Men's First Team Bassett Bulletin

Welcome To Tonight's Game

GOOD EVENING and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Worcester Raiders.

A warm welcome to all our visitors who have made the long journey from Worcester, we hope you enjoy your brief stay with us this evening and wish you a safe journey home. I am not sure why this game needs to be in midweek given that we have just five league games to go and our opponents have just the four games to play and we are still in February, but I am pleased it is not us that are being inconvenienced with this midweek fixture.

Both teams are very much still in the play-off picture after both recorded wins on Saturday. Whilst we were defeating Cirencester Town 2-1 on the 3G at the Corinium Stadium, tonight's opponents were winning 3-0 at home against Slimbridge. Raiders sit just one place and two points below us in the league table and for both sides this is a game that needs to be won if either of the two sides is to break into those play-off spots.

Unfortunately, our record against Worcester Raiders is not a particularly good one with just one win in the previous five meetings, with three defeats and one drawn game. The three defeats include a narrow defeat away at Worcester earlier this season, Worcester winning 2-1 back in November. We will certainly be looking to avenge that defeat here this evening and improve our record against tonight's opponents.

On other matters you will note that our Marsh Challenge Cup tie against Longlevens will now be an away fixture despite us initially having been drawn at home. Unfortunately the Hellenic League scheduled the game for Saturday 1st March when we are scheduled to host the final of the Wiltshire County FA Junior Cup, a date fixed in the diary at the start of the season. As the Fixture Secretary of the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League I had certainly been notified of the cup final by the club and I am sure the Hellenic League would have been similarly notified. Playing the Longlevens game in midweek, say next Tuesday, would have

made a lot more sense than tonight's game. I am sure Sam is frustrated in having to give up home advantage in these circumstances.

It was a bad week for the Development side last week with both their two fixtures being lost, making it three defeats in a row having also lost to Melksham Town Reserves a fortnight ago. On Wednesday night on a difficult pitch at Malmesbury they certainly created enough chances to have won the game easily but they lacked a clinical touch in front of goal and went down to a 2-1 defeat which could prove very costly come the end of the season.

This was followed with a 2-0 defeat on Saturday at the hands of Kingsdown with again several good chances being squandered. Mark Simpkins side now sit just above the relegation zone but have played more games than the teams below them and have a tricky run in with games against second placed Shrivenham, third placed Letcombe, Pewsey Vale, Wroughton and Trowbridge Town to come in their next five fixtures. They finish with games against the two Salisbury based sides and will probably need all six points from those two games to survive as well as getting some points from those five fixtures against the sides at the top end of the table.

The Ladies secured an important win on Sunday, a solitary goal from Laura Jefferies giving them a 1-0 home win over a much improved Corsham Town side. The win for Bassett saw the Ladies move above Cirencester Town into third spot in the table behind champions elect Gloucester City and Bitton. The Ladies are now just a point behind Bitton with both sides having played 14 games with eight to go to complete the season. Both teams still have Gloucester City to play in their final eight games but Bassett still have a great chance of securing runners-up spot if they can keep producing wins against the rest of the sides in the division.

Enjoy tonight's game and hopefully we will be celebrating three more points to keep us in the hunt for the play-offs.

New Head of Senior Section

Royal Wootton Bassett Town are pleased to announce that Rab MacLeod will be joining the club's Executive Committee as Head of Men's Section.

Someone who is no stranger to Bassett, Rab MacLeod has previously served as a coach within the club's youth section as well as for the Development team. He takes over the role from Paul Davis who is stepping down as he will be relocating to Dubai to live and work.

Serving in the role since the 2019-20 season, his tenure coincided with the club's senior Men's team enjoying significant success.

During that time the Men's First Team have - under the management of Sam Collier recorded back-to-back top five Hellenic League Premier Division finishes, reached the 2023-24 Hellenic Premier Division playoff final, reached the FA Vase third round on three occasions and matched the club's best ever FA Cup run by reaching the second qualifying round. Meanwhile, in 2021-22 the Development team won the Wiltshire League Premier Division with Steve Yeardeley as manager.

Commenting on the change, Chairman Paul Gerrish said:

"On behalf of the club, I'd like to express sincere thanks to Paul for all his efforts over the past few years and we wish him all the best with his new adventure in Dubai."

