GOOD AFTERNOON and welcome back to the Swindon Mercedes Stadium for this UHlsport Hellenic League fixture against Thornbury Town

A warm welcome to all our visitors from Thornbury who have made the journey along the M4 today, we hope you enjoy your brief stay with us this afternoon and wish you a safe journey home.

After struggling at the wrong end of the table last season, like us, Thornbury have made a good start to the 2026-27 league campaign winning two of the three league games played so far including a 5-1 win over Corsham Town. Like ourselves they have not fared so well in the two national cup competitions losing to Brislington in the FA Cup, going down by the same 1-0 scoreline that Brislington inflicted on us in the FA Vase, and then losing 4-0 to Step 6 side Stonehouse in the FA Vase. They come into today's game on the back of a heavy 5-0 defeat away to current league leaders Westfields and will no doubt be keen to return to winning ways.

We continue to go in search of that first win of the season but will take great encouragement from last week's point away to Cinderford Town, one of the fancied teams this season. This despite having to play out the closing stages with ten men after Kian McNally picked up a second yellow card. Our record against today's visitors is a good one with Bassett having won nine of the previous 12 meetings with one game drawn and two defeats. Those defeats have come in the past two seasons and we will need to be at our best here today if we are going to secure that first elusive win of the season. I am sure Jonny and Dan have been working hard at trying to boost the confidence of the side and not panicking as I am sure once that first win is secured more will follow given the quality of the squad assembled this season.

The Development side are now six games into their season and have won two, drawn two and lost two. The two victories have come in their last two games against Hungerford Town Development and Park United.

Bassett are very much Park's bogey side, so I was not surprised by that win. Today the Development side are without a game and then make the long journey south to play Bemerton Heath Harlequins Reserves a week on Saturday.

With September just around the corner, the women's side are set to get their season underway with their opening league fixture on Sunday 6th September against AEK Boco. Today's programme contains additional content regarding the women's side with the season set to get underway and thank you to Stuart for providing this content.

An apology for the lack of photos from first team games in today's programmes. After the departure of Steve Green the club have yet to find a replacement who will regularly attend games, and it certainly is making it harder to produce this programme. I am sure the Head of Senior Section is working hard to find a replacement.

From The Committee Room with Paul Gerrish (Chairman)

Good Afternoon. It's a pleasure to welcome our supporters along with the players, officials and supporters from Thornbury Town FC to the Swindon Mercedes Stadium today for our Hellenic Premier League fixture.

It's going to be strange to play a fixture on green grass after the last three away fixtures at Brislington, Fairford and Cinderford where a green blade of grass was very much at a premium. The work carried out in pre-season by Andy Clinch and watering each evening from our water source by Pete and Tony means we still have one of the best surfaces in the league and thanks goes to all involved.

Those last three away games have been frustrating to say the least and certainly don't reflect the performances the team has put in. In the Vase, we dominated Brislington for long periods of time but were undone by a quickly taken, disputed free kick! Fairford's pitch always meant it was going to be an ugly match and so it proved, sadly going down to a last-minute goal from a long throw.

At Cinderford, a combination of two penalty decisions, one not given and the other given, both going against us, added to losing three key players to injury meant we had to leave with a point instead of the three that the performance deserved.

As always happens at the start of the season at all clubs, teams are seeing a lot of changes in personnel, players being lured away by the promise a few more pounds of expenses or disillusioned by playing time. Hopefully everything settles down now and squads get the chance to bond and progress.



A big concern for me early in the season has been discipline. We have already picked more red and yellow cards than I am comfortable with, some deserved, some harsh to say the least. We have had one successful appeal against a wrongful dismissal upheld and have made a very strong case in another. We will never cure the issue of inconsistency with officials but we need to start helping ourselves, not just on the pitch but in the dug-out and around the ground. Officials need to come to our ground knowing it will be a positive experience, not expecting to brandish cards as one official at a development team game was happy to proclaim.

