Welcome To Tonight's Game

GOOD EVENING and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Brimscombe & Thrupp. A warm welcome to all our visitors who have made the journey from Gloucestershire, we hope you enjoy your brief stay with us this evening and we wish you a safe journey home.

Brimscombe & Thrupp have had a tough start to the new season parting company with the management team, led by former Fairford and Shrivenham manager Gareth Davies that included our former player Dave Bampton, just prior to the start of the season. Davies had been brought in to replace long term manager Sam Prior who had left the club at the end of last season, a move which had also seen all of last season's squad depart. To their credit they were still able to play their opening game but lost heavily to Malmesbury Vics. They have since appointed a new management team who have been busy assembling a new squad and they put in a much better performance on Saturday against a good Virginia Water side in the FA Cup, losing 4-2 on the 3G pitch at Slough Town. We should not read anything into that Malmesbury result and Sam will know his side will be in for a tough game here tonight against a side that, until last season, had become something of a bogey side for us. Last season we did the double over Brimscombe but prior to that we had lost the six previous games and not won in eight. Our current record against them now reads won 11, drawn four and lost 13.

It was a great performance by the side last Friday night in the FA Cup against Mangotsfield United in what was an enjoyable game of football between two evenly matched sides. Young Finnlay Hopkins deservedly won man of the match and he is looking to be a great signing by Sam having stepped up from the Wiltshire Senior League where he had been playing for Shrivenham. Friday saw another impressive crowd of over 200, the third

consecutive game if you include the Forest Green Rovers friendly where we have achieved that which will no doubt have pleased both the Club Treasurer and the RWBSA. The Club Treasurer was certainly smiling on Saturday when I saw him at Calne Town knowing we had banked the prize money from that FA Cup win.

Hopefully we can carry on from where we left off on Friday night and secure our first league points of the season here this evening. We are back here again on Saturday when Mangotsfield United make a quick return to the Sustain Stadium and then again a week tonight when we entertain Roman Glass St George. This is then followed by yet another home game, with Didcot Town the visitors in the FA Cup, although at the time of writing it is not clear on which day of the weekend that will take place due to cricket.

On Saturday the Development side got their season underway at Pewsey Vale and fell to a 3-1 defeat against one of the stronger sides in the division. They go again tonight over on the 3G when they entertain Blunsdon.

Tonight's programme includes the First Round draw for the Marsh Challenge Cup that was recently made in Hellenic Towers, although we do not feature until I believe Round 3, it is just the Division Two sides and some of the Division One clubs at this stage. There is also details of the now well established Club Fantasy Football League and all are encouraged to participate. Last season we attracted a record number of 225 entrants and it would be good if we again beat that record this season.

Enjoy the game. Hopefully we can build on that impressive FA Cup performance and return to winning ways in the league.

The Men's programme was ranked 2nd best in the country for all non-league football and for an incredible third season in a row, the Women's programme was ranked number 1 for all Women's football including the Women's Super League. Well done to all involved.

Elsewhere at the club, the Development team started their season with a 3-1 defeat away to Pewsey, a team that always feature at the top of the league. The Women, following an impressive performance in losing 1-0 at Cardiff Met, have a home friendly tomorrow against AEKBoco in their build up to the start of the season.

Brimscombe & Thrupp History



Brimscombe A.F.C. was founded in 1886 – the same year as the Gloucestershire Football Association!

The G.F.A. friendlies were played until the competitive league was formed in 1890. In 1902 the Stroud League was founded and Brimscombe were its first winners. Just after the First World War the Northern Senior League appeared. Its first season was 1922 and once again Brimscombe were the very first champions. Football was interrupted during the Second World War (1939–1945) but the game continued at 'The Meadow' where matches between the Army, Navy, Air Force and a team called 'Brimscombe Wanderers' took place.

When the Gloucestershire County League was first formed in 1968/9, Brimscombe – affectionately known as "The Lilywhites", were again founder members, along with other local sides Forest Green Rovers and Stonehouse Town. In 1973/4 The Lilywhites, amid some controversy, found themselves back in the Senior League, just failing by one vote to secure a place in the Hellenic League.