Host families sought for FC 's-Gravenzande visit in April

Royal Wootton Bassett Town are delighted to be welcoming our friends from FC 's-Gravenzande to England in April. This will be the first visit from FC 's-Gravenzande since an exchange in 2017 and we look forward to reciprocating the fantastic hospitality they provide to our youth teams on an annual basis as part of the club's long-established Holland Tour.

FC 's-Gravenzande's Under 14 and 15 Boys' sides and their Under 15 Girls' team will be visiting from Thursday 24 to Sunday 27 April. 45 youth players are due to be part of their tour party along with 15 adults (including two women). To help with the trip, the club are seeking families willing to host and provide accommodation for our visitors. In total, around thirty host families are sought, each of which will be required to bed and breakfast for at least two people. Based on the planned itinerary, this requirement will involve providing bed and breakfast to guests for three nights, as well as dropping off and collecting them from the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground each morning and evening of their trip. Host families will also be invited to attend a social evening at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground on Friday 25 April, which is to follow games between RWBTFC and our visitors from FC 's-Gravenzande.

This is a fantastic opportunity to host our partner club. And we hope that we will be able to find sufficient host families to provide our visitors with excellent hospitality and create memories that will last a lifetime - just as our Dutch friends do when we visit as part of the Holland Tour. Today's Opponents

Worcester Raiders

Worcester Raiders were formed in 2001 as a youth club, joining the Worcester & District Football League in 2010 upon the formation of a senior side. In 2013, Worcester Raiders joined the West Midlands (Regional) League Division Two, gaining promotion in their first season in the National League System. In 2019, Worcester Raiders won Division One, gaining promotion to the Premier Division. Worcester Raiders entered the FA Vase for the first time in 2020–21. At the end of the 2020–21 season the club were transferred to Division One of the Hellenic League as part of the FA's restructuring of the National League System.

In the 2021–22 season, Worcester Raiders finished second behind Studley F.C. in Division 1 of the uHlsport Hellenic League. Despite a 3-0 loss to Hereford Pegasus F.C. in the playoff final, Worcester Raiders were promoted to the Premier Division of the Hellenic League following the closure of Walton Casuals F.C. in the Southern League Premier South, leading to the reprieve for Merthyr Town and Cinderford Town A.F.C. The result was Worcester were promoted to the Hellenic Premier as runner-up in that play-off.

Worcester Raiders initially played at Claines Lane. On 29 July 2020, English Premiership rugby union club Worcester Warriors confirmed Worcester Raiders would move into Sixways Stadium, with Worcester Warriors' co-owners Colin Goldring and Jason Whittingham becoming joint majority owners of Worcester Raiders in the process. In September 2022 the future of the club was left uncertain after the gates to their ground were locked, as a result of Worcester Warriors' financial problems. This effectively left Worcester Raiders homeless with nowhere to play their home matches. However, it was later confirmed that the Raiders had reached an agreement with the Warriors' administrators to remain at Sixways.

Worcester Raiders had a successful first season in the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division securing a fourth place finish sandwiched between two Wiltshire Clubs Corsham Town and Royal Wootton Bassett Town. Season 2023-24 was not quite as successful with Raiders slipping down to 10th place in the final table some 13 points adrift of the play-off places.

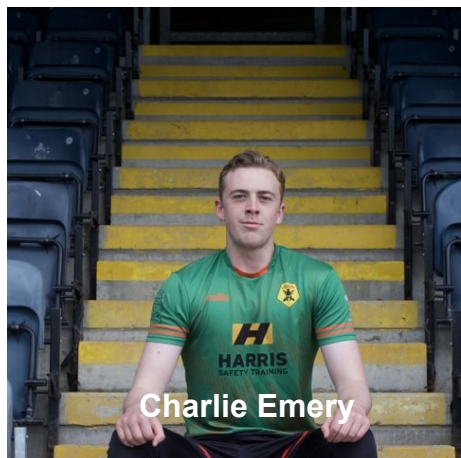

Resilient Bassett rattle Raiders late to claim point

A Time and again this season, Royal Wootton Bassett Town's resilience has stood out as the team's defining characteristic. Unlike in previous years, so far this campaign there has never been a time when Sam Collier's side have been out of a game - even when they have fallen behind.

And that strength was again on show in Bassett's first ever meeting with Worcester Raiders.

After last week's clash with Westfields, this was another tough engagement with the Raiders opening the afternoon in third.

