Welcome To Today's Game

GOOD AFTERNOON and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Tuffley Rovers.

A warm welcome to all our visitors who have made the journey from Gloucester for the game, we hope you enjoy your short stay with us this afternoon and we wish you a safe journey home. As usual with Neil Spiller of Tuffley Rovers, the information provided for today's programme by Tuffley is first class and received in good time, a pleasant change to what I have been used to from other clubs this season.

At the time of writing these notes Tuffley Rovers currently sit in ninth place in the table and are having what could well turn out to be their best season in the Hellenic Premier since they returned in Season 2015-16. They come into today's game on the back of a big 7-3 win over Lydney Town on Tuesday night and now sit just three points below us in the table. They have won more games than they have lost this season and those victories include a 1-0 win over us back in September and they will be looking to complete a league double over us here this afternoon. We will certainly need to be at our best here this afternoon if we are to continue our recent form in the league which has seen us win eight of our last nine league games.

Our recent record against today's opponents, until that defeat in September, had been a good one with us having won the previous six encounters and been unbeaten in eight meetings. Hopefully we can return to winning ways against Tuffley here this afternoon.

Our last league game was here at the Sustain Stadium where an excellent performance saw us come away with a 3-1 win over a decent Westfields side. An excellent result which at the time saw us climb into the promotion play-off spots. The match report from that game is included elsewhere in today's programme.

On Wednesday night we were at Chippenham Town in the Wiltshire Premier Shield having been reinstated in this season's competition after Westbury United had been found to have

played an ineligible player in the last round. The previous night Swindon Town had clearly not taken the cup seriously (or maybe they did judging by how they are going in League 2) losing 9-2 to Bemerton Heath Harlequins. With two of the bigger names in Wiltshire football already out in Swindon and Westbury Utd, this is starting to look like a winnable competition.

With Chippenham having played the night before in the National League South, the team we faced was very much a Chippenham Town Academy based side plus former Royal Wootton Bassett Town player Caine Bradbury. Before the game I thought we had a good chance of making it through to the semi-final, which is exactly how it turned out. After going one down, Tommy Ouldrige brought us back level before half time. That was to be the end of the night's scoring meaning penalties were then needed to decide matters. We scored all four of our penalties, Henry Spalding, Finnlay Hopkins, Bailey Gallagher and Jack Hobson-McVeigh all firing in, whilst Chippenham hit the bar with one of theirs and then saw one saved by James Smallcombe as we progressed to the last four. A match report is again included in today's programme. Joining us and Bemerton in the semi final will be Swindon Supermarine who defeated local rivals Highworth Town, with the winner of the Melksham Town v Salisbury tie set to complete the semi final line up. I am not sure when the draw will be made but there is every possibility that we could see Collier Jnr v Collier Snr if Melksham can defeat Salisbury.

Looking at our others sides, the Development team have picked up in recent weeks and are having their best run of results so far this season. That impressive Wiltshire Senior Cup win over Step 6 side Calne Town, reported on in the last programme, was followed by another impressive result, coming away from unbeaten league leaders Kintbury Rangers with a point following a 1-1 draw. Then last Saturday, in a big relegation battle against Salisbury Development, Mark Simpkins' side picked up three vital points with a 3-1 win that saw them move out of the relegation zone at the expense of Blunsdon who they meet this afternoon at Sutton Park in another 6-pointer. Hopefully the Development Side can maintain that recent form against another one of their rivals who are looking to avoid the drop.

Since the last programme the Women's side have progressed in the Wiltshire County Cup with an emphatic 18-0 win over Blunsdon and have drawn another Wiltshire Senior League Development Division side, Staverton Rangers, in the next round so should be confident of further progress in the County Cup. Last Sunday's league game, the local derby against Purton, was postponed on health and safety grounds with the high winds brought on by Storm Bert. Tomorrow the Women's side are away to Downend Flyers who they beat 6-0 back in September.

Enjoy the game and hopefully three more points to maintain our upward trajectory in the league table.

Stuart Withers

Some of you will be aware that, as well as producing the programme for RWBT and being Club President, I am also the Fixture Secretary and Media Officer for the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League and last week was an extremely difficult and sad one for everyone involved with the league. On Friday I learnt from League Secretary Jim Thorn the devastating news that Stuart Withers, the League Vice Chairman and Chairman of Shrewton FC had died in an accident whilst on his milk round in Salisbury that morning. I immediately contacted Shrewton, who were due to play Trowbridge the next day, asking what they wanted to do regarding the game. The club advised that they wished to consult with the family first before making a decision and the message that quickly came back was that they wanted the game to go ahead, with the two sides both wearing black arm bands and holding a minutes silence before last Saturday's game.

