Men's First Team Bassett Bulletin Welcome To Today's Game

GOOD AFTERNOON and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Longlevens AFC.

A warm welcome to all the players, management team, club officials and supporters from Longlevens who have made the journey from Gloucester to be with us today. We hope you all enjoy your short stay with us this afternoon and we wish you a safe journey home.

Well since the last programme we have won both games and scoring goals by the plenty. The 4-1 win over Lydney Town here at the Sustain Stadium being followed by an impressive 6-3 win away at Slimbridge. We are now unbeaten in five games, the unbeaten run includes four victories and has seen us move up to tenth spot in the table.

This afternoon's visitors sit back in 17th position with just two wins from their opening 14 games, those wins coming against Tuffley Rovers and Westfields. Apart from the defeats against Hartpury and Pershore their results have been pretty close so we should be under no illusions that we will need to be at our best this afternoon to secure the three points. Our record in recent against Longlevens is a good one with just one defeat in the last ten meetings between the two sides. Hopefully we can continue that form here this afternoon.

Next Saturday sees us in the First Round Proper of the FA Vase with a tough looking trip to Southampton to take on AFC Stoneham. This is as tough a test as we could have been given against new opponents for the Men's First Team. Stoneham finished as Wessex League Premier Division runners-up in 2023-24, losing the promotion playoff final 1-0 against Shaftesbury. They have been a consistent force in the Wessex Premier for the past few seasons too, having come third in 2022-23 and fifth the season before that. So far this season, they have won four of their seven league games, drawing two and losing just once. One of those draws was last Saturday

against league leaders AFC Portchester, the two sides failing to find the net in a 0-0 draw. AFC Stoneham also advanced to the FA Cup Second Qualifying Round for a second year in a row, losing to National League South side Salisbury.

The Women's Team are in FA Cup action this coming weekend looking to add a further £4.000 to the £4.800 they have already won in this season's competition. They are away to Torquay United on Sunday. Having fallen short at this stage for two consecutive years, a victory will see Bassett reach the competition First Round Proper for the first time ever. To achieve that feat though Bassett will need to pull of an upset win against tier five opponents. Bassett did just that to see off Ilminster Town on penalties in the previous round. However, that win was at home with Bassett now required to triumph on the road in Devon. Adam Wood's side will also need to overcome a Torquay team who beat Bassett 5-2 in the Third Qualifying Round two seasons ago. The odds may be against them, but - with the opportunity to make history - Bassett will give it everything they have got. A coach will be running for players and supporters to attend. The coach will depart the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground at 9.45am and leave Torquay at around 4.30-5pm. Around 20 seats are available and will cost £10 on a first come, first served basis.

After a great start to the season the Women's side have stalled in their last two games, losing to Bitton and drawing with Paulton Rovers and the FA Cup is certainly the competition to return to winning ways in. Good luck to Adam and the Ladies on Sunday.

The men's Dev Team have also had a couple of cup games in the past week, losing on penalties in the Fountain Trophies Cup against Faringdon Town last Saturday and then defeating Bemerton Heath Harlequins Res in midweek in the Wilts Senior Cup.

Enjoy the game and hopefully three more points to see us continue to move up the table.

The Club, in its current format, was founded in 1954. We initially played in the North Gloucestershire League, but currently we operate in the uhlsport Hellenic League, the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and the Stroud and District League. Our ladies team operate in the Gloucestershire County Women's League.

In 2011-12, Gloucester City Council created a new football facility and we were fortunate enough to be offered the tenancy, which enabled us to make the step-up to the Gloucestershire County League as our facilities at our Club HQ could not be converted to 'make the grade'. At this point, we must give great credit to E. G. Carter and Company Limited, our major sponsors, because, without them, we could not have got Saw Mills up to the required standard.

In recent years the Club has expanded massively, and we now run five male adult sides, a Ladies side and a Veterans team, our Junior Section covers sides from U8s to U11s, from where players transfer into our Youth Sections to give us continuous cover from U8s through to Veterans. Two seasons ago, we introduced a girls' team and this section continues to expand.