But Bassett - without centre halves Adam Corcoran and Dave Bampton through suspension as well as Matt Bennett, Scott Chilcott, Jack Hobson-McVeigh and Chris Taylor - dug deep, producing another solid display to earn a point.

They did so the hard way too, twice coming from behind in an entertaining 2-2 draw.

Bassett should arguably have been ahead though as Gio Wrona managed to rattle the bar with the goal at his mercy early on after great interplay between Tommy Ouldrige and Matt Jones.

Worcester soon capitalised on that miss, taking the lead through Jordan Murphy who slotted home from Jade Ferron's fizzing low cross.

While plugging away at the Worcester back line and dealing with what the dangerous Raiders threw at them, it took until midway through the second half for Bassett to draw level for the first time. After Ouldrige won a free kick inside the visitors' half, Jones teased in a delivery which Landon Golding,

having lost his marker, met with a glancing header into the corner of the net.

Raiders then made it 2-1 as Joe Billingham was on hand to tap in after Matt Crowther could only parry from Murphy's shot on the turn.

That meant Bassett were again forced to dig deep.

But, with time winding down, they snatched the equaliser and point they deserved in some style.

Veteran Alan Griffin drew a foul around 30 yards from goal, and Jones stepped over the ball. Catching Raiders 'keeper Ryan Young off guard, the left footer steered a delightful low curler around the wall and into the bottom left corner.

It was a fine strike - and one that earned another important, valuable result against one of the division's fancied sides.

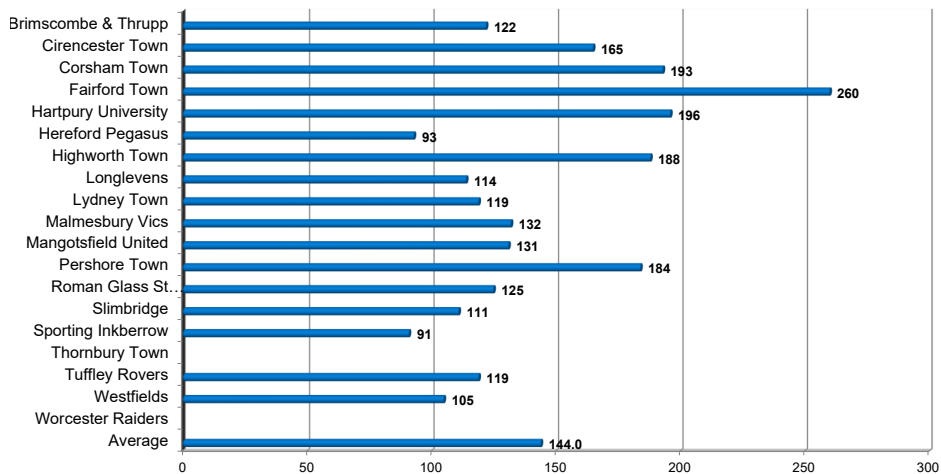

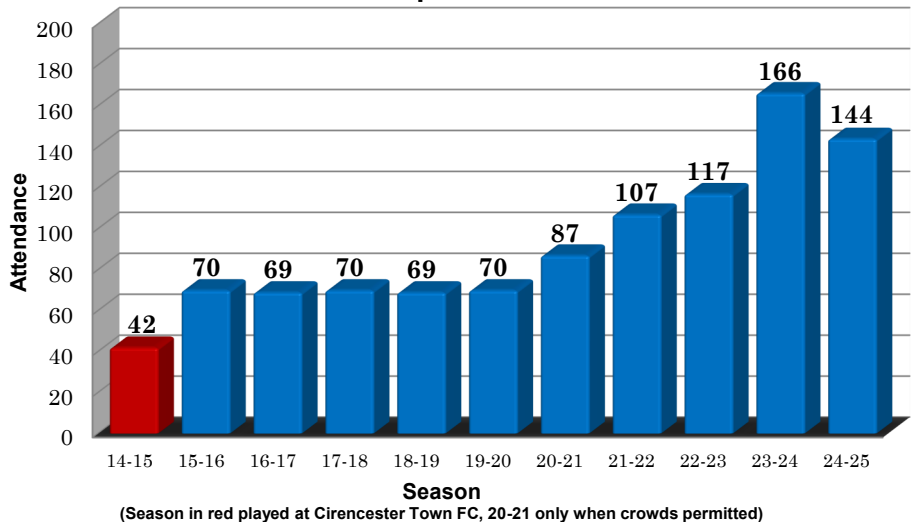

Grieve treble delivers vital derby double

A Dan Grieve hat trick propelled Royal Wootton Bassett Town to an emphatic - and important - 4-1 derby victory at home against Highworth Town as Sam Collier's side completed a season sweep of their rivals.

