Men's First Team Bassett Bulletin Welcome To Tonight's Game

GOOD EVENING and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Wantage Town. A warm welcome to all our visitors from Wantage who have made the short journey down the M4, we hope you enjoy your short stay with us this evening and we wish you a safe journey home.

Wantage include a number of former Royal Wootton Bassett Town players in their squad so it is a particular warm welcome back to the GBSG to Stephen Robertson, Mark Francis, Michael Miller, Harvey Scholes, Ben Lodge, Kyle Pitts and Sam Ockwell.

Last season Wantage Town were relegated from the Southern League after finishing bottom of Division 1 Central Division having been reprieved from such a fate in the first season impacted by Covid, when they also sat bottom of the table with just one win all season when Covid brought the season to a premature end. So far this season Wantage have won two, lost two and drawn one of their opening five league games and currently sit in 9th place in the table. They exited the FA Cup in the Extra Preliminary Round, beaten 4-1 by Bishops Cleeve but progressed in the FA Vase with a 1-0 win over Tytherington Rocks.

As you will read elsewhere in the programme tonight our record against Wantage Town is not a good one and the last time (and only time) we defeated Wantage here in a game at Bassett was at the start of the millennium when the Head of Senior Section and the two oldest members of the Bassett Ultras were playing for the First Team.

So the FA Cup dream is over for another season but we gave a good showing against Southern League Paulton Rovers on Saturday. Although academic now it would have been interesting to see how we would have got on with Luke Matthews in the side on Saturday as I suspect we would have defended set pieces into the box with Luke in the defence. With the FA Cup over and a while before the FA Vase kicks in for us we

will now concentrate on accumulating some more league points starting here tonight.

Matt Bennett recently made his 200th First Team appearance for the club and we missed highlighting it in the last programme so look to make that up today by featuring Matt on the front cover in what was his actual 200th appearance in the away game at Bradford Town. Congratulations to Matt on reaching this milestone as he becomes the second player after Adam Corcoran to have played over 200 games for the Royal Wootton Bassett Town First Team. Both still have some way to go to catch up the all team appearance record held by Stephen Yeardley that stands at 510.

The Development Side finally picked up their first point of the season on Saturday with a draw away to Shrewton United, never an easy place to visit. I understand young Jowan Partridge scored a wonder goal to put the Development side ahead but Shrewton got themselves back on level terms just before half time, with an element of controversy surrounding the goal according to coach Simpkins. Hopefully the Development side will be able to build on that with two winnable games against Salisbury FC Development and Stratton Juniors coming up in the next month along with a tough looking trip to Kintbury Rangers.

The Women's side finally got their league season under way last Sunday but unfortunately there was not to be a winning start for Simon Harrison's side. In a high scoring first half Bassett trailed 5-4 at the break, after having established a 2-0 lead early on and were unable to turn it around in the second half against Bristol Rovers, Rovers adding one more goal to their tally to make the final score 6-4. The Women's side will look to registered their first points on Sunday when they entertain Torquay United.

Enjoy the game tonight and hopefully a return to winning ways for Sam and the boys.

Our record against tonight's visitors does not make pretty reading with just four wins in 24 previous games between the two sides. Somewhat surprisingly there has never been a single drawn game in those previous 24 meetings.

We have also lost the last nine games between the two sides our last win coming back in September 2010.

We have also won just the one time at home against Wantage Town and that win came way back in January 2001 when goals from the current Head of the Senior Section Paul Davis and Lee Stoddart secured a 2-0 win. Also in the squad that day were two of the Bassett Ultras who will tonight spend much of the night behind the two goals we are attacking, Simon Green being in the starting line up for that last (and only) home win with Simon Jones on the bench as an unused substitute.

A very young Matt Bennett (pictured against Didcot in Season 2004-5) scored against Wantage back in September 2004 in a narrow 2-1 defeat Eighteen years later hopefully Matt can repeat that goal scoring feat with one or maybe two tonight.



Whilst for Royal Wootton Bassett Town as a whole cannot look back at games against Wantage Town with any fondness, at least manager Sam Collier can be excluded from that as the current manager scored both goals in a 2-1 success the last time we beat Wantage Town back in Season 2010-11.

Hopefully we can end the dismal run of results against Wantage here tonight and stop them making it ten wins in a row against us.



Opponents History WANTAGE TOWN

Wantage Town FC (the 'Alfredians', or 'Freds') can trace its roots back to 1877, but the established date of 1892 has long been given as the first time the club affiliated to the Berks & Bucks FA. They flitted between the Reading Temperance, Swindon & District, North Berks and Reading & District Leagues prior to the First World War, and the first silverware came in 1903-04 with winning the Swindon Advertiser Cup, a feat repeated in 1907-08 as well as becoming Swindon League Champions and the League Cup winners.