Finally, massive congratulations must go to our fellow Sports Association members, Royal Wootton Bassett Cricket Club on securing the WEPL Premier 2 Glos / Wilts league title last week - an outstanding and fully deserved achievement! They join us with a home fixture today and I am sure the bar will be full and lively later as they begin, well continue their celebrations. Don't forget the joint Football / Cricket Club Race & Comedy event on 12th September - it should be quite an evening!

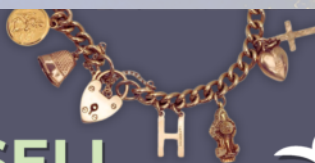

Thornbury Town History

It is understood that football has been played in Thornbury from around 1898 and formerly known as Thornbury Sports became Thornbury Town FC in the early 1970's.

1968-69 we became founder members of the Gloucestershire County League and spectator figures in excess of 500 were regularly recorded. In 1971 the club finished third in the Gloucestershire County League and was accepted into the Western League.

However, due to difficulties in bringing the facilities up to the leagues required standards were unable to take the next step up. Relegation to the Bristol Premier Combination League unfortunately followed in 1976-77.

The following 20+ years saw Thornbury Town strive to regain their former status, never really threatening to take the Premier Combination title. The only success during these lean years was reaching the final of the GFA Senior Amateur Cup in 1985-86 and 1989-90 unfortunately on both occasions loser's medals were received.

During the late 1990's, the Club maintained its strong focus on developing local talent and this eventually bore fruit in 1999 when the final of the Stroud Charity Cup was reached, losing narrowly to Dursley Town. 2001-02 season saw the management team of Dave Wiffill and Steve Burbage take the reins, which brought instant success winning the Bristol Premier Combination title by 13 points and a return to the Gloucestershire County League. This followed a run of thirteen consecutive league wins a club record, which still stands to this day. The league and cup double eluded the club when they were defeated by Sea Mills in the League Cup Final.

In preparation for the return to County League football the summer of 2002 saw a lot of hard work undertaken on the Mundy facilities with the building of dug-outs, improved drainage and revamping of the dressing rooms. All this work appeared to have been worth while with the club establishing itself back in the Gloucestershire County league with a creditable 7th league position for the next three seasons.

Silverware did come our way in 2003-04 when we defeated Taverners on penalties, after a 2-2 draw, to lift the Stroud Charity Cup. The 2003-04 season, also saw the formation of an Under-18's side in order to maintain Youth development within the club and they gained entry to the Gloucester County Youth League.

Following a number of indifferent seasons when relegation back to the Bristol Premier Combination league was only just averted in 2006-07, a new management committee and first team management were appointed. Dave Lippiatt took over as first team manager, coming to the club from Sea Mills Park bringing with him Carl Derosa as his assistant. With an initial three / four year strategy, which came to fruition during the 2009-10 season when after a steady first half to the season a tremendous winning run of ten league games saw the Surridge Gloucestershire County League title won for the first time in the clubs history.

2010 also saw the milestone achievement of the long awaited coming together of the two local football clubs "Thornbury Town FC" and "Thornbury Falcons FC" now under one club management umbrella of Thornbury Town FC without losing the heritage and identity of Thornbury Falcons. This will further enhance the long term development within the local community for junior, youth and senior football.

Thornbury Town History



In the 2010-11 season the final of the Les James Cup Final was reached, which resulted in a penalty shoot-out disappointment against Henbury Town. 2013-14 saw the U18's in their highest league position in the Gloucestershire County Youth League finishing runners-up, which was a tremendous achievement for the team and managers Simon Pirie and Mark Franklin.

The 2014-15 season was a very successful season finishing 4th in the league and winning the Les James Cup for the first time in the Club's history. Andy Davies continued to produce a team of quality which resulted in a third 4th-place in a row in Season 2016-17. 2017-18 saw the club finally succeed in their quest win the Gloucestershire County League. After a lot of work behind the scenes to gain planning permission for the required ground improvements, the club were accepted into the Hellenic League for the first time in our history.

