Welcome To Today's Game

GOOD AFTERNOON and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this FA Cup Preliminary Round tie against Didcot Town. Today's game represents our sixth straight home game and this has been the hardest programme to put together for a number of reasons.

A warm welcome to all the players, management team, club officials and supporters from Didcot who have travelled from Berkshire here today. We hope you all enjoy your short stay with us this afternoon and we wish you a safe journey home. Current Didcot manager Jamie Heapy played for Didcot when they visited Bassett at Rylands Way 20+ years ago, scoring the winner in a 1-0 win in February 2004. I am sure he will find the playing surface here at the Sustain Stadium a little better than the one he would have played on that afternoon at Rylands Way.

Last season was one of struggle for Didcot who finished bottom of the Southern League South Premier Division and were relegated back to Division One South. They opened their season in Division One last Saturday with a 1-0 win over Larkhall Athletic. However, they had a tough time of it in midweek going down 5-1 at Malvern Town (although for some reason the Southern League website is showing it as 4-1 but the two clubs "X" accounts both said 5-1). Based on their squad listed on the Southern League website we can expect that Didcot will bring a young side here today.

Whilst Didcot play at a higher level our record against them is a reasonable one with six wins and two draws in the 17 previous meetings. The last meeting between the two sides was back in Season 2020-21, again in the FA Cup, when two goals from Sam Ockwell helped secure a 2-1 win for Bassett. Today's programme includes the match report from that game which was the first meeting between the two sides since they were in the same division back in 2004-05.

The first meeting between the two sides had taken place way back in Season 1993-94 and had resulted in plenty of goals and a big 6-3 win for Didcot at the beginning of September. Mick Woolford's Wootton Bassett side did however avenge that defeat in the return league game at Rylands Way, running out 3-1 winners. Bassett also knocked Didcot out of the League Cup that season by the same score. Our results against Didcot in all cup competitions reads two wins and one defeat and hopefully Sam and the lads can make it three wins here today although we know it is going to be very tough against higher league opposition. The squad lists that were included in the Bassett match day programme for that league game at Rylands Way are included in today's programme.

The Non-League Paper article in today's programme focuses as expected on the FA Cup and we and Jack Hobson-McVeigh get a mention as a result of that history making goal in the last round. Jack's will get his name mentioned in every programme across the country that carries the Non-League Paper article today and his agent could be in for a busy week!

The result in midweek against Roman Glass St George was not what we wanted but the performance deserved much more. Once again small margins decided matters as I expect is going to be the way all season in what is shaping up to be a very competitive Premier Division this season. We just need to make sure we are on the right side of those tight games. Some goal by Brad Pagliaroli though in our 2-1 defeat.

The Development Team were back in action on Wednesday night but a very poor first quarter when they conceded three goals saw them go down 3-0 to Kingsdown. Today they are away at Faringdon Town.

Enjoy the game and hopefully a cup upset against higher league opposition.

Didcot Town FC were founded in 1907 and prior to becoming founder members of the Hellenic League in 1953 the club had competed in the North Berks, the Reading & District, the Oxfordshire Senior and also the Metropolitan Leagues, albeit with mixed fortune.

Didcot adapted well to the new League format and, under the captaincy of Ray Warr became the inaugural League champions. After four seasons in the Hellenic League, Didcot re-joined the Metropolitan League and reached the League Cup Final in 1961/62. Then in 1963 Didcot returned to the Hellenic League. Didcot waited until the 1965/66 season to taste success again when they won the Premier Division Challenge Cup beating Witney Town 3-2 in the final. The following season the cup was successfully defended but the club had to wait ten long years for further honours.

Indeed, the intervening years had seen Didcot demoted to Division One, and season 1976/77 not only saw a return to the Premier League as champions but also success in the Challenge Cup. A decade later, in 1987, Didcot again returned to the Premier Division after finishing in third place behind champions Bishops Cleeve and runners-up Cheltenham Town Reserves. The club benefited from Hellenic League rules which prevented Cheltenham Reserves from participating in the Premier Division and Didcot took the second and last promotion spot. The season was rounded off with success in the Division One Challenge Cup, where Cheltenham Town Reserves, again the victims, were defeated 2-0 in the final.

The club remained in the Premier Division for the next six campaigns and managed a notable honour in 1992 when they lifted the Premier Division Cup (Banbury United defeated 3-0 in the final). Despite

this success the following season resulted in disappointment with relegation to Division One. Within three years the club was re-instated to the Premier League and while the League Cup was won in 1997 the club had to wait until they moved to the impressive new Loop Meadow Stadium (in 1999) before a turnaround of fortunes was truly achieved as the club established themselves as one of the most consistent performers in the Premier Division at the start of the 21st century, never finishing outside the top 5 for six straight seasons culminating in them winning the league in Season 2005-06, doing the double by also winning the Challenge Cup which they had also lifted in Seasons 2003-4 and 2004-05. The league title saw them promoted to the Southern League where they have remained ever since.

