This is a long overdue first article from me in a Women's programme but I aim to become a regular contributor as the season progresses.

Like the Men's 1st team, the Women came into this season with a new management team at the helm. Just like the Men's position, we had several high-class applicants for the Women's role with James Lally and his back-room team proving to be the outstanding applicant. Unlike the Men, James was lucky enough to retain the services of just about all of last season's squad. James comes with good pedigree and will be looking to get into the 1st Round proper again having done so while managing Swindon Town

Forest Green are no strangers to the Gerard Buxton having beaten us 3-0 in a pre-season friendly back in August, hopefully today's outcome will be somewhat different. Victory today will see the Women advance to the 1st round proper for the very first time. Having lost at this stage for the last 4 seasons, let's hope it is fifth time lucky.

Finally, I would like to say a big thanks to Holly Aitkenhead who is here promoting Her Game Too.

Like almost all women's sides the parent club was formed as a men's side and became founder members of the Mid Gloucestershire League (MGL), the first league in the county outside of the city of Bristol.

When the MGL folded the club become members of the newly formed Stroud League and also the Dursley & District League.

First piece of silverware was secured when the club won the Dursley and District League.

1912 Won the Stroud League under the name Nailsworth and Forest Green United, after the Nailsworth Club amalgamated with the club at the top of the hill above the town.

1921 After a break during WWI, the club enjoyed a period of great success winning two football leagues and three cups in both 1921 and 1922.

The Lawn was created with the field where the team played officially enclosed.

A crowd of over 5,000 saw the club lift the County Cup beating the Sharpness Sharks in nearby Dursley.

Committee members bought the club's field at auction for the princely sum of £120.

Won the Northern Senior League for the first time in 1938.

Joined the newly formed County League.

1975 Were promoted to the Hellenic League.

A successful few years culminate in a double winning season as the club clinched the Hellenic League title and won the FA Vase, defeating Rainworth Miners Welfare 3-0.

In a bid to turn the club's fortunes around, the club were renamed Stroud FC but this near disastrous when many life-long fans & committee members turning their back on the club.

The club name changed back to Forest Green Rovers.

Frank Gregan arrived as manager in 1994, taking the club to the Southern League Southern Division title in 1997 and into the Southern League Premier Division for the first time.

A showdown with Merthyr Tydfil in front of a record crowd of 2,962 at the newly upgraded Lawn saw the club through to the Conference.

1999 Despite being favourites for relegation the club went back to Wembley in the FA Trophy, becoming the first club to appear in both the Trophy and Vase finals. The Trophy final was lost to Kingstonian 1-0.





2001 Under Nigel Spink, the club returned to the Trophy Final at Villa Park, this time losing to Canvey Island again by a single goal.

2006 The New Lawn officially opened in September, 400m away from the old stadium. The ground was built to Football League standards and painted head to toe by the club's supporters, a tradition set back in the 1950s.

2010 With the club in financial difficulty, Ecotricity founder Dale Vince got involved with the club in August, to improve the club's social and environmental impact.

2015 The club went completely vegan as a football club, the first and still the only certified vegan team in the world.

2016 The club announce plans to move to a new 5,000 seat stadium to be built beside junction 13 of the M5, with plans for the stadium to be made almost entirely out of wood.

2017 Mark Cooper leads the club to the Football League for the first time in the club's history, following a 3-1 success over Tranmere Rovers in the National League play-off final at Wembley.

2019 In December, Stroud District Council approved plans to build Eco Park. The club aim to make their proposed new home the world's greenest football stadium, for the world's greenest football club.

2021 The FGR Women's team become part of the club, having previously been an independent organisation. The club also announced plans to launch a girl's academy.

2022 Forest Green Rovers finish top of the League Two table and are promoted to League One as Champions, following a 2-2 draw at Mansfield Town on the last day of the season.

2023 Relegated after one season back to League Two.

2024 Suffered a successive relegation back to non-League in the following year, ending their seven-year spell in the Football League.

Forest Green Rovers Women's Team

The previously independent Women's team had been very successful playing in the The FA Women's National League Southern Division as recently as Season 2015-16. An exodus of players saw them drop back to the South West Regional League, winning the Eastern Division in 2016-17 and promotion to the Premier Division.

However, the women's side were relegated back two season's later.

Leading the Eastern Division at the time Covid brought the 2020-21 Season to a premature close they were elevated back to the Premier Division for Season 2021-22.

Season 2021-22 saw Forest Green in 5th place but some eight points behind the side above them in the table.

Season 2022-23 was more successful with Forest Green achieving a third place finish in the Premier Division, their highest position in Women's football since they left the Women's National League.

