Welcome To Today's Game

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this FA Vase Third Round Proper fixture against Hamworthy United.

A special warm welcome to all of the management players, committee members and supporters from Hamworthy who have made the journey from Poole for this FA Vase game. Hamworthy United play in the Wessex Premier Division where they have been since Season 2006-07 having remain in the top division of the Wessex League since gaining promotion at the end of the 2005-6 Season.

We have played Hamworthy on one occasion previously, that meeting coming in the 2012-13 Season in the FA Cup. We won 1-0 on that occasion on a Friday night under the lights at Rylands Way thanks to a Mark Barnes goal. Further details are included in the Press Officers preview of today's game and there is also his match report from the game later in the programme.

Hamworthy will be tough opponents here today as you would expect at this stage of the competition. We are down to the last 64 teams in the country, the sole representative of the UHlsport Hellenic League and we have the chance to make the last 32 but meet a team who are having a fantastic season in the Wessex League. They were top of the table when last season when Covid brought the season to a premature end and they have carried on where they left off last season and at the time of writing sit 3rd in their league where they are unbeaten in 19 games.

As well as welcoming all from Hamworthy to this afternoon's game, as with the Torpoint game in the last round, it is also a warm welcome to a number of our sponsors who will be in attendance at the game this afternoon. I understand that representatives from the Red Lion Cricklade, Catalent, Interprint and Easy Financial Services are all scheduled to be with us this afternoon and we hope they enjoy today's game and are witnesses even more history being made by Sam and the lads.

Last Saturday we picked up three vital league points with a hard fought 4-3 win over Longlevens AFC. Our record against

Longlevens is a good one and that continued on Saturday and was the first occasion this season we have beaten someone in the top half of the league table. Hopefully this is the start of a much better run in the league, enabling us to climb the table. A match report from that game against Longlevens is included in today's programme.

Development Team

The Development Team were without a game last week but return to action this afternoon with a trip to a struggling Ludgershall Sports side. Whilst Ludgershall are down the bottom end of the table they have picked up in recent weeks and Steve Yeardley's side cannot afford to be complacent this afternoon. Hopefully they will return this evening with all three points to stay in touch with leaders Pewsey Vale at the top of the table.

Ladies Team

The Ladies team fell to another defeat on Sunday, their third defeat on the spin and will be keen to end their run of defeats tomorrow when they entertain Marine Academy Plymouth here at the Gerard Buxton Ground.

Under 18s

The Under 18s finally saw their unbeaten start in the league come to an end when they were beaten by Melksham. Hopefully Nick Warren's side return to winning ways on Thursday against Calne Town.

FA Vase 3rd Round Preview

Royal Wootton Bassett Town have the benefit of playing at home as they enter unchartered territory in the Buildbase FA Vase, having been paired with Hamworthy United in the competition's third round.

The fixture will be the fourth tie Bassett have hosted during their club record-breaking Vase run. In addition to the 2-0 triumph against Torpoint Athletic that sealed Bassett's passage through to the third round, Sam Collier's side have also seen off Knaphill (1-0) and Downton (4-0) when playing in familiar surroundings. Their only away fixture so far was the second qualifying round trip to Portishead Town, which was won 3-1.

In contrast, Wessex League Premier Division outfit Hamworthy have had to battle their way to wins on the road throughout this season's competition. And they'll have to do so again if they are to reach the last 32 for the second time in their history (their only previous fourth round appearance having been in 2018-19).

Entering at the second qualifying round stage, Hamworthy edged out Bassett's Hellenic League Premier Division rivals Corsham Town on penalties after the tie finished 1-1 at the end of normal time. They won on penalties again in the first round, defeating Western League Premier Division side Cadbury Heath after another 1-1 draw. Hamworthy then squeezed past Andover New Street of Wessex League Division One by the odd goal in three to set up their tie with Bassett.

The Hammers' success in the Vase this year has built on that which they have enjoyed in the league and Emirates FA Cup in what has been a hugely impressive campaign so far.

