Men's First Team Bassett Bulletin Welcome To Today's Game

GOOD EVENING and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against near neighbours Malmesbury Victoria. Tonight's game was supposed to be an away fixture but has been switched to the Sustain Stadium due to ongoing issues with the Malmesbury pitch following the major maintenance work undertaken in the summer months.

A warm welcome to all the players, management team, club officials and supporters from Malmesbury who have made the short journey along the B4042. Both the Malmesbury manager Ant Brown and assistant Paul Carson are former Wootton Bassett players, as are a number of their squad here this evening. A special warm welcome to all of our old players who return this evening, in particular Stephen Robertson who scored a hat-trick for Wootton Bassett Town in the last league meeting between the two sides in 2013 which was also the last game ever played at Rylands Way before our move. The programme cover and match report from that game is included in tonight's programme.

As often the way with these derby games, we also have a couple of players in our squad here tonight who have represented Malmesbury not least Alan Griffin who was at the Flying Monk not only as a player but also as part of the management team. Jack Hobson-McVeigh is another who has played in the black and white at Malmesbury, having joined us from Malmesbury a couple of seasons ago, although it is not clear at the time of writing whether he will be able to play tonight.

Malmesbury made a decent start on their return to the Premier Division following last season's win in the Division One play-offs, winning two of their first three league games. Although they have lost the other four league games played to date, they pushed Highworth Town all the way last week in midweek and we will need to be at our best if

we are to return to winning ways here this evening. Despite being just up the road we have not played that many games against Malmesbury Vics over the years, in fact it is just 26 since Malmesbury United merged with Swindon Victoria to form Malmesbury Victoria. Our record against them is eight wins, eight draws and ten defeats. Whilst Malmesbury have the better overall record in the fixture, we have won five of the six most recent games.

Since the last programme we have exited the FA Cup losing against Didcot who themselves went out of the competition on Saturday, beaten 3-0 away at Taunton Town, won away at Thornbury Town and then lost heavily away at Corsham. Since their move across to the Hellenic League, Corsham have become our bogey side and we have lost heavily at the Southbrook Ground on both our last two visits. Sam was obviously disappointed with that result and performance and will be expecting a reaction from the players here this evening.

The Development Team have not made the best of starts in the Premier Division of the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League, going down 1-0 at home to Bemerton Heath Harlequins Res in their latest game. Matters were not helped I understand by a harsh early sending off for Flynn Walters and I know from compiling the League roundup on Saturday night both teams were not happy with the referee in a game that I was told was played in a good spirit yet saw multiple cards being dished out.

The Women's team got their season under way with a 5-1 away win in the FA Cup against Ross Juniors. For the second season running they have already won more prize money than the men's team in the FA Cup. Well done to Adam and his team.

Enjoy the game tonight and hopefully a return to winning ways and local bragging rights over Malmesbury.

MANAGER Ant Brown The Club was originally formed in 1898, and was known as Malmesbury Town, then Malmesbury United. Then in the 1970's, amalgamated with a successful Swindon Club known as Swindon Victoria.

The Club has played in various locations in and around the Town before eventually settling on the present site, known as The Flying Monk Ground. The ground was previously owned by the pub known as The Flying Monk.

There have been ups and downs over the past few years, but in 1999/2000 the Club was extremely successful with both Saturday sides winning their respective Leagues for the first time since 1974. The first the Wiltshire team won Premier League to clinch promotion to the Hellenic League, with the reserves winning the equivalent Junior Division to gain promotion to the Premier Division.

During their first season in the Hellenic League the first team acquitted themselves well to finish 4th in the League. Since then things have been much harder to finish in the top half of the league, but in 2001/2002 the Club did win the Wiltshire 2004/2005 saw Senior Cup. the Club decide to start an Under 18's team in the Wiltshire Floodlit League.

The Club has made huge steps to improve the facilities, in the summer of 2004 the giant step of installing floodlights was completed and the summer of 2005 saw the

complete refurbishment of the Clubhouse.

In the 2006/07 season, we were unlucky not to get promotion into the Hellenic Premier League, finishing in fourth place. The following season 2007/08, we had a poor start, and half way through, after a change of management finished the season in 15th place.

The 2008/09 season saw the Club finish in the runners-up spot in Division 1 West, and with it came promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division, this being the Club's highest level of football in its history. However, the Club was relegated at the end of 2009/10 as the ground had not reached the required standard to continue in that division.