It was at this time the Club experienced a difficult period and in the late 1970's Brimscombe and Thrupp amalgamated to secure both Club's futures. The Club hit a purple patch in the 1980's and won the Senior League Division One and Two and the County Cup all in the space of three seasons, eventually being promoted back to the County League and finishing 4th in 1987. There then followed many years of varying fortunes for the club including relegation to the lower leagues.

However, in 2008 there were major changes to the Club Committee and the Football Management which immediately brought a successful period for the club. In season 2008/9 the First Team managed by Phil Baker were runners-up to Longlevens and were promoted once again into the County League for the third time in its History.

In 2011 Brimscombe & Thrupp F.C. won the Gloucestershire County League for the first time and gained promotion to the Hellenic League under Phil Baker. Since promotion major redevelopments of the ground have taken place including an extension to the clubhouse and the installation of floodlights.

Season 2012/13 saw Brimscombe & Thrupp F.C. win the UHSPORT Hellenic League Division 1 West and gain acceptance into the Premier League. More ground improvements were undertaken which included a new 100 standing/100 seating stand and further walkways around the pitch.

Season 2013/14 saw Brimscombe & Thrupp F.C. playing in the highest league in the clubs history, the ground improvements were complete with the new stand finished and other improvements made. The club experienced its first ever F.A. Vase football and were quite successful reaching the First Round Proper. The season was also made memorable with the First XI winning three cup finals – those being the Stroud & District Charity Cup, the Hellenic League Flying Press Floodlit Cup and the Hellenic League Supplementary Cup.

Season 2014/15 was another historic occasion with the side playing in the F.A. Cup for the first time in its history. The club continued to go from strength to strength during season 2015/16 and saw the team end in fifth position, its highest league finish in its history. The upgrade of the club continues with works being carried out as required by Step 5 football. 2016/17 was another great season for the club when Brimscombe & Thrupp appeared in three cup semi finals and saw the club have their best FA cup to date, eventually losing in the Third Qualifying Round at Weymouth.

Season 2017/18 saw Brimscombe & Thrupp win the GFA Trophy for the first time in its history and finish sixth place in the League.

Season 2018/19 saw the club reach its highest league position in the clubs history, however, second place was not enough to see Brimscombe & Thrupp gain promotion.

Season 2019/20 was virtually wiped out by the Covid pandemic which affected all levels of football throughout the country this continued into season 2020/21 which also had restrictions put on everyone.

Season 2021/22 saw the club make the GFA Cup final, however, they lost in the final, but once again secured a creditable ninth place finish in the league.

Season 2022/23 again saw Brimscombe once again finish in 9th place. Season 2023/24 was to be a difficult one for the club as they slipped to 15th place and after the end of season the club lost its management team and also all of the players. The appointment of former Shrivenham manager Gareth Davies as the replacement did not prove to be a success and Brimscombe now have another new management team in the shape of joint managers Jamie Martin and Joel White. Martin is a former Brimscombe player who has also played for Slimbridge amongst others, White also has Hellenic League experience as a player with Slimbridge and Shortwood United.

Bassett's dynamic playmaking duo of Alfie Presley and Tommy Ouldrige proved far too much for their visitors to handle on an afternoon when Sam Collier's side seemed in control from start to finish.

Presley netted twice, while Ouldrige scored direct from a corner and played a vital role in setting up two other goals.

Brimcombe have been a bogey side for Bassett in previous seasons. But this year they have hardly laid a glove on Bassett. Collier's team triumphed 3-1 away from home at the start of November and comfortably wrapped up a season double in the return fixture.

That lead held until midway through the second half. Bassett were awarded a somewhat soft free kick on the left wing, which Ouldrige swung in and Louis Spalding rose highest, flicking a header beyond Jones who could do little but watch as the ball sailed into the corner.

