Men's First Team Bassett Bulletin Welcome To Today's Game

GOOD EVENING and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Roman Glass St George. A warm welcome to all our visitors from Bristol who have made the journey down the M4, we hope you enjoy your short stay with us this evening and we wish you a safe journey home.

Tonight's game was scheduled to be away from home until last Wednesday when the Hellenic League asked that it be switched to our ground. Whilst the good news is that it means our players do not have to make a midweek journey to Bristol, it would have been nice to have had more notice as far as programme production was concerned as a programme for tonight's game was not factored into an already cramped schedule of league and club work. Tonight's programme was started and finished on Sunday, the quickest turnaround of a programme in the near 20 years of compiling or producing information for the programme. Apologies for any more than normal errors in tonight's edition but it was something of a rush job.

Roman Glass St George currently sit in 12th place in the league table, seven points behind us. However, they have only played seven games so far and have dropped less points than ourselves and would go above us were they to win their games in hand, so another tough fixture is in prospect for us here this evening. Last season Roman Glass St George did the league double over us winning 2-0 here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground and then 4-1 on their 3G pitch. Hopefully tonight's game will see us pick up our first league points against our opponents from Bristol.

Well that was certainly exciting for the spectators on Saturday against league leaders Cribbs. With manager Sam Collier forced to put on the goalkeeper gloves as a result of the late recall of Matt Crowther by Hungerford Town, giving Sam insufficient time to find a replacement, who would have predicted what would happened at 4:45PM. Especially after Sam had been at fault for the earlier Cribbs goal. Prior to the last minute drama, assistant manager Alan Griffin had come off the bench to score a typical Griff goal with his head but when

Jack Hobson-McVeigh brought down one of the Cribbs players on the edge of the area and the ref pointed to the spot few in the crowd would have predicted what happened next. Diving to his right stand-in keeper Sam Collier pulled off a spectacular save enabling us to share the points with the league leaders. Whilst it was only a point in the circumstances it very much felt like a win and it was nothing less than the team deserved, as for much of the game they looked the better side against the league leaders who have yet to taste defeat in the league.

Whilst the crowd were being thoroughly entertained here at the Sustain Stadium, the Development team made the long journey to Bath also forced into finding a new keeper due to the injury to Jack Rae in Thursday night's Floodlit Mark U18 game. Development side maintained their excellent run of late, keeping a clean sheet for the third consecutive game whilst scoring five times at the other end. The 5-0 defeat of Odd Down Development made it four games unbeaten for the Development side ahead of next Saturday's game against Salisbury FC Development. Bassett moved up to 9th spot as a result of the win on Saturday.

Both the Under 18 team and the Veterans' team had excellent wins in midweek to top their respective divisions. The Under 18s were 2-1 winners away at Melksham Town in what was a high quality game between two good sides, whilst the Veterans' were 3-0 winners over Swindon Rovers.

On Sunday the Women's team progressed in the FA Cup with a 6-0 win over Middlezoy. The result will also have brought a big smile to the Club Treasurers face as the win came with prize money of £3,000 and with a minimum amount of £1,000 in the next round, even if we lose, the Women's team will have earned more prize money than the Men's First Team in the FA Cup this season.

Enjoy the game tonight and hopefully we can end the night with our first win over Roman Glass St George and three more points to stay in touch with the teams at the top of the league table.

RGStG Wins

11 August 2021 Royal W. Bassett Town 0 Roman Glass St George 2

After earning a fine point away against Bishop's Cleeve and recording a thumping Emirates FA Cup victory at Thornbury Town, Royal Wootton Bassett Town suffered a reality check in their opening home fixture of the season as they were beaten 2-0 by Roman Glass St George.

In the first ever meeting between the two sides, Bassett found themselves up against a well-organised outfit, whose obdurate defence and quick play on the counter ultimately sprung them to victory.

Both of their goals came in the second half after Bassett had shaded the opening period, yet failing to convert possession into chances. Indeed they had been unfortunate not to concede a penalty when Macauley Dodson appeared to handle in the box.