In the FA Cup, victories on the road against Brockenhurst and Westbury United set up a plum tie away at Southern League Premier Division South Merthyr Town. And after a 0-0 draw in south Wales, Hamworthy triumphed 2-0 against their step three opponents in the replay. Hamworthy's superb run was then brought to an end in the second qualifying round – the fourth time they had reached that stage – with a 3-1 loss at Cirencester Town.

Meanwhile, in the league Hamworthy have tasted defeat just once, winning 13 and drawing five of the nineteen games they have played to date – a record that sees them currently sitting in third in the Wessex League Premier Division with a great chance of reaching the summit if they win their games in hand.

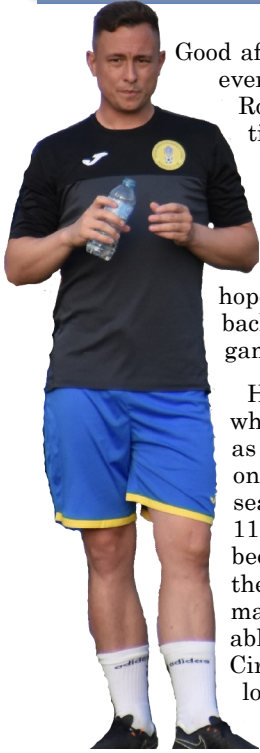
They will therefore represent formidable opponents for Sam Collier's side. But at this stage of the Vase, quality opposition is to be expected.

Bassett can take some inspiration though from the fact that they prevailed 1-0 in the only previous meeting between the teams. That came in the FA Cup Preliminary Round in the 2012-13 season, with Mark Barnes scoring the only goal of a tense Friday night battle at Rylands Way. A report from the game can be read in today's programme.

Bassett's win that night formed part of a record run of its own as Dave Turner's team wound up advancing to the second qualifying round of that season's FA Cup.

Fingers crossed that the second-ever meeting between the sides will serve a similar role in helping Bassett on their way to another record.

From The Gaffer



Good afternoon and welcome to everyone for today's 3rd Round Vase tie, the first time in the club's history we have reached this stage, I would also like to give a special welcome to all involved with Hamworthy FC. I hope you all have a safe trip back to Poole after the game.

Hamworthy are a side who you can only describe as "flying" having lost just one league game this season and conceding just 11 goals in total. I have been able to go and watch them since the draw was made and also have been able to gather reports from Cirencester whom they lost to in the FA Cup 3-1.

Make no mistake about today we are in for a real challenge and it will be for the first time in the Vase this season we go into the game as underdogs.

Last week we got back to league winning ways with a very end to end game against Longlevens, securing a 4-3 win. Although I wasn't delighted with the display, I was pleased how we reacted to going 2-1 down and came back to win. I feel a month ago we would have lost that game. The lads

showed a great work ethic and togetherness to get the three points and it pulled us away from the bottom six or seven and gives us a chance to target the top ten.

It is very pleasing for us to be the only club left in the Vase from the Hellenic League, and we have received some very nice messages of support from rival clubs within the league, which is a nice touch. The marketing team at the club have worked so hard to promote this game and get as much support for the team as possible, which I can ensure you go a long way with myself, Bully and the players.

This is the second year running we have been successful in FA competitions and it does wonders for the club on and off the field and brings a lot of people together, not to mention revenue for the club. It's a real honour to have broken a record for the club after matching the club's FA Cup run last season. So to go one step further this season is great. However we are not ready for it to end yet. As I am sure Hamworthy are also not.

Thank you for everyone who has made the effort in the cold today and for cheering us on, it is a huge support and gives us a real push to be successful..

Regardless of the outcome, this afternoon's Buildbase FA Vase third round contest against Hamworthy United marks a special occasion in the history of Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club.

Since first entering in the 2000-01 season, the FA Vase is a competition in which Bassett have lacked much notable success. There have been three runs to the second round, although for most clubs making the last 128 would seem a rather modest accomplishment. Aside from those limited achievements, the club's participation in the Vase has been littered with disappointments.

Bassett's Vase debut was actually a success, with a dramatic 3-2 extra time win recorded in a feisty contest against local rivals Calne Town in September 2001. While Bassett went out in their subsequent tie, that too was an afternoon to remember with the travelling support from Cornish side St Blazey – who were 2-0 winners – contributing towards a carnival-type atmosphere at Rylands Way.

