Welcome To Tonight's Game

GOOD EVENING and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this FA Cup Extra Preliminary Round tie against Mangotsfield United. A warm welcome to all our visitors who have made the journey along the M4 from Bristol, we hope you enjoy your brief stay with us this evening and we wish you a safe journey home.

Tonight's tie sees us play the same opponents as we had at the same stage last season, albeit that tonight's game is a home fixture, whereas last season we were away from home. Hopefully we can avenge last season's FA Cup defeat against our opponents here tonight. With Mangotsfield set to visit us again in the league next Saturday the two teams are certainly going to get familiar with each other in the next eight days!

Both teams come into tonight's game on the back of opening day defeats. Whilst we were losing here at home 3-0 to Fairford Town, Mangotsfield were narrowly defeated away at Corsham Town. Having watched the highlights on Your Sport Swindon we were well beaten on Tuesday night by what looked to be a very strong Fairford Town side whose centre forward Jamal Lawrence is going to cause a lot of problems to defences all season with his pace and power. We contributed somewhat to our own downfall though, but as Sam said in his interview with Your Sport Swindon, it is just one game with 37 more still to go and it is how we bounce back from this defeat that is important now.

We created very little going forward on Tuesday night and it will be interesting to see if Sam rings the changes for this FA Cup encounter this evening. Even though the FA have not increased the prize money for two consecutive seasons now, it is still a very good money earner for clubs at our level with the winner tonight set to pick up £1,125 with a win and a guaranteed minimum of at least a further £481 in the next round.

Whilst a win tonight will mean six home games to start the season and six programmes in the first six games of the season, I am hoping that I do have to produce a programme for the Didcot game. With the Friday night fixture and a Wednesday night deadline of going to print it is frustrating that no information was received from our opponents. That is now the second game running that we have not been sent pen pics and club histories, although Fairford did at least send us a squad list. The information on our opponents in tonight's programme has been pulled together from the information they sent last season, FA Full-Time, their website and social media. Apologies if players have been missed from the squad list and pen pics.

At least the Non League Paper article is set to return next week and they have sent an advert which has helped fill an empty page tonight.

In other matters the Development Team get their season under way tomorrow when they travel to Pewsey Vale. This will be a tough start to the season for Simmo's side as Pewsey have finished in the top three in each of the last four seasons and a preview from the Club's Press Officer on the Dev Team season is included in tonight's programme.

Don't forget we are back in action here next Tuesday night when Brismcombe & Thrupp are our visitors for another UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture.

Enjoy the game and we can bounce back from that opening day defeat and progress in this prestigious competition where a win would see us home to Didcot Town in the next round.

Mangotsfield United History



The 2024/25 season will be Mangotsfield's third season playing at step 5 following 22 seasons as a Southern League club, which includes the voided 2019/20 and 2021 seasons. After thirteen seasons in the "Pitchin In" Southern Football League Division One South previously finishing 9th in 2009/10, 3rd in 2010/11, (but losing the play-off semi-final, 1-3 to Frome Town), 14th in 2011/12, 13th in 2012/13, 11th in 2013/14, 10th in 2014/15, 14th in 2015/16, 8th in 2016/17, & 16th in both 2017/18 and 2018/19, following the 2 year "Covid gap" Mangotsfield finished 18th (out of 19 teams) in 2021/22 and were automatically relegated into the Hellenic League Premier Division.

There has been football in the village since 1888 and four years later, Mangotsfield FC became a founder member of the Bristol & District League (later to become the Western Football League in 1895) but the club folded after 10 years. From 1898 until the 1950s, Mangotsfield FC was disbanded and subsequently reformed on several occasions. In January 1951, the parent club dispensed with the Reserve X1 for financial reasons leaving many local players without a team to play for. These players decided to form a new club in the village and at the start of the 1951-52 season, the newly established Mangotsfield United FC was entered into the Bristol & District League, Division VII.

They achieved five successive promotions and gained entry to the Bristol & District Premier Combination in 1957. The club remained there until 1972-73, when it was accepted in to the Western League.

The Club became established in the Western League during the 1970's and despite being relegated to the first division in 1981-82, "The Field", as they were affectionately known, bounced straight back the following season and under the guidance of the charismatic Ralph Miller, who as Chairman, undertook the task of improving the ground and its facilities, became a force in the Premier, mainly featuring in the leading positions.

