Today's Game

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup Second Round tie against near neighbours Shrivenham. All the games in this round are local derbies with the draw being fixed to try and attract big crowds for what is Non League Day. A warm welcome to all the players, management team, committee and spectators from Shrivenham who have made the short journey across town for this cup fixture. We are one week into our 'Spring Break' from league action, our next league game now being on Good Friday when today's visitors return to the Gerard Buxton Ground as we seek to complete the league fixture at the third attempt. This is followed by the Ground Hop game against Corsham Town two days later on Easter Sunday.

Whilst today is designated Non League Day the final two league games are also designated games. The game on Good Friday has been designated a "Kick It Out" fixture as we support the campaign to irradiate racism from the game, whilst the game on Easter Sunday has been designated a "Her Game Too" fixture, which could be interesting given the anticipated make-up of the crowd with it being a Ground Hop game.

Getting back to today's game, Shrivenham come to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground on the back of a tough run that has seen them go 12 games without a win, it would have been 13 if the fog had not descended causing the postponement of our league game here. After a decent performance last Saturday which saw them lose by the odd goal at Malvern Town they got a bit of a tanking in midweek as Bishops Cleeve secured the title with a 11-2 win. No doubt Shrivenham will be smarting from that result and we can expect a reaction from them this afternoon and we will need to be at our best to secure the win.

This week we heard the sad news that Chris Kirkland had passed away. Chris did so much for the community of Wootton Bassett, particularly the football club, and a tribute to this truly inspirational man is included in today's programme. Our thoughts are with wife Maureen and family at this sad time.

Ladies Management

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies manager Graham Fletcher has informed the club that he intends to stand down from his position, with the club accepting his resignation.

Fletcher took over the role in November 2020 after the departures of Jonny House and James Goddard. Taking over in difficult circumstances, which were made even tougher by the pandemic and the suspension of football activities imposed shortly after his appointment, Fletcher guided the team through a series of friendlies at the end of the 2020-21 season before overseeing the side's 2021-22 South West Regional Women's Football League Premier Division campaign.

In the club's first full season at tier five of the women's football pyramid, Bassett won seven, drew one and lost ten of their eighteen matches and are on course to finish between the fifth and seventh place, depending on the results of Forest Green Rovers' and Bishop Lydeard's outstanding fixtures.

Reflecting on his time as manager, Fletcher said: "It has been a real privilege to manage and coach the players. Their commitment has been fantastic, and I would like to thank them for everything they have done this season."

"I'd also like to thank the staff involved and to thank Royal Wootton Bassett Town for the opportunity to manage the team – I wish the club every success in the future."

Chris Kirkland



It is with great sadness to learn of the news that Chris Kirkland passed away last Wednesday.

A hugely popular, inspirational figure, Chris made a remarkable

contribution to sporting life in Royal Wootton Bassett and the wider community thanks to his infectious enthusiasm, passion for sport and a generosity of spirit that knew no ends.

It is certainly the case that Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC would not be the club that it is today without Chris.

Most notable of all, Chris established the Holland Tour while a teacher at Wootton Bassett School – which he served with distinction for close to two and a half decades working as a geography teacher and Deputy Headteacher. Chris organised the first tour to Holland in 1988. The tours then became an annual event and, since 2002, have been organised through our club. For all those fortunate to have been able to take part, whether through the school or the club, the Holland Tours represent the most cherished memories of youth football and ones that will last a lifetime. Thanks to Chris' efforts and the links that have been forged with the likes of SV Loosduinen, FC 's-Gravenzande, FC Dordrecht, EBOH and SC Monster among others, strong, enduring friendships have been made with those at the clubs that we have visited over the years.

In addition to the Holland Tours, the Community Football programme that Chris ran for many years in the town helped develop a vast number of players

and enabled the club to establish and grow its youth section in the late 1990s and early 2000s. Indeed, most players who featured for the club's youth teams in those years acquired their first formal experience of learning how to play football at the Community Football sessions and soccer fun weeks that Chris organised. As a result, many within this generation affectionately knew Chris as 'Football Grandad'. The Community Football programme offered opportunities for a number of volunteers to gain experience coaching too, among them former first team managers Pete Yeardley and Paul Burke, current Development team manager Steve Yeardley and numerous individuals who have played in the club's youth section.

