Men's First Team Bassett Bulletin Welcome To Tonight's Game

GOOD EVENING and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for what could be our final home league game of the season, tonight's encounter being a quarter final tie in the Marsh Challenge Cup against Clanfield 85.

A warm welcome to all our visitors who have made the relatively short journey this evening and we hope you enjoy your short stay with us and wish you a safe journey home.

Well our play-off hopes were ended on Saturday with a disappointing 2-1 loss at home against Thornbury Town. However, even if we had won on Saturday. Highworth Town's impressive 3-2 win over FA Vase semi-finalists and probable champions Hartpury University meant we would have missed out even if we had won on Saturday. Tonight's cup encounter means we still have the chance for Sam to bag his first trophy as a manager of Royal Wootton Bassett Town in what is now his eighth season as manager here. We have gone close on several occasions hopefully we can get there by winning three more games this season.

Whilst we have not been in the same division as tonight's opponents Clanfield 85 since was back in Season 2012-13, and have only played them three times in the past 12 seasons in cup competitions three times, we have met on 44 previous occasions. Clanfield were regular opponents in our early years in the Hellenic League. Our overall record against Clanfield is a very good one with 29 victories, eight draws and just seven defeats. Our recent record against them is also a good one with just one defeat in our last eleven games and with us winning all of those aforementioned three cup games. Our one defeat in that spell of eleven games coming in the final league meeting between the two sides.

Clanfield 85 are having a good season in Division One of the Hellenic League and currently occupy the final play-off spot for promotion to the Premier Division. It is very tight, however, for those play-off spots with Abingdon United level on points with

Clanfield, but Clanfield are above them because of a superior goal difference. Stonehouse Town are then two points behind Abingdon but having played one more game than the other two. Both Clanfield and Abingdon have four games to go with Clanfield having a very tough run in with runaway leaders Droitwich Spa, third placed Redditch Borough and Stonehouse Town to play in those four games.

Saturday saw the Development Team pick up an impressive 7-1 win over Trowbridge Town who still have ambitions of achieving a top five position and possible promotion. Four goals up at half time they continued to smash in the goals in the second half against a shell-shocked Trowbridge side. The win did the Development Team's chances of survival the world of good but the win was needed relegation rivals Development also served up their best performance of the season beating Wiltshire Senior Cup finalists Wroughton 6-2. With Salisbury still to play away it is going to be an interesting end to the season for the Development side.

The Women's side made it back-to-back wins on Sunday with a 2-0 home win over Bath City. With Corsham Town doing us a favour by beating Bitton, a second place finish is still a possibility but we might have to beat unbeaten Gloucester City to achieve that. Again it should be another interesting final month of the season for the Women's side.

Well done to the club for the hosting of the Wiltshire Senior League Ladies Cup final. The hard working volunteers at the club did the club proud in what was an enjoyable afternoon of football and I know my fellow League Committee members were very impressed with how the club staged the final. It is customary to thank everybody in the final programme of the season but given the short time in having to turn this programme around given yesterday's cup final, I am hoping there will be another opportunity to do so in the next few weeks.

Clanfield Football Club was founded in 1890 and for many years played in the Witney & District League. Two years were spent in the North Berks League in the 1960's and for 1967-68 season the club joined the Hellenic League.

Clanfield's first game in the Hellenic League was on the 19th August 1967 against Hungerford Town in front of an attendance of 146. In 1969-70 the club won the Hellenic Division One Championship and were promoted to the Premier Division for the first time.

In 1971-72 they missed out on the Runners-Up position only on goal average but went on to secure the Runner-Up spot for the next two seasons also winning the Premier Division Challenge Cup in 1973-74. In 1974-75 the Club reached the Final of the Oxfordshire Senior Cup. The first game ended in a draw after extra time, but Pressed Steel won the replay. 1975-76 saw a repeat of the Cup run to the Final but again Clanfield ended up losing Finalists. After a great period through the 60s and 70s they were relegated to Division One at the end of the 1979-80 Season. However, the Club soon bounced back finishing in second place the following season. At the end of the 1984-85 Season they were once again relegated to Division One where they have remained ever since.