That debut 2001-02 campaign would be all that Bassett had to enjoy about the Vase for a long time though as in the six seasons that followed the club were eliminated at the first hurdle. There were a pair of narrow defeats in replays against Christchurch and Shrewton United in the 2005-06 and 2006-07 season – with both ties producing plenty of drama and excitement. But heavy losses were the norm, with these being suffered away against Shortwood United (2002-03), Bemerton Heath Harlequins (2003-04), Wellington (2004-05) and, worst of all, Bournemouth (2007-08).

Dave Turner's first year as manager eventually saw Bassett break out their Vase slump. The 2008-09 season brought away wins at Buckingham Athletic and Henley Town before an upset victory against then step five Kidlington sealed progress to the second round for the first time ever. Although Bassett were convincingly beaten away at previous Vase winners Wimborne Town, it was at least some relief to finally have made some progress in the competition.

It would take another nine seasons to get to that stage again though.

Losses by the odd goal against Hamble ASSC and Cadbury Heath followed (the latter

coming after a comfortable triumph against Devizes Town). But the 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14 campaigns saw Bassett revert to type. In defeats against Shortwood United, GE Hamble (formerly Hamble ASSC) and Odd Down, Bassett conceded 17 goals without scoring once.

Under Paul Braithwaite, Bassett finally recorded wins in the Vase in consecutive seasons. And both were impressive, Cove being beaten on the road in 2014-15 and league rivals Binfield being ousted in a 2015-16 replay. Yet, single goal defeats were suffered in the following round in both years. Then in 2016-17, Bassett were second best against fellow Hellenic League side Thame United.

2017-18 would prove to be the year that the club finally recorded some more success in the Vase. Fairford Town were beaten under the Friday night lights before wins against Codicote and Ampthill Town saw Bassett through to the second round. That's where Bassett shot themselves in the foot though as ill-discipline cost the team despite a valiant effort on a midweek visit to Horndean.

After two seasons in which Bassett failed to advance beyond the qualifying rounds with defeats against Wessex League outfits Bashley and Tadley Calleva (the latter following a blowout win against New College), last season saw the club again threat to go on an extended run. The 1-0 win at Stonehouse Town may not have been that impressive, but Sam Collier's side then swept aside Camelford. But, despite a comeback attempt, the second round proved again to be Bassett's limit as Bridgwater Town narrowly prevailed one year and one week ago.

Finally, this season has seen progress achieved (at least) one stage further. Never before have Bassett been where they stand this afternoon: in round three, the last 64, with an opportunity to progress to a stage of the competition that potentially allows for a matchup with a team from a part of the country that the club would never likely meet. Round five is then where the Vase becomes a fully national competition draw.

History has already been made on this record-breaking run. Here's hoping this afternoon sees the club write some more.

Max Wilcock **Forward** Max, also referred to as 'Rhino', is as strong as his nickname suggest. Max has many facets to his game; he can hold the ball up and he can run in beyond. Another welcome addition to the squad.

Opponents History

A team was first formed in the 1890's called Hamworthy St Michael's, winning their first trophy the Whitehead Minor Cup in the 1899-1900 season. Hamworthy Football Club was formed in 1926, and moved to the present ground The County Ground (formally known as The Nursery) in 1950. Hamworthy United Football Club was formed from a merger between Hamworthy F.C. and Trinidad Old Boys F.C. in 1970-71 after missing the 1969-70 season in the Dorset Combination League due to administration problems. The County Ground was renamed the Specsavers County Ground by the Dorset County Football Association the leaseholders in 2018.

Hamworthy United first team have been members of the Sydenhams Wessex League Premier Division since winning promotion at the start of the 2004-5 season from the Dorset Premier League. The Hammer's second team were promoted from the Dorset First Division at the end of the 2004-5 to play in the Dorset Premier League. They dropped out of that league at the end of the 2017-18 season with the intention of entering a development team in its place in the Wyvern League. Due to a last minute complication, they were unable to do so until the start of the 2019-2020 when they joined the Wyvern (Western) Division.

