Men's First Team Bassett Bulletin Welcome To Today's Game

GOOD AFTERNOON and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Slimbridge.

A warm welcome to all our visitors who have made the journey from Slimbridge for the game, we hope you enjoy your short stay with us this afternoon and we wish you a safe journey home. As with the last game, the information provided by today's opponents for the programme this afternoon was first class and received in good time.

At the time of writing these notes Slimbridge currently sit in 13th place in the table having lost one more game than they have won. One of their joint-managers, Adam Coyle, stepped down from the managerial role in midweek but it appears he may still be involved in club matters going forward given his affection for the club. Former Brimscombe manager Sam Prior will now become assistant manager to Tom Deakin starting with today's game at the Sustain Stadium.

Until recent times our record Slimbridge was frankly abysmal. The first nine meetings between the two sides had all been won by Slimbridge and we finally registered a win at the tenth attempt in April 2010, some guy called Collier scoring in a 2-1 win at Rylands The match report from that game is included in today's programme. The next two games saw Slimbridge return to winning ways but thankfully in recent times under Sam we have started to make inroads into our losing deficit against Slimbridge, with Bassett winning all of the last three meetings since Slimbridge returned to the Uhlsport Hellenic League from the Southern League. Those three wins include a 6-3 away win back at the beginning of October with Bassett scoring four times in the opening quarter of an hour. Alfie Presley led the way with a fine hat-trick that afternoon with further goals from Finn Hopkins, Brad Pagliaroli and Chris Zebroski. Bassett today will look to record back-to-back wins against Slimbridge for the second season running but we know we will need to be at our best against a side who will be looking to prove something to the changed management team.

Our last league game at the Sustain Stadium saw us record an excellent 4-0 win against Tuffley Rovers as we maintained our push for a play-off berth. Unfortunately the 3-0 midweek defeat away at Mangotsfield United that followed ended our four game winning run and we will be keen to return to winning ways this afternoon.

Last weekend's game against Lydney Town was one of many in the area to fall victim to Storm Darragh with just the three games played in the Hellenic Premier last weekend, with today's opponents Slimbridge avoiding the worst of the weather by playing on Friday night.

The Development Team's game last weekend in the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League against league leaders Kintbury Rangers was the only game in the two divisions of that league that went ahead. Kintbury could have called the game off with the league adopting the same approach as other leagues with regard to postponing due to travel concerns but Kintbury wanted to play and with the game on 3G there were no issues with a waterlogged pitch. Unfortunately for Bassett, Kintbury ran out 3-0 winners with Bassett missing that cutting edge and experience up front with several key players missing.

Even though the winds had subsided somewhat by Sunday, the Ladies home game was postponed for the second home game in a row due to concerns over health and safety.

For the First Team it is going to be a busy Christmas period with three games in the space of seven days followed by two trips to Hereford to start the New Year (again). A preview of the festive schedule is included elsewhere in today's programme. As this is the last home game before Christmas on behalf of the club I would like to wish everyone a Happy Christmas, I hope that Santa reads your Amazon Wish List and you get everything you have asked for. Enjoy the short break before the two home games on Boxing Day against Corsham Town and then two days later against Pershore Town.

Enjoy the game and hopefully we will be celebrating three more points come five o'clock to keep us in the hunt for the play-offs.

Mangotsfield, Highworth Inkberrow all separated by a single point. So, everything still to play for as we enter the hectic Christmas fixtures. Next week we head to Longlevens followed by the visits to the Sustain of Corsham and Pershore finished with a trip to Hereford Pegasus on New Year's Day.

The New Year doesn't get any quieter as we enter the Challenge and Floodlight Cups with away games at Watlington Town and Didcot Development respectively.

Congratulations to Finn Hopkins who was the November Player of the Month. A firm favourite with the fans, I am sure we are going to see a lot more from him. It has been a pleasure to have at the club since his move from neighbours Shrivenham FC.