The Club re-entered the FA Vase in 2006 when Buckingham Athletic were visitors to Radcot Road, in a game Clanfield won 1-0. The club won the Jim Newman Memorial Cup in 1978 & 2018 and have been finalists in recent staging of the same event and won the Faringdon Memorial Cup in 1996-97 and 2016-17. Season 2010-11 saw the club finish in fourth place in Division One West and narrowly miss out on promotion to the Premier Division.

The Club have recently adopted a positive youth policy. The Under 18 Team have won the Allied Counties Youth League Central Division and las season their County Cup Competition. The previous season, 2016-17 the Under 17 Team won the Oxfordshire Invitation Youth League Division B whilst the Under 16 Team won their County Cup Competition.

For the 2020-21 season former player Jamie Butt alongside Chris Blakley and Martin Staddon continued as the first team management, with Gary Brown joining them. The season was looking very positive but again was curtailed by the Corona Virus Pandemic.

There was a management restructure for the 2021-22 season with Andy Lyne joining the club as the first Director of Football. Chris Blakely and Martin Staddon stood down from their First Team commitment and the club thanks them both for all their effort over their time with Jamie. Following a nasty injury whilst playing elsewhere, Jordi Mulvany returned to the club as First Team Coach. The season was a success for the club as Clanfield finished third in Division One, losing out in the semi final to Hereford Pegasus who went on to secure promotion in the final against Worcester Raiders. They were also losing semi-finalists in the Challenge Cup as they went out 1-0 to the eventual winners Cribbs FC.

For the 2022-23 season Craig Connor stepped into the First Team Assistant role after deciding to step away from the rigours of playing. The club enjoyed success in the pre-season retaining the Jim Newman Trophy and winning it for the third time in recent years beating Cropredy 8-1 in the final. Clanfield finished the season in fourth place, securing a Play-Off berth for the second season running this time against Milton United. This time the Robins lost out on penalties, with Milton going on to secure promotion on penalties over Hartpury University.

The coming season sees Shaun Morgan joining the coaching staff as Jamie and Craig continue at the helm. Preseason has been promising with the club winning the Jim Newman Trophy for the third year running. The club wishes the players and managers all the best for the season.

Tuesday 21st August 2012


Wootton Bassett Town did their damage early on against visitors Clanfield, scoring four goals in the first half on their way to a 4-1 victory. It was Bassett's third win in four league games and sent Dave Turner's team top of the table.

Steve Yeardley continued his fine start to life back at Rylands Way, opening the scoring just four minutes in. The free scoring Mark Barnes then doubled the lead midway through the period.

It wasn't long before it was 3-0 as defender Liam Edmondson opened his account for the season in the 34th minute. The visitors struck back moments later when Steve Olphert found the net.

However, Barnes struck for the seventh time in five games four minutes before the break to stifle any hopes of a Clanfield comeback. The foot was taken off the gas following the restart, but rarely did the visitors pose any threat.

It's now five games unbeaten for Bassett, and a perfect way to head into Friday's FA Cup clash with Hamworthy United.

James Foster Foster is an experienced goalkeeper who joined Bassett towards the end of last season when he made five appearances, keeping three clean sheets - including against Highworth Town in the Hellenic League Premier Division playoff semi final. Foster brings significant Southern League experience having represented the likes of Abingdon United, Didcot Town, Hungerford Town, Thatcham Town and North Leigh at that level. He was with Shrivenham in 2021-22 before serving as Wantage Town's number one a season later.