The 18 years they have spent in the Southern League has seen them promoted twice to the Premier Division although on both occasions they have found it tough at the higher level. They were first promoted at the end of Season 2008-09 after finishing fifth and then winning the promotion play-offs, a 2-1 win over AFC Totton. They spent just two seasons at the higher level, being relegated back down to Division One at the end of Season 2010-11 after finishing 19th in a division of 21 teams. The highest place finish in the following 11 seasons in Division One (either South or Central) was a sixth-place finish in 2017-18 but a third place finish in Season 2022-23 and another win in the play-offs thanks to a 1-0 win over Ware saw them return to the Premier Division last season. However, it was to be a struggle again at the higher level and Didcot were relegated straight back down after winning just six of their 42 league games.

Faultless Bassett deservedly spring a surprise

It's a rare thing in football that everything comes together on the pitch just as planned. But on a gorgeous September afternoon, it did so for Royal Wootton Bassett Town, whose faultless display delivered a stunning 2-1 upset win away against Didcot Town in the Preliminary round of the Emirates FA Cup.

Across the entire pitch Sam Collier's side were superb, bettering their Southern League Division One Central opponents from the first whistle to the last. Indeed, it would have been cruel had the result been any different. In the end though, Bassett deservedly booked a place in the First Qualifying round for only the fourth time in the club's history courtesy of Sam Ockwell's brace.

They did so with one of the finest performances Bassett have ever produced in the competition, and one that will stick long in the memory.

Bassett were sharp from the off, applying plenty of early pressure that eventually saw them take a sixth minute lead. They could have been ahead earlier than that too, with Jack Stirland's glancing header being held by Leigh Bedwell following a dangerous cross from debutant Trevor Muterio.

When the goal arrived, it came in style. TJ Bohane, playing alone up front, drew a foul from Joe Green on the edge of the area and Ockwell curled a beauty of a free kick that flew beyond Bedwell into the bottom right corner.

Playing with confidence, Muterio then narrowly missed the target, dragging wide after he had deftly controlled a crossfield pass and cut inside right back Taylor Bedwell.

Didcot did soon equalise, but it was in rather fortuitous circumstances. From a free kick pumped into the box, Green's back post header took an awkward bounce that meant Bassett 'keeper Harrison Ellis was just unable to claw the ball away. The loose ball then fell for Seth Humphries who nodded in from six yards out.

Playing against higher level opponents, Bassett would perhaps have been forgiven if

that equaliser dented their confidence. But the visitors remained the better side as Kai Robinson and Bohane forced Bedwell to make a pair of saves – albeit relatively routine ones – before the break.

That continued after the restart too, Ockwell having an early opportunity when his header from Alex Dinsmore's cross was held on the dive.

Didcot then had a rare opening when a heavy touch from Dinsmore opened up space for Jordan Thomas, but the winger shot wide of the left post after cutting inside from his position on the right wing.

The hosts were unable to create much throughout the game though, something that Bassett's dogged pressing, which began with the selfless Bohane up front and was aided by tireless performances from Robinson and Gio Wrona in their advanced roles in the centre of midfield, contributed heavily towards.

The pressure applied also influenced an erratic, nervous performance from the Didcot defence. On the back foot for long periods, the Railwaymen's back four were forced into conceding numerous corners.







And it was from such a set piece just before the hour that Bassett restored their lead as an unmarked Ockwell guided home Wrona's delivery from twelve yards.

Didcot had no real answer to that. In fact, it was Bassett who appeared likelier to contribute another goal, with Jack Stirland almost adding a third as he found the side netting from a low Dinsmore cross.







With thirteen minutes to go, Didcot did get another opportunity when substitute Jimmy Deabill set the ball to Connor Ferguson, but his low drive from a tight angle was blocked by the feet of Ellis.

The hosts lacked any form of other inspiration though. They were forced to rely on Bassett to provide their final chance of the game too as Matt Berry-Hargreaves conceded a free kick in the left corner for an unnecessary push on Brett Gardner. But while Harley Giles' free kick was not immediately dealt with, it was soon enough hacked away as Bassett rightly claimed an FA Cup scalp.