Finally, I am sure you will all join me in wishing Louie Spalding a speedy recovery from his knee surgery this week and we all look forward to seeing him back next season.

The Gloucestershire village of Slimbridge is world renowned for its Bird Sanctuary, but much hard work has gone into making Slimbridge better known in football circles.

The Club's history can be traced back to the 1899/1900 season, when the team were playing in local football at various venues in and around the village. A gap in the records suggests there may have been a couple of seasons when no games were played, and thus, officially, the Club's centenary was celebrated in 2002/03.

For the next forty-odd years the Club were predominantly members of the Stroud and District League with varying degrees of success and failure, except for a period between 1960 and 1968 when they were in the Gloucester Northern Senior League.

It was not until 1951 that the current ground at Wisloe Road (Now renamed as Thornhill Park) became the club's home, and it subsequently became the legal property of the club after former player, and ex-Chairman of the club, Evi Thornhill, bequeathed the land to the Club in his Will, with the Club becoming legal owners in 1960. It was to prove an incredibly valuable treasure in future years.

By 1988, the club had fallen on hard times, but fortunately, a handful of committee members led by Gordon King and Gordon Tudor kept the Club afloat. The following season local businessman Paul Chappell arrived. The Club was stabilised and construction of new changing facilities, to County League standard, were completed. Paul Chappell was to remain a vital part of the club until his retirement from his duties in 2020.

As playing standards improved, 2000 saw the completion of the building of a long-awaited Social Club in an area of the ground that in Its old life had housed a cowshed. John Mack, a successful local entrepreneur, joined the club as Chairman, and he remains a committed supporter of the club to this day as Club President. In the summer of 2001, Doug Gray was appointed Manager, and the club began a period of upward momentum.

The team achieved a Runners-up spot in their first season in the Gloucester County League, and were accepted into the Hellenic League. Hellenic Division One West was won by an Eleven Point margin in 2002/03. A creditable fourth place finish was achieved in the Hellenic Premier League in 2003/04. In a marvellous season the club also claimed the Hellenic 'Norman Matthews' Floodlit Cup and the G.F.A. Challenge Trophy.

Floodlights arrived at the ground in the summer of 2003. A pre-season visit from Conference side Forest

Green Rovers on 22nd July, produced a then ground record attendance of 427 to witness the inaugural game under lights at Wisloe Road.

A few weeks later on Sunday 24th August, that ground attendance record was beaten at a Bank Holiday Hellenic Premier Division fixture that was part of the 2003/04 annual 'Ground Hop' weekend. Local rivals Shortwood United provided the opposition in front of a crowd of 525.

Season 2004/05 again saw a fourth-Place finish in the Hellenic Premier. The club also made their first appearance in the F.A. Vase, which resulted in a run to the third round proper before a 2-1 extra time defeat at Western League side Backwell United.

In February 2005, Gray stood down after nearly four seasons at the helm of the club.

The club started season 2005/06 under newly appointed Manager Doug Foxwell. A first entry into the F.A. Cup saw a visit from Wessex League side Wimborne Town. A 1-0 defeat did not dampen the sense of occasion on the first day of the season. A second successful run in the F.A. Vase came to an end in the Third Round Proper, with a 3-1 defeat at South Midland Premier, Welwyn Garden City.

After a record-breaking 64 game season, the team achieved a Fifth-Place finish in the Hellenic Premier, and the club also won the Hellenic 'Norman Matthews' Floodlit Cup and the GFA Challenge Trophy, both for the second time in three seasons.

Season 2006/07 proved to be the most successful in the Club's history to date, with both the First Team and Reserve side recording League and Cup doubles, with the bonus of record-breaking F.A. Cup and Vase runs for the senior side.

In the F.A. Cup, a Five Match run from the Extra-Preliminary Round finished at Merthyr Tydfil in the Third Qualifying Round. Along the way there were memorable wins against two other Southern Premier sides, 2-1 at Yate Town and 3-1 at home to Chippenham Town. It was six matches in the F.A. Vase before defeat was tasted, the run ending in the Fifth Round Proper at home to the eventual winners, Truro City.