Mike & Ethan Price



Dan Hill Hill is a right back who joins Bassett this season from Cirencester Town. A dependable, solid performer. Hill brings plenty of Hellenic League Premier Division experience, as well as Southern League experience acquired in spells with the Centurions and Highworth Town, Hill made his debut in senior football in 2012-13 with Cirencester Town Development before moving to Fairford Town two seasons later. He earned the Reds' Players' Player and Young Player of the Year awards in 2015-16 before moving to Brimscombe and Thrupp for the 2016-17 campaign. Hill quickly established himself as a key player for the Lilywhites, and was a part of the Brimscombe team that lifted the 2017-18 Gloucestershire Challenge Trophy and finished as Hellenic League Premier Division runners-up in 2018-19. He then joined Highworth ahead of the 2022-23 season, though would finish that campaign with Cinderford Town. Hill split last season between Cirencester

John Trollone



Spalding

A highly talented young full back who is entering his 3rd season with Bassett. Skilful, quick, an outstanding defender and a player who always looks to get forward, he was named Manager's and Players' Player of the Year following a standout debut season in 2022-23. Spalding played 47 times, scoring a hugely impressive ten goals. Among his goals was a long range stunner in the FA Cup against Reading City, a last minute winner at home against Tuffley Rovers and a brace away at the same opponents. Spalding enjoyed another excellent season in 2023-24, featuring 45 times while scoring three goals. With Swindon Town as a youth, Spalding joined Cirencester on loan in 2017-18. While taking on his current role, Griffin has continued to play, featuring 38 times last season (34 appearances coming from the bench) and adding 5 goals. As a player, Griffin is an assured finisher, strong in the air and capable of effectively holding up the ball. He made a prolific start to his playing career with Corsham in the Western League, and soon moved onto Southern League football, plying his trade with Cirencester, Chippenham, Gloucester City, Mangotsfield Utd, S. He took over the Under 18 Floodlit team in 2020-21, guiding them to a sixth place finish in the Wiltshire League Floodlit Division. Hellenic Premier Division Roundup - 22 March 2025

Highworth Town confirmed their place in the end of season play-offs in style with a 3-2 home win over champions elect and FA Vase semi-finalists Hartpury University. Josh Davis scored all three Highworth goals starting with a 39th minute penalty. His second came in added time at the end of the first half. Hartpury pulled a goal back on 52 mins when a free kick from the edge of the penalty box struck a post before re-bounding into the net of the back of keeper Connor Johns. It was 2-2 on 66 minutes when a right sided corner was nodded home at the far post and it seemed Hartpury were in the ascendancy. However, the home side took the lead again when a defender misjudged the bounce of the ball to allow Davis a run on goal from which he produced another neat finish.

In outside competitions, Fairford Town progressed in their county cup after a penalty shoot out win over fellow Premier Division side Slimbridge. The two defences had been on top in the 90 minutes played with neither side managing to find the back of the net. In the penalty shoot out it was Fairford who held their nerve to win 5-3 and are into the final of the GFA Challenge Trophy where they will meet former Hellenic side Hallen who were 3-1 winners over AEK Boco.





Defensive nightmare costs Bassett

Saturday 22nd March 2025

Two highly avoidable defensive mistakes condemned Royal Wootton Bassett Town to a disappointing 2-1 defeat against Thornbury Town in the final home Hellenic League Premier Division game of the season for Sam Collier's side.

While Bassett had the vast majority of clear cut chances throughout the match, it was lower mid-table Thornbury who came out on top after right winger Cam Drew was gifted a first half brace that put his side in clear control.

Bassett pulled one back midway through the second half through Kyle Witt. However, the team's subpar display wound up getting them nothing from a drab match.

Collier's side made a bright start to the match, creating a pair of opportunities in the opening our minutes, with Witt heading narrowly wide from a Brad Pagliaroli cross and Pagliaroli skewing just over with an acrobatic volley.

15 minutes in Witt was played in by Alfie Presley but, through on goal, delayed his shot too long allowing Nathan Sage to recover and block his shot. Shortly after Pagliaroli then sent a low 20 yard drive just wide of the right post.

Up to that point the hosts had not looked in any danger. But they soon found themselves behind. Casually overplaying at the back, 'keeper Dan Brabham dwelled on Adam Corcoran's back pass too long, and when he attempted to clear Drew was able to block the ball and tap in from close range.

It was a dreadfully sloppy goal to concede.

But not the only such one Bassett would concede.

