# Men's First Team Bassett Bulletin

## Welcome To Today's Game

**GOOD AFTERNOON,** and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Marsh Challenge Cup semi-final for what is our final home game of the season. A special warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters from our visitors Worcester Raiders who have made the journey from Worcester for the second time this season, we hope you enjoy your short stay with us this evening and we wish you all a safe journey home.

This afternoon is a historic occasion with Sam and Griff having made the decision to step down and an opportunity for everyone to say thank you for their efforts. We include in today's programme a repeat of the tribute to the duo written by the Club Press & Media Officer for the Club Website. There are some additional statistics to provide additional insight to Sam's successful tenure at the helm that saw him achieve the highest position ever in the long history of this club, an impressive overall win ratio of 43.2% and seen him in charge of more Hellenic League fixtures than any other manager in our 37 seasons as a Hellenic club. The parties part on good terms and Sam knows he will always be welcome back here at the Sustain Stadium and we all wish him well with whatever his next venture is.

It is fitting that today sees us with the chance of reaching a cup final which would give Sam the opportunity to leave with a trophy in our trophy cabinet, the only thing missing from his tenure as our manager. It will not be easy though as Worcester Raiders are a strong side who sit just three points and two places below us in the table having one game still to play, which if they win would see them finish above us in the final table on goal difference. Our record against Worcester Raiders with just one win in the six previous meetings between the two sides.

Whilst this is the final game of the season for the First Team, the Development Team have one game to play away to cup finalists

Bemerton Heath Harlequins Reserves. A three game unbeaten run has guaranteed their Premier Division status for next season, but it would be good to go out on a winning note against Bemerton. The game is scheduled for Bank Holiday Monday.

The Women's side, who are currently on a five game unbeaten run, still have two games to play and currently sit third in the table. The last game of that five game unbeaten run saw them become only the second team this season to take points off unbeaten Gloucester City with a 3-3 draw last Sunday. Even if Bassett win those two remaining games it is unlikely that they will improve on that third place position but, despite missing out on promotion, it has been another good season. As with the first team, manager Adam Wood is stepping down as at the end of the season but will remain in a coaching capacity. Head of Women's Section Bryan Wood will now commence the search for a replacement manager.

As this is the last home game of the season it is the time of the year when it is appropriate to say thank you to the people who have helped the club over the season. Apologies if I miss anyone out (this was not intentional) and in no apparent order I would like to say a **BIG THANK YOU** to:

## Chairman's Chat

### GOOD AFTERNOON

It's a pleasure to welcome our supporters along with the players, officials and supporters from Worcester Raiders FC to the Sustain Stadium today for this Marsh Challenge Cup semi-final fixture.

The league campaign came to a close with a 2-1 victory at Westfields which leaves us currently sitting in sixth position, although today's visitors can overtake us should they win their last fixture, also away to Westfields. Ultimately, losses to Malmesbury and Thornbury meant that we missed out on another chance in the play-offs, but that shouldn't detract from what has been another great season for the club.

The end of the season brings several changes at the club and there will be none bigger than the decision of Sam and Griff to step down as the management team of the Men's First team.

Sam, who was already well known to the club as a player, initially joined as part of Rich Hunter's team, but soon took on the role of manager bringing in Matt Bulman as his assistant. And so began his seven and a half year reign during which time the club would regularly improve on their highest ever Hellenic League finish, match their best ever run in the FA Cup and have their best run in the FA Vase, reaching the third round twice, not forgetting the anguish of losing out in last season's play-off final. Sam is arguably one of the busiest manager's in and around the league, forging good relationships with other managers and clubs that has enabled him to strengthen his squad in times of need. His presence isn't only felt on match days,

making himself available to help out wherever required and always happy to promote the club on our social media platforms.

Griff joined in the 2021-22 season, initially as a player who soon became a firm favourite with the spectators, especially the young group of ultras. The following season saw him join Sam in the dug-out, still able to take to the pitch as and when required. A much quieter personality than Sam, Griff's very presence and the high regard he is held in around local football inspires all those around him.

The Sam and Griff double act will be a hard one to follow, but they go with the club's very best wishes and thanks for a truly enjoyable journey that has seen so many highs and just a few lows. Hopefully today will be a high and see us reach the final that they and the club so richly deserve.

