Welcome To Today's Game

GOOD AFTERNOON and welcome back to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this first UHlsport Hellenic League home fixture against Cirencester Town.

A warm welcome to all our visitors who have made the short journey from Cirencester, we hope you enjoy your brief stay with us this evening and wish you a safe journey home. A special warm welcome back to George Peare and Ollie Pitt who were with us last season. It is good to see both back playing after injuries suffered playing for us last season.

Cirencester Town look to be a much stronger side this season and I am sure they are keen to try and rejoin the Southern League in the near future having spent 28 seasons in that higher league before taking voluntary relegation at the end of the 2023-24 Season. They would have been ineligible for promotion last season because of the decision they made but my understanding is that restriction only applies for one season.

We are forever indebted to today's visitors for allowing us to remain in the Hellenic League by utilising their ground whilst our facility here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground was under construction.

Well Wednesday night's 3-0 FA Cup Replay win over Lydney Town will have lifted everyone at the club. To get that first win of the season is important and to get it in the most prestigious of all competitions is even better. The side deserve great credit for achieving the victory whilst having to play with ten men for the whole of the second half after the sending off of Rudi Hopkins. I am sure there were some tired legs come Thursday morning. Using all five substitutes in the circumstances was a smart move and hopefully the whole squad had an enjoyable evening celebrating in the bar afterwards. Next round sees us at home again with Amersham Town our scheduled opponents.

Today sees us back in league action and it is important that we now pick up our first league points of the season. Hopefully all have recovered from Wednesday night's exertions and Jonny has a full squad to choose from today's game against Cirencester.

The first team were not the only side in action in midweek with the Development side making the short journey to Wroughton for their second game of the season in the Premier Division of the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League. It would prove to be an excellent evening for Mark Simpkin's side as they secured their first win of the season, defeating Wroughton 3-1 at the Weir Field, never an easy place to visit, thanks to goals from George Cook, Sam Case and Prince Nyongolo. They are back in action this afternoon with a trip to Faringdon Town who have made a good start to the season and are unbeaten after their opening two fixtures.

The draw for the Women's FA Cup was made this week and I am probably the only one at the club who is quite pleased about the away draw, with the women having been drawn against Frimley Green. Whilst it is 61 miles from Bassett and a journey time of one hour 16 minutes, for me it is just 12 miles away from my house and a journey time of just 25 minutes enabling me for once to hopefully get to one of the ladies' games.

With last Wednesday's FA Cup Replay and having been drawn at home in the next round it now means we will have a run of five home games in a row. It may mean the programmes will need to be cut down in size as this is also my busiest time of the season with my activities as Fixture Secretary and Media Officer for the Wiltshire Senior League so if anyone wishes to contribute an article for inclusion in the programme it would be gratefully received. The revised midweek game night is not ideal or the production of the programme as normally the programme would be going to the printers on a Wednesday night or first thing Thursday morning but if the big crowd on Wednesday is anything to go by it was a smart move.

Enjoy today's game and hopefully we will be celebrating our first league win of the season.

Today's Opponents - Cirencester Town



Cirencester Town FC was formed in 1889 and played amateur football in the Cirencester & District League, Cheltenham League and eventually the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League.

In the late '60s Cirencester joined the Gloucester County League, moving from there up to the Hellenic League in 1969. During that time, they had their first national cup run, reaching the 2nd round proper of the FA Amateur Cup. They won their first major piece of silverware, taking the Hellenic First Division Championship in 1973-74 to reach the Premier Division. Following a subsequent relegation, the modern phase of development was slowly established, with their Smithfield ground being improved.

