look back with pride on the five games they have played in the competition.

It would have been great to have progressed even further - and Bassett were not that far off doing so.

But club history has been made. And that in itself is something to be proud of.

Man of the Match: Will Davidson - another strong performance from the left back, who provided some useful, threatening passes going forward and performed his defensive duties diligently.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's winless start to 2022 continued as they fell to a 1-0 defeat away against Hereford Lads Club. Both sides produced plenty of chances throughout an open match. But the lack of a clinical edge ultimately proved costly for Bassett as Will Loughman struck the decisive goal for the hosts with fifteen minutes remaining.

The result marked the first time this season that Sam Collier's side have tasted defeat against one of the sides currently situated in the bottom half of the Hellenic League Premier Division, with Lads Club exacting revenge for a 3-1 reverse in Wiltshire earlier in the season.

Cavanagh was then again tested from a free kick. The 'keeper did well to parry Jamie Cuthbertson's shot, with Levi Ellis unable to find the target with the rebound. Kiea Cowley-Hair was next up to come close as he guided narrowly over.

Bassett were the side who finished the half strongest though. On the half hour mark, Gallagher was denied by an important Cuthbertson block after being released by a clever John Mills reverse pass. Ten minutes later a Mills free kick was parried by home

custodian Steven Bell, before the 'keeper denied the returning Sam Packer's side low shot. Finally, with time winding down Dave Bampton guided a header from a Will Davidson cross inches wide of the post.

The visitors did have the ball in the net shortly after the restart, but an offside flag ruled out what would have been a Mills goal.

The pendulum then swung back in the hosts favour, but still a goal was not forthcoming as Will Loughman found the side netting and Cavanagh was equal to an Ellis shot.

Back at the other end, substitute Alan Griffin volleyed against the bar as a well-worked set piece saw Gio Wrona play a short free kick to Gallagher, whose fine cross picked out the veteran forward.

It was very much a game in which all three outcomes were a clear possibility. But Lads Club proceeded to strike what would ultimately be the decisive blow a quarter of an hour from time.

After racing onto a pass into the right channel, Ellis swung a low cross into the box and Loughman was able to get himself in between Cavanagh and Macaulay Dodson, with the forward stretching out his left foot to steer in first time at the near post.

That was a sucker blow to Bassett. And although Griffin headed narrowly over from a Dodson cross not long after his side went behind, it was Lads Club who looked likeliest to add a second as they sought to take advantage of the visitors' desperate attempts to get on terms.

Indeed, Lads Club had the ball in the net twice more in the closing minutes, only to see a pair of strikes from Tom Bendall disallowed for offside.

There was one further opportunity for Bassett as Packer cut back for Griffin, but the forward lifted his effort over from an advantageous position.

CLUB HISTORY

Shrivenham Football Club was formed in 1900 and just eight years later the infant club became one of the founder members of the North Berks League. Shrivenham Football Club was formed in 1900 and just eight years later the infant club became one of the founder members of the North Berks League. Success in the early years was hard to find however, after winning the Second Division crown at the end of the 1994-95 campaign, two Division One Championships were to follow - in 1997-98 - a season which also included the club winning the Charity Shield, and again in 2000-01, which after completing the required ground improvements, saw the club promoted to UHlsport Hellenic League Division One West at the second time of asking.

With our inaugural Hellenic League season ending with a creditable twelfth placed finish, a period of building began and after gaining some stability in the league, a further title winning season followed in 2004-05 gaining the club promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division after we won the league by a single point in what was unarguably, at the time, the most amazing season the club had ever experienced. A club record breaking eighth place finish was recorded in 2007-08, however a gradual decline began and despite avoiding relegation after finishing bottom of the table in 2012-13, just two seasons later relegation was confirmed after a nineteenth placed finish and a decade of Hellenic Premier League football brought a tough era to an end.

Two seasons of mid-table mediocrity ensued, however the club appointed a new Chairman ahead of the 2017-18 campaign and the introduction of a new management team soon followed as the club began rebuilding its ambitions and the bid to return to the Hellenic Premier Division. That goal was achieved at the first attempt as an amazing 12-game unbeaten run to the end of the campaign, found the club in second place and in an exciting final day which saw promotion rivals Easington Sports in third place, needing a result at home and Shriviv without a fixture. Sports suffered the heartache of defeat against a midtable Letcombe side, and Shriviv clung on to gain promotion.