Their departure will give the club a chance to re-evaluate where we are going forward. The search for their replacements will start this week; we have already received interest and expect much more in the coming weeks.

Finally, I want to again praise the group of volunteers that operate behind the scenes. It's easy to see what people do on match days but so much happens behind closed doors that is taken for granted. We wouldn't be able to operate without them.

# Today's Opponents

## Worcester Raiders

Worcester Raiders were formed in 2001 as a youth club, joining the Worcester & District Football League in 2009 upon the formation of a senior side. In 2013, Worcester Raiders joined the West Midlands (Regional) League Division Two, gaining promotion in their first season in the National League System.

In 2019, Worcester Raiders won Division One, gaining promotion to the Premier Division. Worcester Raiders entered the FA Vase for the first time in 2020–21. At the end of the 2020–21 season the club were transferred to Division One of the Hellenic League as part of the FA's restructuring of the National League System.

In the 2021–22 season, Worcester Raiders finished second behind Studley F.C. in Division 1 of the uhlisport Hellenic League. Despite a 3-0 loss to Hereford Pegasus F.C. in the playoff final, Worcester Raiders were promoted to the Premier Division of the Hellenic League following the closure of Walton Casuals F.C. in the Southern League Premier South, leading to the reprieve for Merthyr Town and Cinderford Town A.F.C. The result was Worcester were promoted to the Hellenic Premier as runner-up in that play-off.

Worcester Raiders initially played at Claines Lane. On 29 July 2020, English Premiership rugby union club Worcester Warriors confirmed Worcester Raiders would move into Sixways Stadium, with Worcester Warriors' co-owners Colin Goldring and Jason Whittingham becoming joint majority owners of Worcester Raiders in the process. In September 2022 the future of the club was left uncertain after the gates to their ground were locked, as a result of Worcester Warriors' financial problems. This effectively left Worcester Raiders homeless with nowhere to play their home matches. However, it was later confirmed that the Raiders had reached an agreement with the Warriors' administrators to remain at Sixways.

Worcester Raiders had a successful first season in the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division securing a fourth place finish sandwiched between two Wiltshire Clubs Corsham Town and Royal Wootton Bassett Town. This was the highest ever position in the Club's history. Season 2022-23 saw Raiders enter the FA Cup for the first time in the Club's history, winning the first two rounds against Daventry and Malvern before getting knocked out by Worksop.

Season 2023-24 was not quite as successful with Raiders slipping down to 10th place in the final table some 13 points adrift of the play-off places.













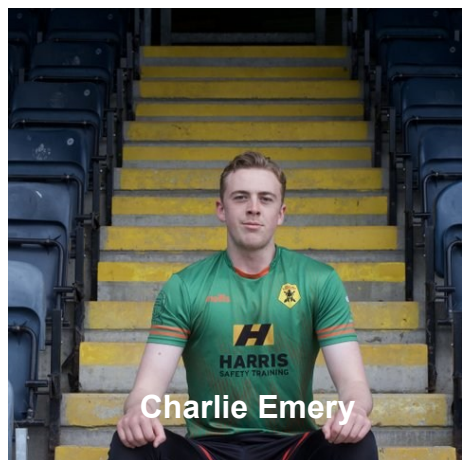

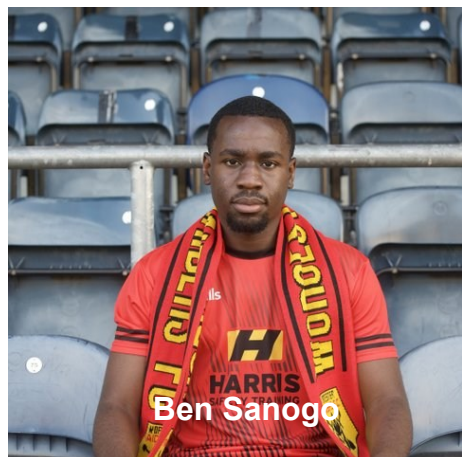

A Royal Wootton Bassett Town reached the half century mark as a dramatic late comeback earned Sam Collier's side a hugely impressive 2-1 victory away at Worcester Raiders.

A lively fixture whose outcome was always in the balance with both teams pushing the other hard ultimately fell Bassett's way after Alfie Presley converted a somewhat contentious penalty with seven minutes remaining.