In the Hellenic Premier Division, bad weather, which led to a record number of postponements during the subsequently extended season, led to half a Seasons fixture being played in the final two months. A tremendous effort saw the Club Bring the Championship Shield to Wisloe Road, the winning margin being three points over second placed North Leigh.



There was a rousing performance in the G.F.A. Trophy Final against Almondsbury Town. A 3-1 victory not only retained the Trophy, but recorded a third success in four seasons in that competition.

The Reserve side had an early success in the Gloucester Northern Senior League Cup with a 2-0 win against Division One Tuffley Rovers. This saw confidence rise and they went on to break a Gloucestershire Northern Senior League record in winning Division Two with a Played 30, Won 30 record.

As a result of winning the league after an inspiring final day victory, and the upgrade to the ground facilities at Wisloe Road, the club were promoted into the BGB Southern League Division One Midlands for Season 2007/08, however, there was a twist to come in the tale

On July 10th 2007 the club decided not to take up the promotion, and effectively, the first team took over the position in the pyramid occupied by the reserve team, which was disbanded.

The First Team reverted to the Gloucester Northern Senior League. This meant a severe upheaval in the club both on and off the field with the manager Doug Foxwell and several senior players moving on the pastures new

However, a loyal band of players stayed on including James Cole, who over as player manager with assistance from long term club captain Leon Sterling to begin the next stage of the club's journey.

Four promotions followed as the club regained their previous status. James Cole handed over to Leon Sterling, who moved into the Manager's role, with Leon joined as Assistant Manager by long time Slimbridge stalwart Freddy Ward. The two guided the side to three top six finishes in their first three seasons back in the Hellenic Premier

After the completion of the 2012-13 season, the Swans applied for a transfer to the Toolstation Western Premier League to reduce prohibitive travelling costs, a move which was approved by the FA in the Summer of 2013.

After two seasons in the Toolstation Western Premier League, a third-place finish at the end of the 2014/15 season gave the Swans a second opportunity to return to the Southern Football League. This time the club accepted the offer and took their place in the South and West Division, finishing a credible 18th in their first season, the highest level the club had ever achieved at that time in their history. Prior to the commencement of that campaign, John Mack had stepped back from Chairman duties and his position was taken up by Barry Gay.

At the start of the 2016-17 season, and prior to our pre-season friendly fixture with neighbours Forest Green Rovers, the football ground in Wisloe Road was formally renamed to Thornhill Park in recognition of the marvellous gift we received from Evil Thornhill 46 years earlier.

Evi's son, Tony and his late wife Margaret were on hand to cut the ceremonial ribbon, and Tony made a short heartfelt speech about how much the renaming meant to him and the entire Thornhill family, and how honoured they were that the football club had recognised their father in this way.

A difficult two seasons of struggle at a higher level saw the eventual departure of Leon Sterling as Manager, with Freddy Ward stepping up to the plate, assisted by local footballing legend Lee Driver-Dickerson. With Freddy then stepping aside to concentrate of his last few years of playing having steadled the Swans' ship, 'Drive' took over the reins as Manager of the first team.

The Club's previous ground attendance record was smashed on 4th February 2017, when 898 fans saw the side suffer a 3-0 defeat to Hereford FC, who were working their way back up the league pyramid following their reformation after the collapse of Hereford United

The last 2 years have seen an incredible expansion of the football club—the establishment of a thriving Youth setup at Under 18 level, and the resurrection of the Reserve side has seen Slimbridge AFC make great strides as a club.

