Welcome To Today's Game

GOOD AFTERNOON and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Sporting Club Inkberrow.

A warm welcome to all the players, management team, club officials and supporters from Inkberrow who have made the journey from Worcestershire. We hope you all enjoy your short stay with us this afternoon and we wish you a safe journey home.

This is the first time we have played Sporting Club Inkberrow and with the side only existing since 2016 there is not the usual extensive statistics on our opponents in today's programme. I must confess to not even knowing where Inkberrow was in the country although, in pulling this programme together, I now understand that Inkberrow is a village in Worcestershire. Moreover it is often thought to be the model for Ambridge, the fictional setting of BBC Radio 4's long-running series The Archers, with The Bull, the fictional Ambridge pub, supposedly based on The Old Bull in Inkberrow. Sounds like a pub worthy of a visit for the return fixture in January.

Whilst Sporting Club Inkberrow's history is short it has been massively successful with four league titles in the eight seasons they have existed, remembering also that two of the other four seasons were impacted by Covid and not completed.

They have certainly adapted well to life in the Premier Division of the UHlsport Hellenic League after last season's promotion following the demise of Hereford Lads Club. Having lost to Malmesbury Victoria in the play-off final, Sporting Club Inkberrow were promoted as a replacement when Lads Club folded. Sporting Club Inkberrow currently sit in fourth place in the table with just three defeats in their opening 17 league games. Their only defeats so far have come at league leaders Hartpury University and surprisingly at home against Cirencester Town and Brimscombe & Thrupp. Be warned

they have a 100% winning record in Wiltshire this season having won away at both Highworth Town and Corsham Town. We will certainly need to be at our best this afternoon if we are to continue our rise up the table. We are currently unbeaten in our last seven league games, six of which have been won but today's encounter is certain to be a stern test to that unbeaten record.

We did fall to defeat in midweek in the Wiltshire Premier Shield against Southern League opponents Westbury United, continuing our miserable record against Westbury. I thought it was an excellent game and that we competed well against our higher league opponents. If that shot of Brad's not been saved by Rob Brown with his feet on his return to the GBSG I feel we would have gone on to win the game. Westbury were gifted a goal at the end that gave them a two goal advantage which for me flattered them as we had more than matched them over 90 minutes.

The Development side are back in action today with a trip south to take on Shrewton United. When the two sides met at the end of August at the Sustain Stadium it finished all square at 1-1 and another close encounter is expected today.

Tomorrow sees the Women's side have a massive game at the top end of the South West Regional Women's League North Division 1 with the visit of Gloucester City to the Sustain Stadium. This represents a crunch test for the Women's side as Bassett host the league leaders and title favourites. Gloucester finished third in Division One North last season and have made another strong start this year as they arrive at the Sustain Stadium having won all their league games to date. Admission on Sunday is £4 for adults, £2 for concessions and free for RWBTFC youth members.

Enjoy the game and hopefully three more points to maintain our upward trajectory in the league table.

Committee Chat Special

Head of Girls Section - Sam Wood



Not the usual person from the Committee writing the programme notes today. Due to his busy schedule I was kindly asked by Chairman Paul Gerrish to assist him by introducing the expanding Girls Section to you all.

This season I was asked to become Head of the Girls Section within the club, which as a young player who was fortunate to play for RWB throughout my own youth this project has and continues to be one that I will put my heart and soul into, as it's important that young girls are given the opportunity to play, with the hope that one day they will develop into young females who will represent RWBTFC at the senior level within the women's team.

Although this process hasn't happened overnight, the club are beginning to form a large girls section that has now increased from one team five years ago to six teams in this current season, and the main source of this development has come from the free Wildcat sessions that Mark Ellis has been hugely involved in across the years. Many of our girls have started at these sessions and have gone on to represent RWBTFC in our teams across the section.

Our U8's team have started their season incredibly well and are beginning to create a good bond with each other, and are currently improving week on week within their matches and training sessions. This year they have been helped by Andy Morris, Lisa Merwood-Palmer, Barry Mannings, Alex McLeish and Freya K (one of our U15G) who are keen to ensure they continue to help the girls develop their skills further.

