Welcome To Tonight's Game

GOOD AFTERNOON and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for what is our final home league game of the season in the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division, with Thornbury Town our visitors.

A warm welcome to all our visitors who have made the journey along the M4 from Bristol, we hope you enjoy your brief stay with us this afternoon and wish you a safe journey home.

After last week's results, which saw us drop two points away at Lydney whilst Highworth Town had secured an impressive 3-0 midweek away win at Hereford Pegasus, our play-off hopes are as good as over. Highworth, with their better goal difference, probably just need one more point from their final three games to secure that final play-off spot. Today sees them entertain league leaders Hartpury University so we may still be in with a theoretical chance come five o'clock this evening if we win today, but I would expect Highworth will get themselves over the line from their three remaining games.

If we are to miss out on a second consecutive season in the play-offs we should not be too disappointed as it has been another good season in the Premier Division for the club. We didn't get off to the best of starts, losing four of our opening six league fixtures, but credit to Sam and the lads for getting things back on track and putting us in with a chance right until the end of the season. I am sure Sam will reflect back on some points dropped late on in games, but equally we also picked up points with late goals and overall the league table does not lie come the end of the season and it looks like we will fall a few points short in the final analysis. It would be great to end on a winning note and our record against Thornbury is a good one with eight wins for Bassett and one draw from the nine previous meetings to date.

Since the last programme we have won twice, once in the league against Pershore

Town and once in the Marsh Challenge Cup against Longlevens, and drawn our other two league games against Worcester Raiders and Lydney Town. A match report on all four of these games is included in today's programme. The win in the cup against Longlevens sees us through to the Quarter Final stage where we are set to meet Clanfield 85 this coming Tuesday.

Last week saw the Development Team go mightily close to making the final of the prestigious Wiltshire Senior Cup, holding Wroughton to a 0-0 draw before finally losing in the penalty shootout, missing all three of the penalties that we took. A fantastic effort by Mark Simpkins side who must now pick themselves up from that disappointment and make sure they pick up enough points to preserve their Premier Division status in the Wiltshire Senior League. A match report on that semi final is again included in today's programme. The Development Team are home to Trowbridge Town this afternoon on the 3G.

The women's side returned to winning ways last Sunday with an excellent 4-2 away win at Cirencester Town on the 3G at the Corinium Stadium. The result was an important one as Cirencester are one of our main rivals for third place. Tomorrow the women take on another of their rivals for that third spot in Bath City. This game is again on the 3G with the main pitch set to stage the final of the Wiltshire Senior League's Ladies Cup between Bemerton Heath Harlequins and Highworth Town, a game arranged some time ago before the abandoned Bath City game had been rearranged for this Sunday.

Enjoy the game and hopefully a win for Bassett to round off another good league season here at the Sustain Stadium. Don't forget though that we are back here on Tuesday night for the Quarter Final tie in the Marsh Challenge Cup against Clanfield 85 as Sam looks to win that elusive first trophy as Bassett manager.

Thornbury Town

The exact date of the formation of the club is uncertain, but there are records of football being played in the late 1800s, with the first mention of "Thornbury Town" in 1898. Before the outbreak of World War I, Thornbury played in the Dursley & Wotton League, with records of games against Chipping Sodbury Town, Wickwar and Westbury Park. During this time Dr. E. M. Grace, elder brother of W G Grace, played for the team.

After the war, the club re-formed and joined the Bristol and Suburban League. The club played in what is now the upper end of The Castle School Sixth Form Playing Field, on a pitch surrounded by an iron fence. They used changing rooms at a social club on the High Street which is now the Thornbury branch of HSBC.

In 1933, multiple clubs in the area merged to form Thornbury Sports, later becoming Thornbury A.F.C., and later, Thornbury Town A.F.C. At the end of World War II, the club moved to its current home at the Mundy Playing Fields. After using various establishments for changing room facilities, a pavilion at the playing fields was built in 1964. After playing in the Bristol and District League, they became founding members of the Bristol Premier Combination, winning the league in the 1956–57 season.