Two became three when Ouldrige's in swinging corner was placed perfectly underneath the crossbar, and a flustered Jones - under pressure from an onrushing Sam Packer could only flap at the ball as it nestled into the net.

A Presley 25-yard daisy cutter then completed the rout.

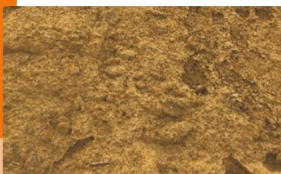

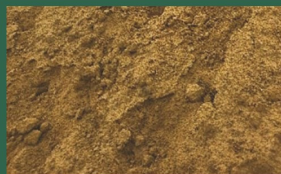

Midweek Roundup

The Premier Division of the UHSport Hellenic League kicked off on Tuesday night with seven fixtures with a further three games the following night.

On Tuesday evening newly promoted **Malmesbury Vics** were at the right place at the right time as they took full advantage of opponents **Brimscombe & Thrupp's** managerial difficulties that has seen them lose virtually the entire squad from last season to score eight unanswered goals to be the early leaders of the division. There were two goals apiece for Chalmers Pinn, new signing Jack Smith and substitute Harrison Archer (pictured), with further goals from former Bassett player Zac Skinner and Tom Wynn-Davis.

Fairford sat second in the table on Tuesday night after their excellent performance here at the Sustain Stadium thanks to two goals from Jamal Lawrence and one from Harrison Edwards. Former Bassett player Luke Whelan put them ahead on nine minutes getting on the end of a Edjidja Mbunga cross. Thornbury got themselves back on level terms at the half hour mark, Luke Franklin with the goal. Highworth got themselves back in front on 67 minutes, another former Bassett player Matt Cheetham restoring their lead. They then made certain of all three points thanks to a third through Connor Mattimore five minutes from time. Interesting to see that Highworth had an evergreen Gio Wrona in their starting line-up.

Another Wiltshire based side who got off to a winning start were a much changed **Corsham Town** with the majority of last season's squad following Kieron Baggs out of the club. They fell behind to tonight's visitors **Mangotsfield United** as early as the third minute, Mircea Ilea with the goal. Corsham got themselves back on level terms on 18 minutes, Bradley Selwood scoring from a free kick. Corsham then had veteran keeper Kane Kauppinen to thank for maintaining parity 15 minutes from time, the keeper pulling off a double save from close range. Six minutes from time Corsham went in front for the first time in the game, substitute Jamal Salawu netting after a scramble in the box. Deep into injury time Corsham again had Kauppinen to thank as the keeper pulled off another tremendous save to deny Mangotsfield a share of the points, 2-1 the final score.

It was a tight affair between newly promoted **Hartpury University** and **Westfields**, two teams I have predicted to do well this season. In the end the two defences came out on top with neither side able to find the net and having to settle for a point apiece following a 0-0 draw.

It finished all square also in the game between **Slimbridge** and **Pershore Town** although this time there were plenty of goals as the two sides both scored three times in a six goal thriller.

Hereford Pegasus got their season off to a winning start with a 2-1 away win at **Lydney Town**.

It was a certainly an impressive opening night for attendances with six of the seven games producing three figure crowds, with the one exception at Thornbury being just one short. The biggest crowd was here at the Sustain Stadium with 260 in attendance with Corsham also drawing an impressive 246 for the start of the post-Baggs era.

There were three more games on Wednesday night. **Worcester Raiders** made the trip south to Gloucester to take on **Longlevens** and it was a tight affair throughout with the game remaining goalless until the 55th minute. The deadlock was broken by Jordan Stoddart who headed Raiders in front. The visitors then had keeper Charlie Emery to thank on 71 minutes for retaining their lead, the keeper pulling off an excellent save to deny the home side. With the game deep into injury time there was then a power cut and the game abandoned. It will be interesting to see if this will now need to be replayed or the score at the time of the abandonment allowed to stand.