Hamworthy had an Under 18 team in the Dorset Youth League since its formation until they unfortunately had to withdraw it in 2009 due to managerial problems, but they were able to reform in time for the 2010-11 season. With Chairman Steve Harvey and his new Board of Directors keen to see Hamworthy United develop their own talent an Under 16 team was started in 2018 followed by an Under 15 team in 2019.

Hamworthy United has had great success at all levels over the years in various competitions. After winning the Dorset Combination/Dorset Premier League two years running they were promoted in the 2004-5 Season to Wessex League Division 1. Hamworthy won the Wessex League Cup in their first season beating Thatcham Town in the final at Christchurch. They reached the

final again in the 2008-9 season, but this time lost to VTFC 2-1 after a very close contest. The Hammers won the Dorset Combination Cup in the 1997/1998 season against Wareham Town, and the Dorset Senior Cup in the 2005-6 season against Poole Town. Hamworthy lost to Eastleigh Town in the 2nd Qualifying Round of the FA Cup in the 2007-8 and went out to Basingstoke Town at the same stage in 2008-9. Hamworthy have had several good runs in the FA Vase one of their best being in the 2008-9 when they got as far as the 3rd Qualifying Round where they lost to Hungerford. The Hammers once again reached the Final of the Dorset Senior Cup in 2013-14 when managed by Graham Kemp, but lost it 2-0 to Poole Town. They again reached the 2nd Qualifying Round of the FA Cup in 2015-16 this time going out to two late goals scored by the much higher ranked Bideford. In 2018-19 United got as far as the 4th Qualifying Round (down to the last 32) in the FA Vase, but just lost out to Willand Rovers away at their ground 1-0.

With the management of Tim Sills and Chris Senior as his number two in their third year in charge, we saw them head up a winning team to lift the 2020-21 Wessex League Cup. This 2021-22 season they are determined to repeat and continue where they left off in the previous Covid hit season where the squad were top of the Wessex League at that time at the time the season was brought to a premature end.

The Reserves over the years had their share of successes, which was not an easy thing playing mainly against other clubs' first teams. They won the Dorset Division 1 Cup twice in 1992, and 1999. They also won promotion to the Dorset Premier League at the end of the 2004-5 season. In 2008 the Hammers second team beat Portland Reserves to win the Dorset Senior Trophy. As previously stated at the end of the 2017-18 season the decision was made to withdraw the Reserve team from the Dorset Premier League. The Reserves have now re-entered the Dorset Premier League again for the Season 2021-22.

The Under 18s have also won several honours over the years winning both the league and the Dorset Youth Cup in the 1987-8 season. They were the Dorset Youth Division 2 Champions in the 2003-4, and again won the Cup in season 2004-5, 2006-7, 2012-13, and 2014-15. They also won the Division 1 title and the League Cup in 2014-15 making it their most successful season to date. In 2007-8 the Southwest Youth League team won promotion to the First Division but declined to go up due to the extra cost of travelling involved. The Sunday side in their first and only season 2008-9 won the Dorset Sunday First Division. 2021-22 Season sees them under the name of Hamworthy United Wessex playing in the Sunday Hampshire Division 1 League.

Hamworthy United Football Club, after years of playing on an exceedingly difficult pitch, with very limited facilities and resources, saw things begin to change when the Dorset

County FA decided to upgrade the ground in 2016. This included a new 3G all weather artificial pitch as well as new floodlights and surrounds. Shortly afterwards the club received the news that due to the generous legacy of Hamworthy stalwart Stan Wallis and his wife Betty, together with a grant from the Football Stadia Foundation Fund, meant that they finally would be able to double the size of the clubhouse and bar to generate more income. Harry Redknapp performed the opening ceremony of the clubhouse in October 2017 followed by a match between Hamworthy United and a Dorset Representative Team. Other changes at that time saw the club become a limited company headed by the late Steve Harvey as Chairman. Hamworthy Utd now have a new set of Directors including the Club President Bruce Scammell and with the new Chairman Steve Mitchener spear heading what hopes to be a great future and season ahead for Hamworthy United Football Club.