In the 1968-69 season, the club became founding members of the Gloucestershire County League and in the following season recorded attendances in excess of 500 spectators. In 1971, the club was accepted into the Western Football League after finishing third in the County League. However, the Mundy Playing Fields didn't meet the requirements, therefore, the club remained in the County until their relegation to the Bristol Premier Combination in 1977.

The club returned to the Gloucestershire County League in 2002 after many steady, but unsuccessful, seasons in the Bristol Premier Combination, finally winning the title by 13 points. The club finally won their first County League title in 2009-10, but history repeated itself with the club unable to make the step up to a higher level due to lack of facilities at the Mundys. That summer, the local youth football team, Thornbury Falcons, merged with Thornbury Town in a bid to cement the long term tradition of developing local youth talent.

After the title winning season in 2009–10,

Thornbury Town struggled to repeat the success and went through multiple changes of management in the following seasons. Under the stewardship of Andy Davies, the club won the Les James League Cup for the first time beating league winners, Cheltenham Civil Service 1–0. That season the club also finished in a respectable 4th place, which they repeated for the next two seasons.

In 2017–18, the club finally improved on their three consecutive fourth-place finishes, winning the league for a second time. The club also completed the double by winning the Les James League Cup for a second time, beating Frampton United 1–0. Work behind the scenes by committee members, meant the club were also in a position to apply for promotion to Step 6 of the Non-League System after receiving planning permission for a 50-seater stand, floodlights and perimeter fencing. The club's application was successful and they were placed in the Hellenic Football League Division One West for the 2018-19 season. The improvements to the Mundy Playing Fields were officially opened by the Mayor of Thornbury, Shirley Holloway on Tuesday 23 October 2018 before Thornbury Town's Hellenic League Subsidiary Cup game against local rivals Tytherington Rocks, which they won 6-0. After staying in the race for the top spot until the final weeks, the club finished in a respectable 3rd place behind Easington Sports and Cheltenham Saracens. Thornbury also finished the season winning the league's Supplementary Cup, beating Wallingford Town 2-1 at the ASM Stadium in Thame.

Ahead of the 2019-20 season, manager Andy Davies announced he was stepping aside as first team manager to take a break from football management, ending Thornbury Town's most successful era. Former player Jason Rees and ex-Gloucester City player Gary Kemp were announced as the new management team.

On 12 July 2019, it was announced that the club would take part in the FA Cup and FA Vase for the first time in the club's history, falling at the first hurdle against Leighton Town in the FA Cup, whilst reaching the second round in the FA Vase. In Season 2020-21 Thornbury sat second in the table in Division One West when the season was curtailed and that was sufficient to enable them to be promoted to the Hellenic Premier for the first time.

Fourth straight win sees Bassett scale the heights

**Royal Wootton Bassett Town 2
Thornbury Town 0**

Saturday 4th September 2021

A 2-0 home triumph against Thornbury Town - Royal Wootton Bassett Town's fourth straight league win - saw Sam Collier's side reach the heady heights of second place in the Hellenic League Premier Division.

The season may still be in its embryonic stages, but the omens are so far proving very good for Bassett, who have now recorded 14 points from their opening seven league fixtures. Indeed, that points haul represents Bassett's best start to a Hellenic Premier campaign after seven matches.

The coming weeks are set to be a big test of Bassett's credentials though. The team's next three league fixtures pit them against sides - Brimscombe and Thrupp, Bishop's Cleeve and Bradford Town - who can all leapfrog Bassett if they win the games in hand which they possess. They then finish September with a visit to Roman Glass St George - who inflicted Bassett's sole league defeat so far.

But having points on the board ahead of such a tough run of games is an ideal position to be in. And the pressure will be on those teams to claim a result that will taken them back above Bassett and give them hope of staying in touch with current pacesetters Cribbs.

Bassett's latest triumph - their second against Thornbury so far this season after a 4-0 victory in the Emirates FA Cup - was a relatively comfortable one.

It was sealed courtesy of Alan Griffin's brace, with the in-form forward netting for the fifth consecutive game.

His first came from the penalty spot six minutes before half time as he coolly tucked the ball away into the bottom left corner, out of reach of Thornbury 'keeper Kurtis Parkin who did manage to guess correctly.