The rebuilding was set to continue, however pre-Christmas the club looked odds on favourites to be fighting relegation, before an amazing turn of fortune saw the side go on a seventeen-game unbeaten run, during which time the picked up fifteen wins and two draws, and catapulted the club up to a new record finish of fifth, come the end of the season, 2019-20 saw the side in 4th position in the standings when the season was curtailed early due to the Covid-19 pandemic and the off season saw manager Gareth Davies step down in order to take a break from the game and Chris Hurley was appointed as his successor shortly before the season was due to start.

With a makeshift squad, the club endured a difficult start but despite being in bottom spot by the time the season came to a halt due to the Covid pandemic, new faces had begun to arrive and things were looking up once again, however by the time preseason arrived a lack of First XI players at the opening training session brought back memories of the previous campaign, and in a bid to continue moving forwards, Chris Hurley saw his time at Barrington Park come to a close. The club have now recruited the management duo of Robin Broadbank and Daniel Broadbank for the 2021-22.

Given how they controlled most of the game, Sam Collier may have waited longer than he would have wanted to see his side finally break the deadlock in their derby visit to Shrivenham. But the Royal Wootton Bassett Town manager will be delighted that his team eventually did find the net as they secured a 1-0 win and completed a fine Bank Holiday double.

Alan Griffin was again the man who provided the goods when it mattered most, heading in from Tom Moore's cross with just minutes to spare for his sixth of the season and his second match-winning goal in the space of 48 hours. In truth it gave Bassett a derby win that, on the balance of chances created, they more than deserved. But a lack of composure in front of goal as well as some fine last ditch defending from the hosts meant that the outcome remained uncertain right until the end.

It had been one way traffic during the first half with Shrivenham setting out a very defensive stall. Yet the visitors were unable to make their pressure count. Midway through the period a pair of chances arrived in quick succession, with Griffin denied by a brilliant goalline block and Matt Bennett firing over from the edge of the area. Then on the half hour mark Griffin teed up Bennett but another last gap block cleared the danger.

It was more of the same early in the second period. Ten minutes after the restart Bennett's pace allowed him to accelerate in behind the Shrivenham defence but his ball across the face of goal had just a bit too much pace meaning Griffin was unable to get on the end of what would have been a tap in. Eventually the hosts got a foothold into the game. And on the hour they came close to taking the lead but Eddie Cavanagh kept the scores deadlocked with a great save to guide the ball around the post. The resulting corner then saw Shrivenham go close again.

While those opportunities served as a wake up call, things soon got nervier for Bassett when they were temporarily reduced to ten men with Dave Bampton sent to the sin bin. But Bassett successfully saw out the ten minutes they were forced to play short-handed before reasserting the dominance they earlier enjoyed.

With time winding down, Griffin placed a header narrowly over from a Bennett cross when he should really have done better. He quickly made amends for that miss though. The move that led to the goal was impressive too. 'Keeper Cavanagh caught Shrivenham off guard with a quick kick sprayed out to the wing. Moore was the recipient and he delivered a fine cross which Griffin, outmuscling his marker, climbed to meet and the veteran flicked a header home. Better late than never, it was what Bassett deserved - and a goal that also brought to an end a run of four straight league losses against Shrivenham.

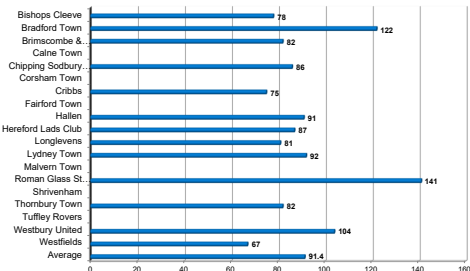

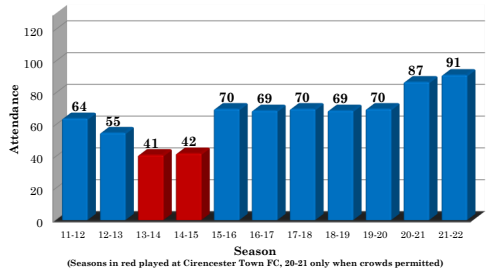

ESSENTIAL READING FOR FOLLOWERS OF THE NATIONAL GAME

WHETHER they be taking charge of a local game on a Sunday morning or a cup final in front of a 80,000 capacity stadium, referees and their assistants get called all sorts.

But certain names that never get muttered by managers, players or supporters alike are “vital”, “integral” and “lifeblood” of the game we all love.

Last week, we ran a feature on a dangerous shortage of officials which is threatening to send the grassroots game spiralling into crisis.