We are recognised as a Two Star FA Accredited Club, the system that has replaced the previously used Charter Standard 'banner'. A special mention here to Dennis Barnsley who has done so much work in respect of the Youth Section, to our Chairman Mark Cornell and Treasurer Chris Trout for putting in so much work to make the

expansion of the Junior/Youth Sections happen.

We had spent more than forty years trying to reach the Gloucestershire County League, but amazingly, within three years we had passed through it and gained promotion to the uhlsport Hellenic League, having won the County League in 2013-14 and once again we were indebted to E. G. Carter and Company Limited for helping us upgrade Saw Mills to the required standard.

In 2014/15 we started another new phase for the Club, in Division One West of the uhlsport Hellenic League and what a start! We won the Division at the first attempt, so after three consecutive titles and two consecutive promotions, we found ourselves in the Hellenic Premier Division and have consolidated our position in that Division, which is no mean feat given that the majority of sides we play have a history and an infrastructure that is superior to ours.

In the 2021-22 season, we had our best ever experience in the FA Cup that culminated in us playing Gloucester City – a dream day out for the Club which will live long in the memory – but the past two seasons we were brought back to earth with exits from the FA Cup in the extra preliminary round.

The 2023-24 season saw a 16th place finish however the club did have the best FA Vase run reaching the second round after victories against Keynsham Town, Shortwood United and then a 430 mile round trip to Helston Athletic.

Three of the best ensure home campaign ends on a high

GBSG, 25th February 2017

A Sam Packer brace and stunning Dale Richards volley ensured Royal Wootton Bassett Town signed off at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for the season with a richly deserved 3-1 triumph against Longlevens.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town saved one of their best home performances of the season for last as they inflicted an emphatic 3-1 defeat on Longlevens.

Three outstanding goals - two for Sam Packer and a tenth of the season for Dale Richards - sealed a victory for Rich Hunter's side, which ensured they ended their second season at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground with a record of eight wins, a draw and eight defeats in the league.

Bassett's home form during the season has been a weak spot, with the formula for turning their new surrounding into a fortress proving elusive.

That indifferent record - which, thankfully, will not be a losing one for a second successive campaign - has arguably been the main reason as to why Bassett have failed to cement a secure position in the top half of the Hellenic League Premier Division.

But if they can repeat the performance put in against Longlevens throughout next year, then that will no doubt occur.

The hosts dominated in the early stages against their Gloucestershire visitors.

Immediately getting on the front foot, Bassett came close early on as good through balls from Richards and Packer almost created an opening. Richards then sent a fizzing low free kick across the face of goal, which required just a touch to guide it in. However, the ball somehow evaded those waiting to pounce.

Richards continued to cause panic in the Longlevens ranks, blazing just over with a left foot drive before Ryan Withers and Steve Robertson came agonisingly close. The former headed wide from a brilliant Nathan Hawkins cross, while Bassett's leading marksman saw an effort headed off the line.

The inevitable duly arrived midway through the half though as Richards smashed in a screaming volley from twenty yards.

In full flow, Bassett soon doubled their advantage with a well worked team goal. Richards set free Robertson, who produced a sublime cross, which Packer duly steered in.

Half time came as great relief for Longlevens, and - to their credit - they re-grouped well after the interval.







Wiltshire Senior League Premier Division Roundup 05 Oct

It was the First Round of the Fountain Trophies Cup this weekend with 13 ties scheduled although one, the game at Malmesbury Victoria Development where Calne Town Reserves were scheduled to be the visitors was postponed due to ongoing issues with the pitch.

The 12 games that took place saw several cup upsets with teams from Division One knocking out sides from the Premier Division. Two sides who are unbeaten in their league fixtures in their respective divisions met at Kintbury Recreation Ground where Premier Division leaders Kintbury Rangers entertained Division One leaders Cricklade Town. In the league Kintbury had won ten of their opening 12 league fixtures, drawing the other two whilst Cricklade had won all nine of their opening league fixtures in Division One including a hard fought 3-2 win against Kintbury's Development side on their last visit to the Recreation Ground. It was to prove to be a happy return visit for Mani Roper's side as they repeated that 3-2 win albeit this time against Kintbury's first team. The manager himself was amongst the scorers for Cricklade, Harry Ayres and Callum Parsons with the other two Cricklade goals who had led 2-0 at the break. Whilst Kintbury scored two of their own after the breakthrough Ollie Denner and Tom Beal it was not enough to prevent them falling to their first defeat of the season. Both are again in cup action next week in their respective County Cups, Kintbury Rangers are at home to near neighbours Hungerford U23, whilst Cricklade are home to Swindon & District League side Nalgo Masters in the Wiltshire Junior

Lambourn Sports are also going well in Division One this season and were another side on Saturday to defeat Premier Division opposition, Thomas Whitham scoring the only goal of the game against **Shrivenham** in a local derby at Lambourn Sports Club.