Chris also organised summer youth tournaments, the template for which the club adopted in 2001. And over the next decade our club's six-a-side event grew into one of the leading, most popular tournaments held in Wiltshire.

It is not just the football club who have benefited from Chris' tireless efforts and generosity over the years though. Through initiatives such as the Mad March Hare Fun Run and the sporting dinners that he organised as well as the numerous marathons which he completed, Chris helped raise significant funds for the town's schools, sports clubs and other worthy causes in the local area. Chris was also a passionate supporter of Swindon Town, volunteering as a steward and turnstile operator at the County Ground for a number of years. After moving to the south coast in order to be near to his daughters and beloved grandchildren, Chris then volunteered as a coach and on matchdays at Portsmouth FC.

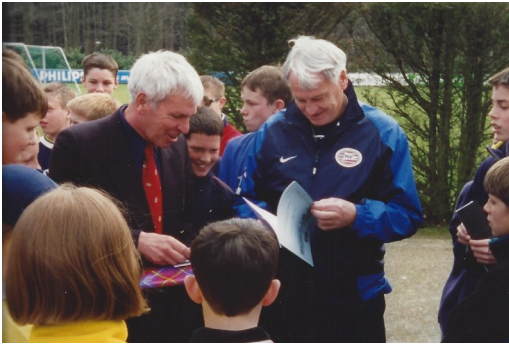
Through all that he has done, Chris' efforts helped in more than just a material way, as he was a true champion of the idea of sport for all. Chris was a keen supporter of girls and women's football. More broadly, he made sure that there were opportunities to play and learn the beautiful game for all young players regardless of their ability. Seeing sport – and football in particular – as a way to help develop life skills, the only things that Chris insisted on when you played were that you had fun and, most importantly, demonstrated a good attitude, commitment and effort. Chris lived by example too – and this was particularly evident in the way that even during his

final months he would don his sports kit and go for a daily run.

A hugely inspirational figure, all at Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club mourn Chris' passing. However, we will forever remember the person that he was and the legacy that he leaves.

Our thoughts at this difficult time are with Chris' wife Maureen and all his family and friends.

Thank you, Chris, for everything that you have done for our club, our community and our sport.

Good afternoon and welcome everyone to yet another meeting with us and local rivals Shrivenham this season, with another still to come. It feels very strange starting a cup competition in the middle of May with two games of the league season still to go, but we can not be shocked with anything that the Hellenic league throw at us. I hope all from Shrivenham enjoy the visit and game. Some very good people behind the scenes at Shrivenham and we wish them well.

Shrivenham come here off the back off a big defeat away on Tuesday to newly crowd champions Bishops Cleeve. Although the result must have hurt

the management and players, I feel it was never going to be a positive outcome with what they were up against and Cleeve needing a point on the night and it being the first game under the lights back at their redeveloped ground. Today's cup brings a chance for us to try a few things and start planning for next season, we have signed a few of the Under 18s this week after seeing and hearing good things about them along with watching a few in the Dev team last Saturday away to Wroughton, Another massive win was picked up by Dip and his team on what wasn't an easy surface as we all know at the Weir Field.

I think we can all agree that the best team has now won this league in Bishops Cleeve, we started our Hellenic league campaign away to them in August and I have to say that was close to the best we have played this season and drew 2-2, Having been 2-0 up and missed great chances it still felt like a great point. We also ran them very close here for the return leg. Well done to everyone at Cleeve.

This week we had some very sad news as a club with the passing of Chris Kirkland. I knew Chris from my days working as Groundsman at Swindon Town and having held many conversations with him and hearing him tell me what I was doing wrong. He had a fantastic outlook on life and was always bright and bubbly and had a huge smile on his face. You could always hear his laugh over the mower too. Chris had a huge connection with the club before my time and I know he did a huge amount for the club and its youth over the years. Rest well Mr K.

I hope you all enjoy the game and I strongly recommend that you try the Chicken Pie at half time!