Stuart had been a member of the Wiltshire Senior League Management Committee since 1999 and had taken on the position of Vice Chairman in 2006. However, he is best known in the football community of Wiltshire for his exploits with Shrewton United, firstly as a player and then as a highly successful manager who took the club from junior football all the way to the Western League.

Whilst manager of Shrewton United, in what is now the Premier Division of the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League, his side lifted the league title trophy on three occasions and were runners-up four times. They also won the league's Senior Cup on four occasions. The league title triumphs came in Seasons 1996-97, 2001-02 and then again, the following season,

in 2002-03, when for the second season running Stuart's side secured a league and cup double. In between those first two league title triumphs, Season 2000-01 saw Stuart lead his club to their one and only appearance in the Wiltshire Senior Cup final, their opponents that day, Wootton Bassett Town. We lifted the cup that evening, winning 2-0, but the Wiltshire League side gave us a really tough game, with keeper Richard Stevens saving us on several occasions.

After their third league title triumph Stuart took his Shrewton side up into the Western League where they more than held their own at Step 6, securing a top half of the table finish in all but one of the eight seasons he was in charge of the side in the Western League.

After Stuart stepped down as manager, Shrewton were to remain in the Western League for two more seasons before returning to the Wiltshire Senior League where Stuart and his wife Maureen had remained as active league committee members. Stuart remained a key member within the Shrewton club taking on the position of Club Chairman.

Personally I have lost a highly respected friend and colleague who helped me greatly when I first joined the league committee. Having been so heavily involved at club level, as well as league committee level, he was an extremely useful sounding board who always helped balance discussions with more of a club perspective on matters than elsewhere on the committee, which tends to be made up of a lot of ex-referees.

Stuart was a highly respected member of the football community in Wiltshire and all who knew him have been devastated by the news of his passing and all our thoughts are with Maureen and the family at this difficult and sad time.

All clubs will be holding a minute's silence before their games today in the Wiltshire Senior League as a mark of respect to Stuart. Shrewton have invited a lot of ex-players, Stuart's family and friends to their home game today against Melksham Town Reserves for what they hope will be a memorable day in remembrance of "Mr Shrewton".

Tuffley Rovers • Club History



The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Mustoe achieved an 18th place finish at the end of the 2022/23 season, his first full campaign, before achieving a healthy 14th place in 2023/24, with a much improved squad.

Robin Hoffland**Goalkeeper**

Macaulay Herbert**Defence**

Tall, strong in the air, solid in the tackle and capable in possession, this could be the season when he steps up into first team football.

Tawana Chang**Defence**

Recent addition to the squad, after signing from Hartpury University, and an attacking full-back. Deceptively quick but very comfortable on the ball. Previously had trials for Southampton and played for the English Colleges Association.

Elijah Simpson**Defence**

Player under Neil Mustoe at Gloucester City U18s and recently signed from Brimscombe & Thrupp and a great addition to the squad. Comfortable on the ball when in possession, shows a turn of pace, and good defensively. A key signing for this season.

Mark Pritchett**Defence**

Tasted Hellenic League title winning success at Bishops Cleeve. Previously at Rovers as Player/Manager before stepping away from the role in 2021/22. Offers a no nonsense, uncompromising, good old-fashioned performance in every game, and a threat in the opposition box.

2024/25 PLAYER PROFILES

Ellis Clifford**Defence**

Came through the U18s squad, after joining from Gloucester City's youth set-up. Made a breakthrough last season and amassed 14 appearances at left-back. Very promising youngster who will be looking to be a regular in 2024/25.

Ollie Hambling**Defence**

Young defender who has progressed well with our U18s and recently made the step-up into the first team squad, albeit as an unused substitute. He is seen as a good prospect. Definitely one for the future!

Sammie Hicks**Defence/Midfield**

Now in his fourth season at the club, after spells at Gloucester City and Cinderford Town. Injuries have hampered his progress but he remains a reliable and very versatile member of the squad, capable of filling in at full-back, in midfield or in the No.10 role.

