Men's First Team Bassett Bulletin Welcome To Today's Game

GOOD AFTERNOON and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Westfields.

A warm welcome to all the players, management team, club officials and supporters from Westfields who have made the journey from Herefordshire. We hope you all enjoy your short stay with us this afternoon and we wish you a safe journey home.

A warm welcome also to the representatives from the RAF Benevolent Fund and No. 4 School of Technical Training who are present at our game today seeking to raise money for their worthy cause. Further details regarding the Benevolent Fund and what assistance it provides is included on Pages 34 and 35 of today's programme. Please give generously.

In terms of the game here this afternoon, we only started playing Westfields when they moved across from the Midland Premier Division in Season 2019-20 and the two teams have so far met on just eight occasions, with our visitors today having much the better record with five wins to our two with one game drawn. Last season both teams won on their opponents ground and all four games in the past two seasons have seen no more than one goal separating the two sides at the end of 90 minutes and another close encounter is anticipated this afternoon.

Westfields currently sit in 12th place in the table, with eight wins in their opening 19 league fixtures but have started to hit form in recent weeks. They are currently unbeaten in six games in all competitions and have hit 14 goals in the last two games.

Our away win in midweek at Brimscombe & Thrupp saw us reach the half way stage of our league season sat in fourth place in the table. Today's programme includes a status report prepared by Press Officer Stuart Smedley charting our progress to date and comparing it with previous seasons.

The same night that the First Team were winning to move fourth in the table the Development Side were causing a major shock in the Quarter Final of the prestigious Wiltshire Senior Cup, defeating Jewson Western League Division One leaders Calne Town, who could well be playing in the Hellenic Premier League next season if they continue their current league form. The 2-1 win for Mark Simpkins side takes us through to the last four of a competition that our first team have only ever won twice in our long history, in a competition whose winners include all the heavyweights of Wiltshire Football including Świndon Town. Also through to the last four are Devizes Town and Warminster Town, both from the Western League with the other semi finalists set to be the winner of today's Wroughton v Trowbridge Town tie. The Development Team will now try and take the cup form into the league as they look to move away from the relegation zone but have a tough looking fixture today away at unbeaten league leaders Kintbury Rangers.

On the subject of County Cups, we have also been reinstated into the Wiltshire Premier Shield after it was confirmed by the Wiltshire FA that Westbury United had played an ineligible player in the game against us, our former keeper Rob Brown the offending player. We will now play away at Chippenham Town in the semi final which is set for Wednesday 27th November.

After an impressive 6-2 win away at St Vallier in the league last week, the Women's side are also in County Cup action tomorrow when they entertain Blunsdon from the Wiltshire Senior League who include several former Bassett players in their squad.

Enjoy the game and hopefully three more points to maintain our upward trajectory in the league table.

Westfields Football Club commenced the new 2024/25 season again in the UHL Hellenic League Premier Division, having played last season and finished twelfth, despite great ambitions to finish in a promotion place.

Last season, Westfields reshuffled their management team and brought in a new look team involving Scott Russell, Dan Chance and Nik Morgan, and this year have added former football league goalkeeper and Welsh experienced manager Lee Kendall as head coach.

Westfields are full of optimism in finishing in a much higher place this season and hope to challenge for promotion to Step 4. Last season Westfields had to reorganise their playing staff, as well as the management staff, but everything went to goo defect and a good number of progressive youngsters were brought into the side, alongside the experience of Westfields long established players.

During the last 57 years, Westfields have enjoyed a meteoric rise throughout the West Midland League to the Midland Football League and along the way have finished runners-up twice in the Midland Football League and narrowly missed out on promotion to the Southern League South and West having finished runners-up to Gresley Rovers and Stratford Town in previous

seasons. Westfields celebrated their 50th anniversary season in 2016/2017 with an amazing giant killing run in the FA Cup, which saw them go through to the first round proper before losing to Curzon and Ashton, following a Match of the Day game at Allpay Park in the first round proper.