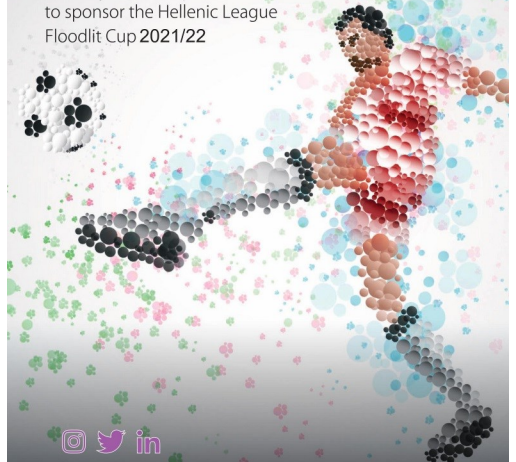

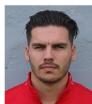

CLUB HISTORY

Shrivenham Football Club was formed in 1900 and just eight years later the infant club became one of the founder members of the North Berks League. Success in the early years was hard to find however, after winning the Second Division crown at the end of the 1994-95 campaign, two Division One Championships were to follow - in 1997-98 - a season which also included the club winning the Charity Shield, and again in 2000-01, which after completing the required ground improvements, saw the club promoted to UHlsport Hellenic League Division One West at the second time of asking.

With our inaugural Hellenic League season ending with a creditable twelfth placed finish, a period of building began and after gaining some stability in the league, a further title winning season followed in 2004-05 gaining the club promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division after we won the league by a single point in what was unarguably, at the time, the most amazing season the club had ever experienced. A club record breaking eighth place finish was recorded in 2007-08, however a gradual decline began and despite avoiding relegation after finishing bottom of the table in 2012-13, just two seasons later relegation was confirmed after a nineteenth placed finish and a decade of Hellenic Premier League football brought a tough era to an end.

Two seasons of mid-table mediocrity ensued, however the club appointed a new Chairman ahead of the 2017-18 campaign and the introduction of a new management team soon followed as the club began rebuilding its ambitions and the bid to return to the Hellenic Premier Division. That goal was achieved at the first attempt as an amazing 12-game unbeaten run to the end of the campaign, found the club in second place and in an exciting final day which saw promotion rivals Easington Sports in third place, needing a result at home and Shrivvy without a fixture, Sports suffered the heartache of defeat against a midtable Letcombe side, and Shrivvy clung on to gain promotion.

The rebuilding was set to continue, however pre-Christmas the club looked odds on favourites to be fighting relegation, before an amazing turn of fortune saw the side go on a seventeen-game unbeaten run, during which time they picked up fifteen wins and two draws, and catapulted the club up to a new record finish of fifth, come the end of the season. 2019-20 saw the side in 4th position in the standings when the season was curtailed early due to the Covid-19 pandemic and the off season saw manager Gareth Davies step down in order to take a break from the game and Chris Hurley was appointed as his successor shortly before the season was due to start.

With a makeshift squad, the club endured a difficult start but despite being in bottom spot by the time the season came to a halt due to the Covid pandemic, new faces had begun to arrive and things were looking up once again, however by the time pre-season arrived a lack of First XI players at the opening training session brought back memories of the previous campaign, and in a bid to continue moving forwards, Chris Hurley saw his time at Barrington Park come to a close. The club have now recruited the management duo of Robin Broadbank and Daniel Broadbank for the 2021-22.

Two first half John Mills goals and a seemingly commanding advantage going into the game's final quarter of an hour counted for nothing as Royal Wootton Bassett Town's home derby against Shrivenham was abandoned due to fog. It's the second time in a matter of weeks that Sam Collier's side have been frustrated in their desire to face Shrivenham – a team they are vying to complete a league double over and with which they are jockeying for position in the middle of the Hellenic League Premier Division pack.

Covid cases in the away camp had previously scuppered the prospects of the game being played on 27 December, its original date. Now, after being shoehorned into a midweek slot in mid-January despite requests for a more supporter friendly date to be chosen (the fixture is after all one between local rivals with Bassett having missed out on the above-average gate that a Christmas fixture would certainly have attracted), a new place in the teams' schedules will again have to be found. When that date eventually arrives – and here's hoping that when it comes there won't be any more issues affecting the ability of the game to be played – Bassett will be aiming to recreate the position they found themselves in prior to the referee halting proceedings.