The third side to cause a cup upset were **Bratton** who, despite sitting in mid-table in Division One, inflicted a surprise 1-0 defeat of Premier Division **Wroughton**, who currently sit second in the table, meaning both the top two in the Premier Division crashed out of the cup at the first hurdle. The only goal of the game came when a cross from debutant Lewis Wayman was turned into his own net by a Wroughton defender.

Two of the all-Premier Division ties required penalties to settle matters including the game at Salisbury where third placed Pewsey Vale were the visitors in a game switched to the new 3G at Sarum. Pewsey took an early lead but Narum Gurung brought Salisbury back level from the penalty spot after Omari Henry was brought down in the box. Two further goals for Pewsey saw them open up a 3-1 lead but Henry gave Salisbury hope with a second and Dillon Gurung then completed the comeback scoring with a diving header. It remained 3-3 meaning penalties were needed to settle matters, Pewsey Vale prevailing in the penalty shoot-out, winning 3-2 from the spot kicks. The Pewsey Vale scorers before those penalties were required were Josh Fowler with two, taking his total for the season to 18, and Callum Ball.

The other tie requiring penalties was at Tucker Park where Faringdon Town's visitors were Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development. When the two sides had met at the same ground in the league back in August, Faringdon had won 3-1. It looked like the visitors Royal Wootton Bassett would avenge that defeat when they led

2-1 with the game moving into injury time, but a powerful volley from Adam Rudman brought Faringdon back on level terms meaning penalties were once again needed. Earlier Harry Timbrell had given Faringdon the lead, but goals from Adam House and Ryan Withers had Royal Wootton Bassett on course for victory until that late strike from Rudman. In the penalty shoot out Royal Wootton Bassett Town went first and scored from the first penalty but then missed their second. Faringdon went on to score all five of their penalty kicks to run out 5-4 winners from the spot kicks.

The all-Premier Division tie between current cup holders Melksham Town Reserves and Blunsdon ended up not being a close affair, but at half time it looked like another that could have been heading for penalties. Blunsdon led 1-0 thanks to a penalty from Eliot Wheatley as the game entered the final minute of the first 45 but two goals for Melksham in injury time at the end of the half saw Melksham turn things around to go into half time with a narrow lead. However, the second half was to be a different story as the young Melksham side hit Blunsdon with five unanswered goals to run out 7-1 winners, a score few would have predicted at half time.

There were three ties where Development sides of Premier Division clubs took on sides from the Premier Division but there were to be no shocks in these three fixtures. At Kingsdown School it was an in-house affair when **Kingsdown Development** took on their own **Kingsdown** first team with the result going as expected with the first team winning 3-1 thanks to goals from Josh Atwell, Tyler Preedy and Tyler Wilkinson, Steve Davis with the reply for the Development side.

Last season's cup finalists and previous winners of the Fountain Trophies Cup Larkhall Athletic Development maintained their good record in the competition with a 2-0 away win over Shrivenham Development at the lan Richardson Ground. Visitors Larkhall dominated the early stages of the game and scored twice through Thomas Dowell, with his seventh goal of the season, and Harvey Kendrick with a powerful header. Larkhall went close on several occasions, hitting the post and missing other good chances but it was just the two as the teams turned round at half time. It was a different story after the break as Shrivenham Development fought to get back into the game creating several chances of their own, but the Larkhall defence held firm, avoiding conceding to safely progress through to the Second Round.

Pewsey Vale Development from Division One were at home to Premier Division side Letcombe and goals from Ben Cleary, Jack Daley and Dan Timbrell ensured Letcombe remain fighting on all three fronts with their County Cup fixture against Burghfield set for this coming Saturday.