Following on from last weekend's hard fought triumph at Fairford Town, Bassett produced the goods in their second consecutive must-win derby against fellow Hellenic League Premier Division playoff contenders.

And Grieve has played a decisive role in both games, scoring twice against Fairford before putting on a masterclass in finishing against the Wothians.

Bassett benefited from the fact that Highworth had to play the best part of 75 minutes with ten men as Sol Pryce received a pair of bookings in the opening 15 minutes of the match. He was already walking a tightrope after just nine minutes when he picked up an extremely soft yellow card for a foul. While that was a harsh decision, a few minutes later the forward daftly earned another for kicking the ball away - leading to him being sent for a very early bath and putting his side at a serious disadvantage.

And Bassett would punish Pryce for his indiscipline, ensuring they made the extra man pay.

From the resulting free kick, Bassett were in front as Alfie Presley found the net in style. Receiving a pass from Brad Pagliaroli, Grieve set the ball back to Presley and, after taking one touch to control, Bassett's leading scorer spun a fine 25 yard effort into the bottom right corner.

The scores were soon level. Former Bassett star Sam Packer was frustrated to see a shot tipped around the post by debutant Dan Brabham. But from the resulting corner he rose highest to glance a header home from a Rhys Wells corner.

But Grieve put Bassett back in front shortly before the half hour mark. A sloppy passage of play saw both sides give the ball away. But eventually Pagliaroli was able to break down the right and he passed inside to Presley, who - returning the earlier favour he received - set the ball back to Grieve who coolly steered into the bottom corner from the edge of the box.

He then made it 3-1 shortly after the restart. A sliced clearance from Wells went straight to Kyle Witt and he headed into the path of Grieve, who deftly guided a low left foot shot into the net from twelve yards.

He completed his hat trick to condemn Highworth to a heavy defeat with quarter of an hour to go. His seventh goal in Bassett colours since signing from Chipping Sodbury Town in December was another demonstration of his finishing ability.

Jack Hobson-McVeigh picked out Grieve on the edge of the box with a superb line breaking pass. With his back to goal and closely guarded by Dan Comer, a fine turn from Grieve sat the Highworth defender on his backside, and - with the help of a deflection - his well struck shot found the net.

The damage could then have been even greater, but Highworth had 'keeper Connor Johns to thank for sparing them even more pain as he kept out Witt as well as two efforts from Presley with assured saves late on. The result ensures Bassett stay alive in the playoff race. Defeat would have seen Collier's team slip nine points behind the fifth place Worthians - a deficit that would surely have been insurmountable with just six games left.

Instead the gap is now three points - though Highworth still have a game in hand to play.

With their victory, Bassett made sure Highworth now will be under significant pressure not to slip up. And next up for the Worthians a derby date with Fairford in what will be a do or die game for the Cinder Lane side.

For Bassett, it's the case that they have to keep winning - and hope that Highworth and Pershore Town drop points.

Pershore, who Bassett are still to visit, were held away at strugglers Lydney Town. Bassett are therefore now level on points with the Plums - albeit having played a game more with a far inferior goal difference.

Barring disastrous late collapses, Mangotsfield United, Sporting Club Inkberrow and Roman Glass St George seem on course for three of the playoff spots (assuming favourites Hartpury University claim the title).

Bassett, thanks to this big derby win, are still in the mix for the final spot..

Bassett narrow the gap with latest derby win

Royal Wootton Bassett Town moved back within just one point of a place in the Hellenic League Premier Division top five after a 2-1 derby win at Cirencester Town kept their playoff push on track.

While 15th in the table, Cirencester have been on a strong run of late, winning four - including away at second place Mangotsfield United, drawing one and losing one in their last six league games.

Sam Collier and his side therefore knew that a tough encounter was going to be in store. But Bassett held their nerve to notch another big three points in the playoff race.

The visitors led early after being awarded a sixth minute penalty for a handball in the box. The ice cool Jack Hobson-McVeigh stepped up to the mark and stroked the ball home to put Bassett ahead.

Bassett were in front for just quarter of an hour though. Shortly after seeing a header well saved by Dan Brabham, Cirencester captain Aidan Bennett got the better of the Bassett 'keeper to cap a well worked move.