Bassett's performance had by no means been a perfect one. Indeed, it was rather scruffy and they were fortunate not to have conceded at least once. Yet, a combination of Mills' ruthlessness in front of goal and their visitors' profligacy meant that it was enough to have staked out a clear lead by half time - and one that the hosts did not appear likely to relinquish. Shrivenham had made the better start on the night, though were unable to make anything of the chances they were able to muster. With Eddie Cavanagh hesitating to come off his line to collect a hopeful ball over the top, away forward Shane Hibbert had the best early opening as he crept in to lift an attempted lob over the 'keeper, but his effort lacked the required power and direction, allowing Macaulay Dodson to calmly avert the danger.

Bassett did eventually liven up and it took a save with the feet from visiting shotstopper

James Foster to keep out a Sam Packer header from John Mills' weighted corner.

Back at the other end, after Bassett failed to clear the lines the experienced Jonny Davoile unlocked the home defence with a perfectly placed through ball for Hibbert. But the forward again fluffed his lines when presented with just Cavanagh to beat, skewing a rushed shot wide of the left post.

Then with eight minutes to go before the break, Bassett were ahead. The goal came out of nothing, but was the product of two moments of quality. First, Adam Corcoran rose on the halfway line to meet a Foster clearance with a powerful header. Placed behind the Shrivenham backline, it was put in a perfect position for Mills to run onto and the forward took one touch before lifting a deft right footed lob over the advancing 'keeper.

The visitors should really have been back on level terms immediately from the restart though. Slack defending allowed the Bassett backline to be beaten by a ball over the top and an unmarked Hibbert was presented with his third golden opportunity of the half. However, he shot straight at Cavanagh from the edge of the box. After the rebound came straight back at him, Hibbert had a second bite at the cherry. This time he cut past the 'keeper, but pressure from Dodson deflected his weak follow up wide of the upright.

Having survived that let off, Bassett soon doubled their advantage. Packer slipped a pass to Mills on the left edge of the box and the forward cut inside his marker before squeezing a powerful low drive from twelve yards between the legs of an unsuspected Foster. By this point of the game, a mist had already descended. But that appeared to have lifted when the teams were back out for the second half. In front of goal there was little of note after the restart. The most notable action of a scrappy, untidy period occurred when the visitors' manager Dan Broadbank was sent off for his reaction to a firm, but seemingly fair Will Davidson challenge.

The pea souper soon returned and, at least for those watching, it became impossible to tell what was going on. Subsequently, a temporary suspension of play – in the seemingly futile hope that the fog would somehow lift – then became an abandonment with fourteen minutes to go. The match will therefore have to be replayed. Here's hoping it will be third time lucky when that comes around.

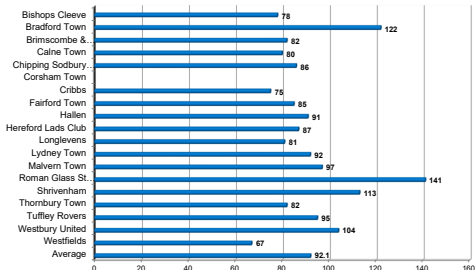

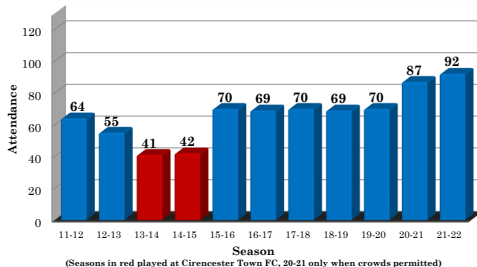

Royal Wootton Bassett Town sealed a season double over near neighbours Calne Town courtesy of an Alan Griffin winner ten minutes from time. Just as in the reverse fixture two and a half weeks ago, Sam Collier's side triumphed 2-1 against the Lilywhites in a tense derby battle.

Unlike in that first meeting between the teams though, it was Bassett who actually went ahead. Capping an early spell of dominance, Gio Wrona slid home from close range on the quarter hour mark to give the hosts the lead after Adam Corcoran had headed a John Mills free kick delivery from deep back across the face of goal.