Already, it has led to matches at Step 7 and above being played without a qualified referee or, even worse, cancelled altogether.

Indeed, the Liverpool County Premier League has even had to scratch scheduled games in the divisions below its top flight this season due to their pool of referees being required to officiate matches in FA competitions or County Cups.

And it's not just a problem being experienced at local level. This season, three referees who normally operate in the Championship were drafted in to take charge of FA Trophy qualifiers during the October international weekend due to shortages.

Just why the situation has worsened so suddenly is unclear but it doesn't take a genius to work out where the problem may lie. Covid hasn't helped, of course, but abuse directed at match officials for just doing their job (voluntarily in many cases) is a problem which sadly won't go away.

The NLP's feature highlighted the work done by Cheshire FA to recruit new match officials and protect existing referees from becoming victims.

“Abuse directed at match officials is one factor but that's been a problem for a while,” said Cheshire League chairman Rob Goodwin-Davey. “But it's definitely not the sole reason.

“We've all lost match officials, but not been able to replace them. There isn't a quick fix.”

Cumberland FA have run a series of extra courses throughout the summer to attract the new batch of matchday officials with a number having hung up their whistle since the Covid outbreak. The average age of those attending was 15, showing that a demand still exists among the next generation, both male and

female.

“I'm encouraged by the take-up,” said Scott Taylor, the area's referee development officer.

“We've got youngsters who are still playing and want to referee alongside, those who referee for health reasons, and those who want a bit of pocket money.

“Because we've not been able to put on courses for almost two years, those 14 or 15-year-olds are now 16 or 17 and might now be doing other things.”

Another bone of contention is the cost of applying for a place on the course – a problem which the West Lancashire League is trying to address.

The fee, around £130, is said to have put off potential match officials – and it's easy to see why. I mean, who would cough up £130 just to qualify to be abused week in, week out?

With this in mind, the West Lancashire League has pledged to reimburse newly-qualified referees a percentage of the course price once they've taken charge of five fixtures in that competition. Barry Cropp, referee appointments officer for the West Lancashire League said: “Registrations are down in Lancashire and the £20 fee for doing so should have been waived this season to encourage people back.

“The same goes for the course fees. It's a lot of money when you don't often read positive news about refereeing.”

Keeping the conveyor belt of new referees rolling with courses such as this have now become vital in ensuring the grassroots game has a future.

For all the negativity which is publicised, a career as a matchday official has many perks and advantages and can often provide a healthy second income at senior Non-League level.

As New Year's Resolutions go, I would thoroughly recommend you get in touch with your local county or regional FA and enquire about becoming a football referee. You may just even contribute to help save the beautiful grassroots game.

FA Vase Third Round

Royal Wootton Bassett Town were unable to extend their record-setting Buildbase FA Vase run any further as Sam Collier's side fell to a 3-1 home defeat against Hamworthy United in a tense third round encounter.

While matching their opponents for most of the game, Bassett were ultimately left to rue a series of excellent chances that went begging. And at the other end Hamworthy ruthlessly punished Bassett for two instances of slack play either side of half time before being gifted a third that killed off any hopes the home side had of progressing to the last 32.

On balance Hamworthy were worth their win. But Collier and his players will feel that their opponents were there for the taking.

Indeed, Bassett expertly executed their game plan for the opening 44 minutes of the game and appeared on course to take a deserved lead into the break. And it was an advantage that could have been greater than just the one goal. Yet a failure to take the other opportunities they fashioned and a lapse in concentration in the final minute of the half meant they went into the break all square.

Seeking to negate the impact of Hamworthy's high press, Bassett adopted a more direct approach than usual. That almost paid dividends within the game's opening 180 seconds when Matt Bennett controlled Will Davidson's ball out from the back before a give-and-go with strike partner John Mills set him free in behind a laggard Hamworthy backline. However,

when presented with just 'keeper Shane Murphy to beat, Bennett dragged wide across the face of goal.

Hamworthy initially appeared unable to settle into any real rhythm, though they were able to twice threaten on the break from Bassett corners. A necessary, professional foul from Gio Wrona on the halfway line snuffed out one while Cam Munn eventually dragged wide from another.

But aside from those moments, Bassett appeared the most composed side. And on 23 minutes they exploited Hamworthy's vulnerabilities in defence to take the lead. Mills played a delightful ball into the pocket of space behind left back Chris Clarke to set Bennett free for a second time. After beating down on goal, Bennett saw his effort parried by an onrushing Murphy. However, the 'keeper was unable to get enough on the ball to push it away to safety and Tommy Ouldrige was on hand to tuck away the rebound.