Our U10's team have had a slight change in personnel over the summer due to children relocating and moving onto other teams. However, these spaces were filled very quickly and Josh Connolly and Mark Bennett are on track to developing the side in their first year at 7 a' side football.

Our U12's team are also experiencing new challenges within their league, as they took the step up a division after being promoted last season. This is also the first year they are experiencing nine a' side football which has

challenges in itself. Andy Guppy, Damien Gower and Simon Merwood-Palmer are continuing to push the girls further to aid development and have already achieved some success as they sit seventh in the table with two wins, one draw and two defeats.

Our U13 girls have started their season strong, as they continue to battle in the top division. This team is ran by myself and Bryan Wood and we are continuing to push the ethos that ensures all of the children within our team are composed on the ball. This season the U13's currently sit in sixth position on nine points having secured three wins and two narrow defeats. This team will also be making history next year after being invited to go to Holland, as part of our club's annual trip. In previous seasons only boy's team have attended with female players participating in those teams, however this will be the first all girls team to represent the club within Holland and we plan to make the club proud and be remembered.

And finally our U15's have also started strong this season within their division as they have also seen players leave, but have gained several players in their first season at 11 a' side. Currently they sit second in their division on 12 points with four wins from five games. This is a tremendous start for Dave Bundy's side who with the help of Kelvin Spencer and Jess Newman continue to develop them towards senior football in a few years time.

And our biggest success within the last couple of months has been the growth of our new U7s team at RWB. Over the last month we have seen the numbers grow from three girls in their first session to 13 just before the half term break. The plan is to start early with this young side and push the development of the basic skills within football, to help develop their game knowledge later on in the season. This team is currently being coached by Mark Ellis who has been important person in ensuring the young girls within the club are developing their fundamental skills surrounding football.

We hope you enjoy today's game and get behind the first team in their quest to pick up some league points against Sporting Club Inkberrow.

Sporting Club Inkberrow

Inkberrow FC was established in its current form in 1978, providing an opportunity to play and watch football for local people, in both a friendly and competitive atmosphere. The club grew in strength due to the addition of its junior section in 2000 and were awarded "Chartered Standard" status by the FA in 2004. The ambition of the club has been to provide a fun environment for local players and to encourage player development within the club. The rise of Sporting Club Inkberrow has been testament to this, with over 50% of the current playing squad graduating from the Inkberrow FC junior section.

SC Inkberrow itself was originally founded as "Inkberrow Reserves" in the summer of 2016 under the guidance of Neil Guy, Carl Stenton and Tom Harris, who remain in charge today. The team began life in the Stratford Alliance Division 2, quickly making progress by winning the Stratford Alliance Premier League in their second season and looking for further opportunities to push up the football pyramid. The Midland Football League Division 4 appeared to be an ideal home, with Inkberrow FC first team already competing in the MFL Division 3. But for Inkberrow Reserves to secure entry into the league, the team were required to register under a new name to avoid potential complications with Inkberrow FC being in the league above. Therefore, the team took on the name SC Inkberrow, following the name of the wider sports club, and adopted the green and white kit originally used by the club in 1978.

The club continued to make good progression on the pitch with Inkberrow FC gaining promotion to the MFL Division 2 (Step 7), and SC Inkberrow were also invited to join the Hereford Premier League (Step 7). With two affiliated teams in Step 6 feeder leagues the club had high ambitions for the 22/23 season, but it was Sporting Club Inkberrow who were able to secure promotion to the Hellenic Division One, after fending off title challengers Ledbury Town in a dramatic end to the season. The 23/24 season was the first time in the history of the club competing within the football pyramid, with progress being made on and off the pitch to support this fantastic achievement. An extremely positive season culminated with a 4th placed finish and a place in the play-offs to fight for promotion to the Hellenic Premier league. SC Inkberrow travelled to Clanfield 85 FC for the semi-final, winning the game 0-3, and then made the journey to Malmesbury Victoria FC where the team lost a competitive game 2-1. But due to a league restructure, SC Inkberrow were offered promotion as losing Finalists, making the team one of only two in the country to complete back to back promotions into Step 6 then Step 5 of the football pyramid.