After dropping down and returning to a focus on local players, the club saw great success in the Wilts premier league. ending in being champions in 2014/15 season and gaining promotion to the Western League for 2016/17 season and finishing in a very position. respectable 9th Following a mid-table finish in 2017/18, League re-structuring has seen the club return to the Hellenic League in the 1 West Division where we look forward to renewing old friendships and making new ones.

The Club is in the early discussion stages to move to a new ground close to the present one, but high enough not to have to worry about flooding.

Malmesbury 0 W. Bassett Town 2 11th March 2006

Wootton Bassett Town's defence once again showed why they are the best in the league as they kept another clean sheet – their seventh of the year – in a comfortable 2-0 victory away at Malmesbury Victoria.

Bassett did the damage in the first half and took the lead in the 13th minute when Rich Gee headed home at the far post from an in-swinging Nathan Hall free kick taken from what looked like an impossible angle.

Five minutes later the lead should have been doubled but Lee Marshall headed over a free header from a Matty Bennett cross.

A looping cross from Andy Mitchell tested John Haines just before the half hour mark as his cross from the right sailed just over.

In the 33rd minute Jon Smith missed a sitter, which should have levelled the game up again. Mitchell cut the ball back to Smith, who was lurking on the edge of the six yard box but the Malmesbury forward shot wide of the near post.

Five minutes before the break Bennett latched onto a Hall through ball before nutmegging the last man. Bennett's finished wasn't up to scratch though as he dragged the ball wide with his left foot from the edge of the area.

However Bassett doubled the lead a minute before the break when Sam Lawro played a ball into the corner and both Bennett and Malmesbury 'keeper Martin Woodhouse chased it down. Bennett was first to the ball and rounded Woodhouse before cutting the ball from the byline to an unmarked Hall, who tapped into the open goal from six yards.

Malmesbury forced a save out of Haines in first half stoppage time as he was equal to a Rob Hunt header.

Nine minutes after the restart a first time effort from Mitchell sailed over before Anthony McCusker was booked for dissent. Hall then shot over from the edge of the area in the 57th minute.

Two minutes later Bennett latched onto a clearance from Gee in behind the Malmesbury defence. Bennett ran untouched towards goal and shot from 15 yards, forcing a good save from Woodhouse who tipped wide. Steve Bunting replaced McCusker in the 60th minute before Chris Hawkins came on for Stu Hemsley nine minutes later.

With sixteen minutes left, Hawkins drilled a low cross into the box, which struck a Malmesbury defender and if it weren't for the positioning of Woodhouse, Bassett would have furthered their lead.

A trip by Nathan Hall earned him a yellow card in the 81st minute before Ryan Whitefield was given his debut, the ex-Cricklade player replacing Paul Crabtree.

Malmesbury pushed for a goal that would pull them to within one of their opponents but this search was in vain as the Bassett defence held out.

The last time we met Malmesbury at home in a league game was something of a special occasion, the last ever game at Rylands Way. The match report from that game is below. In recognition of the occasion of his hat-trick we were going to invite Steve Robertson along to tonight's game but we must thank Malmesbury for getting their first. Hopefully this evening will not be so memorable for Steve!

It may have taken 76 minutes for Wootton Bassett Town to break the deadlock in their final fixture at Rylands Way, but once they did they ensured a perfect ending to life at where they have called home for over three quarters of a century.

For when Steve Robertson steered Mark Barnes' elegant cross into the back of the net, it triggered a superb finish. Robertson, who came on as a substitute, bagged two more to complete an outstanding hat-trick, while the defence held out for a clean sheet, ensuring an emphatic 3-0 victory against local rivals Malmesbury Victoria.

That it capped a season in which Bassett finished in second in Hellenic League

Divison One West, thus securing promotion back to the Premier Division, made certain of a perfect night.

There could have been no better way to say goodbye.

In recent weeks Malmesbury had found their feet. And, despite their lowly league position, were able to keep Bassett in check during the game's early stages.

But when Robertson scored, something triggered inside Bassett. Soaking up the extra energy typically supplied when the floodlights are beaming, the hosts took control.

With five minutes remaining, Bassett's scorer tucked away an effort from the edge of the box. A minute later he raced onto a ball over the top before finishing coolly. Game over.