After the 1st World War, the Freds briefly played in the North Berks League, winning the North Berks Cup in 1920 and 1921 and the Championship in 1921-22. After a brief period playing in the Reading & District League with no success they then re-entered the Swindon & District League, winning the Division 2 title in 1931-32, and Division 1 in 1933-34. The Fifties was the most successful period for the Club, winning the S&DL Division 1 in 1952-53 (without losing a game) and the Premier Division in 1955-56, while in 1954-55, the Fred's won no fewer than five cup competitions, including the Berks & Bucks Intermediate Cup.

Since joining the Hellenic League in 1956, the Fred's have spent most of their seasons in the Premier Division, winning promotion from Division 1 on six occasions - as runners-up in 1969-70, 1987-88, 1991-92 (where they set a club record of 32 games unbeaten) and 1995-96, and as Champions in 1980-81 and 2003-4. The Reading Senior Cup was won for the first time in 1982-83

Season 2003/2004 was one of the Fred's most successful. The First Team won Division One East to regain its position in the Premier Division of the Hellenic, and the Reserves finished top of their league, also winning

promotion. In 2010-11, the Fred's won the Premier division title, but they were not promoted to the Southern League due to ground grading criteria not being achieved. In the 2012-2013 season, the club achieved the Southern League Ground grading, but finished runners-up to a very strong Marlow side, and again missed out on promotion.

In 2013-2014, the Fred's won the uhlsport Hellenic Premier title again, and this time with the appropriate ground grading in place, saw promotion to Division One (South and West) of the Southern League. The Fred's remained in the Southern League for 3 years, before seeing relegation back to the Hellenic League at the end of the 2016-17 season. In 2018-19, the Fred's won the uhlsport Hellenic Premier title for the third time and regained their place in the Southern League, this time in the Division 1 Central section. The Reading Senior Cup was won for a further two times, in 2017-18 and 2018-19

The following two seasons at the higher level were not completed due to the Covid-19 pandemic, but they finished bottom at the end of 2021-22 and were relegated back to the Hellenic.

Throughout the years the Club has worked to upgrade the facilities at Alfredian Park. Purchased outright for the princely sum of £500 in 1922; floodlights were introduced in 1996 and new stands in 2012. The club merged with the junior section to become one entity in 2020, and re-introduced a Women's team in 2015, meaning football is now offered from U7s through to adults for players of both genders. The club has a long lease on St Mary's field behind the club, use of the adjacent school and another site at field, Tugwell to accommodate the growing number of teams.





FA Cup Match Report 22-23 MEN'S FIRST TEAM

Paulton punish slack defending

Royal Wootton Bassett Town saw their hopes of extending their Emirates FA Cup run even further extinguished as a poor day at the office defensively enabled Paulton Rovers to triumph 4-2 in a hectic and entertaining first qualifying round tie.

While the Southern League Division One South side were deserved winners come full time, Bassett will be disappointed that they failed to spring an upset - or at least force a replay - with all four of the visitors' goals being in some way avoidable. A poor clearance gifted Paulton an equaliser midway through the opening period before Bassett conceded from three set pieces in the second half. In the end, Bassett were left with a sense of what could have been as they came up short in their attempts to equal the club's record run in the FA Cup for a second time in three seasons.

There was action right from the start as both teams should intent from the opening whistle. Ed Butcher narrowly missed the target twice in the opening three minutes for Paulton, while at the other end Jack Hobson-McVeigh saw a firm drive deflected over and Alfie Presley found the roof of the net with a cross-cum-shot.

It was Paulton who had a firmer grip on proceedings though and they should have been ahead on 18 minutes when Kyle Tooze beat the offside trap to race on to a ball into the right corner before teeing up strike partner Paulo Borges but he could only produce a weak shot on the turn from twelve yards that was straight at Matty Crowther.

Having passed up that golden opportunity, the visitors soon found themselves behind. Bailey Gallagher won a penalty as he beat Mircea llea to a Presley cross and was felled by the centre half. Chris Taylor's effort from the spot was comfortably parried by Aaron Sainsbury. However, Tommy Ouldridge was on hand to sweep home the rebound.

The goal came against the run of play but at least offered a platform from which Bassett could build. Instead the hosts' lead lasted all of five minutes. Adam Corcoran failed to clear, instead finding Butcher on the edge of the box and the lively midfielder confidently swept home into the bottom corner. Butcher could then have had two in minutes as Corcoran again played

the ball into his path. However he dragged his snap shot from close range straight at Crowther.

The game would then remain level up until the 65th minute. Until that point, the game fell into something of a lull - and that was not helped by the stop-start nature of the opening 15 minutes of the second half which yielded four bookings - three for the visitors - and saw Bassett forced into two changes as Taylor and Dave Bampton picked up knocks.

Those substitutions hurt Bassett, depriving them of experience and leadership at a crucial point in the game. And soon enough Bassett found themselves behind as Paulton scored a soft second. Tooze floated in a free kick from the left wing and llea - completely unmarked at the far post - scored with the simplest of headed goals.