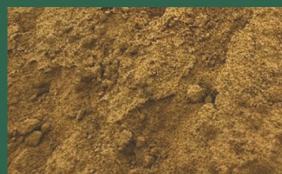

Player	Biography	Sponsor
 <p>James Foster</p>	<p>Foster is an experienced goalkeeper who joined Bassett towards the end of last season when he made five appearances, keeping three clean sheets - including against Highworth Town in the Hellenic League Premier Division playoff semi final. Foster brings significant Southern League experience having represented the likes of Abingdon United, Didcot Town, Hungerford Town, Thatcham Town and North Leigh at that level. He was with Shrivenham in 2021-22 before serving as Wantage Town's number one a season later.</p>	<p>Mike & Ethan Price</p>
 <p>Dan Hill</p>	<p>Hill is a right back who joins Bassett this season from Cirencester Town. A dependable, solid performer, Hill brings plenty of Hellenic League Premier Division experience, as well as Southern League experience acquired in spells with the Centurions and Highworth Town. Hill made his debut in senior football in 2012-13 with Cirencester Town Development before moving to Fairford Town two seasons later. He earned the Reds' Players' Player and Young Player of the Year awards in 2015-16 before moving to Brimscombe and Thrupp for the 2016-17 campaign. Hill quickly established himself as a key player for the Lilywhites, and was a part of the Brimscombe team that lifted the 2017-18 Gloucestershire Challenge Trophy and finished as Hellenic League Premier Division runners-up in 2018-19. He then joined Highworth ahead of the 2022-23 season, though would finish that campaign with Cinderford Town. Hill split last season between Cirencester and Fairford.</p>	<p>John Trollope</p>
 <p>Louis Spalding</p>	<p>A highly talented young full back who is entering his 3rd season with Bassett. Skilful, quick, an outstanding defender and a player who always looks to get forward, he was named Manager's and Players' Player of the Year following a standout debut season in 2022-23. Spalding played 47 times, scoring a hugely impressive ten goals. Among his goals was a long range stunner in the FA Cup against Reading City, a last minute winner at home against Tuffley Rovers and a brace away at the same opponents. Spalding enjoyed another excellent season in 2023-24, featuring 45 times while scoring three goals. With Swindon Town as a youth, Spalding joined Cirencester on loan in 2017-18. That year he made eleven appearances, before signing with the Centurions ahead of the following season after his release from Swindon. With Cirencester in 2018-19, Spalding featured 38 times as his side finished as runners-up in Southern League Division One South. He then joined Swindon Supermarine, appearing in 38 games in the curtailed 2019-20 Southern League Premier Division South campaign, ten matches a season later and four times in 2021-22.</p>	<p>John & Kath Fellows</p>