The goal unsettled the visitors even more - and Bennett was soon presented with two further openings to extend Bassett's advantage.

After Davidson intercepted a stray pass and played the ball forward to Bennett, the Bassett man rolled Connor Cocklin with ease before placing narrowly wide of the right post from the edge of the area. Three minutes later, he raced onto Gio Wrona's through pass into the right channel and clipped a powerful shot past an advancing Murphy from the edge of the area only to see his effort again glide inches wide.

Hamworthy were certainly fortunate not to have faced an even greater deficit. Having rode their luck, they proceeded to capitalise on some soft defending with seconds left on the clock to equalise.

Bassett failed to pressure Clarke, allowing the left back to advance towards the edge of the area with the ball. His inside pass was then not properly cut out, allowing Max Wilcock to pick up the pieces and curl low into the bottom corner with a skidding 20-yard strike.

It was to prove a pivotal goal.

Shifting momentum in their favour, it provided Hamworthy the spark that they needed. They subsequently started the second half on the front foot, playing with intent.

Wilcock almost added another within sixty seconds of the restart as he sent a powerful drive over from a dangerous position just outside the area. Munn then cut in from the right side before sending a low curler narrowly wide of the left post.

They soon enough struck for the second time - doing so on 56 minutes and punishing Bassett for sloppy play. The hosts had possession of the ball in midfield but a wayward Sam Morris pass allowed Hamworthy to break, with only a saving tackle from Davidson denying the visitors. The defender was only able to force a corner though. Eddie Hodge floated the set piece into the six-yard area where 'keeper Eddie Cavanagh was able to get a part of the ball - but it was not enough to punch away from danger and Jack Lovell snapped up the chance to bundle in a header from close range.

Wilcock had the ball in the net again on the hour mark but his effort was ruled out for a handball offence.

Bassett, seemingly starting to fray, then were presented with a golden opportunity to level things up. Again though it passed them by. After jumping on an underhit clearance from Murphy, Ouldrige quickly passed inside to Bennett who split the defence with a through ball to Mills. The forward had just Murphy to beat but his left foot attempt was too close to Murphy, who produced a clutch save, tipping around the post.

Another critical moment in the game, that miss proved costly.

Within seven minutes Bassett were 3-1 down. It was a goal which 'keeper Cavanagh will want to forget quickly too. Hodge swung in a seemingly innocuous free kick from the deep on the left. But, biting on the run of Lovell, Cavanagh froze on the spot, allowing the ball to sail into the bottom corner untouched.

That goal sapped the life out of Bassett. The best they could muster as they sought to chase the game in the final quarter hour was when Macauley Dodson steered over from 15 yards after a Mills free kick delivery dropped for the defender.

Instead, the hosts spent much of the rest of the game chasing the ball as Hamworthy methodically wound the clock down. Munn was even close to adding a fourth, only to be denied at point blank range by Cavanagh.

Bassett had nothing left to give. It had been a brave display and Hamworthy had been forced to work hard - and ride their luck - to claim their win. Ultimately though not taking the gilt-edged chances when they fell Bassett's way and Hamworthy's ruthlessness proved decisive.

After such a strong effort and having had the opportunities that they did, Bassett will justifiably be asking themselves 'what if?'. However, as painful a defeat as this may be, all involved with this year's Vase run can look back with pride on the five games they have played in the competition.

It would have been great to have progressed even further - and Bassett were not that far off doing so.

But club history has been made. And that in itself is something to be proud of.

Man of the Match: Will Davidson - another strong performance from the left back, who provided some useful, threatening passes going forward and performed his defensive duties diligently.

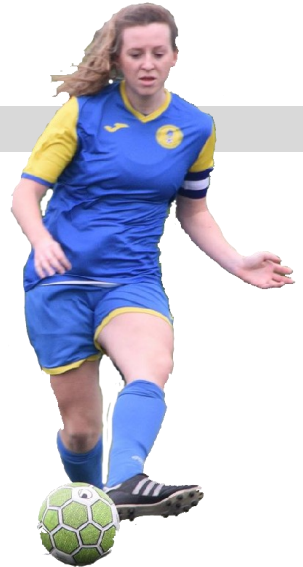

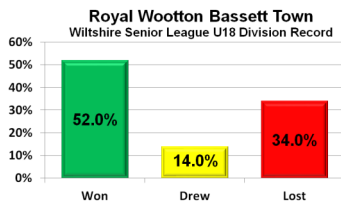