Season 1995-96 was the start of the new era. In partnership with Cirencester College, the club began the groundbreaking Football Academy programme. Developing rapidly, first under Dave Hockaday and when he moved as Youth Team Manager to Watford FC, followed by Steve Lowndes, the Academy have been National College Champions in '97 and in '98, five times winners of the English Schools FA U19 Colleges Cup since 1998, and British Colleges Trophy Champions 4 times since '97. The youngsters have regularly reached the latter stages of the FA Youth Cup as the last remaining non-league club in that competition and in 2008-09 reached the third round proper before losing to Sunderland at the Stadium of Light. The success of the Academy has had the knock-on effect of providing CTFC with new blood and developing talent.

Off field, a long planning process led to the development of the Community Club phase led by Chairman Steve Abbley and implemented over 3 years by Business Manager Anna Kocherhan. In summer 2002 Brian Hughes succeeded Ray Baverstock as manager. At the same time the club, having invested the proceeds of the sale of Smithsfield in the Corinium Stadium at Kingshill, moved into their new facility and renamed as "The Centurions".

This development was followed in November 2004 by the opening of The Arena, a state-of-the-art full size indoor training facility. We have now been awarded the FA's "Charter Standard Community Club" status and this summer we received the 2006 Gloucestershire FA Award for "Charter Standard Community Club of the Year", which was presented to Steve Abbley by Sir Geoff Hurst.

In May 2006, after four highly successful years and having raised expectations at the club, Brian Hughes resigned as First Team Manager to be replaced by Neil Hards. Neil had taken a year out of football after his achievements at Winchester City where they gained "back-to-back" promotions and won the FA Vase in 2004. Unfortunately, despite some good early performances, the team lacked the necessary consistency, and a disastrous run of results after Christmas meant they finished in the relegation places. However, the club was later reprieved from relegation after a number of changes were made to club allocations in the non-league structure due to club mergers and other decisions.

Manager Adi Viveash left the Centurions to take up his role as Chelsea and Brian Hughes was again called upon to take up the hot seat as First Team manager. The 2009 – 10 seasons proved to be a very successful one with the Development squad winning the league in their first season and the first team gaining promotion via the play offs after 2 very good away wins both with late goals.

Manager Brian Hughes managed the clubs first season back in the Premier Division in 2010-2011 and the club finished 13th. Unfortunately, 2011-12 saw the heartbreak of relegation and our first year back in the South & West division saw us finish 10th in the table.

2013-2014 saw the club have its most successful season ever gaining automatic promotion back to the Southern League Premier by clinching the title on the last day of the season to beat Merthyr Town to the championship.



Today's Opponents - Cirencester Town

Brian Hughes worked with a small squad which managed to overturn a 9-point deficit and clinched the title last term by winning the last 7 games of the season whilst everyone else dropped points on the way.

2016-2017 saw changes at the helm after a poor start Brian Hughes was relieved of the manager's job and Charlie Griffin was installed as his replacement. The 2017-2018 saw a brand-new state of the art 3G pitch installed at The Corinium Stadium. After a slow start The Centurions missed out on a playoff spot on goal difference and disappointment was to follow last season after finishing runners up, promotion was denied via the play offs losing to Cinderford Town FC in the semi-final by 1 goal.

December 2019 saw another change with former North Leigh manager John Brough take the helm replacing Charlie Griffin after a disappointing start to the season. The change nearly had the desired effect as the Centurions climbed the table with a play off place in sight before the season was sadly cut short due to the current situation, we find ourselves in relating to COVID 19.

The COVID-19 pandemic put paid to two seasons before we returned fully in 2021-2022. After a great league campaign, heartbreak again for the Centurions as we missed out on possible promotion losing in the play offs again.

2020-2024 was a new era for Ciren with the appointment of John Brough. John's first season ended in heartbreak with a loss in the playoffs, season 2 was curtailed due to COVID when the Centurions were league leaders. The last 2 seasons were extremely difficult after we were placed in the Central division, missing out on the playoffs both seasons by 1 point.

2024 voluntary relegation to the Hellenic league was taken due to the levels of travel required in the Southern League, we ended our 28-year stay. Following the departure of John Brough, we appointed assistant manager and ex player James Mortimer-Jones.