After an evenly matched opening period, the teams ultimately went into the break level.

But Bassett would strike what proved to be the decisive goal shortly after the restart as a Kyle Witt strike took a deflection and found its way past Ronnie Newberry.

Bassett then saw out the remainder of the game, the defence offering Cirencester little as the home side struggled to muster a response after going behind again.

Bassett certainly did what they had to do - win. And to make the afternoon even better, results elsewhere went their way.

Pershore Town's defeat against Tuffley Rovers means Bassett move into sixth, three points ahead of the Plums (who do still have a game in hand).

Indeed Pershore slipped to eighth - beneath Worcester Raiders who Bassett host on Tuesday.

More importantly, Bassett also closed the gap on Highworth Town - who currently occupy the fifth and final playoff spot - after the Worthians were held to a 1-1 draw by Fairford Town. Highworth's advantage over Bassett is now just one point. They do, like Pershore, have a game in hand to play, but the pressure is building.

What is clear is that the final few weeks of the season will be full of intrigue with plenty of twists and turns to come.

Adding to the drama is the number of games the contenders for fifth still have to play against each other (assuming Hartpury University, Mangotsfield, Roman Glass St George and Sporting Club Inkberrow lock down the top four spots).

After hosting Raiders, Bassett visit Pershore.

Highworth still have Pershore and leaders Hartpury University to play.

In addition to Bassett and Highworth, the Plums' final six games also see them face Hartpury and Mangotsfield.

Raiders and Fairford may fancy their chances too - and still have to face each other.

Fairford also must take on Sporting Club Inkberrow and Roman Glass St George.

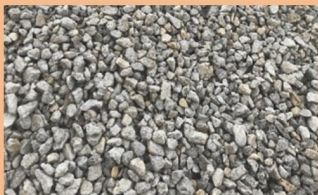

The home side created the better chances in the opening half but a combination of some wayward finishing and some excellent saves from the Kingsdown keeper Lewis Simmonds saw them fail to find the back of the net. The visitors Josh Atwell showed them how to do

it though when he put the visitors in front, getting on the end of a cross from the right to volley home to give his side a 1-0 lead. After the break Kingsdown upped their game and went further in front when Atwell, chasing a lost cause, beat his defender to the ball and squared to Antonio Gerrish who fired into the far corner of the net for 2-0. The win for Kingsdown saw them climb up to fifth place in the table. For the home side that is now three defeats in a row and results elsewhere saw them slip a place in the table and they are now just above the relegation zone and in serious danger of the drop with the sides below them in the table all having games in hand. beaten opponents but having played more games than all the sides above them in the table.

Wednesday 19 February 2025

**Malmesbury Vics Dev 2
Royal W. Bassett Town Dev 1**

There was a vital game in midweek at Malmesbury where Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development made the short journey along the B4042 to take on Malmesbury Vics Development. When the sides had met back in October a late Flynn Walters goal had given Royal Wootton Bassett Town the three points and they were looking to complete a league double to ease their relegation fears.

The game started on what was already a heavy Malmesbury pitch at the Flying Monk, with the pitch having staged a first team game the previous night, and heavy rain in the second half on Wednesday made the difficult conditions even worse for both sides. It was the visitors Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development who created the early chances, Dale Richards forcing a save from the Malmesbury keeper Rhys Simpkins as early as the second minute. Richards should have put the visitors 1-0 up ten minutes in when presented with a golden chance from just six yards out but somehow, he managed to fire over the bar when it looked easier to score, and it remained 0-0. Three minutes later Richards set up Flynn Walters for another good chance but the visitors leading scorer saw his shot deflected for a corner. It was not all one-way traffic though and at the other end a long throw into the box from Ciaran Lyon caused all kinds of problems in the visitors defence but it was eventually cleared in what was Malmesbury's best chance of the half.

Eight minutes before the break Walters once again went close for Royal Wootton Bassett Town Dev but his shot from distance went just wide of the post and the teams turned round at the break at 0-0 and all to play for.

Ten minutes into the second half Malmesbury were nearly gifted an opener by the Royal Wootton Bassett Town keeper Dan West, his miskick going straight to Sam Parker but Parker's shot towards an empty net went just the wrong side of the post. Malmesbury went close again a minute later, Rob Collier getting clean through on goal, but his powerfully hit shot went over the bar. At the other end Walters went close to

breaking the deadlock on 64 minutes when a ball over the top saw him through in on goal, but Simpkins saved with his feet to prevent the home side from going behind.