This also featured Westfields appearance on Football Focus and prior to that Chief Executive Andy Morris had appeared live on the FA Cup draw as a studio panel quest in Westfields Manchester. have enjoyed tremendous support financial by being sponsored firstly by the ground sponsor Allpay Limited, who have for the first 15 vears were the shirt sponsors of the club. This has now been taken over by CJ Insurance, who have enjoyed fantastic support and coverage in the last five seasons during the period in the Hellenic Football League as Westfields' official club sponsor. In addition, Westfields are supported by Metclad of Nottingham, Support Air, Bloor Homes, Airband, along with support from life member Ron Marshall, who continues to support the club he has known since it's in origination in 1966.

Westfields are a club geared up to success with a very strong committee which has been well established over many years and with a ground with an e-certificate for higher graded football and a recent refurbished clubroom, bar, and dressing rooms.









Westfields rain supreme

Royal Wootton Bassett Town 1 Westfields 3

Saturday 2nd October 2021

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's winless run in the Hellenic League Premier Division extended to five games as they were beaten 3-1 by Westfields on an afternoon of relentless, torrential rain at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground.

The result sees Bassett slip further into the midfield pack, though the team were certainly much improved from their midweek thumping at the hands of Roman Glass St George.

In an open contest, Bassett - not only without manager Sam Collier who was attending the birth of his son Fred, but also leading appearance makers Dave Bampton and Adam Corcoran as well as midfield dangerman Tommy Ouldridge - performed well enough but ultimately succumbed to their visitors' potent attacking force.

Bassett started excellently, taking the lead after just seven minutes. Patient build up saw the ball worked into Alan Griffin on the edge of the area and, taking advantage of some slack defending, he was able to work enough space to squeeze home the opening goal of the game.

Westfields reacted immediately to going behind though and were on the front foot. Daniel Stoneman brought out a good save from Eddie Cavanagh before Josh Hunt went close.

Eventually their equaliser arrived on 27 minutes as Hunt found the net. The goal owed a lot to Matt MacDonald's firm but fair challenge inside Bassett territory. The loose ball then spurted forward and a pass played into Hunt, who controlled with his chest before confidently curling beyond Cavanagh.

It was still anyone's game with Bassett probing forwards. But the best opportunities before the break fell the visitors way as Cavanagh denied Harrison Iddles and Richard Greaves narrowly missed the target.


It then took Westfields all of two minutes to go ahead after the restart. After collecting the rebound from a shot of his that hit the post, MacDonald squared to Stoneman, whose clever low delivery was turned in. The visitors credited Iddles with the goal but it seemed as though an unfortunate Jon Beeden was actually the player to divert the ball into his own net

Bassett should perhaps have been on level terms soon after falling behind though. A clever backheel from Griffin opened up the right side of the visitors' defence and Joe Selman threaded a pass through to John Mills. However his attempted chip of an on rushing lan Havard lacked the required height to beat the 'keeper. Griffin then saw a powerful rising drive from the edge of the area held by Havard.

It was clear that there was at least another goal in the game. Westfields' Iddles placed wide from a prominent position before Joe Davies headed over and Hunt saw a half volley saved well by Cavanagh.

Finally, with quarter of an hour to go, the visitors got their third to kill off the game.

Stoneman broke forward down the right and squared to MacDonald whose powerful effort crashed off the bar and into the net off the back of a helpless Cavanagh.

He was with Shrivenham in 2021-22 before serving as Wantage Town's number one a season later.