Ronnie Newbury - Goalkeeper

Into his second full season after taking over as the No. 1 spot after 6 games last term. Highly rated young goalkeeper with a big career ahead of him in non-league football. Brilliant Shot Stopper and getting better

Ed Scott- Defender

Signed from Bishops Cleeve and impressed the Ciren Faithful with displays at the heart of the Centurions defence. Big, Strong, pacy and good on the ball. A brilliant first season at The Talent Hire Stadium last term.

Kyle Pitts- Defender

Returned to The Talent Hire Stadium in January 2025 and he commanded a starting place from the outset. A star performer in the last 4 months of the season leading at the heart of the defence & it was no coincidence our form improved with arrival.

Elliot Keightley- Defender

Joins the Centurions after 2 successful seasons with Worcester City. The former Hartpury student had a brief spell under old manager John Brough and is a great addition to the squad. The experienced tough tackling defender will bolster the defence this season.

Jordan Morris - Defender

Signed from Forest Green Rovers in 2018 and has been at The Talent Hire Stadium ever since. One of the best lefts foots in the league and managed 30 league games last season after a long-term injury. A key player for the Centurions down the left with bags of experience.

Fraser Bell - Defender

Talented full back and younger brother of midfielder Fin. Joined Ciren from Forest Green Rovers on loan at the tail end of last season and slotted in to the full back position straight away. An impressive pre-season has seen the youngster join permanently.

Ethan Rose- Midfielder

Last season's young player of the year. The talented midfielder has a great engine and never stops working. Selfless for the team and covers every blade of grass and contributes with a few goals.

Jack Freeman - Midfielder.

A quality ball carrier who loves to spray the passes and loves to get forward when the opportunity arises and has plenty of goals in the locker.

Jack Horrell - Midfielder

One of last season stand out players after rejoining Ciren from Worcester Raiders. The talented midfielder has a good football brain and a great array of passing and his leadership on the pitch was second to none last term.

Finley Bell - Midfielder

Last seasons player of the year and supporter's player of the year. A fantastic first season at The Talent Hire Stadium which included 7 goals and was instrumental in our Wiseman Cup Victory. The Fast, pacy and tricky midfielder has a number of clubs currently chasing his services.

Harrison Reeves - Midfielder

Another match winner in the midfield. The tricky winger has a superb first season in red and black with more to come this year. 10 goals in only 29 games and hopefully more of the same to come. Exciting to watch on the ball and beats defenders with ease..

Aidan Bennett - Striker

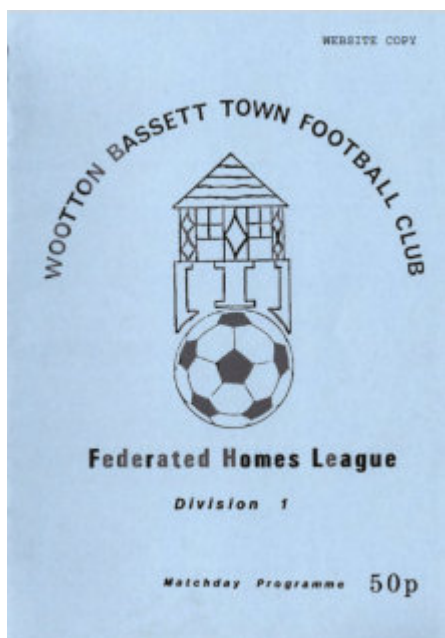

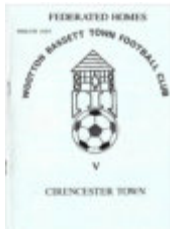

Whilst we have not as yet found a match report for this game that took place 35 years ago we do know that two goals from Damon York gave us a share of the points. Mick Woolford's team went on to secure a mid-table finish in seventh place, a comfortable eight points clear of eighth place Wallingford Town. Cirencester ended the season in 11th place in the table. York went on to finish joint Division One top scorer award after bagging 25 goals. The season also saw Bassett triumph in the Division One Cup in what was only the club's second Hellenic League season. Whilst we do not have a match report we do hold the programme from the game. Included in the programme is the following regarding our visitors Cirencester Town.