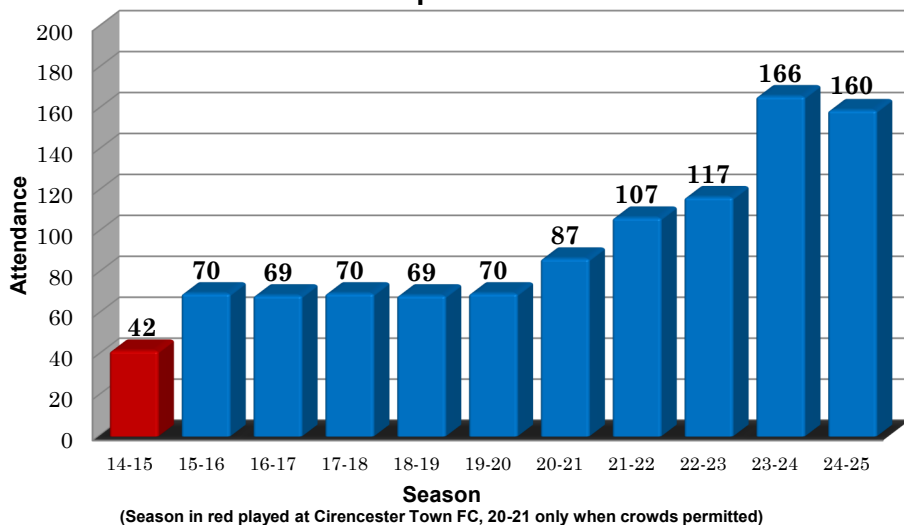

No Home Comforts

So far in the early stages of the 2024-25 season it's been the case of home, not so sweet home for Royal Wootton Bassett Town.

Bassett did muster a quick response as Brad Pagliaroli - signed at late notice to provide cover given the ongoing injury crisis - produced a trademark rocket finish into the top right corner from 25 yards.

An equaliser was not forthcoming though.

Bassett now finish their home stretch with something of a free hit as they aim to pull off a cup upset against Didcot Town. Three straight away league games then follow in which Collier and his team will seek to kickstart their league campaign.

Opening Fixtures

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's opening month of fixtures in the South West Regional Women's Football League Division One North have now been published.

Following their Women's FA Cup first qualifying round fixture away against Ross Juniors on Sunday 1 September, Adam Wood's side are due to open their league campaign with a visit to near neighbours Purton on Sunday 8 September. The game is a repeat of last season's opening league fixture when Bassett triumphed 3-0 at the Red House. A derby contest, pitting the teams finishing second and third in Division One Eastern against each other, it promises to be an exciting opener.

Bassett then play their home opener against Downend Flyers, who finished seventh in Division One North last season, on Sunday 15 August. The fixture will be the first ever league meeting between the teams, though not the first competitive fixture with Downend having won 5-1 in a Women's FA Cup first qualifying round contest in 2015-16.

Bassett are then due to visit SGS Olveston United on Sunday 22 September for what would be another first league encounter between the teams. Olveston were fifth in Division One North last season. This fixture would need to be rescheduled though if either team advance in the Women's FA Cup; if Bassett beat Ross they would entertain Ilminster Town in the second qualifying round on that date.

September is then due to finish with a league visit to Stockwood Wanderers on Sunday 29 September. Like Bassett, Stockwood have been moved to Division One North this season after finishing fifth in Division One Eastern. Wood's side won on both of their visits to Stockwood last season, securing a 7-2 Women's FA Cup victory before a 6-1 league triumph.

All games are due to kick off at 2pm.

Women's FA Cup

Draws for the opening rounds of the 2024-25 Adobe Women's FA Cup have been announced.

Historically Royal Wootton Bassett Town have had limited success in the most prestigious knockout competition in English women's football. First entering in 2012-13, Bassett had been knocked out at the stage they entered the competition in eight of their initial ten participations, recording just three wins.

The past two seasons have brought more success though with consecutive trips to the third - and final - qualifying round. In 2022-23, Bassett triumphed 6-0 away at Middlezoy Rovers before a 5-2 reverse in the third qualifying round against Torquay United.

Bassett advanced to the same stage last season following thumping wins away against Longwell Green Sports (14-0) and league rivals Stockwood Wanderers (7-2). However Adam Wood's side came up agonisingly short of the first round proper courtesy of a 1-0 home defeat against AFC Stoneham.

After that case of so near yet so far, Bassett are now determined to finally go a step further as they seek to make it to the first round proper for the first time in club history.

Doing that will be no easy feat though, with three wins again necessary.

In the first qualifying round - due to be played on Sunday 1 September - Bassett will visit Ross Juniors.