In 1991, the club, managed by Harold Jarman and assisted by Terry Rowles, achieved regional glory by taking the (then) Great Mills League Premier Division title, ahead of runners-up Torrington. Disappointingly, they were denied promotion to the Southern League as the ground failed to meet the grading requirements and there followed several lean seasons as the team disbanded. Under newly-elected Chairman Richard Davis, however, off the pitch, things were improving. Terry Rowles returned to manage the club himself in 1995 and kept them in the spotlight by consistently finishing in the top three/four in the Great Mills/Screwfix League and an appearance in the FA Vase semi-final (losing to Clitheroe), but their ambitions of promotion and Southern League football were always thwarted by the continual success of Taunton and Tiverton Town. It was considered very important to establish a sound working base, improve ground facilities and secure a long-term tenure on their Cossham Street ground.

In earlier years, the Roger Pullin / Richard Davis partnership had seen many improvements take place, with the installation of Conference-style floodlights and at the end of the 2003/04 season, the Cossham Street end of the ground was covered, together with new toilet blocks and social club improvements. Ex player Andy Black returned to the club as Manager in 1999 and guided the club to promotion to the Dr. Martens Southern League and three successful campaigns. The 2003/04 campaign did not go too well and just before Christmas, Black was replaced by Martyn Grimshaw. Towards the end of the campaign, Nigel Webb came in as his Assistant, but the club could only finish in 13th place, which was not high enough for the planned restructuring of the Pyramid.

The Management duo made promotion their priority in 2004/05 and the club headed the table

for most of the campaign, eventually taking the Division One West title with a 21 match unbeaten run. After 28 seasons at Western League level, the club had spent just five campaigns at Southern League level before reaching the Premier Division. In April/May 2005, Roger Pullin left the club and Mike Richardson took over as Chairman, with a new Board.

As detailed at the start of this article Mangotsfield enjoyed life in the Southern League finishing most season's around mid table, but have struggled financially during the last few years. Sometimes now referred to as "The Mangos", the 2020/21 campaign, started with Glyn Ashton, at the helm. He had previously been in charge of the U18s Floodlit Youth side, but took over as temporary Manager in 2019/20, after the sudden departure of Manager Ollie Price, and bought in almost his entire U18s squad. Glyn Ashton returned to his role of managing the U18/Reserve team for the 2021/22 season as Ray Johnston, along with assistant Terry Moore, took over the first team management role but Glyn returned to the hot seat following the departure of Ray and Terry following some disappointing performances and results. The club, however, were unable to "avoid the drop" finishing in 18th place in a league of 19 teams.

The summer of 2021/22 has been a busy one for the club as Chairman Mike Richardson has been replaced by Steve Brown, a new committee has been formed, and with a new commercial team in place the club are about to enter an exciting new era in it's history

At the start of Season 2022/23 a new management team, headed by John Allen, previously of Toolstation outfit Keynsham Town, took charge with a mix of experienced players, that John bought in, along with the young players already at Mangotsfield. Unfortunately results didn't go as well as expected as the players struggled to "gel", so Glyn Ashton stepped into the lead role yet again. The team were in 18th place just before Christmas but eventually finished in 11th place and won the Wiseman Lighting Cup in the process.

Season 2023/24 season saw Mangotsfield finish two places lower than in the previous season, this after a decent start to the season, particularly in cup competitions. This coming season sees them having to start away from home at the beginning of the season, with all 19 away games set to be played before their first home game due to the installation of a new 3G pitch. They are not scheduled to play at home until 23 November.

Young goalkeeper who joins Mangotsfield from Slimbridge where he was No. 1 last season. Previously also with Cinderford Town, Chippenham Town and Bristol City Academy.

Stuart Tovey

A very experienced defender who has spent much of his career playing in the Southern League with Bristol Manor Farm, Paulton Rovers, Chippenham Town & Larkhall Athletic. A tough tackling defender and natural leader. Regular last season making 41 appearances, scoring once for the Mangos.

Jeffrey Barimah

Another player to come through the Youth set up at Mangotsfield. Made 16 appearances last season

Tom Warren

Experienced centre back. Has a wealth of knowledge at this level and higher. Was player coach at Larkhall Athletic in Season 2022-23. Originally played for the Mango's back in the 2005/06 season before returning ten years later. Has also played for Yate Town, Bridgwater Town, Melksham Town to name just a few.

Luke Bence

Came through the Youth Section at Mangotsfield. A strong and quick centre half who spent Season 2022-23 on loan at Hallen but was recalled to the Mangotsfield squad and has been a fixture in the Mangotsfield line up since. Was a regular last season making 36 appearances and scoring four goals.

Aaron Parsons

In the starting line up at Corsham on Tuesday night adding to the six appearances he made for Mangotsfield last season in the UHlsport Hellenic Premier division.

Harley Purnell

In his second spell at Mangotsfield having previously playing for the Mangos in 2011/12 making. The central midfielder brings a wealth of experience to the club and as captain is helping with the development of the younger players. Made 44 appearances for Mangotsfield last season. Picked up a sin-bin in their opener at Corsham on Tuesday night.