While Raiders - whose eighth loss in nine games leaves their Hellenic League Premier Division playoff chances hanging by a thread - felt hard done by the decision, Bassett will care little as their march to the playoffs continued apace.

Collier's team now sit on 51 points, with a healthy ten point cushion separating them from Fairford Town - the team currently occupying sixth and the first team on the outside looking in of a playoff spot.

Even more impressively, third place Bassett - who, if the season finished today would be guaranteed a home playoff semi final - are now seven points clear of Roman Glass St George in fourth.

Like most of their 16 league wins to date this season, Bassett's latest triumph was of the hard fought variety.

The visitors started the brighter of the two teams, though Raiders were probing too.

And it would be the hosts who found themselves in front when Kyri Kourouyiann rose highest to head home a free kick on 25 minutes.

Raiders took their advantage into the break and held onto it for a healthy part of the second half.

But Tommy Ouldrige eventually equalised on 67 minutes, blasting in after home 'keeper Jack Oxenham could only bay away Bailey Gallagher's low cross into the box.

That set up a tense, exciting finish. Both teams were desperate to find a winner - Raiders to try and keep their season alive, Bassett to further solidify their top five status.

The second half had already been a physical battle and both teams continued to push.

The hosts thought they had the lead with quarter of an hour to go but Jordan Wilkins' effort whistled just past the post.

Soon after they were behind with Bassett awarded a penalty and leading scorer Presley keeping his nerve to ultimately settle the contest..

# End of an era as Collier and Griffin to step down



They say all good things have to come to an end. And so it is with Sam Collier's reign as Royal Wootton Bassett Town Men's First Team manager.

Collier and his assistant Alan Griffin will be stepping down from their roles when the season ends - and will leave Bassett with big shoes to fill. Both depart on very good terms, having helped deliver a sustained period of success for Bassett in the Hellenic League Premier Division.

Indeed, during the seven and a half years in which Collier's has been in charge Bassett have finished higher than ever before in the Hellenic League Premier Division, reached the 2023-24 promotion playoff final, achieved record-setting runs in the FA Vase - with three consecutive trips to the third round, and gone on a record-equalling run in the FA Cup.

All that is missing from that list of achievements is some silverware. But there is still the chance to deliver that with the potential for Collier to lead his team out in the Marsh Challenge Cup final in his last game - if Bassett succeed in their forthcoming semi final.

Assuming the role in January 2018 initially on an interim basis, Collier has been Bassett's longest tenured Men's First Team manager this side of the Millennium.

His initial task was to secure safety in the Hellenic League Premier Division. And, despite a slow start saw his team winless in his first nine matches in charge, Bassett finished the 2018-19 campaign in 15th.



That helped Collier secure the manager's position on a permanent basis. And he would guide Bassett to a tenth place finish in 2019-20 - which at that point was the club's highest ever placing in the Hellenic Premier.

Covid interrupted the following two seasons, but that did not prevent Bassett having cup success.

Bassett equalled their best FA Cup and Vase runs in 2020-21. Their FA Cup performance that year was particularly impressive with upset away wins against Southern League sides Didcot Town and Cinderford Town helping Bassett reach the second qualifying round where they lost narrowly at home to National League South Oxford City - a side three levels above Bassett. In the Vase, Bassett advanced to the second round for only the third time in club history, and also reached the Hellenic League Challenge Cup semi finals that season.

More cup success followed in 2021-22 - the season Griffin joined in a playing capacity and quickly established himself as a cult hero. The first full post-pandemic season, Bassett finished 12th in the league and advanced to the FA Vase third round for the first time ever thanks to wins against Knaphill, Portishead Town, Downton and Torpoint Athletic before losing to eventual semi finalists Hamworthy United.



2022-23 was another record-setting year, with Griffin joining Collier in the dugout as his assistant, replacing Matt Bulman. After a run to the FA Cup first qualifying round, Bassett again reached the Vase third round - where they lost on penalties to Corsham Town who, like Hamworthy the year before, made it to the semi finals. Meanwhile, Bassett finished fifth in the league - another record placing - and advanced to the Hellenic League Challenge Cup semi finals for a second time.

Last season was then even better. A superb campaign saw Bassett again reach the third round of the FA Vase, suffering an exit on penalties against Bridgwater United, as well as the semi finals of the Wiltshire Premier Shield where they lost narrowly to Swindon Supermarine. In the league, Collier guided Bassett to an outstanding fourth place finish and a place in the promotion playoffs. A 1-0 semi final victory away at Highworth Town took Bassett through to the final. Played at the Sustain Stadium in front of a near-four figure crowd, Bassett would ultimately lose 4-0 to Cinderford Town.