Harley Mustoe**Defence/Midfield**

A member of this season's U18s squad after joining the squad late in 2023/24, Harley has gained experience playing County League football for Harwicke. Now holding down a regular first team spot. Most comfortable in midfield but has played at full-back and looked very accomplished.

Callum McGuirk**Defence/Midfield**

Signed from Longlevens in 2022, where he'd largely been used at full-back, he is a hard-working midfielder, who looks comfortable on the ball. Played academy football during his earlier years, including a spell at Bristol City. Was originally with the Rovers, where he featured in our U18s squad.

Liam Smith**Midfield**

Has Southern League experience. Calm in possession and possesses a good passing range, whilst also physically strong, will be looking to hold down a regular place in the side, after three injury hit campaigns. Offers experience and capable of dropping into the back four when needed.

Corey Warrington**Midfield**

Signed during pre-season after excelling at Northern Senior League side Tredworth Tigers during 2023/24. A highly energetic midfielder who likes to get on the ball; he's ambitious and could be an excellent addition to the squad for 2024/25, although an injury in pre-season could limit his immediate progress.

Forward

Forward

Experienced at a higher level, this is a player who Neil Mustoe was delighted to sign in November 2023. Previously at Gloucester City, Hungerford Town, North Leigh, as well as a spell overseas, and is a goalscorer equally at home wide or in the middle. Finished 23/24 as top scorer for the first team; added the threat that Rovers have needed.

Yeshaya Lomotey

Forward

Powerful striker who joined in 2021/22 after spells at other local clubs, including Slimbridge and Cinderford Town. Offers quality on the ball and packs a powerful shot that is a potent weapon. Will be hoping to contribute more goals to secure a regular place in the side.

Connor Walters

Forward

Wide player who joined from Gala Wilton in 2023/24. Strong and full of trickery, he had a fantastic start to his first season and contributed goals, as well as being a threat to opposition defences. Works hard for the team.

Riley Bourne

Forward

Under 18s player who graduated from our U16s last season. Quick, skilful, with an eye for goal, age is no impediment for this confident lad.

Forward

Signed from Fairford Town last season. Incredibly hardworking, tenacious, a real team player. Runs all day and although not a prolific goalscorer has been a good signing, who regularly contributes a goal. Can play wide or down the centre.

Signed on a dual registration basis from County League side Gala Wilton, a bit of an old fashioned striker – tall, good with his back to goal and already a regular goalscorer. Still only 17 (and only just!) he is attached to Gloucester City, too.

Forward

Recent signing, joining from Newent Town, making a late debut in the entertaining 3-3 draw with Highworth Town. Looking to make a mark at Step 5 after starting at Kidderminster Harriers, before spells at Worcester Raiders and Bewdley Town.

Neil Mustoe

Manager

Appointed as Manager in January 2022, took the club away from relegation fears in 2021/22, before successfully battling against relegation in 2022/23. Spent many years as a professional at Manchester United, Wigan Athletic, Cambridge United, Stevenage and Yeovil Town, before over 350 appearances for Gloucester City. Previous coaching experience with City before a spell away from the game until his appointment with The Rovers.

Liam O'Neill

Assistant Manager







Shortly after conceding, Liam Wright came

close to recording an equaliser, but fired narrowly over from the edge of the area.

Meare then made the first of a string of noteworthy saves to keep out Jamie Goodwin.

Shayne Anson was next to be presented with a great chance for the visitors, but shot straight at Meare, who then did well to keep out Wright.

Eventually Tuffley did get the ball into the back of the net, though Ben Tunncliffe had his strike correctly ruled out for offside.

Keiron Mace was next up to fluff his lines as his side's frustrations grew ever greater.

The suckerpunch was soon delivered as the ever reliable Robertson found space and buried an effort low beyond Evans to seal not only a complete haul of points for Bassett, but also a first ever home victory against Tuffley and a rise up to seventh in the Hellenic League Premier Division table.