Prior to the Covid suspension of football in March 2020, the Under 18s and the Reserves were top of their respective leagues, while the first team were sitting in 12th place in the Southern League Division One South, the highest placing in the history of the football club. Although the FA has made the season's results null and void, they have been officially added to club statistics and all appearances and goals will stand in our records as a permanent tribute to all who represented the club in a fantastic season in the strangest of all campaigns

The Club has gained a great local reputation both on and off the pitch for looking after players and developing them in their careers - Already some of those previously with the club in the last 2 seasons have moved to Conference South level to ply their trade

It is a tribute to the committed and very talented team of coaches and managers in place at all levels of the club, that the future is very bright indeed for the Swans.

Collier Lob Ensures Bassett Break Their Swans' Duck

Royal Wootton Bassett Town 2 Slimbridge 1 Saturday 10th April 2010

With a finish that was as cool as they come, Sam Collier made history for Wootton Bassett Town. More importantly, his winning goal moved his side one step closer to a return to the Hellenic Premier Division

Ten minutes into the second half, with the scores knotted at one apiece against fellow title challengers Slimbridge –who had won all eight of the preceding encounters between the two clubs, the defender-turned-forward – with his weaker right foot – produced a perfectly weighted lob from the edge of the area that beat onrushing 'keeper Dave Evans.

It wound up to be the decisive goal of the afternoon as Dave Turner's team triumphed by the odd goal in three to move back to the top of the table. And with Purton losing, the three points put Bassett's destiny further into their own hands.

Their afternoon started perfectly. Four minutes in, the visitors failed to deal with a corner, allowing James Turner to recycle the ball. His teasing lofted pass was perfectly placed, allowing both Chris Oram and Collier to flick the ball on unchallenged before Jon Holloway stabbed home from 12 yards with a first time effort.

It could – and perhaps should – have been two just minutes later. Holloway bravely kept an overhit Matty Bown free kick in play, but Craig Shand could only blast over from close range after the defender had headed the ball back across goal to him.

Bassett's start had undoubtedly caught Slimbridge off guard. However the visitors reacted with intent, pinning their hosts into their own half for the majority of the remaining time in the first half.

Yet, resolute defending – a staple of Turner's reign in the Rylands Way hotseat – limited them to a handful of half chances. The best the visiting side could muster prior to the break would come from a free kick on the stroke of half time, which Joe Tustain struck beautifully, but he could not

beat Stewart Thompson, whose acrobatics ensured the ball found the roof rather than the back of the net.

The Bassett shotstopper – as good as they come in Division One West – though could do next to nothing to deny the forward shortly after the restart.

The equaliser was something of a gift as Bassett failed to clear the lines, despite having numerous opportunities to do so. But it took a finish of the finest quality to put the sides back on level terms.

From 30 yards, Tustain rifled a volley of the highest calibre into the top left corner that had Thompson rooted to the spot, unable to react. The strike made Arjen Robben's Champions League winner in the week look ordinary.

By now Bassett were on the ropes, but another teasing ball from Turner would lead to their second, stunning the visitors. Full back Shane Anson should have done far better in dealing with the ball. But with Collier breathing down his neck, he could only slice his clearance straight to the forward. And in the rich vein of form he finds himself in, there would be no denying Bassett's leading marksman.

Trailing once more, Slimbridge threw everything they had at Bassett in the dying stages. As in the first half though, they were met with spirited resistance.

Thompson was in imperious form, brilliantly denying substitute Andy Varnham's snap shot with a fine parry low to his left, before saving low from a venomous Tustain free kick with seven minutes to go.

The visitor's goalscorer – who seemed determined to cover every blade of Rylands Way grass in order to find his side an equaliser – proved himself a handful in the dying stages and deserved better when his right-wing cross was glanced agonizingly wide by Ross Langworthy.

But his – and his teammate's efforts – would ultimately prove to be in vain.

Those eight previous defeats to their Gloucestershire opponents? More than worth it for a victory of this magnitude..





Jack Hobson-McVeigh played the free kick following the tackle on Gallagher short to Brad Pagliaroli on the left side. And Pagliaroli danced his way into the box past two defenders before producing a low, crisp shot with his weaker right effort that flew into the net.