The stage was set for Bassett to leave Rylands Way in style. And they did. The ground has seen a huge amount over the years – both bad and good.

Its final swansong, fittingly, was nothing short of brilliant.





Late comeback snatches vital win

With their visit to Thornbury Town entering the closing stages, Royal Wootton Bassett Town appeared headed for a fourth defeat in their opening five Hellenic League Premier Division games. A poor first half display had seen Sam Collier's injury-ravaged side fall behind and, while on top for most of the second period, Bassett had been unable to get back on terms.

Their cause wasn't helped either by the fact that, with quarter of an hour to go, they were temporarily reduced to ten men after Ollie Case was sent to the sin bin. A further set back in what has been a highly frustrating opening month of the campaign in more ways than one appeared imminent. But salvation soon arrived.

On 80 minutes a defensive error from the home side presented Finn Hopkins with a golden opportunity, and the young forward kept his cool, producing a composed finish to make it 1-1. A point - though not the best outcome against a side who finished just outside of the relegation zone last season - would have been ideal and perhaps something that Bassett, still missing seven first team regulars, would have settled for.

Instead, Collier and his team wound up snatching all three points. With four minutes of the allotted 90 remaining the ball was worked out to Tom Moore on the wing and he fizzed in a low ball across the face of goal which a home defender could only turn into his own net. It was certainly an unfortunate way for Thornbury to lose. But Bassett will take the points, however they may ultimately have arrived.

Defeat would have left Bassett languishing in 16th place. With victory though they are up to 13th and, most importantly, back within touching distance of the upper reaches of the table despite the difficulties they have endured in the opening weeks of the campaign. Thornbury had led for the vast majority of the game and were certainly deservedly in front at the interval.

They went ahead after just 12 minutes, doing so in style. A neat move culminated with the ball being worked into the feet of Luke Franklin. After taking a touch to compose himself, he lashed an unstoppable effort from 25 yards out into the top corner beyond James Foster in the Bassett goal.

The hosts should then have doubled their advantage on 20 minutes. Sloppy play at the back saw Bassett turn over possession deep inside their own territory. Fraser Moss had an initial bite at the cherry. His shot was off target but fell to Isaac Adebo at the far post, who cut the ball back across goal for Callum Chalmers. Chalmers failed to connect with the goal at his mercy, but Ash Fowler still had a chance which he put wide.

Chalmers then headed narrowly wide from a Marcus Wormwell cross. By this point a quarter of the game had elapsed and Bassett were on the ropes. Finally getting into the match, they quietened the hosts before getting on top of proceedings after the restart.

Still that didn't seem as though it would be enough. However, even though a man short, Bassett swung things around with their vital late, late showing.



Four then became five in stoppage time as late substitute Grace Whitehouse steered home from another towering Jefferies corner.

A fine five goal performance and a place in the next round booked - it was pretty much the perfect way for Bassett to start their season.

Now to carry that form over into next week's league opener away at rivals Purton.

Wiltshire Senior League Premier Division Roundup 31 Aug

For the first time this season all 18 teams in the Premier Division of the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League were in action on a Saturday and the nine games produced a series of close games with four being decided by one goal margins. Letcombe and Kintbury Rangers, were both involved in close games which would be decided by a solitary goal. Letcombe were away at Kingsdown and goal just after the half hour mark from player-manager Luke Stone from a corner proved to be enough to take all three league points for the league leaders. Kingsdown fought hard to try and get back on level terms, but that equaliser eluded them as Letcombe's defence maintained a clean sheet in consecutive games and their sixth of the season in their eight league games to date.

It was another tight affair at Kintbury Rec where Trowbridge Town were Kintbury Rangers' visitors. Last season's two league encounters had seen the sides win their respective home games and Kintbury continued that trend with a second half goal scored by Jesse Bowers which was all that separated the sides at the final whistle. Kintbury remain two points behind Letcombe with a game in hand. Pewsey Vale lost ground on the two leaders when they were held to a 2-2 draw at home by Calne Town Res. After a tough start to the season Calne have now lost just once in their last five games as they took advantage of a Pewsey side who were not at their usual best in front of goal. Two goals from Jack Smith saw Calne take a 2-0 lead. but they were pegged back by strikes from Callum Ball and a 13th of the season from Josh Fowler to level matters up at 2-2. Pewsey created plenty of chances to have claimed the three points, but they were either wasted, or Pewsey saw young keeper Lewis Clark deny them with a string of excellent saves in a man of the match performance.