Griffin's second arrived a matter of minutes later. Having rattled the crossbar, he spun and finished decisively to give his side a commanding half time lead that they would not relinquish.

It may still be very early in the season. But a fourth straight win, another clean sheet and a record start all offer reasons for optimism.

The test now is to keep that streak going.

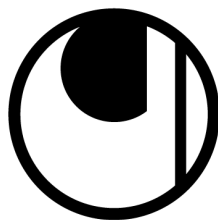
Jordan Sheen and Declan Morley-Lyne ensured a share of the points.



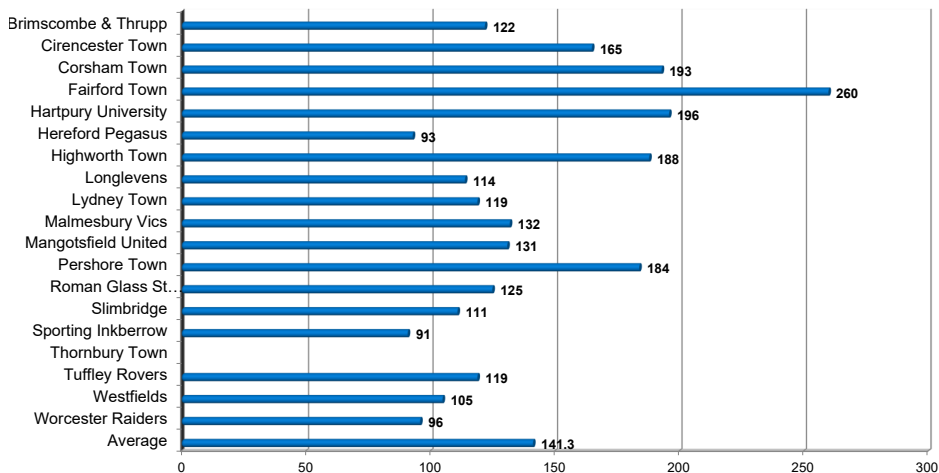

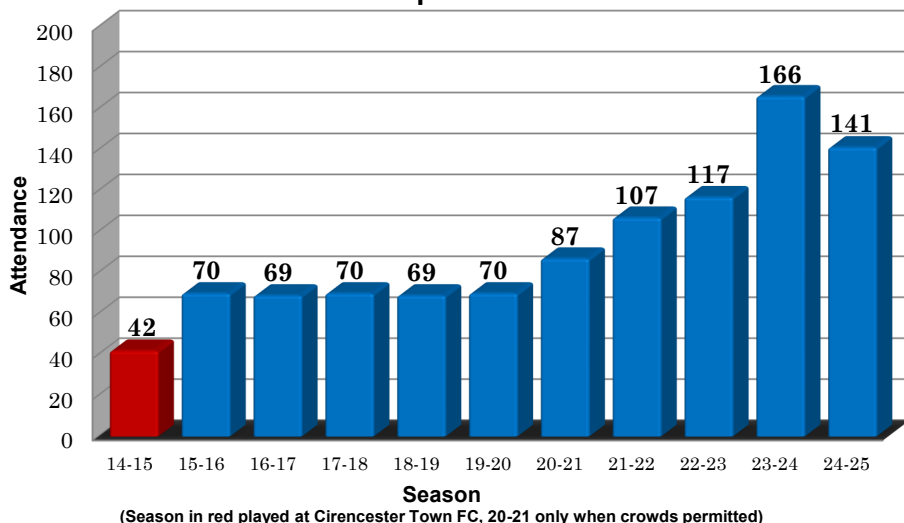

Royal Wootton Bassett Town and Worcester Raiders played out a 1-1 draw at the Sustain Stadium - a result that doesn't do either side too much of a favour in the tense race for the Hellenic League Premier Division playoffs.

Bassett had led midway through the first half when, from twenty yards out, Brad Pagliaroli whipped a stunning free kick into the top right corner. A phenomenal set piece, the Bassett forward left a despairing, helpless Charlie Emery in the Raiders goal absolutely no chance to keep the ball out.