Dan Hill Hill is a right back who joins Bassett this season from Cirencester Town. A dependable, solid performer. Hill brings plenty of Hellenic League Premier Division experience, as well as Southern League experience acquired in spells with the Centurions and Highworth Town, Hill made his debut in senior football in 2012-13 with Cirencester Town Development before moving to Fairford Town two seasons later. He earned the Reds' Players' Player and Young Player of the Year awards in 2015-16 before moving to Brimscombe and Thrupp for the 2016-17 campaign. Hill quickly established himself as a key player for the Lilywhites, and was a part of the Brimscombe team that lifted the 2017-18 Gloucestershire Challenge Trophy and finished as Hellenic League Premier Division runners-up in 2018-19. He then joined Highworth ahead of the 2022-23 season, though would finish that campaign with Cinderford Town. Hill split last season between Cirencester

It was at Binfield thought that he made his breakthrough, scoring 11 times in 32 games in 2017-18. Pagliaroli joined Bassett a season later, scoring 18 goals in 40 appearances on his way to a Players' and Supporters' Player of the Year double before netting eight times in 19 games in the Covid-shortened 2019-20 campaign. Last week, the Vase was whittled down to the last 64, this week it's the turn of the Trophy to enter its final qualification round before the big boys from the National League enter the fray in the third round.

This afternoon, the 48 clubs from National League North and South join the 32 Trident League clubs that have battled their way through to the Trophy second round.

Eight Step 4 clubs remain with Coleshill Town and Hadley FC both drawn at home (against Biggleswade Town and AFC Telford United respectively) as two of 14 clubs looking to reach the last 64 for the first time ever.

Southern League Division One South leaders Yate Town also have a home game, against Step 2 side Hampton & Richmond, whilst all five other Step 4 clubs are drawn away from home. Brentwood Town, Sporting Khalsa and Felixstowe & Walton United all also trip to Step 2 opposition in Hereford, Oxford City and Boreham Wood as they bid to reach the last 64 for the first time.

Sittingbourne's visit of Winchester City in one of three ties where the winner will either equal or set their best run. Stockton Town v Scarborough Athletic is the only one of the three to guarantee a club reaches a first-ever last 64 berth.

Three former winners are involved in this second round. Brackley Town (2017-18) and Hornchurch (2020-21) both have away trips to Hashtag United and Enfield Town respectively, whilst Kidderminster Harriers (1986-87) host Halesowen Town in a crunch West Midlands derby,

National League North high-flyers Curzon Ashton will have revenge on their minds when they host runaway Northern Premier League leaders Macclesfield at the Tameside Stadium following the Silkmen's 2-0 win last season on route to the semi-finals.

Weston-super-Mare, however, will be looking to end a 42-year wait to avenge a 1-0 replay loss to Weymouth.

Of the last 64 In the FA Vase, 11 still remain from Step 6 with three of those guaranteed a place in the fourth round, just four steps from the final under the arch.

Abbey Hulton United were rewarded for their fine 2-0 win at Step 5 Atherstone Town with a home tie against Droitwich Spa, who also recorded an away win over higher-level opposition, beating Ashby Ivanhoe 3-1.

Atherton Laburnum Rovers toppled Step 5 Abbey Hey 4-1 away and now host Ashton Town, while Vase debutants Sutton United (Birmingham), 2-0 winners at Midland Premier side Tividale, travel to fellow Step 6 club Winsford United, who were 6-1 winners over Darwen FC.

Three other Step 6 clubs produced shock victories over higher-level opposition last weekend. Okehampton Argyle beat Thornbury Town 2-0 away, Windsor & Eton walloped Hilltop 5-0 at home, and Clay Cross Town, the competition's top scorers with 19 goals, knocked out Stourport Swifts 4-3 away to reach the third round for the first time in 15 years.

Debutants Wombwell Town and Wells City are the other Step 6 clubs left in, alongside only one former winner, in North Shields (2014-15) and two runners -up (Epsom & Ewell 1974-75) and Tunbridge Wells (2012-13).

Defending champions Romford lost 3-2 to Essex Senior League rivals Takeley in their first Vase defence, while Newport Pagnell Town, back-to-back finalists in 2021-22 and 2022-23, were also knocked out, going down 2-1 at home to Dereham Town.

