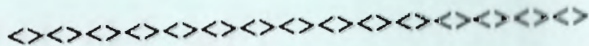

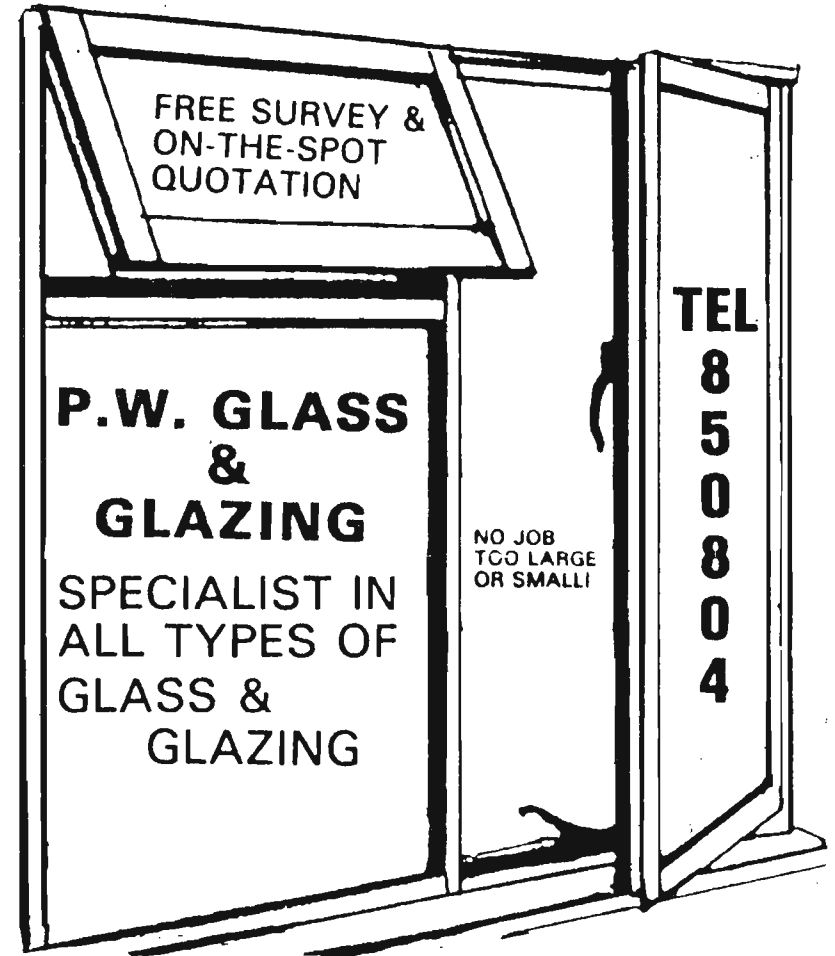

TEAMS

Welcome once again to the Gerrard Buxton Sports Ground where we continue our pursuit on the Federated Homes Division 1 League Cup against The Herd. This fixture was originally scheduled for 16 Dec but was the victim of a waterlogged pitch, so we are pleased to be finally getting the game underway, and to the players, management and supporters of The Herd we extend a warm welcome this afternoon.

Well we have certainly got the New Year off to a flying start, and at present both the 1st XI and the Reserves are achieving some excellent results.

Our last game here at Bassett, when our visitors were high flying Cheltenham Town Reserves, was on 6 Jan and on a pitch which was made very difficult by heavy rain, those who braved the weather were treated to what must have been the best game seen here for a very long while. All our previous encounters with Cheltenham Town Reserves have been open games but up until 6 Jan we have failed to gain a victory over them, but goals from Alan Wilson, Roger Frost and Damon York secured the 3 points in a 3-1 victory, which helped push Bassett up the league table. Last week Bassett travelled to Lambourn who were at that point 3rd from bottom of the table. Bassett continued their fine run of results and convincingly beat Lambourn Sports 5-1, to secure a further 3 points and move Bassett into joint 4th position in the League. Bassett have now earned 9 points from their last 3 games, but what is more pleasing is that 2 of those games have been played away from home. Back to Lambourn Bassett were 1-0 down after 1 minute but from a well rehearsed free kick Gerry McKay equalised and Neil Timbrell scored to put Bassett into a 2-1 half-time lead. The second half was one way traffic and further goals from Colin Valters (2) and Damon York sealed the victory for Bassett, 5-1, which was their highest win in the current season.