Thornbury came close to doubling their lead on the half hour when Dan Hill sliced a clearance from an Ash Fowler cross to an unmarked Andreas Smolka but his shot from twelve yards was fortunately deflected wide. The resulting corner was cleared only as far as Smolka on the edge of the box and his low drive had to be guided over by Presley inside the six yard box.

Two defensive blocks at the other end then denied Ollie Case after he connected with Jack Hobson-McVeigh's free kick.

Then, shortly after Thornbury's Smolka blazed just over, good play between Pagliaroli and Presley freed Dan Grieve in the inside right channel. He threaded a shot past an onrushing Adam Clark but a covering Dan Parry scrambled off the line.

While not at their best, Bassett were continuing to fashion the better opportunities. And Pagliaroli came close to an equaliser, when after brilliantly winning the ball back just outside the Thornbury box, he curled an effort from the edge of the box straight at Clark.

But with half time looming the Bassett defence let their team down again. Right back Bailey Gallagher was caught napping on the ball deep inside his half. Drew dispossessed him and, with a clear run on goal, coolly slotted past Brabham.

That left Bassett a mountain to climb after the restart.

The second half began with Bassett again creating chances, Presley shooting wide from outside the box and Witt stinging Clark's palms.

The hosts survived a scare when the dangerous Smolka raced onto a clearance over the top and lifted a lob narrowly wide.

Soon Bassett did cut their arrears. Substitute Finn Hopkins made a near immediate impact as he crossed for Witt to half volley home a side foot effort from ten yards.

Collier was perhaps cursing not introducing Hopkins earlier as he posed a significant threat from his position wide on the right.

At the back though Bassett were still rather shaky. And good saves from Brabham denied Drew a hat trick from a tight angled shot and Zak Kempster whose crisp twenty yard drive was tipped over.

Bassett would have two late chances to grab a leveller come to nothing. A surging run inside from the right from Hopkins opened up space for him to shoot but his drive from the edge of the box was deflected wide. Witt then headed over when well placed from an Ollie Pitt set piece delivery.

A disappointing loss to end their home league campaign, the result also puts Bassett in danger of slipping in the table.

Thanks to Highworth Town's impressive win against champions-elect Hartpury University, Bassett can now finish no higher than sixth.

However they are in danger of slipping to seventh or even eighth if they are unable to beat Westfields next week and Pershore Town and Worcester Raiders are able to claim three and four points respectively from their final two fixtures.

Player of the match: Finn Hopkins - the youngster was impressive in his half hour of action, immediately providing an assist and proving a tricky customer for the Thornbury defence who struggled to contain him.



And with Cirencester also losing this weekend against Stockwood Wanderers, Bassett now need one point from four games to all but ensure they finish above the Centurions.

Bassett's eyes will now be set on leapfrogging Bitton though. And they can take confidence from another assured victory.

The game against Bath first came into live in the closing stages of the first half when Millie Powell did well tip a Maddy Brown shot over the bar before Maddy Elliott set Kat Bach through on goal at the other end only for the Bassett forward to place wide.

Bach then put Bassett ahead shortly after the restart. Mia Mugford and Laura Jefferies combined well with the latter delivering a cross into the box that Bach rose to head home.

Mugford should have made it two shortly after as she drove forward before shooting just wide. She later forced a good save from Sadie Farley before eventually getting Bassett's second with twenty minutes to go.

After taking on two defenders she played a neat give-and-go with Hannah Gulliver before tapping in past Farley.

Bath would rarely threaten, with the closest they came being when Jefferies headed a testing Tara Taylor corner off the line at the far post.

Bassett will now look to make it three wins on the bounce when they host SGS Olveston United next week - before an away date against champions-elect Gloucester City.