A third soon arrived. Crowther produced a fine save to steer another Butcher effort around the post. But from the resulting corner, swung in by Nuno Felix, Ilea again found himself unmarked and coolly swept in from twelve yards. That goal initially seemed to sap Bassett's confidence. However Sam Collier's were soon gifted a lifeline as Matt Bennett seized upon a Martin error in the right corner, surged into the box and squared for substitute Luke Whelan, who found the net with a deft backheel.

Bassett were lifted and came close to an equaliser when Harrison Lea connected with a Hobson-McVeigh free kick, seeing his glancing header go narrowly over. Presley then arrowed a low drive narrowly wide of the left post after collecting Gio Wrona's diagonal ball and bursting past Felix.

There would ultimately be a sixth goal - but it came for Paulton in the last minute. Felix delivered another inswinging corner and substitute Dave O'Hare rose highest to head home at the near post. The Somerset side thus march on, while Bassett are left to stew over a brave cup effort that ended in disappointment.

The Non-League Paper FEMALE BOSSES



I USED to have a teacher at school called Mrs Parker.

She was hardly your archetypal role model - in fact she'd be amazed to think that I suggested so - but she understood me and was ultimately the reason I ended up in my dream job.

It was the kind of mutual respect that has followed me around my working life – particularly with female influencers. I've worked under two female editors and countless superiors and took a little bit from each one on my career path.

Last week, Tony Incenzo dedicated his Non-League Paper column to Rosi Webb, In charge of Eastern Counties League Division One South side Stanway Pegasus, she is the first permanent female manager of any team playing in the National League System from Steps 1 to 6.

And a jolly good job she's doing too, having recently overseen the club's promotion from the Essex & Suffolk Border League.

Rosi's twitter bio reads "Making my way in the Male game" - and she's built up quite an impeccable CV. She has been coaching for 15 years and has held the UEFA B licence for the last six.

She's certainly put in the hard yards but her success is also built on that kind of mutual respect that she has from the players and officials at Pegasus.

"I knew it would be a big challenge but it was a prospect I simply couldn't down," she said when asked about her arrival at the club three years ago.

"With Ian [Booth, club owner] as my assistant,

we make a good partnership and compliment each other on the management side.

"My experience within the men's game has been nothing but positive. Right through being given this opportunity by the club to the respect I receive from the players and every team we play against.

"But I feel that respect works both ways and there are numerous great people that help make this club what it is. We have created a family environment and everybody is equally important, from the Under 6s all the way to the first team. I am a small part of this."

Humble indeed, but Rosi's pioneering role in changing the face of women's involvement in football can not be understated.

With the media spotlight still very much on Sarina Weigman and her England's Euro 2022 heroines, here is someone who continues to break down barriers in the men's game too.

But Rosi won't be a lone trailblazer for long, I'm sure. Mary Phillip – England's first female black captain – is making a name for herself in charge of Kent County League side Peckham Town, at Step 7 and is destined for bigger things, while the number of women's coaches gaining their badges is increasing all the time.

Chelsea FC head coach Emma Hayes has won everything there is to win in the women's game and has previously been linked to a number of top jobs in the Football League. Surely it's only a matter of time before she, or perhaps the extremely highly rated Weigman, land a pioneering role in British football.

As the saying goes 'respect has to be earned' and it's clear to me that a women's role in football – whether it be as a player, coach or in the media – has made huge steps in doing just that.

Random Thoughts TRANSFER WINDOW

Transfer deadline day came and went with some ridiculous amounts of money being spent by a number of clubs in the Premier League. In total £1.9billion was spent by Premier League clubs in the summer window. Most ridiculous of all was seeing Nottingham Forest sign an incredible 21 new players for £145m, breaking the British record for most recruits in a single season. The BBC website commented about having been promoted to the Premier League at the end of last season that "judging by their summer shopping they are determined to stay there". It is probably more like they have to stay there now as they could have serious issues with Financial Fair Play rules should they be relegated back to the championship at the end of the season.

With Nottingham Forest being the first club to ever spend £1million on a player when they signed Trevor Francis back in 1979, for Forest fans it must feel like they have signed 21 Trevor Francis's as I am told £1m in 1979 is worth about £5.6m in todays money. Somehow I suspect none of the players they have signed will be anywhere near as good as Trev was and I fully expect Nottingham Forest to be joining Bournemouth returnina in Championship next season, along with Leicester unless they turn things round quickly and look forward to seeing how the financial fair play stuff pans out.


I liked the joke going round social media that when the new players at Nottingham

For my own club QPR, Transfer Deadline Day is not about who you sign but who you keep with rumours of clubs sniffing around some of our better players it is always a relief when old Jim White announces the window is now closed. It is always hard when your best players are sold so late on in the window, as there is little if no time to sign a decent replacement. Thankfully there is no such thing as a transfer window in Non-League football and Sam can continue to try and bring in players all the way through the season up until the cut off in Spring. If there were such a window who do you reckon would be the Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division equivalent of Nottingham Forest? Who would be spending the most on big name players? I could probably suggest a few names but probably best not to for fear of getting into trouble.