Bassett cling on after cup drama

Having led 4-0, Royal Wootton Bassett Town survived a seemingly impossible comeback attempt from Longlevens, hanging on for a 4-3 victory to reach the last eight of the Marsh Challenge Cup. First half goals from Dan Grieve, Ollie Pitt, Bailey Gallagher and Alfie Presley seemingly put Bassett in total control of the tie. Even though the hosts pulled one back before the break through Monty New, Sam Collier's side sensed little real danger. Bassett should have been out of sight. Indeed, 4-1 up, most would have been forgiven for thinking they were. However, after the break it was a different matter.

New grabbed his second shortly before the hour and doubt started to creep in to the Bassett ranks. Sam Kelly then added a third and it was now anyone's game. Fortunately though, that seventh goal would be the final one of an exhilarating, dramatic, nerve-jangling encounter.

It certainly didn't have to be like that. But Bassett have the tendency to make things difficult for themselves when they don't necessarily need to be. Bassett had led after just six minutes. Grieve timed his run perfectly to beat the offside trap and latch onto a Presley through ball before coolly slotting home.

The opening thirty minutes were relatively evenly contested though with both teams showing well. But Bassett's second on the half hour seemed to tip the tie firmly in the visitors' favour. Taking advantage of a rare start, Pitt finally broke his Bassett duck as he curled a fine left-footed effort into the top corner from the edge of the box. That was the first of a quickfire three goal salvo. Bassett's third arrived five minutes later in controversial fashion. In the process of delivering a cross from the right, Gallagher was fouled with the referee blowing his whistle. However, the ball sailed over Longlevens' keeper Kane Winman and into the net and, rather than proceed with the free kick as might have been expected, the man in black gave the goal. Longlevens were furious. Given what was to come, Bassett were delighted with the decision.

There was no doubting the validity of Bassett's fourth. A clever move down the right ended with Grieve being felled in the box. Leading scorer Presley was on hand to take the penalty and duly made no mistake. 4-0 Bassett - surely that was game over? Longlevens did manage to get on the scoresheet before the break as Alex Knight blocked Dan Brabham's attempted clearance and the ball fell to New who fired into the net. A somewhat fortuitous goal, Bassett probably thought little of it.

Indeed, while the performance level dropped after an outstanding first half display, Bassett were troubled little early in the second half. In fact Bassett came close to reclaiming their four goal lead when Grieve narrowly headed over from a Pitt cross. But Longlevens soon made it 4-2 as New headed in from Jack Byard's cross. At this point Bassett started to flag even more. They still had chances, Brad Pagliaroli volleying wide shortly after Kelly had come close at the other end. However, it was Longlevens making most of the running. And with twelve minutes left Kelly took advantage of some slack defending after a cross into the box to steal in and make it 4-3. The hosts were then left to rue failing to capitalise on opportunities to find an improbable equaliser. Kelly rushed an effort that went straight at Brabham when well placed. Bassett's blushes were then spared by assistant manager Alan Griffin, who - on as a substitute - was forced to clear off the line after Knight had seemingly got the better of Brabham.

Pagliaroli came close to settling Bassett's now furiously jangling nerves when he sent a free kick just wide of the post in the first minute of stoppage time. One final chance then fell Longlevens' way when Brabham came up empty hand as he sought to claim a 95th minute corner. Fortunately though, the danger was cleared. In cup football, you'll take a win, regardless of how it comes about.

Given the position they were in, Bassett will have hoped to have sailed through. Instead, they reach the quarter finals by the skin of their teeth.

That will all be forgotten by the time their last eight tie kicks off though. Now is the time to think positively and to fix the eyes on the prize - Bassett are 180 minutes of football away from a cup final.

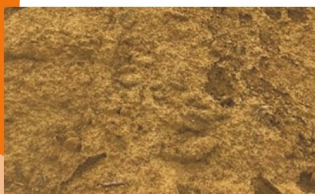

Bassett outlast Ciren in derby six-pointer

Shortly after Kelly Nightingale headed in a Laura Jefferies corner at the far post to give the visitors their first two goal advantage of the afternoon.