"Today is the first time of the current season that we have met Cirencester - our scheduled fixture on 3 Feb was the victim of a waterlogged pitch.

Last season for Cirencester was a bit of a disaster. It was not until 9 Nov that they earned their first point, ironically it was against Bassett when the outcome of the evening fixture was a 2-2 draw. Then shortly afterwards on 19 Nov when Cirencester visited Bassett, the outcome was a 2-1 victory for the home side. Cirencester then had to wait until 10 Dec to collect their second point of the season with a very good 3-3 draw at Cheltenham Town Reserves, but it was not until 11 Feb 89 that they recorded their first win - 3-1 away to Lambourn Sports. Two more victories to the end of the season saw them finish at the foot of the table on 14 points.

However, they are now under new management and they have certainly made a better start to the current campaign.

They come to us today currently placed 12th in the league on 16 points, but they do have quite a few games in hand, and with 3 points for a win in this league, (although they still have to earn them), Cirencester should finish the season fairly well placed."

Elsewhere in the programme it was noted that the game was the first game to be played at Rylands Way for almost a month due to the atrocious weather. The programme noted that the last game played at Rylands had been a 1-1 draw against another Cirencester side, The Herd, in the League Cup. Away from home on 27 January Bassett were one of the few games to be played when they secured a 3-0 away win at Cheltenham Saracens thanks to goals from Kenny Regan, Damon York and an own goal.

The week prior to the Cirencester game Bassett travelled the short distance to the Red House to play Purton on a pitch that the programme editor described as "only just playable". Two goals from Colin Valters securing a point in a 2-2 draw, Bassett having led 1-0 only to fall behind in the second half with Valters getting the equaliser late on firing in from an acute angle.

The Reserves in the Wilts League had seen their last three games postponed losing momentum having been going well at the time. Finally, the programme noted that Bassett were set to host the Wiltshire Senior Cup semi final between Highworth Town and Swindon Athletic the following week. The Bassett squad listed in the programme (but not necessarily the team that played was) Mark Ayres, Andy Bryant, Neil Timbrell, Tony Woosnam, Jon Haines, Alan Wilson, Frank Serretore, Gerry McKay, Colin Valters, Kenny Regan, Damon York and Gary Bartlett.