Cirencester Town made the decision to drop down from the Southern League in the summer and it looks like they will be fielding a young side under new manager James Mortimer-Jones. They certainly found **Roman Glass St George** to be too strong a side in the battle between the two sides who play on 3G pitches, with Roman Glass running out 6-1 winners, Kyle Chester with the consolation goal for Cirencester.

Tuffley Rovers had a good end to last season, unbeaten in their final four games of the season, but the new campaign did not get off to the best of starts away at newly promoted **Sporting Club Inkberrow**. Aaron Brown put Inkberrow ahead on his debut for the club and then William Skelton doubled the home sides lead. It finished 2-0 meaning all three of the promoted sides remain unbeaten after the opening round of fixtures in the Premier Division.

Match Report

Mangotsfield United (H) (FAC)

History maker and flying Finn deliver Cup revenge

A historic Jack Hobson-McVeigh goal and Finn Hopkins winner helped Royal Wootton Bassett Town on their way to exacting Emirates FA Cup revenge over Mangotsfield United as Sam Collier's side prevailed 2-1 in their extra preliminary round encounter.

Against a Mangotsfield side who knocked Bassett out at the same stage last season, it was always set to be a tough contest. And that proved to be the case with both sides enjoying chances in an entertaining contest where any outcome seemed possible.

In the end though, Bassett's quick start and young starlet Finn Hopkins' bundled second half winner saw the hosts prevail and book a preliminary round date with Southern League Didcot Town.

Bassett's evening began in perfect - and history-making - fashion.

In the ninth minute strong pressing from Alfie Presley and Tommy Ouldrige forced Mangotsfield to concede possession deep in their own territory. And Hopkins squared to Hobson-McVeigh, who from the left edge of the penalty arc teased a curling first time shot past an outstretched Ellis Parker into the bottom right corner.

Coming so early, the goal represented the joint -opening goal of this year's competition, with Great Yarmouth Town's Louie Duffield registering in the same minute of their Friday night tie against Kirkley and Pakefield.

Given the FA Cup had never started as early as 2 August, the pair also now have the distinction of netting the earliest goal in a season in the competition's history.

Yet, while an impressive and distinct piece of history to possess, Bassett's sole aim at the start of the evening was to progress and banish the disappointment of last season's loss to the Mangos.

Eventually Bassett got there, having to work hard for their win.

In a relatively even opening half, the visitors pulled level ten minutes before the break. Near the byline Michael Barry broke inside from the right and Chris Taylor clumsily felled him just inside in the area. It was a clear foul - albeit with questions as to whether contact started outside the box. Regardless, it was deemed a penalty, which Will Ashton coolly stroked past Sam Jepson who guessed correctly.

Bassett did have a great opportunity to restore their advantage before the interval. Hopkins rounded Parker and looked odds on to score. However, he was unable to get his shot off before the angle became too acute and placed into the side netting with a stabbed right foot attempt.

Shortly after the restart though, player of the match Hopkins got the goal his performance merited.

Mangotsfield had only just come close to taking the lead as James White's teasing free kick was headed narrowly wide of the right post by Aaron Parsons.

Play quickly switched to the other end though and, in the 52nd minute, strong play from Presley saw him shrug off the attentions of Parker - who had come off his line - and Parsons to retain possession after latching onto an Ouldrige through ball. He then squared across goal and Hopkins was on hand at the left post to scramble the ball across the line.

There was still plenty of time left to play and Mangotsfield did all they could to get on terms. And there was to be late drama as the visitors struck the bar deep into stoppage time. After initially winning a flick on from Parker's punt forward, substitute Ben Shepherd received a return pass from Jeremy Agyemang and hit a fine 25 yard drive that had Jepson beaten but crashed against the woodwork.

Fortune was thus on Bassett's side to prevent a replay.

After a disappointing opening to their league campaign, Collier and his team are now properly up and running in the new season.