 <p>Adam Corcoran</p>	<p>Bassett's current longest serving player and captain, Corcoran is entering his thirteenth season with the club, having reached the 300 appearance mark in 2022-23. Corcoran is an imposing central defender - with the ability to also play at full back when needed - who is composed on the ball and dominant in the air. A Cirencester Town Academy graduate, he initially joined Bassett in 2011-12 after brief spells with Fairford Town and Calne Town. Corcoran quickly established himself as a key part of Bassett's defence, and in 2012-13 helped the team to promotion from Division One West. After a brief spell with Shrivenham, he re-joined Bassett in the summer of 2015 and has been with the club since. He is a player whose performances have seemed to get better and better over time too. The 2021-22 campaign was without doubt his best in Bassett colours, with the defender going on to earn both Manager's and Players' Player of the Year awards. A quality striker of the ball and danger at set pieces, he has also contributed 18 goals in his 352 Bassett appearances.</p>	<p>John Trollope</p>
 <p>Bradley Pagliaroli</p>	<p>Pagliaroli is an exciting, dangerous attacking player who rejoins Bassett this season. Possessing a sublime touch, great skill and a lethal left foot, Pagliaroli previously spent two years with Bassett from 2018 to 2020 before making a handful of guest appearances in the seasons since then. Prior to this seasons, he had featured 70 times for Bassett, scoring 32 goals. Pagliaroli began his senior career with Wantage Town before having a brief spell with Thatcham Town. It was at Binfield thought that he made his breakthrough, scoring 11 times in 32 games in 2017-18. Pagliaroli joined Bassett a season later, scoring 18 goals in 40 appearances on his way to a Players' and Supporters' Player of the Year double before netting eight times in 19 games in the Covid-shortened 2019-20 campaign. In the seasons since he has featured for Thatcham Town, Binfield and Uxbridge at step four, while also featuring for Kintbury Rangers and Newbury.</p>	
 <p>Oliver Case</p>	<p>Another product of Bassett's youth section, Case re-joined the club in January 2024 and played a key role in the Men's First Team's late season playoff push. In all, he featured 14 times for Bassett last season. He scored two important goals - against Fairford Town and then in the playoff semi final against Highworth Town, with both proving to be match winners. An intelligent, composed player who is strong in the air, Case is an extremely impressive young centre half. After starting out his youth career with Bassett, Case joined Swindon Town's Academy. Following his release, he joined Highworth in 2021-22 and, across two seasons, featured 62 times for the Worthians, scoring three goals. He joined Southern League Premier Division Didcot Town at the start of the 2023-24 campaign, playing 14 times before joining Bassett.</p>	<p>KG Sports Massage & Injury Therapy</p>
 <p>Jack Hobson-McVeigh</p>	<p>An experienced, cultured central midfielder entering his 3rd season with Bassett having joined from Malmesbury Vics. 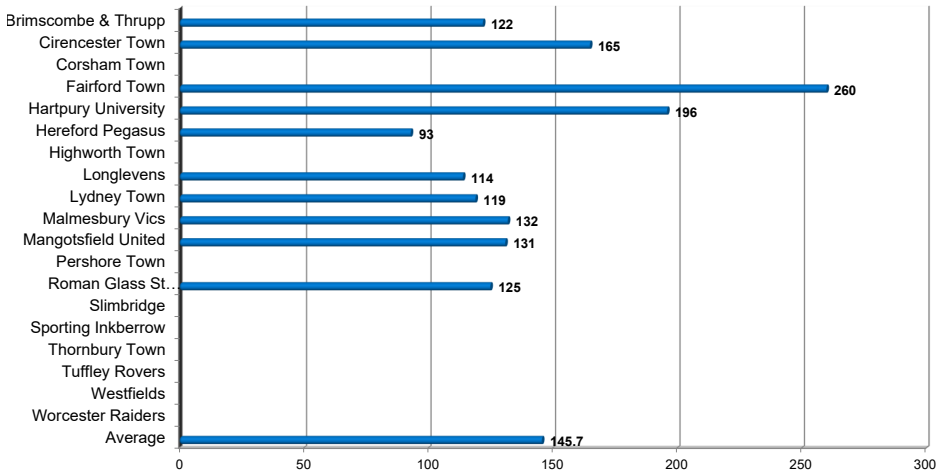