Four minutes after the restart a flowing move ended with Tommy Ouldridge squaring inside to Alfie Presley whose sweeping first time effort from the edge of the area went in off the left post.

It was soon 3-0. Pagliaroli teased a free kick from just outside the box towards the bottom right corner which Hoffland did well to get across to and keep out. However, reacting instinctively, Presley was on hand to put away the rebound from close range.

Chris Zebroski then finished the scoring, blasting in from 18 yards after good build up play involving Finn Hopkins and Presley.

Bassett's fine form thus continues apace. December is set to pose a number of challenges. But with the way his team are playing, Collier will be confident his team can keep on flying.



Wiltshire Senior League Premier Division Roundup 7 Dec

Storm Darragh resulted in all but one of the games involving teams from the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League in either league, or cup fixtures being postponed this Saturday. With an amber weather warning impacting some of the county, the league allowed clubs to postpone their games where there were concerns over safety in terms of travelling to the games. Several games were also called off due to waterlogged pitches. The postponed games included all four fixtures in the Wiltshire Junior Cup which will have a knock-on impact to fixtures in Division One next week, although Cricklade Town's re-scheduled game has been put to the 21st by the Wiltshire FA.

The one game played this weekend was in the Premier Division and it involved league leaders Kintbury Rangers who were prepared to travel to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for their fixture against Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development despite the offer to postpone, with the wind less strong in the North of the County and across the border in Berkshire. That said it

was still extremely difficult conditions in a game switched to the 3G pitch at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground. Kintbury got off to a great start as two goals early on in the space of a couple of minutes from George Armstrong put them in a commanding position. That was to be the end of the scoring in the first half and whilst the home side created chances of their own, they lacked that cutting edge and experience in front of goal, something the visitors certainly had with Armstrong back leading the line for the title favourites. Kintbury made sure of all three points with a third goal after the break, Jesse Bowers being on hand to turn the ball in after Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development keeper Adam House had pulled off a great save, but the ball fell nicely for Bowers who fired home for 3-0 and his fourth goal of the campaign. The win saw Kintbury move eight points clear at the top of the table as they reached the halfway point of the season with their league fixtures, although second placed Letcombe now have a game in hand.



AND then there were two.

A total of 653 clubs from the National League System entered the 2024-25 Emirates FA Cup, at various stages, from the extra preliminary round back in early August.

Now it's just Dagenham & Redbridge and Tamworth flying the flag in the third round proper from outside the 92 – and they've both got tasty ties to look forward to!

Tamworth, in particular, got the best possible reward for knocking out League One neighbours Burton Albion by landing a plum home tie with Premier League giants, and eight-time winners, Tottenham Hotspur.

Yes, Big Ange and his men will be gracing The Lamb on the weekend of January 11 for what promises to be a humdinger of a clash, evoking memories of when Spurs, with Jose Mourinho, Gareth Bale et al, famously visited Marine during the Covid-hit 2020-21 campaign.

Tamworth were the headline act of Sunday's second round ties after holding rivals Burton to a 1-1 draw at the Pirelli Stadium after extra time before popular goalkeeper Jas Singh made two crucial saves in the penalty shootout to see his side through.

That came under 24 hours after Dagenham & Redbridge had become the first Non-League side to take their place in the hat for the third round tie after knocking out London rivals AFC Wimbledon 2-1 on Saturday – their second successive away victory over League Two opposition.

Next up for Ben Strevens' men is a crunch London derby with Championship side Millwall – a tie which is bound to whet the appetite of a partisan area east of the capital.

There were a few near misses too, as far as Non-League progression went.

Kettering Town led Doncaster Rovers for long spells of their Sunday lunchtime kick-off, only for two late goals from former Sheffield United striker Billy Sharp to turn the tables and break Poppies hearts.

Then, a couple of hours later, fellow Step 3 side Harborough Town raced into a 2-0 lead at

Reading, only to be pegged back to 3-3 at the end of the 90 minutes.