One goal was all that Bassett would yield from that spell though. And Calne would be gifted an equaliser on 30 minutes. Seeking to play a square ball inside from his right back position, Macaulay Dodson's sloppy pass instead fell straight into the feet of Josh Bright. The Calne forward then twisted his way into the box before sending a low left-footed drive into the bottom corner.

Bassett certainly did not begrudge Bright getting a goal. Indeed, it's great to see him back playing at a high level mere months after suffering a cardiac arrest, which led to the rescheduling of this fixture from

November to mid-March. That Bright has recovered from such a scary incident is fantastic news - and that news is made even better by the fact he is now back to enjoying playing football. But Bassett will still be disappointed by the nature of the way in which they conceded.

After the teams went into the break level, the second half proceeded with neither side seeming able to find the magic touch needed to go ahead. Eventually though, Bassett struck with just over ten minutes remaining. Griffin started and ended the move. The veteran forward flicked an Eddie Cavanagh goal kick on to Alfie Presley before making his way towards the box. In the meantime, Presley fed Tommy Ouldrige with a reverse who in turn advanced into the left channel before setting out wide to Mills. Mills then arrowed a daisy-cutter of a delivery across the face of goal, and Griffin was on hand at the far post to steer in what ultimately proved to be another match-winning goal.

Calne did come close to equalising again with Charlie Norman heading onto the bar from an inswinging corner deep into stoppage time. Agonising as that may have been for Calne - who need every last point they can squeeze out of their remaining fixtures to steer clear of being in one of the second from bottom positions that could lead to relegation, for Bassett it came as a relief, preserving a vital three points in their battle for position and a club record points haul in the Hellenic League Premier Division.

This year is no different with various offers and special events taking place up and down the country.

Harrow Borough, for example, have dished out free tickets for their Isthmian Premier Division visit of Bowers & Pitsea to several local schools, and offered half-price entry for Premier League and EFL season ticket holders, as well as those attending the England v Switzerland game just down the road at Wembley later in the day.

It's free also for Under16s and to NHS and Emergency Service workers and the Armed Forces.

The majority of supporters reading this will have already caught the Non-League bug but you too can play your part.

By just bringing one friend, work colleague or member of the family you are spreading the word and helping your local football club to become a vital cog in the community wheel.

Veterans' County Cup Final

Friday 11th March 2022

Royal Wootton Bassett Town 3 Bradford Town 3 (Bradford win 6-5 on pens)

On a very wet Friday night at the Wiltshire FA's Green Lane Playing Fields headquarters, Royal Wootton Bassett Town and Bradford Town served up a fantastic game of football in the final of the Wiltshire FA's prestigious Veterans' County Cup. In the end penalties were needed to decide matters after the game finished all square at 3-3, with Bassett losing in heart-breaking fashion as Bradford edged a shootout that featured eighteen penalties, winning 6-5.

In a feat of attacking football, Bassett led through Jeremy Newton before a Steve Tweddle pair gave Bradford a half time lead. Newton grabbed two further goals in the second half to complete his hat trick - his third forcing the shootout after Paul Beavers had made it 3-2 to Bradford. Bradford's stand-in 'keeper Allan Clarke then proved to be the hero. Taking over the gloves after regular shot stopper Adam Sheppard was injured in his attempts to save Bassett's first spot kick, Clarke scored one of his side's penalties and proceeded to save the final Bassett attempt to give his side the trophy.

It was an agonising way for Bassett to lose as both sides had risen to the occasion to produce a classic of a cup final. But Bassett can hold their heads high after a phenomenal run to the final and an excellent effort in that deciding contest. And it's certainly the case that all involved will be able to look back at their runners-up medals with a sense of pride.

Bassett started the game brightly with the pace of Newton, Chris Head and Steve Shaw causing the Bradford back line problems. In the 5th minute Head was put through one-on-one with Sheppard but the 'keeper won this challenge, pulling off a great save with his feet to deny the striker. Bradford then went immediately up the other end, and when Tweddle went down in the box under a challenge there were big shouts for a penalty kick, but referee Chris Harris waved away the appeals. Moments later, Bradford's Ricky Trott went close to breaking the deadlock, his header from the edge of the six-yard box going just over the bar.