This year has seen Bassett narrowly miss out on another playoff placing in what has been a highly competitive division. Bassett again advanced to the Wiltshire Premier Shield semi finals, coming up just short once more against Supermarine. Collier and Griffin will now seek to finally guide Bassett to a cup final with their last game (hopefully games) to come in the Hellenic League Challenge Cup.

"Sam is surely the busiest manager in the league. He is fiercely loyal to his players but constantly looking to improve his squad, forging links with other clubs near and far, searching for the right players all the while putting out teams that play attractive football enjoyed by our ever growing fan base."

"Griff may be the quieter one, but his very presence inspires those around him and he has so often proved he can still do a job on the pitch."

"Lots will be said and written about these two going forward, including much more from me, but for now on behalf of everyone at the club - our committee, volunteers, fellow managers and coaches, players and supporters, a huge thank you to both of you and we wish you every success in your goals at a higher level."

"Now, let's finish the season off in style and get that silverware that you both so deserve."

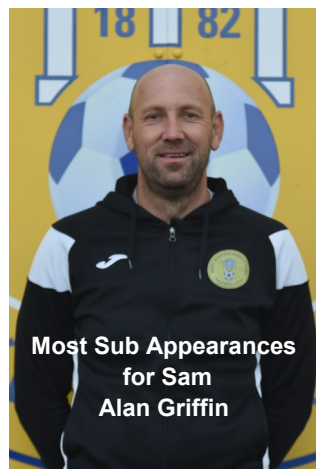

After dropping down to the National League South with Eastleigh in 12-13, Zebroski returned to the Football League with Newport County a season later, winning their Player of the Season award in 13-14 after netting 13 times in 39 games. He had a spell away from the game from 2015 to 2017 before returning to National League Eastleigh in 17-18. Zebroski has since spent time with Chippenham Town, Malmesbury Victoria, Swindon Supermarine, Melksham Town, Fleet Town and - most recently - AFC Croydon Athletic, where he was assistant manager in their Combined Counties League Premier Division South promotion winning campaign.</p>	
 <div>Alan Griffin</div>	<p>A high quality target man who enjoyed a distinguished playing career in non-league football. Now entering his 2nd season as Bassett's assistant manager. Initially joined for the 21-22 season as a player, scoring 16 times in 32 appearances before joining the coaching staff. While taking on his current role, Griffin has continued to play, featuring 38 times last season (34 appearances coming from the bench) and adding 5 goals. As a player, Griffin is an assured finisher, strong in the air and capable of effectively holding up the ball. He made a prolific start to his playing career with Corsham in the Western League, and soon moved onto Southern League football, plying his trade with Cirencester, Chippenham, Gloucester City, Mangotsfield Utd, S.Supermarine and Bristol Manor Farm. Bassett then achieved consecutive runners-up finishes under Warren's guidance in 2021-22 and 2022-23. 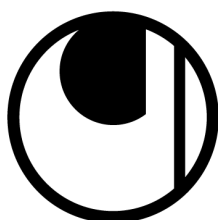