But despite being down to ten men, the Royals found a way through thanks to two extra-time goals from Chem Campbell.

Harborough's defeat naturally re-opened the 'FA Cup replay' debate with the new ruling denying the Bees the chance of taking Reading back to Bowden Park for a lucrative second crack of the whip, undoubtedly in front of the TV cameras.

Solihull Moors' 2-1 defeat by last season's playoff final conquerors Bromley rounded off a memorable second-round weekend for Non-League clubs with the likes of Gainsborough Trinity, Oldham Athletic, Brackley Town and Wealdstone all coming mighty close to securing a place in round three and a potential Premier League big gun.

That prize this year belongs to Tamworth – and I'm sure the Non-League family will be behind them every step of the way.

Elsewhere, something pretty cool happened to us at Non-League Paper towers this week.

We are very proud and delighted to have won the Football Supporters' Association award, in the Non-League category, for the first time.

It was particularly humbling given the list of such deserving nominees we were up against; Dunstable Town, for the incredible community work they carry out, the Torquay United Supporters' Trust for their efforts in saving the club during a tough year, and Worthing owner George Dowell for his incredible tale, turned into a fly-on-the-wall documentary.

Naturally, we are unbelievably proud to have claimed this award but we simply couldn't have done it without the amazing support of so many people; the football clubs, managers, chairmen, contributors, writers and photographers, sponsors, and most of all you, the readers.

It really is a huge team effort and we thank each and every one of you.

Christmas Period Preview - Bassett Aiming To Be Greedy

The Christmas period is meant to be the season of goodwill. However during the club's time in the Hellenic League, Royal Wootton Bassett Town have interpreted that a bit too literally, typically gifting the opposition points in games played between Boxing Day and New Year.

But with three games upcoming over the course of the Christmas period, Sam Collier and his side will be looking to deliver a rare bit of festive joy for Bassett - and buck the rather dismal trend the club has set in league games played at this time of year.

Boxing Day - when Bassett host Wiltshire rivals Corsham Town - has been an especially difficult day. Nine previous Hellenic League games on 26 December have seen Bassett win just twice, with one draw and six defeats to their name. Making that record worse, all four home games have ended defeat with Bassett failing to register a single goal.

Their most recent Boxing Day win was 12 years ago, with Steve Yeardley scoring in the opening minute and Matt Bennett adding a second in a 2-1 victory at Purton. Tytherington Rocks are the only other team Bassett have triumphed against on that date, winning 2-1 on Boxing Day in 2006 courtesy of goals from Stuart Hemsley and Scott Large.

Six games on 27 December have then yielded just one victory - a 3-1 away win at Brimscombe and Thrupp in 2014. Otherwise, Bassett have drawn once and lost the other four. Those losses include consecutive 3-1 reverses at home against Corsham and Highworth Town with all four defeats seeing Bassett concede at least three goals.

This coming 28 December sees Bassett host Pershore Town. And that has been one of Bassett's luckiest dates during the festive period. Six games have resulted in three wins and three defeats - and plenty of goals. In 2013 Bassett beat Holyport 6-2 before a 4-2 win against Brimscombe in 2019. Sandwiched in between though was the nadir - an 8-0 loss at Highworth in 2015, with the same date also bringing a 4-0 reverse at the hands of Purton back in 1993.





29 December is a date Bassett have never won on, drawing two and losing two of four games.

Bassett have fared better on 30 December though, last year's 3-2 win at Hereford Pegasus being one of three

victories with the only defeat coming away at Binfield (3-1) in 2017.

Three games on New Year's Eve have then seen two draws and one loss - that coming at home against Lydney (3-1) in 2016.

Bassett do hold a 100% record on New Year's Day - courtesy of winning the only Hellenic League game they have played on 1 January to date when beating Hereford Lads Club 4-0 last year. The opening day of 2025 will again see Bassett travel to Hereford, this time to take on Pegasus as they aim for a repeat of that result.