 Chris Zebroski	A tall, powerful target man with Football League experience who joined Bassett in September 2024. A graduate of the Cirencester Town Academy, Zebroski began his professional career with Plymouth Argyle, making five appearances with the Devon club while in the Championship in 2005-06. He then joined Millwall and during his time with the Lions spent a fruitful spell with Torquay United in 2007-08, scoring 19 goals in 52 games as the Gulls finished third in the Conference National. Zebroski's career then took him to Wycombe Wanderers, who he helped earn promotion from League Two with in 2008-09 before returning to Torquay and brief spells with Bristol Rovers and Cheltenham Town. After dropping down to the National League South with Eastleigh in 2012-13, Zebroski returned to the Football League with Newport County a season later, winning their Player of the Season award in 2013-14 after netting 13 times in 39 games. He had a spell away from the game from 2015 to 2017 before returning to National League Eastleigh in 2017-18. Zebroski has since spent time with Chippenham Town, Malmesbury Victoria, Swindon Supermarine, Melksham Town, Fleet Town and - most recently - AFC Croydon Athletic, where he was assistant manager in their Combined Counties League Premier Division South promotion winning campaign.	
 Alan Griffin	A high quality target man who enjoyed a distinguished playing career in non-league football. Now entering his 2nd season as Bassett's assistant manager. Initially joining for the 21-22 season as a player, scoring 16 times in 32 appearances before joining the coaching staff. While taking on his current role, Griffin has continued to play, featuring 38 times last season (34 appearances coming from the bench) and adding 5 goals. As a player, Griffin is an assured finisher, strong in the air and capable of effectively holding up the ball. He made a prolific start to his playing career with Corsham in the Western League, and soon moved onto Southern League football, plying his trade with Cirencester, Chippenham, Gloucester City, Mangotsfield Utd, S.Supermarine and Bristol Manor Farm. He spent most of his career with Chippenham and was part of their 16-17 promotion winning squad that saw the Bluebirds earn National League South status. In 18-19 he hit 26 goals for Cirencester as they finished runners-up in Southern League Division One South. Joined Bassett after splitting the 19-20 season between Melksham Town and Malmesbury Victoria. Griffin also has prior managerial experience having spent time in charge of Malmesbury.  Nick Warren (Coach)	Warren joins Bassett's Men's First Team coaching staff this season after spending most of the past four years in charge of the club's Under 18 Floodlit team. Warren has been with the club for more than a decade, beginning as a manager in Bassett's youth section. He took over the Under 18 Floodlit team in 2020-21, guiding them to a sixth place finish in the Wiltshire League Floodlit Division. Bassett then achieved consecutive runners-up finishes under Warren's guidance in 2021-22 and 2022-23. He remained in charge of the team at the start of the 2023-24 campaign, stepping down from his role as manager part way through, though the Under 18s would again finish in second place. During Warren's tenure, numerous players have made the step up from the Under 18s into Bassett's Men's First and Development teams.	
 Sam Collier (Manager)	Collier has served as Bassett manager since taking the role, initially on an interim basis while still also a player, in January 2018. In 2018-19, his first full season in charge, Collier guided the team to 10th in the Hellenic League Premier Division - at that point, the club's highest ever finish. Bassett then exceeded that record with a 5th place finish in 2022-23. Last season Bassett went one better, finishing 4th while also reaching the Hellenic League Premier Division promotion playoff final. Bassett have also set records in national cup competitions under Collier's stewardship, with his sides equalling the club's best FA Cup run in 2020-21 and going further than ever before in the FA Vase, reaching the third round in 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2023-24. This is Collier's second job in management after he served as Shrivensham player-manager from February 2014 to 2015. As a player, Collier has made 160 appearances for Bassett. Mainly featuring as a striker, he has scored 71 goals, finishing as top scorer in 2009-10, when Bassett earned promotion from Hellenic League Division One West, and 2010-11. Collier has played in almost every other position for Bassett too though - including as goalkeeper, making a last minute penalty save in 2022-23 to preserve a point against eventual champions Cribbs. During his playing career, he also featured for Purton, Abingdon United, Cirencester Town, Wantage Town and Thatcham Town among others.	Mick Woolford