There was more action to come. Cirencester's Anna Margetts shot wide from a free kick in a dangerous position while Brooks - heading straight at Law from a Jefferies corner - and Elliott - striking over after build up play involving Brooks and Honor Fraser - came close for Bassett.

Brooks then had another effort that Law was equal to before Jodie Bailey twice shot off target for the hosts.

The final stages saw half chances for both sides, but no further goals as Bassett secured what could be a crucial three points as the teams battle for position.

Another important fixture awaits next week against fifth place Bath City. A win for Bassett will extend their advantage to seven points, while the Romans will be aiming to narrow the gap to a single point.

The big game of the week was the semi final of the prestigious Wiltshire Senior Cup, the oldest of the Wiltshire FA cup competitions which includes Swindon Town and virtually all of the top clubs in Wiltshire amongst its previous winners. The semi final tie was at Swindon Supermarine and saw Premier Division sides Wroughton and Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development up against each other. It would prove to be a game of limited chances with the two sides very much cancelling each other out over the 90 minutes. The chances that came the way of each side generally involved their leading scorers, Wroughton's Jonathan Peachey-Score and Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development's Flynn Walters, either in the build-up play or in the final attempt at goal.

It was the relegation threatened Royal Wootton Bassett who created the early first half chances. A free kick from Walters causing problems in the Wroughton defence but nobody was able to get a clear shot on goal and the danger was cleared by the Wroughton back line. Next up a move down the right flank saw the ball played into Wroughton box, eventually reaching the feet of Mani Mesas, who held the ball up before laying it back to Afonso Ferreira but he scuffed his shot which ended up going well wide of the post. At the other end Peachey-Score was off target with the first real chance that came his way, a ball over the top from Max Scholefield found him on the left-hand side of the opposition box, Peachey-Score cutting in before hitting a shot which sailed high and wide of the goal. Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development full back Oliver Smith was the next to have a sight of goal, the ball falling to him after a challenge from Walters on the edge of the Wroughton box, but his low shot was another that went well wide without troubling Wroughton keeper Luke Kuczynski.

The last real chance of the first half once again involved Peachey-Score, a ball from the right from Kassa Anderson finding Peachey-Score on the edge of the box, he

turned his defender before firing a shot straight at keeper Adam House who was well positioned to pull off the save and then see his defence clear the ball to safety.

The first real chance of the second half fell to Wroughton, a short pass from Anderson finding Aaron Maximen on the edge of the box and his turn and shot saw the ball just go the wrong side of the post as it remained 0-0. At the other end Kuczynski did well to punch a close range effort from Jonny Aitkenhead from the edge of the six-yard box over the bar. The closest either side went to finding the back of the net in 90 minutes came when a quick break out from defence saw Peachey-Score get away from the Royal Wootton Bassett Town defence before forcing House into an excellent save to push the ball away to safety. Another half chance at the other end saw George Staten put Walters in the clear but a great recovering tackle just before he prepared to pull the trigger once again ensured it remained 0-0 and the final whistle meant penalties would be needed to decide matters.

Wroughton had beaten Amesbury Town in the Second Round in a penalty shootout and once again demonstrated their proficiency from 12 yards, whilst nerves possibly got the better of their opponents. George Lance, Royal Wootton Bassett Town's usual penalty taker hit the post with his effort. Peachey-Score then followed and the Wroughton striker made no mistake firing high into the top corner of the net giving House no chance. Mani Mesas then saw his spot kick saved by Wroughton keeper Kuczynski and when Max Scholefield made no mistake with penalty number two for Wroughton the pressure was on Walters to make sure he kept his side in the contest, but he fired way over, meaning if Wroughton scored their third they would be through. Experienced campaigner and Wroughton legend Shane Hibbert took the responsibility and fired home to send Wroughton into their second Wiltshire Senior Cup final in three seasons where they will meet the winner of this coming week's semi final between Warminster Town and Devizes Town. Congratulations to Wroughton and commiserations to Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development after a valiant effort. Their attentions must now turn to retaining their Premier Division status in their remaining league games.