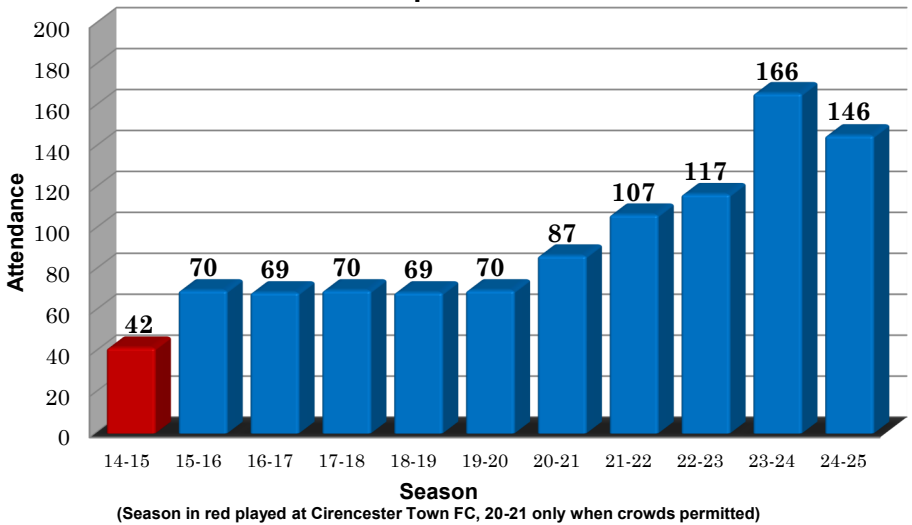

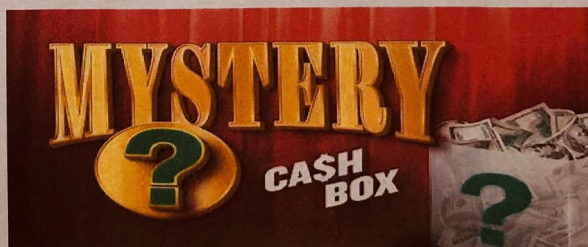

Presley served as the creator for Bassett's second three minutes after the restart. Following a swift counter, he cut back for youngster Hopkins who confidently swept into the bottom corner from twelve yards.

Pegasus' cause wasn't helped shortly before the hour when leading scorer Carlos Moreira picked up a second yellow card for dissent.

And soon after it was 3-0 as Hopkins teed up Tommy Ouldrige for a simple close range finish.

The scoring was then completed five minutes from time when George Peare rose highest to meet a Hobson-McVeigh corner, which he expertly guided into the top left corner.

Bassett now sit seventh, just two points off the playoff places. Those credentials will be tested in their next two league fixtures at home against fellow contenders Sporting Club Inkberrow and then away at Worcester Raiders.

But if they repeat this performance, Bassett will be confident of being back in the top five in the next couple of weeks.

First though they face a home Wiltshire Premier Shield date with Southern League Westbury United - and an opportunity to put higher level opposition to the sword

Jas strikes key note as Bassett end recent blues

Goals from Jasmine Kennedy and captain Laura Jefferies earned Royal Wootton Bassett Town a vital 2-1 win away at Bath City in the South West Regional Women's Football League Division One North.

The result, earned thanks to a gritty, determined performance, ends Bassett's four game winless run which had seen Adam Wood's side pick up just two points from three games. And it was important that Bassett got back to winning ways - especially with leaders Gloucester City, who boast a 100 per cent record from their opening five games - coming to the Sustain Stadium next Sunday

Bassett led early thanks to Kennedy's quick reactions. Bath 'keeper Sadie Farley had denied Caitlin Brooks after she received a fine ball into the box from Darcy Cox. But the rebound fell to Kennedy, who made no mistake, steering into the top corner.

Having lost away at Bath and drawn at home, Bassett knew this was going to be a battle. And the Romans quickly posed a threat as they sought to get on terms, Amy Key heading wide from a corner before Tara Taylor could only place off target after seizing on an underhit pass from 'keeper Millie Powell that was intended for Kelly Nightingale.

But, in an even opening half, Bassett seemed as though they were going to head into the interval ahead.

That was until Bath snatched an equaliser with moments remaining until the half time whistle. Bassett were unable to clear from Erin Duffy's dangerous left wing cross, and the ball fell to Taylor, who showed good close control before fashioning space in a tight area and poking past Powell from close range. Powell may have been beaten then, but she pulled off a fine save shortly after the restart to keep the scores level. Madeleine Brown conjured up a shot from a tight angle and Powell showed great reflexes to tip the ball over the bar.

It remained a tight contest with the teams pushing for the next goal, though few clear cut chances of note being created thanks to some solid defending from both sides. Around the hour mark Hannah Gulliver shot a free kick straight at Farley while at the other end Koren Thorner-Atkinson struck wide from distance.

The decisive moment of the second half then arrived with quarter of an hour to go. Nightingale found Jefferies out wide on the left and the Bassett skipper shrugged off the attentions of Eve Trivett before lifting a shot Farley, who - despite getting a glove to the ball - was unable to keep it out.

Bassett then almost had a third with eight minutes to go as Jefferies found Maddy Elliott whose low drive fell inches wide of the post. The action switched to the other end where substitute Poppy Spratt came close to equalising with pretty much her first touch after coming off the bench. However her half volley sailed narrowly wide with Powell beaten.