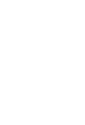
Henri Parry-Williams - Midfield



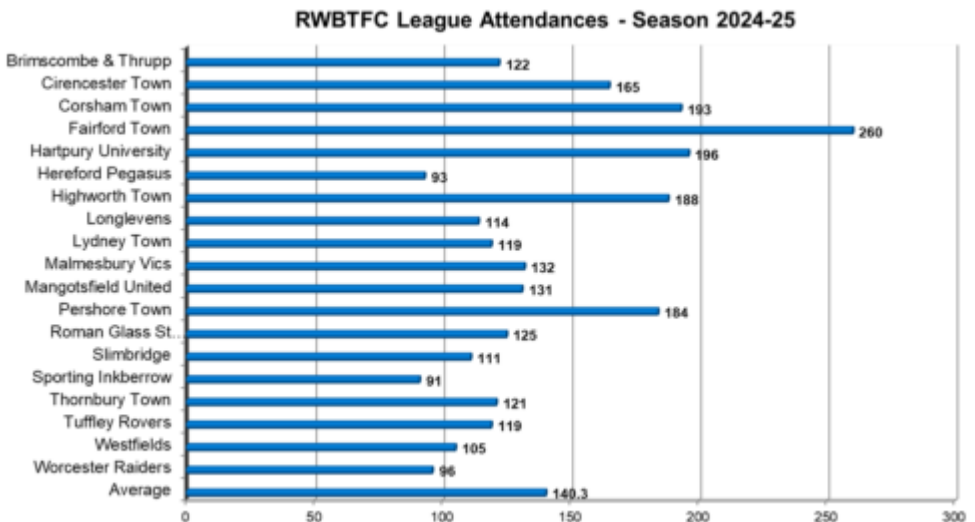
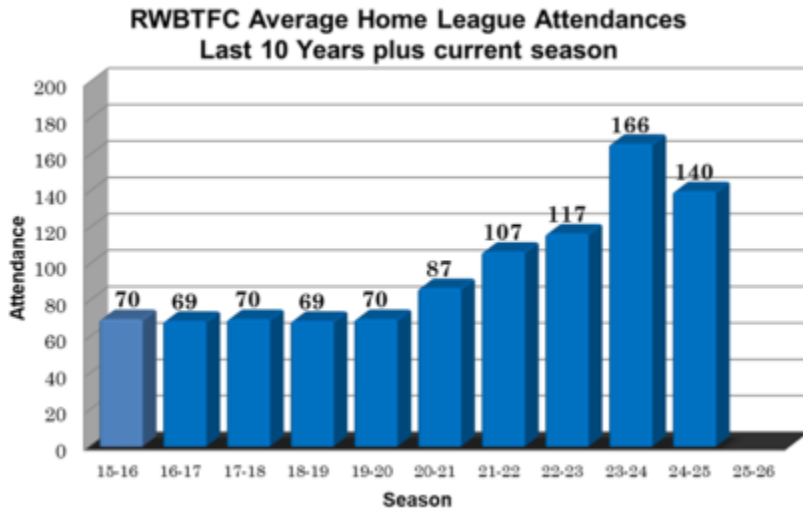

Match Report v Lydney Town

Bassett race past Lydney at second attempt

Royal Wootton Bassett Town marched into the Emirates FA Cup preliminary round with a convincing 3-0 replay victory against Lydney Town.

Just as on Saturday, Bassett raced into a two goal half time lead. But this time Jonny Aitkenhead's side made sure lightning did not strike twice.

Instead they blitzed their way to victory - and a home time against Amersham Town a week on Saturday.

Making their victory all the more impressive, Bassett were forced to play more than an hour with ten men as Rudi Hopkins was sent off for retaliation after a rush of blood to the youngster's head.

But those who remained on the pitch did a stellar job, keeping Lydney at bay despite the pressure Bassett were put under while short-handed and, at the same time, continuing to threaten on the break.

Just as on Saturday Bassett were quick out the blocks and 2-0 up with less than a quarter of the match gone.

Ben Cleary opened the scoring, firing into the roof of the net after picking his way through the Lydney defence on nine minutes.

Bonsa Teshome then doubled the advantage in the 22nd minute with a hammer shot that went in off the post.

Well in front, Bassett were looking to further press home their advantage. But Hopkins' red card after an altercation with Keelan Maguire-Hamblett forced the hosts into a rethink.



It also gave Lydney renewed hope - and they were firmly on top with the extra man, albeit unable to convert pressure into chances.

Indeed Bassett should really have been 3-0 when Cleary rounded Oliver Phillips but saw Ben Dodd clear off the line.

Bassett then survived a scare when Michael Symons rose to meet a Harry Clark cross but saw his header also blocked on the goalline.

The visitors also felt they should have had a penalty when Adi Adichareh was hauled down, though thankfully the referee waved play on.

The second half started in a similar fashion to how the first ended with Lydney on top but unable to breakdown Bassett's resolute defence.

And there was to be no coming back when, after 68 minutes, Marcel Lewis steered home a simple finish after fine build up play from Ed Taylor as Bassett secured their safe passage through.

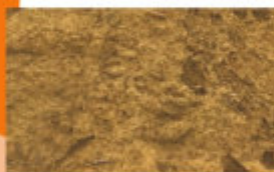

Adobe Women's FA Cup

Draws for the 2025-26 Adobe Women's FA Cup preliminary and first qualifying rounds have now been released. And Royal Wootton Bassett Town will start their journey in this year's competition with an away trip to brand new opponents.