Last Meeting at GBSG Rylands Way

Wootton Bassett Town hopefully won't be playing too much longer at Rylands Way. But when the club does move on to pastures new, there's no doubt that they will miss the transformative effect the ground seems to consistently supply to Bassett when faced with a game of magnitude.

More often than not Bassett have risen to the occasion when granted a home tie in the FA Cup. Upset victories against Highworth Town and then-Southern League Bracknell Town saw Paul Burke's team reach the First Qualifying round for the first time in the club's history. Since assuming the hotseat, Dave Turner has tasted similar glory at home with heroic displays resulting in triumphs against Bradford Town and, most recently, Calne Town.

That latter win set up the prospect of a visit from Hamworthy United; a team plying their trade in a league whose sides have constantly had Bassett's number. For the cynics this could mean only one thing: Bassett's elimination.

But that home advantage, the one which has so often seen the hosts fight off the underdog tag, spurred Turner's team onto another stirring victory as Mark Barnes' solitary goal and a colossal team display booked Bassett's passage through.

From the off the home side matched, and bettered in long patches, their Dorset visitors. And an early impression was made on seven minutes. Jack Ellis found space on the right wing, delivering a testing cross that forced €keeper Shane Murphy to challenge for the ball near the edge of his box. Under pressure from Barnes he spilled the ball and Bassett's in-form forward was gifted with the easiest of tap-ins.

Rattled, Hamworthy found themselves susceptible to the break and it would have been two on 18 minutes had Barnes been able to get the ball out of his feet and square to Shaun Terry with the visiting defence stretched. Matt Bown then almost doubled the advantage on the half hour. Going for the spectacular, his dipping half volley from in excess of thirty yards had Murphy scrambling and eventually relieved to see the ball sail inches over the bar.

Eventually the visitors were able to settle. For the remainder of the half they looked likeliest to score too. Highly impressive youngster Stefan Penny was pulling the string in the centre of midfield, while forwards Sam Pekun and Liam Murrell both caused problems with their pace and power.

When the latter was scythed down by Craig Bowden on the edge of the area the visitors were afforded a golden opportunity to equalise. Stuart Cannie's firmly struck free kick had James Domm beaten, but the hosts retained their lead as the ball smashed against the bar.

Ellis then had a half chance to extend Bassett's lead, forcing a save from Murphy after a swift counter. But Hamworthy appeared more decisive on the break. Seven minutes before half time Aaron Corby surged down the right, creating enough room so that Matt Bown's sliding tackle could only shift the ball into the path of Pekun. Lurking inside the box, the forward sent a snap shot towards goal that forced a fine parry behind from Domm.

Following the restart Bassett forced Hamworthy onto the back-foot. The quickness with which defence was turned into attack enabled the home side to get in behind the visiting defence. In the 47th minute Bown's delicious cross from the left was met with a powerful Terry header that almost found the bottom corner before the veteran forward saw a powerful effort blocked when a simple square ball to Barnes would have gifted his partner a one-on-one opportunity.

Unable to extend their advantage, there was plenty still to do at the other end. Ceding more and more possession, Bassett were backed up ever deeper in their own half. Luckily, however, imperious defending – particularly from centre half Liam Edmondson – helped limit Hamworthy to two headed efforts, which Ross Hampton-Brown and Murrell both saw narrowly miss the target.

Able to stave off the threat, with less than ten minutes to go Barnes was presented with a perfect chance to kill the game off. An innocuous clearance should have been dealt with by Murphy, but he once again saw the slick ball slip from his clutches on the edge of the area. Bassett's leading scorer hurried his finish though, skewing his first time shot well wide despite the open goal in front of him.

This helped make the game's final moments feel like an eternity. On 85 minutes, patient build up play down the left helped fashion an opening but Hampton-Brown's teasing cross went across the face of goal without the necessary touch. In injury time Domm was forced to parry at Ryan Murray's feet before an unmarked Murrell headed wide from twelve yards.

The final whistle soon brought relief and the sense that a fabulous performance had got its due reward.