While formed just two seasons ago, Ross have enjoyed success, reaching the Herefordshire County Cup final in 2022-23 before finishing as unbeaten champions of the Herefordshire FA Women's League last season. They'll making their Women's FA Cup debut this season.

The winners of that tie will then host Ilminster Town in the second qualifying round on Sunday 22 September.

Having been relegated alongside Bassett two seasons ago, the Somerset side secured their return to the South West Regional Women's Football League Premier Division last season, finishing as Division One Western champions, edging out Saltash United.

They also enjoyed success in the Women's FA Cup, reaching the first round after qualifying round wins against Bishop's Cleeve and Winchester City Flyers before suffering a defeat away against Plymouth Argyle.

That was the second time Ilminster had advanced through the qualifying rounds. In 2021-22, victories over Gloucester City, Bristol Ladies Union and Sherborne Town saw them advance to the second round where they fell to defeat against Southampton.

Since first entering the competition in 2005-06, Ilminster have advanced to the third qualifying round on three further occasions.

Bassett have plenty of history against Ilminster. The Somerset side have won eight out of ten previous meetings - including a 4-2 victory in the Women's FA Cup preliminary round in 2014-15 and a 4-3 Divisional Cup quarter final triumph last year. Bassett have won just two of their previous meetings - with both coming in the league in 2022-23, including a 5-0 home win.

Jonathan 'JJ' Lacey enjoyed a day to remember at Wembley Stadium back in May. The Biggleswade Town midfielder and his family were handed the VIP treatment at the Home of Football as a special guest of The FA at the FA Cup Final. This once-in-a-lifetime opportunity was JJ's reward for ranking as the highest scorer in the competition, from the Extra Preliminary Round to the Final, after his 10 goals helped the Southern League Premier Central Waders won through six rounds before being knocked out by Solihull Moors in the fourth qualifying round.

Only Manchester City goal machine Erling Haaland could have possibly toppled Lacey's goal haul ahead of his team's 2-1 loss to Manchester United - but would have needed to have scored six goals. Lacey's day included carrying out the match ball prior to kick-off and being presented with the Golden Ball Award by former Manchester United striker Dion Dublin.

"It's once-in-a-lifetime stuff, to be able to walk the match ball out before kick-off, and to be presented this award, it's amazing for me and my family," he said.

"It's surreal to be the top scorer in the Emirates FA Cup, and invite my family to enjoy the Final at Wembley Stadium and see me receive the trophy.

"We wondered if it all might be too good to be true, so when it became official after the final whistle we were relieved, and now I'm really proud to take home the Golden Ball Award."

Lacey, 25, was pushed all the way by Ramsgate striker Joe Taylor, who notched nine goals for the Rams in a remarkable season tally of 53 for the Isthmian South East side. And he said he was only unaware of the award in September, when he scored a hat-trick in an away tie with then Step 2 side Bishop's Cleeve.

The FA's Director of Pro Game Relations, Andy Ambler, added: "JJ Lacey is an

excellent example of this competition giving players and clubs across the English pyramid the chance to test themselves against the very elite.

"His goal-scoring exploits from attacking midfield were outstanding, and we are delighted that his family could attend today's Final and see him collect the Golden Ball Award."

This year, a record high 221 fixtures took place in the FA Cup extra preliminary round – and the competition kicked off in celebratory fashion after a new record was set for the earliest date and time that a goal has been scored in FA Cup history.

It came on Friday August 2nd, at 7.54pm, when Jack Hobson-McVeigh netted for hosts Royal Wootton Bassett Town in their 2-1 extra preliminary round tie against Mangotsfield United. At precisely the same time, Louie Duffield scored for Great Yarmouth Town who knocked out visitors Kirkley & Pakefield 2-0. Both players now jointly hold that prestigious accolade.

The red-carpet treatment enjoyed by Lacey, the former Berkhamsted and Hemel Hempstead Town player, will undoubtedly inspire goal-getters to shine in these early rounds.

The 2024-25 season may only be a fortnight old but this afternoon the FA Cup reaches its preliminary rounds with the winners already setting their sights on launching a glory run.

One man who has already made a mark is Tilbury's Sam Bantick, who completed a memorable hat-trick in the Dockers' 4-1 extra preliminary round win over Buckhurst Hill with a wondergoal from inside in own half!

The Isthmian North returnees face Stanway Rovers in their preliminary round clash this afternoon and Bantick, among others, will be keen to make their mark once again.

Traditionally, the term 'magic of the FA Cup' is usually saved for the first round proper onwards as Non-League sides lock horns with the elite.

But try telling that to the thousands of hopefuls wearing their hearts on the sleeves this afternoon, dreaming for their moment in the spotlight.