In each of the last three seasons, Bassett have suffered agonising exits at the third - and final - qualifying round stage with a pair of defeats away against Torquay United and a narrow home loss against AFC Stoneham sandwiched in between.

New manager James Lally will now be looking to take his side a step further and write club history by reaching the first round proper.

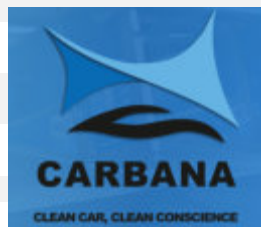

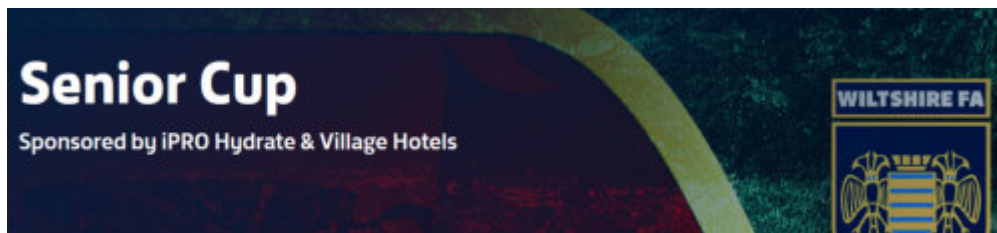

L'Equipe French World Cup Book



A while back I purchased a box of foreign World Cup books. I was specifically after the German football books entitled Fußball – Weltmeisterschaft produced by Lingen (more about these in a later article) that were within the lot, but included in the box were also some French World Cup books.

The first was a book on what remains one of my favourite World Cups, the Argentina World Cup in 1978. Whether it was just the age I was at back then, or maybe it was the fact that England had not qualified so you didn't have to go through all that agony associated with watching England at a World Cup and could just enjoy the football I am not sure, but it was a World Cup that I thoroughly enjoyed watching. Sometimes watching games late into the night. I sat through the whole of that Argentina v Peru game which Argentinian won 6-0 on a night when they were simply fantastic. To this day I don't buy into the conspiracy theories that the game was fixed, Argentina were just on fire that night, particularly Mario Kempes. My other favourite World Cup incidentally is the 1974 one held in what was then West Germany, again when England did not qualify!

The other French book was actually a box set split into two distinct sections and was on the history of the World Cup and was entitled "La coupe du monde". The box set was produced by the French nationwide daily newspaper dedicated to sport, L'Equipe.

The first section covered the World Cups from 1930 through to 1970, whilst the second section covered 1974 through to 1998. The books are both 14 inches high, and each contain over 250 pages.

I must confess my French is not up to much, a legacy of being a forces child who kept moving schools, having started learning German and then going to the next two schools that only taught French and not German. I eventually managed to get an O'Level in German but ditched French as soon as I could as I was always playing catch-up with the rest of the class, much to the disappointment of our house tutor at Bassett Comp who was one of the French teachers.

Consequently, I can't really read the books, but they all contain some absolutely stunning photographs from the various World Cup competitions (as do all the German books which was the reason I started collecting them for the World Cups in my lifetime). Whilst I can't read the books perhaps one day when I am in the care home Stuart, who is now fluent in French as well as German, will come with the books and read them to me. All in all the box set is just a stunning set I just wish I could read them. However, just going through the pages looking at the pictures and the match statistics brings back some memories of some excellent World Cup games over the years.

While the original site at Rylands Way had its charm, such growth would simply not have occurred had the relocation to the new ground not taken place.



All other members of the Sports Association - the cricket, tennis, running and pétanque clubs - have benefited significantly from the relocation too with all having grown and being in rich health.

And all this would not have been possible were it not for the tireless work of the Sports Association relocation committee over many years.