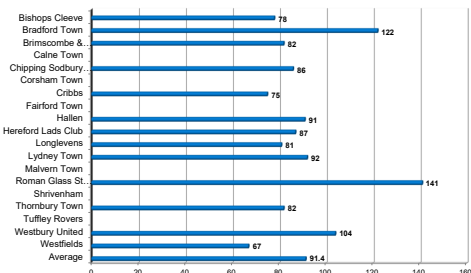

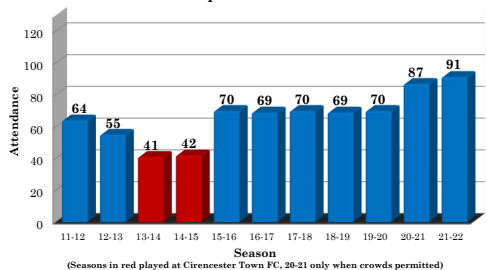

THE NON-LEAGUE PAPER

ESSENTIAL READING FOR FOLLOWERS OF THE NATIONAL GAME



MANY football supporters hope their favourite Christmas present arrives on Boxing Day – in the shape of three points.

Two Non-League sides Sheffield FC and Hallam FC – the world's oldest and second oldest clubs – are the reason the game is played over the festive period.

Hallam hosted their neighbours in the first ever inter-club match on Boxing Day 1860, also known as St Stephen's Day.

The Football League helped continue the tradition in their inaugural 22-game season in 1888-89 when Preston North End defeated Derby County 5-0 on December 26th.

The ceasefires during World War I, particularly on Christmas Day in 1914 when British and German troops played football together, are also said to have strengthened the game's festive legacy.

Matches were even played on December 25th until 1965 when Blackburn beat Blackpool 1-0 in the First Division and Coventry beat Wrexham 5-3 in the Third.

In 1913, Liverpool beat Manchester City 4-2 on Christmas Day, lost the return game 1-0 on Boxing Day, before drawing 3-3 at home with Blackburn Rovers the next day!

In Europe, it is common to have a winter break over the festive period. The Premier League has recently introduced a winter break which this season takes place in January.

The top-flight has maintained its Boxing Day fixture schedule as has the Football League – but the picture is slightly different within Non-League.

The National League, North and South will play on Sunday, December 26th this year and then on Tuesday 28th before playing again on Sunday, January 2nd.

The Isthmian League, Northern Premier League and Southern League – at Steps 3 and 4 – will not play on Boxing Day, competing on Monday, December 27th instead.

They will, however, play on New Year's Day and then on the Bank Holiday Monday, January 3rd.

With the majority of clubs at Steps 3 and 4 part-

time, and given the difficulties faced over the past two seasons, having a Boxing Day off seems a sensible decision.

Clubs at these levels and below rely on volunteers with players and managers balancing their playing commitments with full-time work.

The differing schedules across the National League System will be welcome news to groundhoppers too, who will almost be able to watch a match-a-day during the winter period, while crowd sizes are likely to receive the usual boost with matches taking place on Bank Holidays.

It wouldn't feel right if Boxing Day football was completely abandoned but it's a good move from leagues to be looking after those who keep the game going.

First Team Match Report

Royal Wootton Bassett Town finally registered a victory against a side in the top half of the Hellenic League Premier Division as they edged out Longlevens in a thrilling seven goal encounter at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground.

In a wide open, back and forth contest that featured three changes of lead, Bassett eventually wound up on top as four different scorers found the net.

It certainly was not a game that either defence will look back on with too much pride. But, at least for the neutral, it offered cracking entertainment on a frigid December afternoon.

The tone of the game was set in the opening quarter of an hour when both sides registered - and were also perhaps frustrated not to have scored more than one.

After Matt Bennett had squandered a one-on-one opportunity on six minutes, the forward redeemed himself by playing an importantly role in the hosts' opener shortly after. Following an incisive counter the forward raced toward goal only to see his attempted square ball to an unmarked John Mills blocked. Bailey Gallagher was there to pick up the pieces though. And he passed to Mills who shuffled a square pass to Tommy Ouldrige on the right edge of the box which the winger fired into the top left corner with an unstoppable drive.