Our first season in the Hellenic League saw us finish a creditable 3rd in Div 1 West and win the Supplementary Cup. 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 seasons were ruled null and void due to the Coronavirus pandemic with the team poised to gain promotion.

A restructuring of the football pyramid placed us in the Hellenic Premier Division where we are now competing for our fourth season.

With the departure of manager Richard Joyce at the turn of the year it was left to assistant manager Tim Wilkins, aided by Andy Jones & Matt Lansdown, to steer the club away from the relegation zone. Safety, and a fifth season in the Premier Division, was secured with three games to go after a run of 13 games with only 3 defeats.

For a squad containing the amount of talent that Jonny Aitkenhead has assembled, that is surely going to be soon.



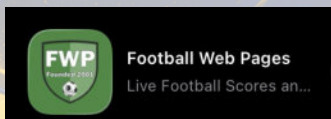

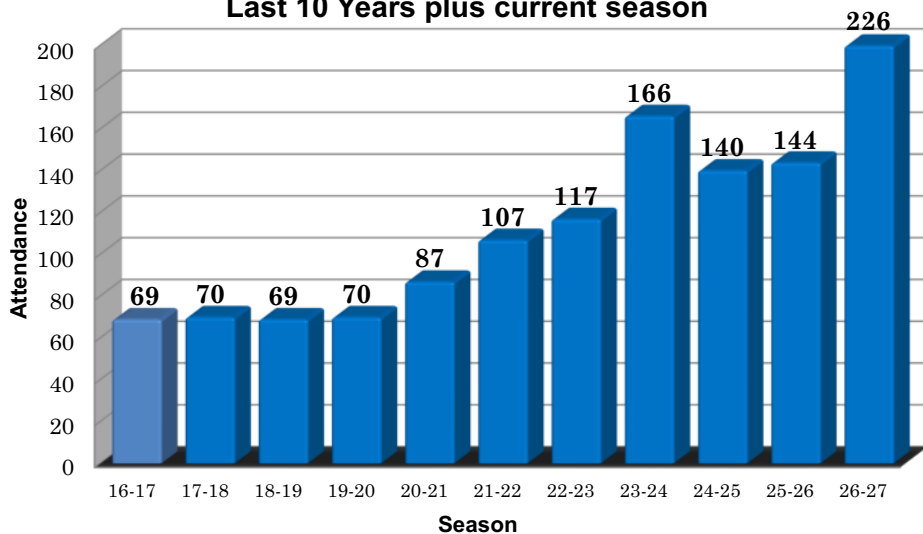

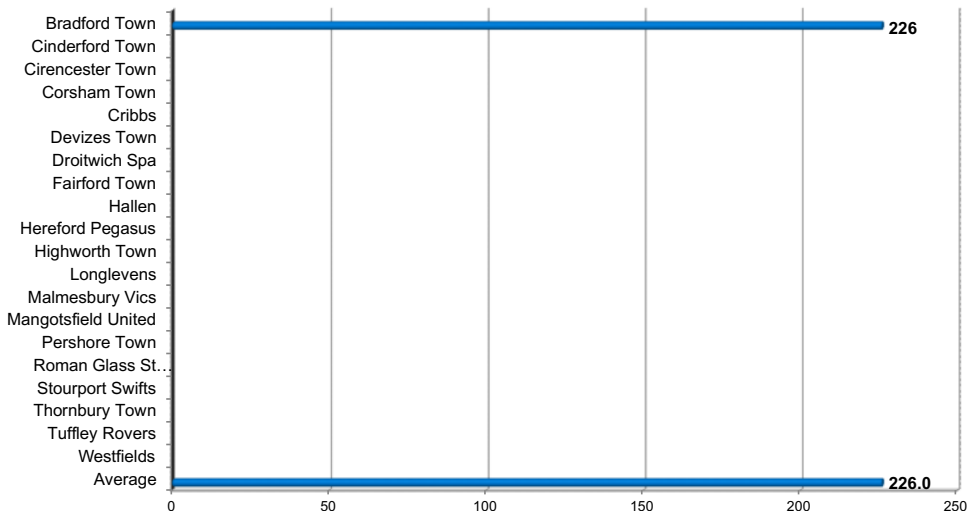


RWBTFC Attendance Stats

Ten man Bassett battle for draw

A battling display from Royal Wootton Bassett Town earned a hard fought 1-1 draw away at Cinderford Town as Jonny Aitkenhead's side saw out the final half hour despite having ten men.

For the third time this season a Bassett player saw red - this time Kian McNally was sent for an early shower, receiving a second yellow card on the hour mark after having only been introduced as a substitute with ten minutes to go in the opening period. However, his teammates rallied, in particular young 'keeper and Bassett player of the match Josh Sawyer, and saw the remainder of the game out to claim a much needed point.

The trip to the Forest of Dean was not exactly what Bassett, in need of a positive result, may have wanted after their start to the season. Indeed, Cinderford went into the match on the back of three straight wins, including away victories at Droitwich Spa and Hallen, and will have been eyeing up a fourth.

But a spirited Bassett performance frustrated the hosts in that quest. The visitors made a fantastic start, taking the lead through Louis Spalding with seven minutes on the clock - a goal that brought Bassett's run of four straight games without finding the net to an end. Ed Taylor received the ball in space on the right edge of the box and sought to shoot. Snatching at his effort, it turned into a pass across the face of goal and picked out an unmarked Spalding, who quickly took a touch before firing past Jude Franks.

Bassett almost doubled their lead midway through the half when Finn Hopkins slipped in Freddie Wyatt, whose low, tight angle effort was well kept out by Franks on the dive.