Kerem Karakus

Strong and powerful young striker with an eye for goal and great technique who came through the U18s at Mangotsfield. Spent time on loan at Stoke Gifford to gain more experience in men's football.

George Neill

Striker who joins from Slimbridge for whom he scored 17 goals last season from 40 appearances. Previously with Chipping Sodbury Town.

James White

Midfield player who joined the club from Ashton & Backwell and has also played for Hallen. Regular in the starting line-up last season with 39 appearances, netting four times in those 39 games.

Dominic Anderson-Gordon

Made his debut for Mangotsfield on Tuesday night at Corsham. Player previously with Chipping Sodbury Town and Roman Glass St George.

Rare goalless draw another step in the right direction

Royal Wootton Bassett Town edged another point closer to securing a Hellenic League Premier Division playoff place after a 0-0 draw away against Mangotsfield United.

The game may not live long in the memory with both sides cancelling the other out courtesy of strong defensive efforts. But it moved Bassett a step closer towards achieving their goal, while also inching the gap to current fourth place occupiers Fairford Town another point higher following the Reds' heavy Friday night loss at Highworth Town.

The result does represent a first for manager Collier, who prior to the afternoon had never overseen a goalless draw in the league. At the 188th time of asking though that has now happened. Indeed it's a first 0-0 league draw for just over seven years - Bassett's last being at home against Ascot United on 4 February 2017.

Collier has been in charge of four cup fixtures that finished deadlocked after 90 minutes. And the most recent was in the Floodlit Cup last season - against Mangotsfield.

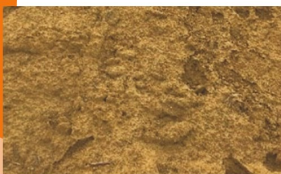

Midweek Roundup

The Premier Division of the UHSport Hellenic League kicked off on Tuesday night with seven fixtures with a further three games the following night.

On Tuesday evening newly promoted **Malmesbury Vics** were at the right place at the right time as they took full advantage of opponents **Brimscombe & Thrupp's** managerial difficulties that has seen them lose virtually the entire squad from last season to score eight unanswered goals to be the early leaders of the division. There were two goals apiece for Chalmers Pinn, new signing Jack Smith and substitute Harrison Archer (pictured), with further goals from former Bassett player Zac Skinner and Tom Wynn-Davis.

Fairford sat second in the table on Tuesday night after their excellent performance here at the Sustain Stadium thanks to two goals from Jamal Lawrence and one from Harrison Edwards. Lawrence was clearly the difference between the two sides and his powerful display reminded me of Les Ferdinand in his prime whilst the defending for the second goal by **Royal Wootton Bassett Town** reminded me of England's in World Cup 1986 for Maradona's second goal.

Highworth Town got their season off to a good start with a 3-1 win away against **Thornbury Town**. Former Bassett player Luke Whelan put them ahead on nine minutes getting on the end of a Edjidja Mbunga cross. Thornbury got themselves back on level terms at the half hour mark, Luke Franklin with the goal. Highworth got themselves back in front on 67 minutes, another former Bassett player Matt Cheetham restoring their lead. They then made certain of all three points thanks to a third through Connor Mattimore five minutes from time. Interesting to see that Highworth had an evergreen Gio Wrona in their starting line-up.

Another Wiltshire based side who got off to a winning start were a much changed **Corsham Town** with the majority of last season's squad following Kieron Baggs out of the club. They fell behind to tonight's visitors **Mangotsfield United** as early as the third minute, Mircea Ilea with the goal. Corsham got themselves back on level terms on 18 minutes, Bradley Selwood scoring from a free kick. Corsham then had veteran keeper Kane Kauppinen to thank for maintaining parity 15 minutes from time, the keeper pulling off a double save from close range. Six minutes from time Corsham went in front for the first time in the game, substitute Jamal Salawu netting after a scramble in the box. Deep into injury time Corsham again had Kauppinen to thank as the keeper pulled off another tremendous save to deny Mangotsfield a share of the points, 2-1 the final score.

It was a tight affair between newly promoted **Hartpury University** and **Westfields**, two teams I have predicted to do well this season. In the end the two defences came out on top with neither side able to find the net and having to settle for a point apiece following a 0-0 draw.

It finished all square also in the game between **Slimbridge** and **Pershore Town** although this time there were plenty of goals as the two sides both scored three times in a six goal thriller.

Aaron Brown put Inkberrow ahead on his debut for the club and then William Skelton doubled the home sides lead. It finished 2-0 meaning all three of the promoted sides remain unbeaten after the opening round of fixtures in the Premier Division.