Bassett's lead did not last long though. From the kick off Longlevens proceeded to win a corner. Delivered by Shaun O'Connor, the set piece was met at the

near post by Rudi McKinnon, who placed a firm header beyond Eddie Cavanagh.

Both sides subsequently fashioned numerous chances from which they came close to grabbing the lead.

Seeming more fluent in attack, the visitors appeared to edge matters, with the dangerous Brad Martin first forcing Cavanagh to parry before firing narrowly over after a last ditch tackle had prevent McKinnon from netting his second.

At the other end, Mills floated in a free kick that Will Davidson steered narrowly over before the forward crashed a set piece that appeared destined for the top corner off the bar.

It was then Longlevens' turn to find the woodwork as O'Connor's thirty yard drive rattled the bar.

Despite the myriad opportunities being created, it appeared as though the teams were set to go into the interval all square. Especially so after Bassett were denied a seemingly stonewall penalty when Ouldrige was tripped in the box on the stroke of half time.

But, launching a swift counter as Bassett appealed in vain, the visitors edged in front. McKinnon was denied, but the loose ball broke for James Sunley who tapped in.

However once play resumed it did not take long for Bassett to restore parity. Having survived a scare when an unmarked Dave Merrick dragged wide, the hosts quickly went up the other end where Chris Taylor's deft through ball unlocked the Longlevens defence and Gallagher coolly slotted home.

Bassett then went ahead for the second time on the hour. Mills swung in a sumptuous free kick from deep on the left side and defender Davidson was on hand at the far post to stab home a first time effort.

Again, it did not take long for a lead to evaporate. With 65 minutes on the clock O'Connor poked forward a seeming innocuous pass. It fell to the tricky Sunley and after a give-and-go with Merrick on the edge of the box he provided the simplest of finishes for his second of the afternoon.

As quickly as that goal arrived though, another followed. And it proved to be the decisive strike. Michael Miller hoisted a ball forward into the Longlevens penalty area and Bennett was unceremoniously bumped to the ground by 'keeper Kane Winman. This time there could be no doubts about it being a penalty and the veteran Chris Taylor held his nerve, picking out the bottom left corner.

A quarter of the game still remained and on the basis of what had come before it was still anyone's guess as to how this topsy-turvy encounter would finish.

Indeed both sides were intent on grabbing another goal.



Bassett felt they were denied a clear chance at a fifth when Bennett was hauled down by last defender Ollie Long on the edge of the box. It seemed like a clear foul that would have merited the Longlevens man a red card - but not even a free kick was given.

At the other ends, a half cleared corner fell for O'Connor who forced Cavanagh to parry away. Then with ten minutes remaining Sunley came within a matter of inches from completing a hat trick as he headed narrowly wide from a Long cross.

That would prove to be the last real opportunity of the match as Bassett held on for an important, hard-earned league win.

Man of the Match: John Mills - the forward may not have got on the scoresheet (although he was a matter of inches away from doing so), but he was an important factor in Bassett's win, providing two crucial assists. The set piece delivery for Will Davidson's goal in particular was sublime.

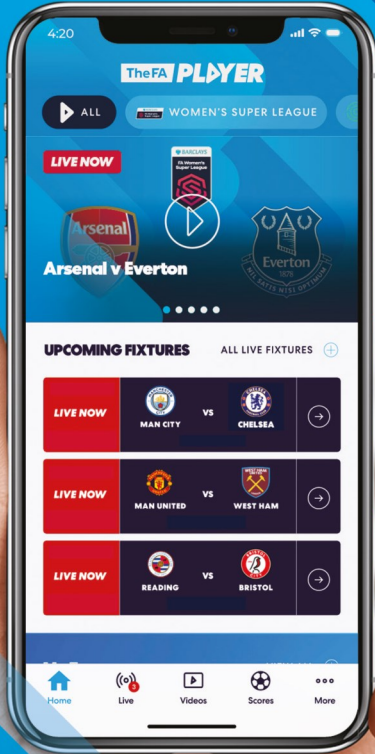