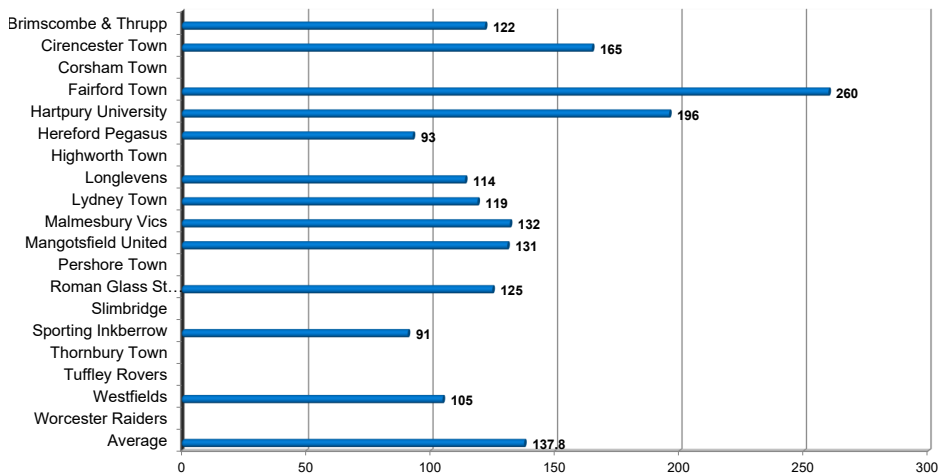

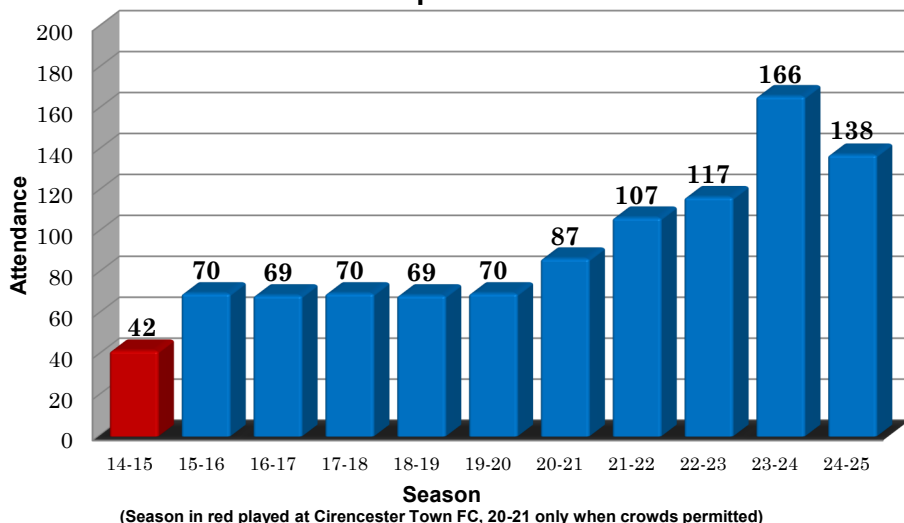

Another fantastic home performance saw Royal Wootton Bassett Town seal a convincing 3-0 home victory against fellow playoff hopefuls Westfields as Sam Collier's side continued their recent Hellenic League Premier Division charge.

Westfields have typically proven very tough opponents to crack, with Bassett's two previous victories against the Hereford side being earned by just a single goal.

On this occasion, however, Bassett were clearly superior. And their visitors - well beaten - showed their frustrations late on when Brooks was sent off.

Bassett's playoff hopes continue to strengthen - and with Tuffley Rovers and Mangotsfield United up next, Collier and his team have the opportunity to further strengthen these by striking a blow to two other teams who are currently in the mix.

Harlee Vozza headed over a cross from ex-Bassett man Caine Bradbury shortly after the equaliser, with Smallcombe equal to efforts from Vozza and Darren McAlastair later in the half break. Smallcombe then continued his assured night following the restart, denying Kouisseoue and Bradbury.

The game did fizzle out somewhat as the hosts rang the changes, including giving a debut to 16 year old - and former Bassett youth section star - Liam Lye-Owens.

And with no further goals forthcoming, penalties were required.

Chippenham had first kick in the shootout with Bradbury converting before Spalding levelled. McAlastair and Finn Hopkins then both scored to make it 2-2.

But it was soon to be advantage Bassett as Nicholls struck the bar with Bailey Gallagher putting the visitors in front.

Smallcombe then continued his impressive night, saving from Vozza before Jack Hobson-McVeigh coolly wrapped up victory.

Bassett will be joined in the semi finals by Swindon Supermarine - who narrowly beat Collier's side to reach the final last season, Bemerton Heath Harlequins and either Salisbury or Melksham Town.

There is therefore the chance to knock out another higher level opponent - and reach a first cup final since Bassett's 2000-01 Wiltshire Senior Cup triumph..