Melksham Town Res went into their game against Faringdon Town having won all of their games except the two fixtures against the two leading teams Letcombe and Kintbury Rangers. They made it three wins on the spin with a 3-1 victory with all four goals in the match coming in the second half. Melksham went in front almost straight after the interval and built up a 3-0 lead before Faringdon pulled one back late on through Kyle Bowyer. On target for Melksham were Kegan Smart and Liam Brooks, both netting their fourth goal of the season, and Aaron Masson who opened up his account for the season.

Wroughton sit one place and one point behind them after a 5-2 win over Larkhall Athletic Dev, two late goals for the home side making sure of all three points against a hard-working Larkhall side. The goals were shared around the Wroughton side with Jon Peachey-Score, Dan Grieve, Nathan Barbeto, Regan Cook and Ryan Major all scoring one apiece. There was another close affair at the GBSG where Royal Wootton Bassett Town Dev entertained Bemerton Heath Harlequins Res in a game switched to the 3G pitch. Both teams had a frustrating afternoon in a game that saw controversial sendings off on both sides and multiple cards being shown. For the home side the early sending off of the

influential Flynn Walters meant it was always going to be tough ask to get anything out of the game and in the end an early goal from Bemerton's Ryan Scott was all that separated the two sides.

Shrivenham Dev have had a tough start to the season and went into their home fixture with Malmesbury Vics Dev still looking for their first win of the season. Malmesbury have also had a tough start to the season and travelled to Shrivenham still looking for their first point of the season. It started well for the visitors, going in front on 21 minutes through Lewis King who got on the end of a cross from Tom Wynn Davis to fire Malmesbury in front. Shrivenham got themselves back on level terms just after the half hour mark following some sustained pressure on the Malmesbury goal, Brad Hirst netting his first goal in the Premier Division this season. Having restored parity, Shrivenham went in front four minutes later, Cody Frost capitalising on some sloppy defending to put Shrivenham 2-1 and it remained that way at the break. Shrivenham extended their lead within four minutes of the restart, Jacon Newdick, the young striker scoring his third goal of the campaign to give Shrivenham a 3-1 lead. Malmesbury Vics rallied and got themselves back in the game 17 minutes from time, Joe Tranter coming off the bench to net following a Matthew Jones long throw. Any hope of a comeback was ended though when Hirst bagged his second of the game to give Shrivenham a 4-2 win that saw them climb out of the relegation positions.

Salisbury Dev were once again unable to stage their home game at the Ray Mac but did secure the use of the 3G pitch at Bulford where they had played several games last season. It was to prove to be an excellent afternoon for the young Salisbury side as they picked up their second win of the season in an entertaining affair against Park United. Goals from Jeremiah Prempeh and Tom Farnsworth gave Salisbury a 2-0 lead, but Park came back strongly to level matters up at 2-2, only to see Naman Gurung restore Salisbury's lead. Park continued to press for an equaliser and did level matters up again at 3-3 only to see Omario Henry net a winner for the home side. Another close game settled by a single goal margin, a sixth of the season from Ben Pring plus further goals from Jamie Norman and Joe Lamb for Park in the 4-3 defeat.

Blunsdon have struggled to field their strongest side in midweek fixtures and have saved their best performances for Saturday's, picking up their second win of the season with a 2-0 home success over visitors Shrewton United with goals in the last minute of each half. Last season's leading scorer Danny Hale broke the deadlock on the stroke of half time and whilst Shrewton pushed for an equaliser they found Blunsdon keeper Luke Kuczynski in fine form and he denied the visitors on several occasions. Blunsdon finally made sure of the three points a minute from time, Freddie Painter scoring a second to finally end any chance of Shrewton taking something from the game. Blunsdon remained in the bottom four on goal difference but moved above both Royal Wootton Bassett Town Dev and Larkhall Athletic Dev.



emerged that the EFL

were ready to offer three promotion places to the National League as part of the "New Deal for Football" - the proposed financial reset resulting in more Premier League funding for the lower leagues, which instead ended in deadlock, squabbling, self-interest and silence.

When Wrexham and Notts County were embroiled in their record-breaking battle for the National League title in 2022-23, a light was shone on the inequity of a structure that grants only two promotion places to the National League, but four to League Two.