Both league meetings between the teams produced late goals - Bassett's visit to Twerton Park seeing the Romans score an injury time winner before Bassett snatched a point in the return fixture with a last ditch equaliser.

There was plenty of stoppage time played on this occasion. But the full time whistle eventually arrived with Bassett's lead still intact, the closest Bath came being when Rebecca Fry tried her luck from distance only to shoot straight into the hands of Powell.

Wiltshire Senior League Premier Division Roundup 26 Oct

Last season **Kintbury Rangers** pushed Amesbury Town all the way in the race for the title, eventually finishing seven points short. This season they are aiming to go one better and go into November unbeaten in the league after registering their twelfth win in 14 games with a 2-1 away victory at **Bemerton Heath Harlequins Reserves**. Ominously for the rest

of the division they now have last season's top scorer George Armstrong back in their ranks and he scored his first of the season in this latest Kintbury win, this season's leading scorer Kye Williams, with his eleventh of the season, with the other Kintbury goal. Dean Reynolds with the Bemerton goal with all three goals coming in the first half.

Wroughton kept in touch with the league leaders with a 2-0 home win over **Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development**. The game remained without a goal until the 65th minute when Wroughton's leading scorer Jonathan Peachey-Score broke the deadlock with his 19th goal of the season. Ten minutes later Kassa Anderson made sure of the points with his second of the game. **Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development** had also been in action in midweek when they visited **Larkhall Athletic Development** and they had moved out of the bottom four places thanks to a 4-2 victory. Two goals from Caleb Geib and one from George Lance and Flynn Walters securing the three points, with Aidan Maslen and Tatenda Mateke getting the Larkhall goals. Following the Wroughton defeat Royal Wootton Bassett remain just outside the bottom four on goal difference, whilst Wroughton's win sees them remain six points behind Kintbury with the two sides yet to meet this season.

The top match of the day was at **Letcombe**, where the home side who sat fifth in the table ahead of this weekend's fixtures were up against the side just above them in the table, **Pewsey Vale**. It started well for the home side as Xavi Diaz put them 1-0 up but Pewsey were level by half time and then went ahead early in the second half, Brandon Vincent and former Letcombe striker Josh Fowler with the two Pewsey goals. Ben Cleary then got Letcombe back on level terms late on in the game, heading in from a corner for his 12th of the season. Just as it looked as though the two sides would have to settle for a point, deep into injury time Kieran Kerby scored a third and winning goal for Letcombe. The win saw Letcombe climb above both their beaten opponents and Melksham Town Reserves into third spot in the table. Whilst currently ten points behind leaders Kintbury, Letcombe have two games in hand.

Melksham Town Reserves suffered a setback to their promotion ambitions when they fell to a 3-2 home defeat at the hands of **Shrewton United**. They trailed 2-0 at the break to goals from Joe Spratt and Charlie Utterson and it got worse for them when Utterson scored his second of the game within a minute of the restart to give Shrewton a 3-0 lead. Melksham rallied and pulled one back through Sam Hendy on 52 minutes and then scored a second 12 minutes from time to give them hope of getting something out of the game, Hendy again the scorer. However, Shrewton's defence held firm to prevent any further goals being conceded as they picked up their second away win of the season.

Trowbridge Town also lost ground in their push for promotion when they fell to their third home defeat of the season, **Calne Town Reserves** leaving with all three points following a 2-1 win. Jamie Lyons had given home side Trowbridge an early lead from the penalty spot after a foul on Connor McKay. However, four minutes later Calne were back on level terms following another penalty, Sean Bailey putting the spot kick away to make it 1-1 and it remained that way at the break. A second half strike from Calne's Lewis Royston saw them end their run of three games without a win and climb above their beaten opponents into seventh place in the table. To add to Trowbridge's miserable afternoon they had Derek Wheeler sent off late on for a second bookable offence.

There was the proverbial game of two halves at the Ian Richardson Football Ground where **Shrivenham's** visitors were **Kingsdown**. The first half belonged to Kingsdown as two penalties from Josh Atwell saw them lead 2-0 at the break. James Hirst started the Shrivenham come back pulling one back early in the second half. The same player then scored a second for Shrivenham from a free kick to level matters up. The game was completely turned around late on when Matty Horsell scored what proved to be the winner for Shrivenham who moved out of the bottom four as a result of their fourth league win of the season and their fourth straight win in all competitions.