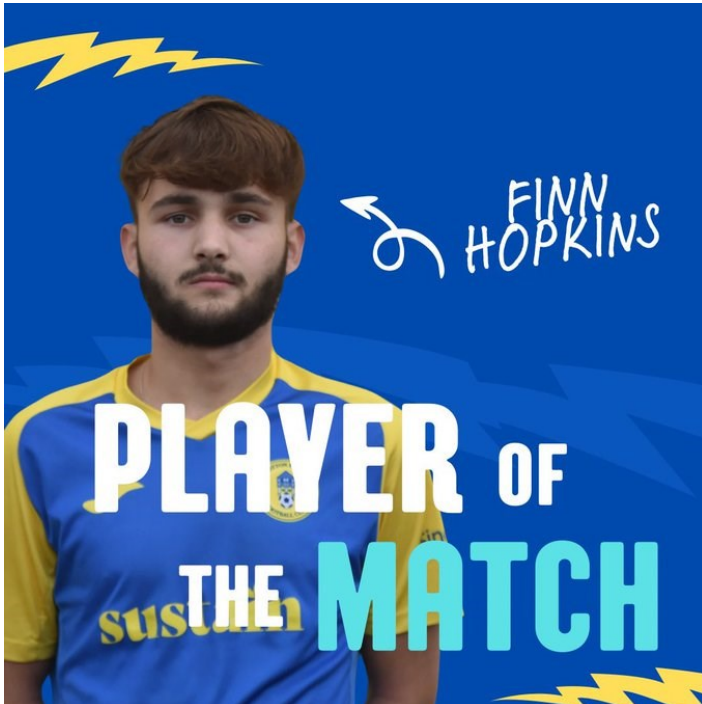

Wiltshire Senior League Premier Division Roundup 23 Nov

Last weekend's fixtures in the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League were curtailed due to the impact of Storm Bert and were also overshadowed by the sad passing of Shrewton Chairman and League Vice Chairman, Stuart Withers who was knocked down and killed in an accident on Friday morning in Salisbury. Stuart had been a member of the Wiltshire Senior League Committee since 1999 and had taken over the position of Vice Chairman in 2006. However, he is best known in the world of

football for his exploits with Shrewton United, firstly as a player and then a highly successful manager who took the club from junior football all the way to the Western League. After consultation with the family, the scheduled match at Shrewton where Trowbridge Town were the opponents went ahead, in what must have been an emotionally difficult day for both sides. The two sides wore black arm bands and held a minute's silence before their game on Saturday as a mark of respect.

The same afternoon Shrivenham were also paying tribute to their own club legend, Roger Sheppard, who passed away during the week after a short illness, with a minute's silence before their Premier Division game with Calne Town Reserves on a sombre day in the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League. As a mark of respect Shrivenham had decided not to 'man the gate' for the fixture, instead, suggesting spectators pay their entrance fee through the way of a donation in Roger's name and after the game specifically wanted to thank Calne Town for their understanding and support on what was a difficult afternoon for the club. Both games were badly impacted by the effects of Storm Bert making conditions very difficult for all the sides.

The game at Shrewton United was played in front of a large crowd who had all come to pay their respects, but the game itself did not start well for the home side, Shrewton having a man sent off in the very first minute of the game and then falling behind to a Ben Wickens goal for Trowbridge Town. Jack Vallis, who was part of last season's championship winning side at Amesbury, has returned to Shrewton this season and brought his side back on level terms with a trademark powerful header on 15 minutes to make it 1-1. It remained that way at half time as the conditions continued to deteriorate due to the persistent rain. There was concern that the game would have to be abandoned but credit to the match officials and the two teams that the game would be played to a conclusion. It remained all square until just before the hour mark when Charlie Utterson was brought down in the box and Vallis made no mistake from the penalty spot for his second of the game. Shrewton finally made sure of all three points four minutes from time when Utterson grabbed a third to make the final score 3-1, a fitting performance from Shrewton as they paid tribute to their Chairman.

Whilst the game at Shrewton would go the full duration, unfortunately the game at Shrivenham had to be abandoned by the referee 20 minutes from due to the deteriorating conditions with the score at 1-1. Calne having gone ahead through Sean Bailey, Bailey getting on the end of a defence splitting pass from Jack Smith, but James Hirst brought Shrivenham back level with a free kick from just outside the 18-yard box.