When the first goal eventually came on the hour mark it came from a spot kick, which was scored by dangerous frontman Neikell Plummer who coolly sent Harrison Ellis the wrong way from the penalty spot on the hour. Plummer had played a heavy part in the move that earned the penalty. Controlling a pass out from the back on the left side, he split the Bassett defence with a through ball to Lewis Ellington. And with Dodson chasing back, he was guilty of a push in the back that sent the midfielder tumbling.

Their second then came from a corner twelve minutes later. Delivered to the penalty spot, Ollie Woodhouse was able to evade marker Alan Griffin and flicked a looping header in over Ellis.

A second half brace from Neikell Plummer helped Roman Glass St George inflict a thumping 4-1 defeat on Royal Wootton Bassett Town as Sam Collier's side fell to a second league defeat of their season against their opponents.

After a nervy, evenly-matched opening, Roman Glass took the lead midway through the first half as Shacquille Smith took advantage of a defensive lapse before producing a cool finish beyond Eddie Cavanagh.

Bassett remained in the game going into half time, though they had the crossbar to thank for keeping the score at 1-0.

However, a rampant second half display from Roman Glass - and Plummer in particular - tore Bassett apart.

A diving header from Plummer doubled his side's lead on 53 minutes before the forward bundled home a low cross quarter of an hour later to make it 3-0. Lewis Ellington then completed the scoring with a fine effort from outside the area with thirteen minutes remaining.

Bassett were able to get one goal back, Alan Griffin heading in his tenth of the season.

However, that was mere consolation as Bassett slipped to a third loss in four league games with this being the heaviest so far...



Opponents History

ROMAN GLASS ST GEORGE FC



The club Roman Glass St George is the result of an amalgamation between Bristol St George and Roman Glass. Bristol St George was formed in 1882 and is the oldest club in Bristol. They were founder members of the GFA in 1886 and won the GFA Senior Challenge Cup on two occasions 1894 and 1895 beating Eastville Rovers 3-1 on the first occasion.

The club also entered the FA Cup in 1891 and the inaugural FA Amateur Cup in 1894. The current ground at Bell Hill was opened with a match between a Bristol & District XI and the English champions Aston Villa in 1894. In 1897 the club turned professional and spent two seasons in the Birmingham & District League. The club reverted to amateur status in 1901 and continued that way until joining the Western League in 1928. In 1935 after struggling financially they dropped out and joined the Bristol & District League once again. They won the first division only once in 1949/50 but were always a leading team until they became founder members of the Bristol Premier Combination in 1957. St George played in this league winning it five seasons in succession from 1963/64 season to 1967/68 until they joined the Gloucestershire County League on its formation in 1968.

The Sixties was the Golden era for the club as in addition to winning these league titles thev also managed win

Gloucestershire Senior Amateur Cup, five times which included four successive seasons. Success was also found in the FA Amateur Cup when they regularly took on the top amateur clubs in the Country such as Hendon, Dagenham, Hayes and Leytonstone in front of crowds numbering thousands. St George won the County league in 1969/70 and was runners-up twice before a gradual decline in fortunes until in 1987 the club were expelled from the league due to sub standard facilities. A return to the Premier Combination saw a brief improvement resulting in winning the Premier Division in 1992/93. With no promotion gained the club nosedived and were in danger of folding when Roman Glass stepped in.

Roman Glass originated as a street team called Wyndham Wanderers in 1960 and played in the Bristol Church of England League and then joined the Bristol & District League in 1974. The club enjoyed moderate success gradually climbing the leagues and in 1980 changed its name to Roman Glass. The club began to decline until in 1990 Roger Hudd took over as manager and steered them to win the Division 4 title the club continued to improve gaining successive promotions until the amalgamation in 1995.

Roman Glass St George in the Premier Combination immediately gained success, winning promotion to the Premier Division that season and then winning that league in 1998/99 season to earn promotion to the County League. The club won the County league in 2001/02 and then season 2006/07 which resulted in promotion to the Toolstation (Western) League, a league the club last played in, in 1935.

Following Promotion to step 5 of the pyramid Roman glass st George FC had 2 Seasons in the Toolstation Western league Premier now due to the restructure. division and compete in the Hellenic Premier division.