A goal was coming though and five minutes later the deadlock was broken, and it was to be the home side who got themselves in front. A free kick from Collier was lofted into the box and Parker rose above the visitor's defence to head into the far top corner of the net past West. A minute later things went from bad to worse for the visitors when substitute Charlie Hancock fired in a second for Malmesbury. To their credit the visitors kept trying to play their football but on such a heavy pitch a more direct approach may have been more appropriate. They had a golden chance to get a foothold back in the game 13 minutes from time when Walters was put through on goal, but he dragged his shot wide of the far post.

Five minutes from time they had another great chance when Toby Parker was put clean through in on goal, but he also fired wide of the post. In the final minute Walters again found himself clean through on goal but hit his shot over the bar. Just as it looked as though they would draw a blank on the night, despite having created numerous chances, they did finally find the back of the net deep into injury time, Walters (pictured below) with the goal when again he was put in on goal and this time made no mistake but it was all too little too late.

Malmesbury saw out the closing seconds to secure their first three points of the season having been deducted points for failing to fulfil fixtures earlier in the season. For the visitors a disappointing result that could prove costly come the end of the season.



I will make the tea and you bring the biscuits – that was the message from Dean Brennan last week when we asked the Barnet boss if he had time for a cuppa and a chat.

He had more to offer than that, throwing open the Hive's doors for a full day to see their preparations for a big National League clash with Solihull Moors.

It's what we all love about Non-League football. Even at the top table, managers are so affording of their time and generosity.

Last season Barnet missed out in the play-offs – ironically to Solihull – and the previous year their hopes were ended by Boreham Wood.

But the Bees are edging ever closer and that relaxed feeling around the camp was clear to see.

Will they win every game between now and the end of the season? Almost certainly not and there will be bumps in the road. York City and Forest Green Rovers hold the same title ambitions and there are a whole number of clubs determined they hold League Two status next term.

Brennan, of course, has done the hard yards. He's turned down the chance to be an EFL manager already, staying loyal to Barnet in the hope he can be the manager to take them back into League Two.

Brennan, 44, knows what this part of the season is all about. He took Hemel Hempstead from the bottom of the Southern League into the Conference South in his first job and, after some big learnings at Billericay Town and Kingstonian, then won Step 2 with Wealdstone.

Although an FA Trophy winner with Grays Athletic, Brennan says he didn't live right to maximise his playing career. It's why he's so driven in his management career – one that actually started in Sunday League alongside his Non-League playing days.

"I wanted to get used to speaking in front of a group," Brennan tells The NLP. "Because being a player and saying, 'Oh can we do this, gaffer?' it is totally different to standing up in a changing room and seeing 16 faces staring back at you. Now the squads are even larger.

"You saw me earlier doing video analysis and speaking in front of the players. It's understanding where they're sitting because it's important how you get that communication across. I don't want to be turning around saying, 'Matt, Matt, where are you Matt?' You look like a right idiot. Rather than knowing where you are and saying, 'Right, Matt, this is what we want you to do'.

"I know where everyone is sitting. All those things I learnt early and it's important because it's hard speaking in front of a group.

"If you're a con man, they will know you're a con man. Footballers know if you're spoofing them and bluffing them.

"I just wanted to get that right. So I did player-assistant at a couple of clubs. Way lower down at Dunstable Town and Aylesbury Vale, then I started doing my badges and Mr Boggins (Hemel chairman Dave Boggins) gave me a chance."

The game has changed greatly since his first break. Brennan recalls shouting and screaming back in those days.

"It's amazing, now I don't even do team-talks before games," Brennan says. "When I started out in management and was part-time, we used to do the phases of play in the warm-up so I could get it into the players' heads. We'd be doing attacking phases, shadow play in the warm-up because we didn't have enough contact time.

"Now the week is structured, we've got time, we've got recovery, we've got video. When you look at younger people, especially, now they learn a lot off their phones, from video, social media, YouTube. Does anybody watch Eastenders or Coronation Street? My Ma definitely still watches Corrie and Emmerdale! But, that's what I'm saying, it's generational so how it's changed is fascinating."

Brennan has grown and evolved with the times into one of Non-League's most talented and respected managers. Even in a busy week, he's still got time for a cup of tea with The NLP – and a biscuit, of course.