The action in the Premier Division had got underway on Friday night on the 3G at Stanley Park under lights where Park United

entertained Malmesbury Victoria Development. Park started the night in fifth spot in the table whilst visitors Malmesbury sat bottom of the table with just the one point to their name from their opening 13 games but now under new management, with Krystian Hext having taken over in the dugout. The new manager has strengthened the squad with new signings as they seek to get points on the board and try and escape the relegation zone. The two sides served up an entertaining game sharing six goals and the points, Ben Pring, Adam Mitchell and Lewis McCarron scoring for Park, Sam Parker, Rob Collier and Joe Tranter replying for Malmesbury. The point for Park was enough to see them climb up to fourth place in the table, whilst despite doubling their tally for the season, Malmesbury remain rooted to the bottom of the table, nine points adrift of the team above them in the table but with four games in hand and plenty of home games still to come.

The only other game to be played in the Premier Division this weekend was another game on 3G, this time at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground where Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development were at home to Salisbury Development in a big game at the bottom end of the table in the fight to avoid relegation. With the wind and rain making things difficult for both sides, even on an artificial surface, the story of the game is really one of the home side capitalising on mistakes at the back with a high-press. They went in front playing against the wind in the first half, George Staten intercepting a ball played across the Salisbury back line to fire home. They doubled their lead when Flynn Walters this time capitalised on another defensive mistake to put Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development two goals to the good. Salisbury got themselves back into the game early in the second half with an excellent goal from Joshua Ngombi following some tricky play down the wing from Naman Gurung. First half Royal Wootton Bassett full back Oliver Smith had kept Gurung quiet but second half Gurung started to cause all kinds of problems to the Bassett defence as Salisbury went in search of an equaliser. Having avoided conceding a second, the home side with the wind behind them, upped their pressing game as they sought a third but found Salisbury keeper Ernest Osei was having an excellent game and they only made sure of the points when once again they capitalised on another defensive error, Flynn Walters the beneficiary for his second of the game as it finished 3-1.

ARTIFICIAL Intelligence (AI) is getting everywhere these days – even now in football it seems.

This week, The NLP ran an article on former Non-League and Football League player turned sports agent, Guy Branston, who has launched a new AI venture that he says will revolutionise the way clubs engage with their supporters.

The ex-centre-half has launched an AI bot named Mai that he says can help clubs speak to thousands more fans - and even reach a global audience.

One of Branston's former clubs, Rotherham United, as well as Premiership Rugby side Leicester Tigers have already signed up to the service - named Sports AI Consultants - and Branston says talks are underway with several other sports clubs.

Branston, 45, made over 400 career appearances for a variety of clubs through the EFL including Hull City, Sheffield Wednesday and Peterborough United.

He also turned out for a number of now Non-League clubs, such as Oldham Athletic, Aldershot Town, Rochdale and Torquay United and had a season-long spell at Kettering Town in the Conference National back in 2008-09.

After retiring in 2014, he subsequently worked as chief scout at Notts County, operations manager at Nuneaton Town and director of football at Chesterfield before becoming a licensed agent in 2023.

Explaining how AI can revolutionise sports consultancy, Branston explains: "the advent of artificial intelligence (AI) has transformed numerous sectors, and the realm of sports consulting is no exception" Branston explains on his LinkedIn page.

"AI-powered sports consultants are at the forefront of this transformation, utilizing advanced algorithms and data analytics to enhance fan engagement and optimize team performance."

Speaking our sister paper, The Football League Paper, for whom he also doubles up as a columnist, Branston continued: "In the simplest terms, it's an AI bot that will have a conversation directly with the fan or customer over the phone,

"So, imagine you're a football club or a rugby club and you're offering a half-season ticket for sale.

"Traditionally, that would be advertised via email or a social media post, but those things are very cold and impersonal. A social media post can be missed. Emails can drop into junk folders or not get opened.

"And there's a good reason why things are done this way. At most clubs - particularly lower league clubs - there simply aren't enough arms and legs in the building to call fans individually.

"The secretary is doing multiple jobs. The marketing people are flat out. Even if you could afford to hire a telemarketer, how many people would they reach in a day? Maybe 100. It's not worth it.

"What Mai can do is call 2,000 people a day, and have a conversation in any language. It can take the 'temperature' of the conversation to work out whether someone is annoyed or unhappy or eager to hear more, and respond accordingly.

"Then, at the end of that day, the club gets a report saying how many people engaged with the call, how many people have requested a text message with a link to the landing page that sells the season ticket, and how many people bought one.

"And this is just one application. Right now, we're looking at how clubs could use AI to address mental health issues - engaging with lonely ex-players, getting kids back into football who've had a hard time after being released.

"This really does have the potential to revolutionise the way clubs communicate."