The past two seasons have again seen them challenging at the top end of the table finishing in fourth spot in both Season 2023-24 and 2024-25.

This season they have again started well winning both their two league games played to date and also defeating Downend Flyers 6-1 in the FA Cup to set up today's meeting here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground.

Rovers Late Surge Sees Off Bassett

Royal Wootton Bassett Town 3 Forest Green Royers 5

Sunday 28 November 2021

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies fell to their second league defeat of the season as they were beaten 5-3 by Forest Green Rovers in an enthralling, high-scoring affair. After the game was all square at 1-1 at the break, the second half produced six goals - with the visitors eventually sealing the points courtesy of two goals in the final five minutes.

The result means Bassett missed out on moving up from fourth position, with a visit to title favourites Ilminster Town up next.

And Graham Fletcher's side will certainly be rueing the opportunity not to have claimed at least a point against Forest Green in a see-saw contest.

It took less than five minutes for the deadlock to be broken as Ella Hitchcox broke into the box and produced a fine first time finish to put away Nynka Rucker's low cross into the box.

However, Bassett were on level terms shortly after. Laura Jefferies swung in a trademark towering free kick from the left side and leading scorer Libby Davies flicked home a header into the bottom right corner.

The opening period delivered no further goals. But after the restart it did not take long for the floodgates to open.

Bassett were the side to strike first. After controlling a Jefferies free kick on the edge of the area, Davies twisted and turned as she sought to fashion space to shoot. As she did so, Rovers' captain Hattie Jones aimed to win the ball back but her tackle served only to find a gap in her side's defence, allowing Amber Egerton to run in to pounce on the loose ball and fire home.





The visitors were then gifted an equaliser. Bassett failed to clear their lines and the ball fell to Jones, whose 25 yard shot slipped through the hands of keeper Millie Powell.


Two minutes later the visitors were ahead as Rucker raced onto a hopeful punt upfield, outmuscled Olivia Owenson and coolly slotted into the corner.

Trailing for a second time, Bassett were able to make it 3-3 with 25 minutes to go as Davies met a Jefferies free kick with another fine glancing header that nestled into the corner.

That meant a grandstand finish was on the cards. Unfortunately for Bassett though, it was the visitors who would strike two decisive blows.

Jones restored her side's lead with her second of the afternoon, scoring with a snap shot after Charlie Rowlands' low corner broke to her.

Hitchcox then sealed the win. Rowlands' slide rule pass split the Bassett defence and her strike partner latched onto the through ball before rounding an onrushing Powell and calmly slotting into the net from a tight angle.

Efficient start continues as Bassett win league opener

Royal Wootton Bassett Town may have only scored four goals in their three competitive fixtures so far this season. But three straight clean sheets have meant a hat trick of victories for James Lally's side - with their latest win a 1-0 triumph against Downend Flyers in their South West Regional Women's Football League Division One North opener.

Just as in last week's Women's FA Cup clash with Bristol Brunel, Elle Scott scored the only goal of the game to seal the points against Downend.

It was a contest of limited chances for either team, though Bassett just about edged matters.

And their opening points of the season were secured on the stroke of half time when strong pressure from Maddy Elliott allowed Bassett to seize possession in Downend territory and Scott was on hand to turn the ball home.

Bassett's attack may not yet be firing on all cylinders. But their defence is looking in great shape as they once again put up a shutout.

Three games, three wins, no goals conceded it's been a solid first month of the 2025-26 campaign.



Introduction

Founded in May 2021, Her Game Too is an unpaid, voluntary campaign led by a team of dedicated female football fans who are passionate about creating a positive change in football and the wider sportling world. We aim to raise awareness and educate others on the importance of inclusivity and diversity in soorts.

Our ultimate goal is to create a safe and welcoming environment for everyone, regardless of their background, ability, or gender. We believe that everyone should have the opportunity to participate in sports and have access to the same resources and opportunities.

Findings from our first survey conducted in 2021 indicated that a staggering 91.9% of supporters sald they have seen sexist abuse online targeted towards a woman in football. 63.1% said they have experienced sexist abuse online because of football and 56.4% said they have experienced sexist abuse in person at a football aame or in a pub.

By working with clubs and organisations, we can encourage women of all ages to get involved with football. We can do this by:

- Creating visibility and championing female role models in the game.
- · Building up a safe space for women at stadiums and areas surrounding football.
- Taking action against sexist abuse.
- Donating funds towards the development of grassroots girls football.
- · Encouraging women & girls to attend live matches.

Mission