IT'S approaching 15 years since the birth of Non-League Day. Inspired by a pre-season trip to Devon to watch Queens Park Rangers play at Tavistock, visionary James Doe set it up initially as a social experiment and the rest, as they say, is history. Now, Non-League Day, scheduled to coincide with an international break, has now grown to become an annual part of the football calendar, backed by Premier League and Football clubs. MPs. celebrities. League organisations, charities and the like. But most importantly, it's been embraced by the clubs and fans themselves with the occasion providing a platform for clubs to showcase affordable volunteer-led community football, while offering supporters of Premier League or Championship clubs the chance to get their football fix by supporting their local side.

This week in The NLP, columnist Gregor Robertson told how amid plans of new £2bn super stadiums and ever-increasing ticket prices at the top level, the fans are feeling disillusioned and exploited as the elite game changes beyond recognition.

"These fans feel their game is being taken away from them," Gregor said. "Profit has become a greater incentive than sporting adventure.

"Football in this country has never been so popular. Crowds in England are at their highest for half a century. That's just as true in Non-League football.

"But I can't help feeling that elite football on these shores is being ripped away from the places and communities where it was founded.

So as we approach the 16th annual Non-League Day, a platform conceived to promote the value of community football, a prediction: the trickle of marginalised Premier League fans we've seen converge at local Non-League games? That's only the beginning.

"Don't be surprised to bump into more of these fans at your local club, this weekend and beyond."

Indeed, it may well be that some of those disillusioned and exploited supporters of Premier League clubs are reading this very article right now, stood on the terraces of their local club experiencing life on 'the other side'. The 3pm kick -offs, realistic ticket prices, the ability to stand (and enjoy a pint) anywhere in the ground and guaranteed a warm welcome by volunteers who run their clubs for a love of the game. What's not to like?

As the years go by, Non-League Day becomes increasingly prominent in the calendar with clubs

making the most of their place in the spotlight by putting on a host of special events, ticket promotions and charitable initiatives. Clubs like Ascot United, who are hosting a St Patrick's Day special when they host Isthmian South Central leaders Farnham Town. Fans wearing Irish fancy dress will get half-price admission, while the bar is open late for 30 per cent off a pint of Guinness.

Elsewhere, Altrincham are urging fans to Paint The Town Red for Non-League Day when they host National League leaders Barnet. Starting at 12,30pm ahead of their televised 5.30pm kick-off, the Robins are putting on a number of shows and activities including a children's penalty shootout, a children's entertainer and football freestyler Jay Rosa, along with various stalls and a raffle for an Athletic Bilbao shirt, in aid of Prostate Cancer UK. The Premier League trophy is also getting in on the act, visiting no fewer than three Essex Senior League grounds for the league groundhop, appearing at Benfleet FC (12pm), Buckhurst Hill (3pm) and then Takeley (7.45pm).

Abingdon United are hosting a Retro Shirt Day for their visit of Bewdley Town with anyone wearing a pre-2012 shirt getting half-price entry, while live music from Jason Rampling and a performance by The Twilight Twirlers precedes AFC Sudbury's visit of Redditch United. Three Bridges are using the event to formally open their new 3G pitch, while Harwich & Parkeston will be continuing their 150th anniversary celebrations with a historic town visit, followed by a tour of the club's Royal Oak ground.

Charities too will be supported with Prostate Cancer UK the chosen beneficiary of a number of clubs on the day, while Non-League Day's extra mission this year focuses on encouraging people to give blood, led by former Non-League stalwart Francis Duku, the former Dulwich Hamlet, Ebbsfleet, Bromley and Lewes defender.

And this year, Non-League Day have joined forces with the Seventy7 Group in providing a fully managed social media campaign, creative assets, and advertising support to boost awareness and attendances on the day. The Seventy7 Group are encouraging attendees to share their Non-League Day experience on Instagram for a chance to win £150 worth of football prizes. Simply upload a photo of your NLD experience on Instagram, use the hashtag #NLD2025 and follow @nonleagueday_uk with a £50 voucher for mystery football kits and £100 to spend with their local club.

With so much going on up and down the country, it promises to be another Non-League Day to remember. It's a time to embrace semi-professional and grassroots football and of course the volunteers who work tirelessly behind the scenes to keep your local club at the heart of the community. Now that's got to be worth celebrating.