A nasty clash of heads between Wyatt and Sam Sullivan then led to a lengthy stoppage in play that saw the Bassett frontman forced to withdraw.

When play resumed, Bassett had Sawyer to thank for preserving their lead. He made two assured saves in a matter of moments, first denying Harry Leeson with his feet after he had been slipped in by Jack Watts' clever reverse pass. Cinderford were then able to recycle the ball and Watts this time found himself goalside but Sawyer was quick off his line to parry away.

Shortly after Bassett, who had only three subs, were forced into another change when Harry Messenger picked up a knock and was replaced by McNally. Cinderford continued to hold the slight upper hand and Sawyer twice denied Tom Chamberlain before the break, saving low from a shot on the angle just inside the area before getting a firm glove to a long range strike.

In between those efforts Hopkins had dragged across the face of goal at the other end. Then with half time looming Harrison Edwards lifted a ball over the top for Ed Taylor to run onto, though, not helped by an awkward bounce, he failed to trouble the target with just Franks to beat.

Bassett would head into the break ahead, but their lead didn't last long after the restart. Watts had came close early on when he beat the offside trap only to see Jack Coward clear off the line and Sawyer tip away his second attempt. At the other end Nat Bell hooked narrowly wide after a neat move down the left side.

Twelve minutes into the second half McNally was penalised for a rather soft looking foul in Tom Chamberlain in the box and Jack Watts put the resulting penalty into the bottom right corner, sending Sawyer the wrong way.

Back level, Cinderford were then seemingly gifted momentum in the game when McNally, still frustrated by the penalty decision that went against him, picked up his second yellow for a tug on Watts, making his cameo a short lived one. There were a couple of later scares, including Watts shooting wide of the left post and Sawyer dealing well with an awkward Kian Davies strike. But Bassett ultimately closed ranks and adroitly managed the final half hour to ensure a share of the spoils. A first win of the season still eludes Bassett. But this was a step in the right direction, with two opportunities to grab that first set of three points to come over the bank holiday weekend.

She is someone that is highly reflective and her own biggest critic, which sets a great standard, and I can always rely on her to speak her mind honestly to both me and the players."