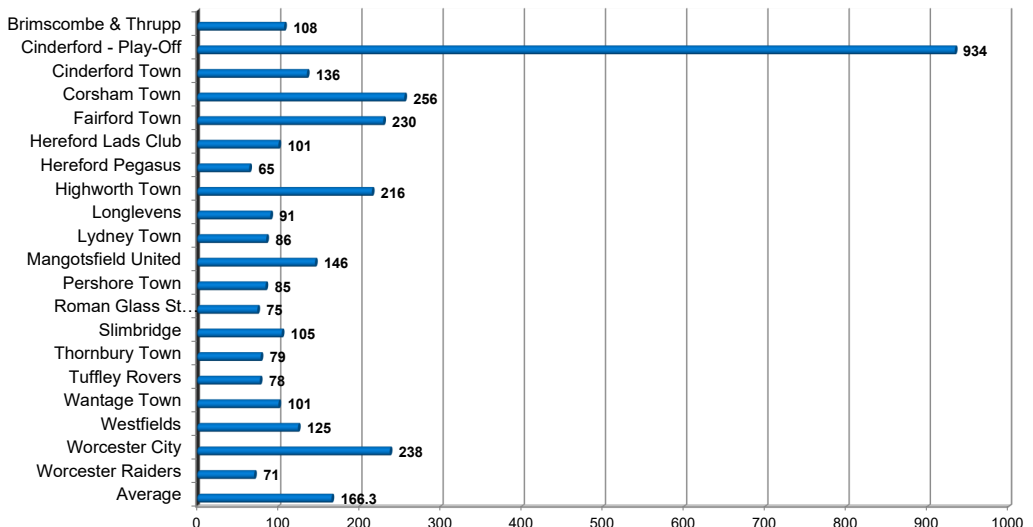

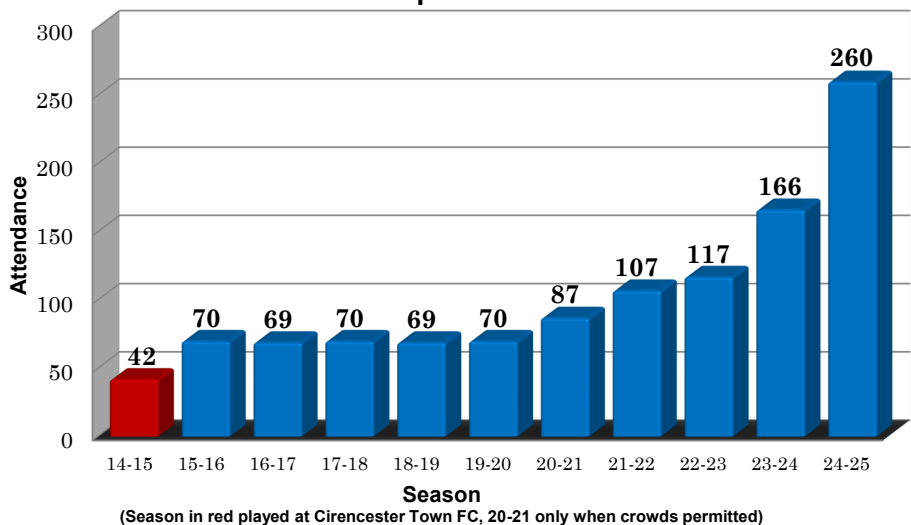

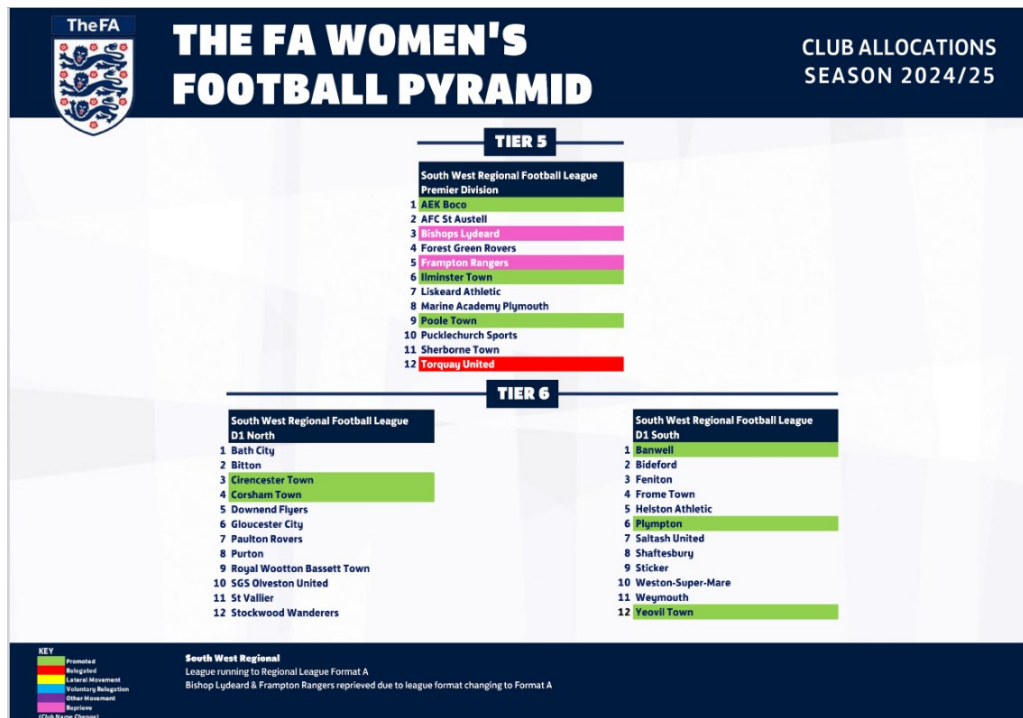

Premier Division Roundup 03 Aug

The 49th Season in the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League got underway on a bright and sunny afternoon on the first weekend in August, with six games in the Premier Division. Two of the four promoted sides were in action, and it was a day of mixed fortunes for the new boys. Letcombe, promoted from the Hellenic League Division 2, made their debut in the league away at Calne Town Reserves. They started brightly and nearly went in front on eight minutes when centre forward Ben Cleary got behind the Calne defence down the left flank, but he left himself too acute an angle and his shot ended up running parallel to the goal along the six-yard box and was cleared to safety. They didn't have to wait too long to break the deadlock though, as two minutes later they were in front. A miskick from Calne keeper Lewis Clarke went straight to Kieran Kerby 25 yards out from goal and Letcombe's right winger fired it back into an empty net to give his side the lead. Kerby went close to getting a second ten minutes later went put through his shot to the far side of the goal came back off the outside of the far post and was cleared to safety. Letcombe were on top for most of the opening half but were finding it difficult to create any clear-cut chances as the hard-working Calne defence frustrated them in the final third. The closest they went was just after the half hour mark when they managed to get behind the Calne defence but an excellent sliding