And there are still faint hopes, perhaps, that the forthcoming independent regulator can force the hand of the EFL to right this wrong, but there's no shying away from the fact that, in the fight for "three-up, threedown", momentum has ground to a standstill.

And yet it has become a familiar sight at this time of year to witness the National League's promoted clubs attacking League Two with the same sense of adventure that earned them a place in the Football League, despite the margins for error being gossamerthin and narrower than pretty much any other league on the planet.

Chesterfield and Bromley's starts to this season have been no different, with Paul Cook's buccaneering Spireites side sweeping aside Crewe, last season's League Two playoff finalists, with a 5-0 win at Gresty Road last weekend, and Bromley, thanks to the sharpshooting Michael Cheek, winning the opening two games of their first-ever EFL campaign.

That the teams joining League Two are good enough has never been in doubt. In the past ten seasons, the median finish for the National League champions and playoff winners has been 11th and 14th and, as I'm sure you are aware, no promoted team has been immediately relegated since the system of re-election came to an end in 1987.

It's not just fallen EFL giants like Bristol Rovers, Lincoln City, Tranmere Rovers, Wrexham, Notts County or Stockport who tend to hit the ground running, though: Harrogate Town and Sutton United thrived in their first season in League Two and, while gravity may pull them down eventually, to have won promotion from the National League you had to be a bloody good side.

This is the point. The status quo has shackled aspirational, dynamic clubs and rewarded mediocrity for far too long. For a change to be ratified, of course, there would need to be a vote of all 92 Premier League and EFL clubs, with 50% being the threshold for change. We've heard the line about "Turkeys voting for Christmas" enough already. Why should the National League be no more than a bargaining chip in money-hungry negotiations between the EFL and Premier League?

If you're reading these pages, you probably know that this has been a war decades in the waging. When automatic promotion and relegation was finally introduced between the old Fourth Division - now known as League Two — and non-league's top tier in 1986-87, Scarborough were the first non-league side to earn the right to play in the Football League via promotion, while Lincoln City became the first team to

be relegated from Division Four. The National League had to wait another 16 years for a second promotion place to open up to the winner of a playoff, and two decades later the division remains an outlier for no discernible reason.

I know all about the unique challenges of the National League. I played for Grimsby Town in two promotion chases in 2014-15 and 2015-16. The first year, we held onto the coat tails of Martin Allen's title-winning Barnet side until the death, before finishing third and losing on penalties to Bristol Rovers in the playoff final at Wembley. The next season we finished fourth, 21 points adrift of Gary Johnson's Cheltenham Town, 101-point haul whose made them deserving champions. This time in the playoff final we beat Forest Green Rovers, who had run Cheltenham closest, to secure a joyous promotion.

So I know that the margin between joy and despair adds to the drama and excitement of the league. I know, too, that the standard of football at the top end is far better than the lower end of League Two. You have to be woeful to be relegated from League Two; you have to be near-faultless to win automatic promotion from the National League.

Yet that disparity isn' healthy. It can't be right that teams like Gillingham, Colchester United and Stevenage have stunk out League Two in recent years, but were saved from relegation because of clubs like Oldham Athletic or Scunthorpe United withering under negligent regimes.

Broadening the promotion picture would not be diluting the excitement of the National League or the quality of League Two; on the contrary, it would improve the spectacle in non-league and standard of football in League Two — and reward success instead of failure.

Let's not forget how imbalanced the relationship between the leagues already is. Quite often, as the National League bids farewell to a successful, upwardly mobile club heading for League Two, it's inheriting a relegated side whose demise is the result of mismanagement that occurred while a member of the EFL.

And players like Cheek, who at 32 is embarking on his maiden League Two campaign, underline how fine the margins can be for players at this level of the game too. Cheek has scored bucket loads of goals in the National League for Chelmsford, Braintree, Dagenham & Redbridge, Ebbsfleet United and now Bromley. Last season he scored 26 times, including two in the playoff final against Solihull Moors, and a penalty in the allimportant shootout victory.

Yet despite a promise from Andy Woodman that he would make Cheek a Football League player one day, he must surely have begun to think that his chances of appearing in the EFL were fading in the rear-view

After scoring Bromley's first-ever Football League goal in the 2-0 win at Harrogate on the opening day, however. Cheek scored another in the win against AFC Wimbledon last weekend to show that he and his teammates — like many more in the National League deserve a fair chance step up and prove their worth at the next level.