RESPECT CHECKED IN WILTSHIRE

Wiltshire FA is launching a campaign to tackle poor behaviour in football throughout Season 22/23.

With unprecedented levels of negative behaviour in the grassroots game, Wiltshire FA will shine a light on RESPECT this season with the 'Respect Checked' campaign, with aim to reduce discipline incidents, retain both players and referees and improve the football experience in Wiltshire.

Oliver Selfe, Wiltshire FA CEO said, "We are aware of the detrimental impact that poor conduct has on the game. Behaviour and discipline are often the main concerns of our community, and these concerns lead to experienced officials leaving and players dropping out teams.

"In response we want to raise awareness about respect, gain understanding about why incidents are happening, challenge behaviour and change attitudes."

Cases of misconduct in Wiltshire have risen by 77% since Season 19/20, with 35% increase of cautions and 83% increase of red cards.

Oliver continues, "We are now watching. We are sending out RESPECT Ambassadors who will anonymously attend football fixtures throughout the season so we can gain first-hand understanding about why poor behaviour is occurring and be able to offer support to prevent further incidents."

RESPECT Ambassadors will take note of the environment, equipment, match day support, the RE-SPECT infrastructure and any incidents with reports being fed back to Wiltshire FA where they will be analysed, and invention offered.

Oliver concludes, "We believe that when there are good levels of respect players enjoy playing, referees enjoy refereeing, coaches enjoy coaching and supporters enjoy supporting. We must all check we are contributing to a positive environment for people to enjoy the nation's favourite sport."







Jeepers keepers! Management duo seal deserved point against leaders

Saturday 1st October 2022

Royal Wootton Bassett Town 1 Cribbs 1

Management duo Sam Collier and Alan Griffin came to the rescue for Royal Wootton Bassett Town as they both contributed to unbelieve late drama that saw their side claim a deserved point against Hellenic League Premier Division leaders Cribbs at the Sustain Stadium.

Griffin came off the bench to head Bassett level with eight minutes to go. But his goal seemed set to be for nothing when Cribbs earned a last minute penalty. However, Collier - forced to don the gloves for the afternoon – parried Joe Hillard's spot kick to ensure Bassett did not come away emptyhanded from a game in which they more than matched their high-flying opponents.

That Collier found himself between the sticks was certainly not in the manager's plans. An injury crisis at Hungerford Town meant regular 'keeper Matt Crowther received a call up from his parent club late on Friday. With no other 'keeper registered, Collier was forced into a desperate search to sign an emergency shotstopper. The Bassett boss contacted around thirty 'keepers to try and entice them to play. However, for various reasons his search was unsuccessful.

The plan then was to start Griffin - who had produced heroics when taking over the gloves against Hereford Lads Club last season - in goal. However, Collier's assistant was returning from holiday and unlikely to make it to the ground in time from Bristol Airport.

Desperate times therefore called for the most desperate of measures as Collier signed himself on and pencilled his name next to the number one on the teamsheet. It was certainly not the ideal solution when facing a side in fine form and still yet to taste defeat in the league.

In the end though, it would all turn out fine. Well, just about.

Bassett had found themselves trailing at half time following a Collier error (and, admittedly, a huge slice of luck for the visitors) seven minutes before the interval.

After George Kellow weaved past two defender to open up space on the right, he delivered a cross into the box which the Bassett boss failed to hang on to. Collier then sought to make amends and clear with his feet. But after connecting with a strong swing of his left foot, the ball bounced straight off forward Jack Fillingham and into the net.

The goal meant the visitors were ahead despite not having had a proper shot – let alone one on target – in the opening period.

Up until then, it had been an evenly-matched contest, though Bassett arguably shaded things. Indeed, it was the hosts who had produced the only three shots on goal of the half, all of which fell to Matt Bennett. The forward dragged the first narrowly wide of the left post after latching onto a Luke Whelan through ball, before seeing a low shot from the edge of the area comfortably held on the dive by Rob Brown. After spinning past defender Ryan Crouch, he then skewed wide with his left foot when the better option would perhaps have been to square to Whelan.