tackle from Josh Morse denied Cleary a shot on goal just as he was about to let fire. The resulting corner came to nothing, and it remained 1-0. Calne started to come more into it as the half wore on but their only real shot on goal was a long-range effort from Morse eight minutes before the break. A minute later Calne's Tom Gates looked like he might create a goal scoring opportunity but a fine challenge from Luke Faircloth prevented the shot and Letcombe went into the break one goal to the good having dominated most of the possession.

There were just three second half minutes on the clock when they doubled their lead and once again it was Kerby with the goal, the Letcombe forward firing into the bottom corner of the net with a powerful drive from the edge of the box after the ball was laid back to him by Cleary. Letcombe continued to have the better of things in terms of possession but, as in the first half, struggled to create any clear-cut chances. Calne's task got more difficult when they were temporarily reduced to ten men 15 minutes from time when Morse was sent to the sin bin by the referee for dissent. Letcombe failed to take advantage of the extra man and Morse returned to the action with the score still 2-0. Right at the end Calne went close to reducing the deficit when substitute Ben Wootten headed just over but there were to be no further goals as it finished 2-0 to Letcombe and a victory on their league debut.

The other new side making their Premier Division debut were last season's Division One runners-up Faringdon Town who entertained 2022-23 league champions Trowbridge Town at Tucker Park.