The game between Premier Division Park United and Division One side Stratton Juniors turned into a one-sided affair with Park running out 12-3 winners to progress to the last 16. Star of the show was Jamie Norman who scored four of the Park goals, Lewis McCarron, Charlie Norman, Adam Mitchell all bagged a brace and there were further goals from Zac Hillier and Alex Hillier. For Stratton the goal scorers were Ogedi Uzokwe with two and Daniel Bond.

IT'S FA Cup weekend and for the 64 teams contesting the third qualifying round this afternoon, that feeling of 'what if' is already firmly locked at the back of the minds of many.

'What if' we win one more game and get a winnable tie in the fourth qualifying?

'What it' we then pull out a Birmingham City or a Bolton Wanderers when the EFL clubs from Leagues One and Two enter in the first round, and 'what if' we get the TV cameras down for a nice big payday to boot?

Not that'll you'll catch managers admitting to harbouring such thoughts at this stage, but for chairmen and women, the boards of directors and, of course, the fans, it's very much allowed. In fact, it's insisted upon.

Each and every year a Non-League club get their place in the spotlight, it seems. A fairytale story decided upon by the FA Cup gods alone, irrespective of league position or previous history.

You only need cast your minds back 12 months for an example of what can achieved. The FA Cup first round threw up a dream tie for Step 4 side Cray Valley PM, whose reward for a fourth qualifying round victory over Enfield Town was a first-round clash at neighbouring big guns Charlton Athletic.

Incredibly, a Lucas Ness own goal earned the Millers a lucrative replay in front of the TV cameras at the humble Badgers Sports Ground where the Addicks eventually won through.

Since then, however, Cray Valley have won promotion to Step 3 for the first time in their history and star striker Kyrell Lisbie earned a move to the National League with Braintree Town.

The same thing happened to Isthmian Premier side Horsham, who earned a first-round tie at former Premier League side Barnsley at Oakwell, brought forward to the Friday night.

The Hornets produced the performance of a lifetime to hold the Tykes to a 3-3 draw to force a home replay, where they eventually lost 3-0. But they were soon reinstated after it was discovered Barnsley had fielded an ineligible player, only to go down 3-0 to League Two Sutton United in the next round.

Perhaps under the radar was Aldershot Town's trip to Swindon Town – but it was a tie that was to go down in the history books.

Incredibly, Tommy Widdrington's National League Shots went 3-0 up against their League Two hosts

inside just nine minutes and led 7-0 by the 58th minute before the Robins brought it back to 7-4.

It was the first time in history that a Non-League club had put seven goals past an EFL club in the FA Cup, while Widdrington's men went onto beat League Two leaders Stockport County away from home and earn a third-round to at Championship side West Brom.

Sheppey United also earned a taste of the big time when hosting Walsall for a first ever foray to the 'proper' stages (as The FA so condescendingly call it).

Two years ago, Bracknell Town were the Non-League cup heroes, drawing out an Ipswich Town side on an upward spiral under new boss Kieran McKenna.

A capacity 2,000 crowd and the ITV cameras greeted them at their shared Bottom Meadow stadium where the Step 3 Robins gave the Tractor Boys a rather uncomfortable evening at times before succumbing to a 3-0 defeat.

McKenna and a large number of those Ipswich players are now keeping Premier League company these days so, for Bracknell, it was a night the club will never forget.

Elsewhere in the first round, we saw 1-0 victories for Chippenham Town, at home to League One Lincoln City, and King's Lynn Town, who stunned Doncaster Rovers on the road thanks to Gold Omotayo's winner seven minutes from time.

Torquay United, too, came back from two goals down to force a replay at Derby County's Pride Park Stadium, while Farnborough enjoyed their best FA Cup run for 21 years - since that unforgettable 2003 campaign which ended with a fourth-round defeat at Arsenal - beat humbling League Two Sutton on the road.

Sadly, this year, the dynamic has been altered somewhat with the scrapping of FA Cup replays from the first round onwards.

Naturally, the decision has gone down like a lead balloon with clubs outside of the top-flight with the chances of earning a televised home replay or money-spinning away day now kicked into touch.

But with drawn ties now going straight to the lottery of penalties, a famous giant-killing is still as opportune as ever. It's in the lap of the FA Cup gods.