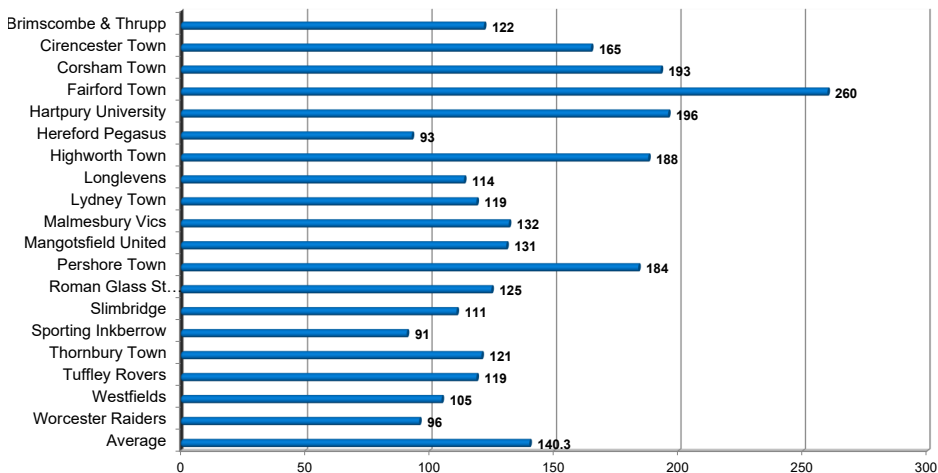

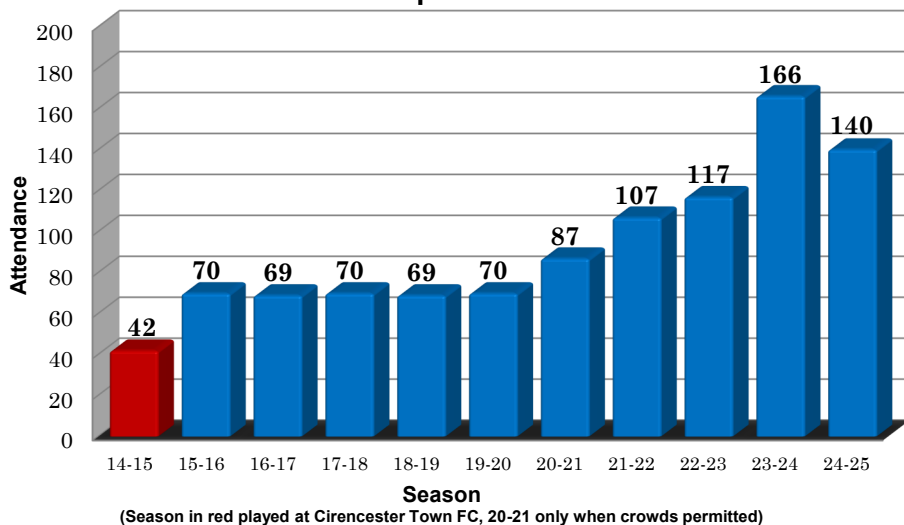

Bassett advanced to the semi finals of the Marsh Challenge Cup as Sam Collier's side came from behind to beat Hellenic League Division One side Clanfield 4-1.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town finished their Hellenic League Premier Division campaign in winning fashion with an impressive 2-1 victory away against Westfields.

The result secured a first ever season double for Bassett over Westfields and keeps Sam Collier's side in sixth place.

However Bassett will have a nervous wait to see if that is where they will finish after Pershore Town and Worcester Raiders won by the same score against Highworth Town and Fairford Town respectively.

Both those teams can overtake Bassett - so long as they win their final games of the season.

Westfields' AllPay Park is never an easy place to visit, making Bassett's victory - their third in a row at the ground - look all the better.

Chances were at a premium in the first half as both teams found the going somewhat difficult on a rock hard, bobbly pitch.

But Bassett were able to get their nose in front ahead of the interval, taking the lead on the half hour mark through leading scorer Alfie Presley after great work from Finn Hopkins in the build up.

Westfields levelled just before the hour though - and they did so in stunning fashion as Mason Godsall beat Dan Brabham with a lob from near enough the halfway line.

However parity did not last long. Dan Grieve restored Bassett's lead in rather more conventional fashion, robbing possession

from the Westfields defence before netting his tenth league goal since arriving in December.

But there was to be justice for the hard done by visitors as Ben Brooks crashed the spot kick against the bar.

The points were therefore Bassett's as they finished their league campaign on a high note.

Ollie Pitt deserves particular praise for his performance on this afternoon. Player of the match by a country mile, he covered every blade of grass on the pitch.

Bassett may have missed out on the playoffs. Yet there is still plenty to play for with (at least) one game still to come in the Marsh Challenge Cup.

If Collier and his team close out the season with a win, it may not mean promotion - the aim back at the very start of the campaign. But it would mean ending the season with silverware.

Now is the time to go after that.

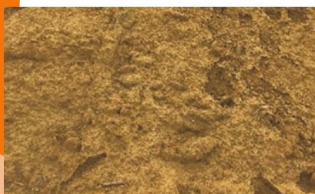

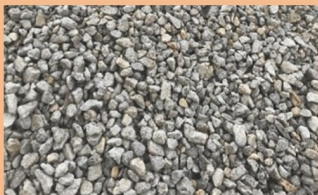