Indeed, it was another weekend of thrills, spills and big scorelines. London Lions avenged their defeat by Stanway Rovers last year with a 10-2 thumping — only the third time in Vase history that score had been produced.

And Crawley Down Gatwick were also flying high, recording their biggest ever Vase win with an 8-0 thumping of Southern Combination rivals Peacehaven & Telscombe.





Half Way Stage

Status Report

Tuesday's visit to Brimscombe and Thrupp saw Royal Wootton Bassett Town reach the halfway point of their 2024-25 Hellenic League Premier Division campaign.

At the start of the season, Bassett had the aim to repeat (and even better) last year's 4th place finish and playoff final appearance. Manager Sam Collier was also not afraid to mention the 'promotion' word when discussing this season's target.

However, after suffering six defeats while accumulating just nine points from their opening nine matches, the playoffs – let alone promotion – seemed a pipe dream.

Bassett have roared back into playoff contention though, courtesy of a fine eight game streak – ended last Saturday away at Worcester Raiders – in which they claimed 22 points from an available 24.

Now, after 19 games, Bassett sit on 34 (to be updated following Tuesday!) points and are one of a near handful of sides who can consider themselves playoff contenders.

How do does their first half of the season stack up with that in 2023-24, as well as 2022-23 when, a year before the playoffs were introduced, Bassett finished fifth?

Last year, en-route to their fourth place finish, Bassett were in a slightly better position at the season's halfway point, having registered 38 points after 19 games. Collier's side would then go on to finish with 73 as they picked up 35 more points in the second half of the campaign.

Bassett may not be quite there this time around. But Collier and his team do find themselves in a better position than they were in at this stage two years ago. In 2022-23 Bassett had recorded 30 points from 19 games. 35 points from their remaining fixtures then saw Bassett finish on 65 points in fifth, which would have been good enough for a playoff spot had they been introduced.

It's looking likely that a tally of 65 points may not be enough to finish in the top five this season though. Indeed, when assessing the 1.71 points per game Bassett earned across the entire 2022-23 campaign, that was the second lowest tally recorded by a fifth place finisher across the last nine Hellenic Premier seasons to be completed. Only Shrivenham in 2018-19 (61 points from 36 games - an average of 1.69 per game) earned fewer and wound up in the top five.


Across that nine-year span, on average the team finishing fifth has gained 1.81 points per game. Over the course of a 38-game season that would work out, rounding to the nearest whole point, at 69 points.

Bassett are certainly capable of getting to that mark. However, with only eight home games between now and the end of the season (including the next two fixtures against Westfields and Tuffley Rovers), Collier and his side will have to be road warriors.

The eleven away fixtures awaiting Bassett comprise contests against fellow playoff contenders Roman Glass St George, Mangotsfield United, Sporting Club Inkberrow, Fairford Town and Westfields. Bassett will also visit grounds they lost on last year when travelling to Pershore Town and Lydney Town. Although sides battling at the other end of the table, derby trips to Cirencester Town and Malmesbury Victoria don't promise to be easy. Journeys to Longlevens and Hereford Pegasus are also on Bassett's schedule.

Bassett's other home fixtures then see them face fellow playoff hopefuls Highworth Town, Corsham Town, Slimbridge and Worcester Raiders, as well as Thornbury Town and Pershore.

While the outcome of this season may be uncertain, it promises to be a thrilling, wide open playoff race. Here's hoping Bassett will once again find themselves with a ticket to the postseason dance.





But Brooks restored Bassett's four goal lead with her fifth of the opening half, heading home from another Fraser delivery.

Elliott extended Bassett's lead further shortly after the restart, steering in at the far post from Jefferies' dangerous free kick delivery.

The score remained that way until just over ten minutes to go when Paige Stewart headed beyond Thea Hopkins, who was introduced for her debut late on in place of Powell.

But that was nothing more than a consolation as Brooks' first half finishing masterclass was more than enough to fire Bassett to a convincing triumph.