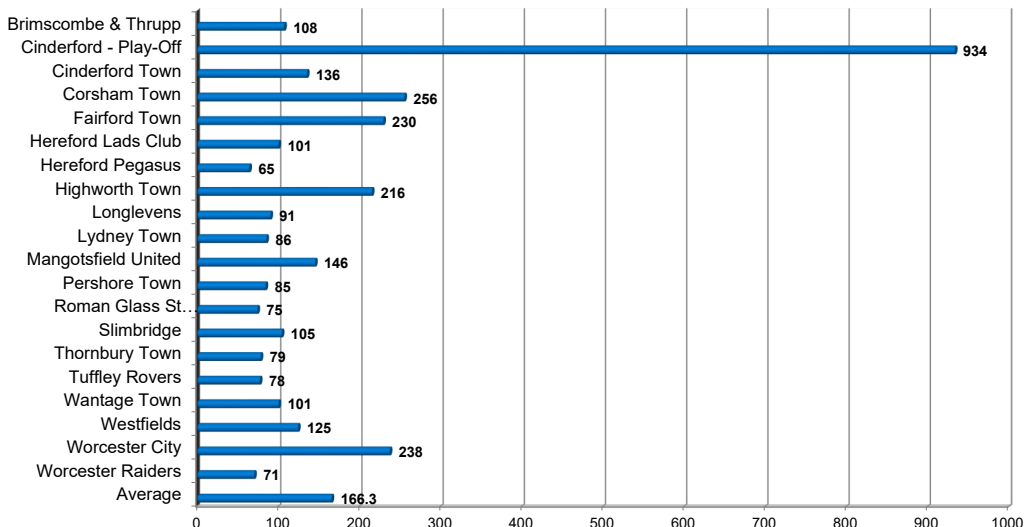

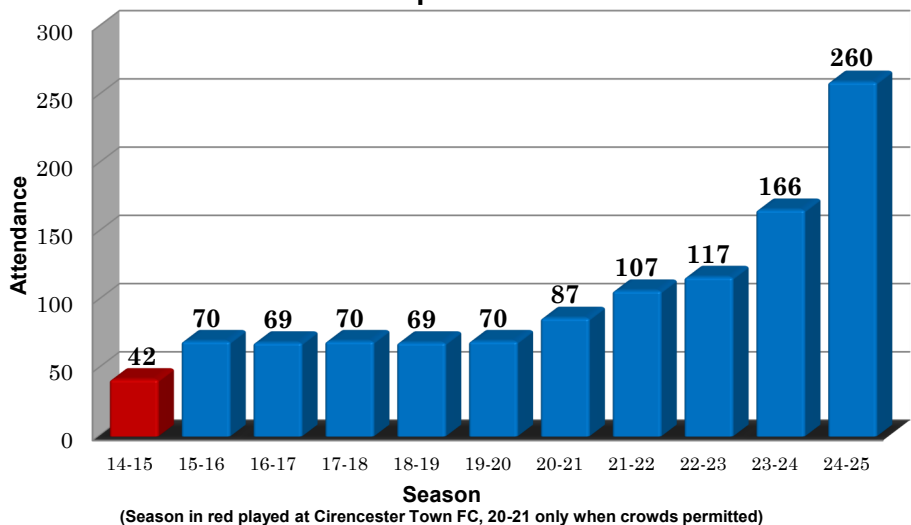

Under Simpkins' guidance, Bassett have gained a reputation for their style of play and

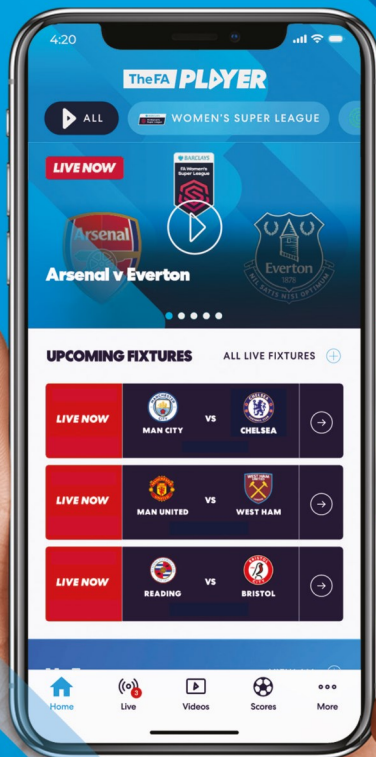
the Development team manager has certainly squeezed the most he can out of a squad that are talented and hungry, yet also still largely wet behind the ears.

Midfielders Will Slater and Sam Smith have also been added to an exciting squad.

They may fly under the radar, but there are plenty of reasons to watch and back the Development team as they seek to repeat last season's impressive showing.