"Scotty is stepping up as a new captain this year. She was a standout performer for us last season and was already displaying clear leadership qualities without the formal title. She is a real motivating factor within the team and a true winner. There were several games and moments last season where she drove the team forward with her performances in midfield and, particularly in the first half of the season, scored and assisted to bring us control in games and settle us down."

"Hannah is another long-term Bassett player who really understands and loves the club. While she isn't a captain this year, she plays a big role in the leadership group and is a really hardworking player that can always be relied upon and who others look up to. Not only is she a role model within our group, but she'll be continuing with her coaching role in the club's youth section."

"Tori has then been an important player for me in several teams and will have a slightly different role this season. 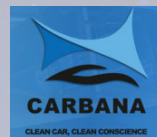

WHEN The NLP's very own columnist Tony Incenzo visited Fulwood Amateurs for their North West Counties First Division North game against Thornton Cleveleys on Easter Monday, he completed a truly epic groundhopping quest.

Fifty-four years after attending his very first Non-League match, broadcaster Tony, 63, had become the first journalist to visit all 2,000 grounds in the English National League System, earning him huge acclaim.

But it Tony's own words in his NLP column last week, the life of a Non-League groundhopper is "akin to painting the legendary Forth Bridge". Once you achieve your targets it is time to start all over again.

Such is the ever-changing landscape of the great English pyramid, Tony was suddenly presented with another 22 new Non-League grounds to visit ahead of the start of 2026-27 season.

A groundhopper's work is never done, it seems.

One of Tony's first missions this season is the visit new, or modified grounds, of clubs he has already visited among his 2,600 or so ventures. Three to be exact.

Take NPL Premier side Workington for example.

Whilst a state-of-the-art £16 million stadium is being built for the West Cumbrian outfit to replace their famous old Borough Park, they are playing at nearby Fibrus Community Stadium (Derwent Park) for the next two seasons or so. It is the home of Workington Town Rugby League club and has held a record crowd of 17,741 in years gone by.

Then there's, North West Counties League First Division North side Woolton. They have reverted to their Simpson Sports Ground headquarters after bringing it up to Step 6 standard.

They spent 2025/26 – their first season as a NLS club – groundsharing at nearby South Liverpool.

I notice Simpson has a 3G synthetic pitch so I'll probably leave it until wintery weather kicks in before venturing there.

And finally, the third is a new Non-League ground currently under construction, just outside Aveley's Parkside Stadium.

A one-time Sunday League pitch with some covered spectator accommodation, the ground is due to be fully enclosed to provide a Step 6 graded home for both Brimsdown and Lymore Gardens, of Eastern Counties League First Division South.

Of the 40+ teams promoted to the NLS this season from the various Regional Feeder Leagues, Tony needs to visit 19 to complete the set once again.

But it's going to require plenty of miles on the clock with 300+ mile treks to South West Peninsula League Premier West Division sides Hayle AFC and St Mawgan on the 'to-do' list. Still, there are worse places to visit I suppose.

Naturally, Tony's already on the case and up and running for 2026-27.

Two of the freshly promoted Step 6 clubs have been visited – the most recent of which, an FA Vase First Round Qualifying round match at Hemsworth Miners Welfare with Dearne & District the visitors.

The Northern Counties East League Division One team have developed a new ground next door to their previous pitch which didn't meet NLS football requirements.

And then earlier in the month, he watched Anstey Town beat Birmingham OJM 5-0 in the Midland League Division One. Anstey play at a nice set-up within De Montfort University at Beaumont Park in Leicester.

With the games coming thick and fast, Tony is out and about most nights of the week – except, that is, when it coincides with a QPR home game. Tony hasn't missed his beloved Rs at Loftus Road for 53 years!

His ground tally now sits at 2,715 with every match logged in his now famous handwritten scrapbook.

He's also a jolly nice bloke, so if you see Tony at a game near you then say hello. I'm sure he'll have a tale or two to tell.