With all the early action, the large crowd did not have to wait long for the opening goal through. A quick break down the right-hand side and a neat passing interchange involving Bassett's pacey front three saw Head feed the ball into Shaw, who set up Newton to produce a smart finish from the edge of the box that completed a well-worked move.

Both teams continued to play football of a very high standard and Bradford got themselves back on level terms ten minutes before the half time break, Nick Ross firing in from the edge of the box for his seventh goal of the season. In a back and forth contest, Bassett went close to restoring their lead three minutes later as Dan Badman saw his shot hit the outside of the post. At the other end, it required a fingertip save from Nick Warren to keep the scores level as Bradford's two leading scorers Tweddle and Rhys Schell linked up. Tweddle played in Schell with a great pass and his strike partner hitting a powerful shot which Warren tipped over the bar in spectacular style.

Ultimately, Bradford were to go into the half time break with a slender lead. A cross into the box saw Warren unable to come up with the ball after a challenge with a Bradford player, and it fell to Tweddle in a central position just inside the 18-yard box and he smashed in an unstoppable

shot to give his side a 2-1 advantage. In the closing minute of the half Tweddle then had an opportunity to make it a first half hat trick, but - to Bassett's relief - this time he placed his shot just wide of the post.

The second half opened in a similar vein to the first period, with both sides playing some neat passing football. The better early chances in the half fell the way of Bradford though. Mark Canham went close with a free kick from just outside the 18-yard box, his shot just clearing the cross bar. Tweddle then had another chance to extend his side's lead, a cross from the right from Paul Beavers being headed back across goal to the forward but his shot went wide of the right-hand post.

Ten minutes from time Bassett went close to restoring parity with a Newton free kick. After arguing that the Bradford wall was not ten yards by pacing out the distance to the wall himself, Newton returned to the ball and quickly spun round, hitting a free kick which came back off the crossbar and was cleared to safety. Bassett were not to be denied for long though as two minutes later a ball into the Bradford box was won in the air by substitute Steve Howse. He headed it back to Newton, who drilled home from a central position on the edge of the box. The goal certainly lifted Bassett and Howse went close to getting a goal of his own, his powerful low shot being parried by Sheppard, who quickly claimed the ball at the second attempt to avert any further danger.

Once again it was end-to-end stuff as both teams went in search of a winner. Bradford thought they had secured it when a cross into the Bassett box saw Warren attempt to come out to claim the ball, but he was beaten to the punch by Beavers, who headed into the net for 3-2. However, it was not to be the winner as there was still time for one more twist in normal time in this dramatic game. Right at the end of the game Bassett were awarded a free kick just outside the 18-yard box. With two goals already there was only ever going to be one taker of the kick and up stepped Newton to curl a low shot around the wall and into the bottom corner of the net. Only seconds were left on the clock when the ball rippled the net, meaning penalty kicks would be needed to decide matters.

After a dramatic 50 minutes of action the penalty shoot-out that followed went close to matching what had gone on before, with a number of twists and turns before the game was ultimately decided. Bassett 'keeper Warren saved the first Bradford penalty. But Newton, having hit a hat-trick, then missed his side's penalty with Bradford shot stopper Sheppard injuring his shoulder as he dived to his left. It looked a serious injury and Sheppard was unable to carry on, with Clarke having to take over in goal after a delay whilst his teammate was treated. Both sides then scored their next two penalties to make it 2-2, with Head and Badman keeping their cool for Bassett.

The next set of kicks for each side were both missed though as Howse could only find the post. Warren then saved Bradford's fifth kick meaning Brady Lilley had a chance to win it. However, he was denied by a fine save from Clarke. Sudden death started with both teams scoring their first three kicks, with Shaw, Pete Wilson and Andrew Gibson on target for Bassett. Clarke, taking Bradford's ninth penalty, then put his team ahead before returning back between the posts to face Bassett's latest kick. And he ensured Bradford would win the cup, denying Martin Jefferies to finally bring an end to proceedings.

It was a tremendous effort from both teams - yet, in the end, heartache for Bassett. Congratulations go to Bradford for their victory and for playing their part in a contest that was a fantastic advert for veterans' football.