There were a couple of important games at the bottom end of the table, and it was to prove to be a good afternoon for the young **Salisbury Development** side who were another side to move out of the bottom four with a win. Goals from Josh Ngombi, Henry Anoma and Naman Gurung secured a convincing 3-0 win over a **Faringdon Town** side who do not travel well, having now lost all six games on the road they have played. ASK any manager or coach, proven goalscorers are so desperately hard to come by these days, so, to see not one, but two, Non-League striker legends hang up their scoring boots, it's only right their achievements are celebrated.

Both Sam Higgins and Dave Tarpey have bowed out of the game these last few weeks with their legendary status intact. Stacks of goals wherever they've played and trophies gleaming in the cabinet back home/

When Sam Higgins first stepped into Non-League football as a fresh-faced 17-year-old, little did he know he would forge a career to bring joy to so many.

After nine years at the Millwall academy and a brief stint at Southend United, Higgins dipped his toes in Non-League waters and the rest was history.

In 16 years, Higgins established himself as one of the part-time game's most decorated figures, scoring a whopping 403 career goals and picking up an unrivalled haul of collective and individual accolades along the way.

Undoubtedly, his highlight was an iconic first spell at East Thurrock United, which yielded 275 goals and no fewer than four Golden Boots, at Steps 2, 3 and 4. He also won the Isthmian Premier and North division titles and steered the Rocks to a first-ever Essex Senior Cup success.

At Hornchurch, he lifted the FA Trophy at Wembley and Isthmian Premier title as well as a Player of the Year and Golden Boot double.

With further success came at Chelmsford City (two spells), Bromley, Canvey Island, it's no wonder Higgins made such an impact in and around his native Essex

But, last week, after picking up a heel injury while playing for Hashtag United, the 35-year-old finally called time on his glittering career, to a social media fanfare from past clubs, managers, teammates and fans.

From his first loan spell at Fisher Athletic to his last hurrah at Hashtag United, Higgins was highly regarded by all and will go down as one of Non-League's all-time greats.

"It's been a very long time and, at some point, it had to come to an end, unfortunately," said Higgins, before admitting he has no burning desire to return to the game in a coaching capacity.

"It was a tough decision, but it felt like the right one.

I've had quite a few injuries over the last few seasons and a couple of weeks back I had a heel injury which is probably going to take a few months to recover from.

"Having a lot of injuries can be mentally draining so to be able to come out of it with a sense of achievement is something to be proud of.

"The thing I will miss most about the game is the people. I've met friends for life; managers, players and the people working within the game. Those are the best relationships, ones to last a lifetime."

Tarpey, meanwhile, has a similar tale to tell.

A hat-trick of promotions, a deal to become a professional footballer and a record-breaking goalscoring season, the 35-year-old too boasts a CV that many aspiring footballers could only dream of.

Tarpey announced his retirement last week after rupturing his ACL for a second time, while playing for Marlow against Biggleswade Town in the FA Trophy.

Starting at Basingstoke Town and then Hampton & Richmond, the skilful forward also enjoyed a spell at Farnborough before taking his game to a whole new level at Maidenhead United, scoring 44 goals in their National League South title winning season – still a league record.

That earned him a two-year pro deal at National League high-fliers Barnet but Tarpey suffered a serious knee injury on his home debut, prompting a lengthy period of rehabilitation.

A stint at Woking saw him rediscover his form before Bracknell Town and Leatherhead led him to a promotion-winning season at Marlow under manager Mark Bartley before his latest injury.

"I always said over the last few years, as long as I can stay injury free I'll keep playing," Tarpey told the Maidenhead Advertiser.

"I've got three children and a fiancé at home who have had to put up with me travelling up and down the country for the last 13 years.

"I got three promotions, won numerous county cups and I can retire and say for the level I've played, I feel I've had a great career with what I've done.

"Some people don't get promoted at all in their career, to say I've won three is a great achievement."