The Reserves have also finally started to move up the Wilts Country Div 2 table. Following their spirited fight back against Avebury on 6 Jan the following week saw them travel to Stratton Red Eagles to win 2-1 with the Bassett goals coming from Ken Regan and Steve Thomas. This game was also played on a pitch made difficult by torrential rain, but the Reserves mastered the conditions well and were deserving winners. Last Saturday they entertained Supermarine Res here at Rylands Way and once again a first class display saw them dispose of Marine 4-1, the goals on this occasion coming from Ken Regan, Mick Karn, Ian Scott-Brown and Steve Baker. So like the 1st XI they have gained maximum points from the last 3 games. Today they travel to Biddestone who will be a tough nut to crack. They lost at home last week to Stratton Red Eagles having surrendered a 2-0 lead, so a victory today for the Reserves would be an excellent result, but the way they are playing at the moment that victory is well within their grasp.

And finally, the Under 12 team. John Drury's boys who are having an excellent season so far took on an unbeaten Brinkworth side on 6 Jan and in a very closely contested game ran out 3-2 winners, but it was back to earth with a bump last weekend when they lost at home 8-1 to Stratton. I have only had the good fortune of watching the Boys on a few occasions this season but they are really do play well and for ones so young really do create some very attractive football and are well worth a visit when they play at home on a Saturday morning.

Thanks for your support today and lets hope that you see a good clean well contested game and hopefully a victory to put Bassett into the next round of the Cup.

OUR VISITORS

Our visitors today, The Herd, who are members of the Gloucester FA, have travelled the relatively short distance from Cirencester.

At present The Herd are not having the best of luck having 2 wins under their belts and they are finding great difficulty in scoring goals, only having scored 10 goals in the 14 games played so far and are currently placed 2nd from bottom of the league on 11 points. But like Bassett, they are currently on a run of good fortune. In a mid-week game against their very close neighbours Cirencester Town on 11 Jan they shared the points in a 2-2 draw, but last Saturday saw them make the long journey to play Viking Sports and come away with 3 points in a 2-1 victory - so their confidence will be high today, and we should be in for a good contest.

This is our first meeting of the current campaign, but last year we beat them in both league fixtures, 3-0 way on 15 Oct and at home on 8 April in a much closer contest, Bassett won 3-2.

The Herd's record for last season was not particularly impressive. They failed to reach a position any higher than 3rd from bottom all season and of the 28 games played in season 88/89, they won 8, drew 4 and lost 16 - scoring a total of 44 goals but conceding a high tally of 62 - the highest in the league.

But today is a different occasion, and I am sure that following their fine results over the past 2 games, The Herd will be looking to continue the impetus and will give Bassett a good game.

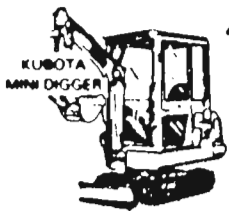

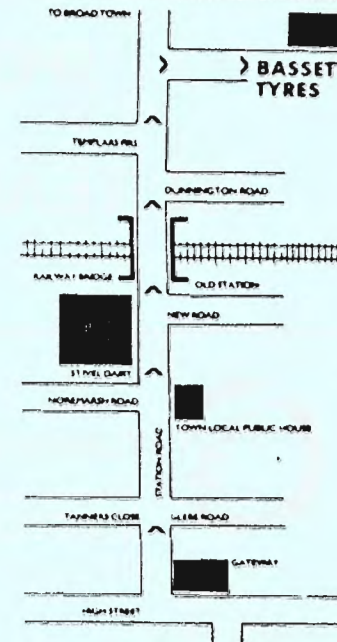