Falling behind in the circumstances could have been terminal for Bassett. Yet, Cribbs – functional, well organised but, for a team at the top of the table, not anything overly special – did not take control of the match. Instead, they stayed in the same gear as they had played during the opening period, refused to commit more men forward and seemed content with their one goal lead.

To Bassett's credit, a strong performance from the back four frustrated the visitors and helped protect Collier.

Cribbs did finally produce some efforts on goal after the restart though, but the 'keeper was equal to them all. On the hour, he dived low to his left to deny Lewis Hedges after the midfielder twisted and turned to fashion space to shoot from twenty yards out. Minutes later, he was almost caught of his line but recovered to bat a snap Fillingham shot around the post. Then with ten minutes to go he was equal to substitute Owen Punselie's low drive after an incisive Cribbs counter attack

At the other end, Bassett continued to probe, but to no avail. Griffin was therefore thrown into the fray with quarter of an hour left - and the substitution soon paid dividends.

With 85 minutes on the clock Jack Hobson-McVeigh swung a quick free kick into the box that caught Cribbs off guard. Bailey Gallagher was unable to control and shoot, but he was able to reclaim possession and worked with Gio Wrona to keep the ball in the left corner. Gallagher then passed to left back Louis Spalding who swung in a superb cross, which Griffin powerfully headed into the bottom corner of the net.

It was a goal that Bassett's quality of play and effort deserved. However, they seemed set to lose after a free kick deep in Cribbs territory came to nothing and the visitors were allowed to break. Out of desperation, Hobson-McVeigh dragged down Steve Murray in the box, earning the midfielder a straight red card.

Defender Hillard stepped up to take the penalty but, aiming to place the ball in the bottom left corner, he saw his weak attempt tipped away by Collier before Griffin thumped clear for good measure.

Bassett's management duo won't be there on the pitch to bail the team out every week – but, in the team's hour of need, they delivered in dramatic style.

Man of the match: Jowan Partridge – this may seem harsh on Sam Collier given his penalty save, but the young full back was Bassett's standout player. Calm and composed, Partridge helped keep Cribbs' attack in check, while also linking up well with Luke Whelan and, later, Alfie Presley down the right flank.

The Non-League Paper FA CUP REPLAYS



THERE'S NOTHING quite like the stress of a looming deadline when something goes a bit awry at NLP Towers.

And so it was last Saturday night when, through no one's fault, there was an issue with the penalty shoot-out scores on the FA Trophy and FA Vase results.

It meant one person shouting them out while another manually bashed them in while the ticking clock grew ever louder.

In years gone past, these games would have gone to replays but we've seen as the knockon from Covid, those games settled on the day.

The general impression we get from managers and players is stopping replays in those two cup competitions has been the right decision.

However, the feeling is a bit different when it comes to the FA Cup, where a club can reap the financial benefits from a a replay with a so-called big gun.

FA Cup replays this season have been brought back, but only until the fourth round. After that, it's on the day.

So it does feel a bit concerning when reading reports some Premier League clubs are keen to can them all together, citing fixture congestion.

Mark us down as sceptical. And here is where the views of the whole game must be taken into account.

Everyone knows how important the FA Cup is to clubs throughout the Pyramid. It is one of the best sources of income through prize money, with the addition of losers' money in recent seasons a major success — even considering the cut in money the game had to absorb from covid.

But binning replays in the third and fourth round – they're already gone after that – would be another kick in the teeth.

Let's take Kidderminster Harriers last year. The National League North side were literally seconds away from one of the competition's finest ever upsets last season in the fourth round. That was until West Ham United were rescued by Declan Rice, with a late equaliser.


Replays were out last season and it went to extra-time where Jarrod Bowen popped up with the last kick to end Kiddy's dream run.


In the same situation this season, that game would go to a replay back at the London Stadium and the Step 2 club would have banked vital money from gate receipts and possibly another TV selection had it been picked.

That revenue, won on the field rather than handed out from broadcast deals, can't be underestimated.

It seems the FA are intent on digging their heels in and not letting the elite get their way entirely. Let's hope that's the case .

As well as now being top, the additional good news is that the injured 'keeper Rae, after being closely watched overnight, is on the mend but will be unable to take his place for the Development side this weekend.