IT'S approaching 15 years since the birth of Non-League Day. Inspired by a pre-season trip to Devon to watch Queens Park Rangers play at Tavistock, visionary James Doe set it up initially as a social experiment and the rest, as they say, is history. Now, Non-League Day, scheduled to coincide with an international break, has now grown to become an annual part of the football calendar, backed by Premier League and Football League clubs, MPs, celebrities, media organisations, charities and the like. But most importantly, it's been embraced by the clubs and fans themselves with the occasion providing a platform for clubs to showcase affordable volunteer-led community football, while offering supporters of Premier League or Championship clubs the chance to get their football fix by supporting their local side.

This week in The NLP, columnist Gregor Robertson told how amid plans of new £2bn super stadiums and ever-increasing ticket prices at the top level, the fans are feeling disillusioned and exploited as the elite game changes beyond recognition.

"These fans feel their game is being taken away from them," Gregor said. "Profit has become a greater incentive than sporting adventure.

"Football in this country has never been so popular. Crowds in England are at their highest for half a century. That's just as true in Non-League football.

"But I can't help feeling that elite football on these shores is being ripped away from the places and communities where it was founded.

So as we approach the 16th annual Non-League Day, a platform conceived to promote the value of community football, a prediction: the trickle of marginalised Premier League fans we've seen converge at local Non-League games? That's only the beginning.

"Don't be surprised to bump into more of these fans at your local club, this weekend and beyond."

Indeed, it may well be that some of those disillusioned and exploited supporters of Premier League clubs are reading this very article right now, stood on the terraces of their local club experiencing life on 'the other side'. The 3pm kick-offs, realistic ticket prices, the ability to stand (and enjoy a pint) anywhere in the ground and guaranteed a warm welcome by volunteers who run their clubs for a love of the game. What's not to like?

As the years go by, Non-League Day becomes increasingly prominent in the calendar with clubs

making the most of their place in the spotlight by putting on a host of special events, ticket promotions and charitable initiatives. Clubs like Ascot United, who are hosting a St Patrick's Day special when they host Isthmian South Central leaders Farnham Town. Fans wearing Irish fancy dress will get half-price admission, while the bar is open late for 30 per cent off a pint of Guinness.

Elsewhere, Altrincham are urging fans to Paint The Town Red for Non-League Day when they host National League leaders Barnet. Starting at 12.30pm ahead of their televised 5.30pm kick-off, the Robins are putting on a number of shows and activities including a children's penalty shootout, a children's entertainer and football freestyler Jay Rosa, along with various stalls and a raffle for an Athletic Bilbao shirt, in aid of Prostate Cancer UK. The Premier League trophy is also getting in on the act, visiting no fewer than three Essex Senior League grounds for the league groundhop, appearing at Benfleet FC (12pm), Buckhurst Hill (3pm) and then Takeley (7.45pm).

Abingdon United are hosting a Retro Shirt Day for their visit of Bewdley Town with anyone wearing a pre-2012 shirt getting half-price entry, while live music from Jason Rampling and a performance by The Twilight Twirlers precedes AFC Sudbury's visit of Redditch United. Three Bridges are using the event to formally open their new 3G pitch, while Harwich & Parkeston will be continuing their 150th anniversary celebrations with a historic town visit, followed by a tour of the club's Royal Oak ground.

Charities too will be supported with Prostate Cancer UK the chosen beneficiary of a number of clubs on the day, while Non-League Day's extra mission this year focuses on encouraging people to give blood, led by former Non-League stalwart Francis Duku, the former Dulwich Hamlet, Ebbsfleet, Bromley and Lewes defender.

And this year, Non-League Day have joined forces with the Seventy7 Group in providing a fully managed social media campaign, creative assets, and advertising support to boost awareness and attendances on the day. The Seventy7 Group are encouraging attendees to share their Non-League Day experience on Instagram for a chance to win £150 worth of football prizes. Simply upload a photo of your NLD experience on Instagram, use the hashtag #NLD2025 and follow @nonleagueday_uk with a £50 voucher for mystery football kits and £100 to spend with their local club.

With so much going on up and down the country, it promises to be another Non-League Day to remember. It's a time to embrace semi-professional and grassroots football and of course the volunteers who work tirelessly behind the scenes to keep your local club at the heart of the community. Now that's got to be worth celebrating.
