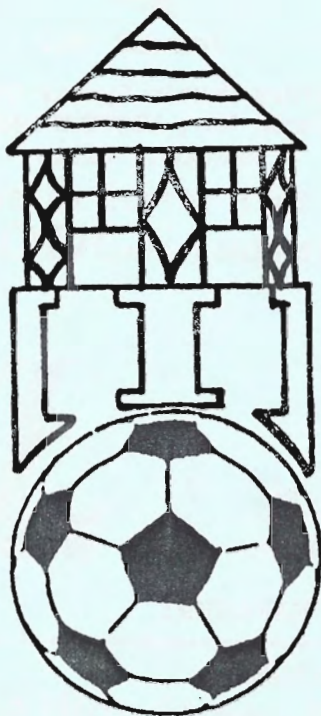

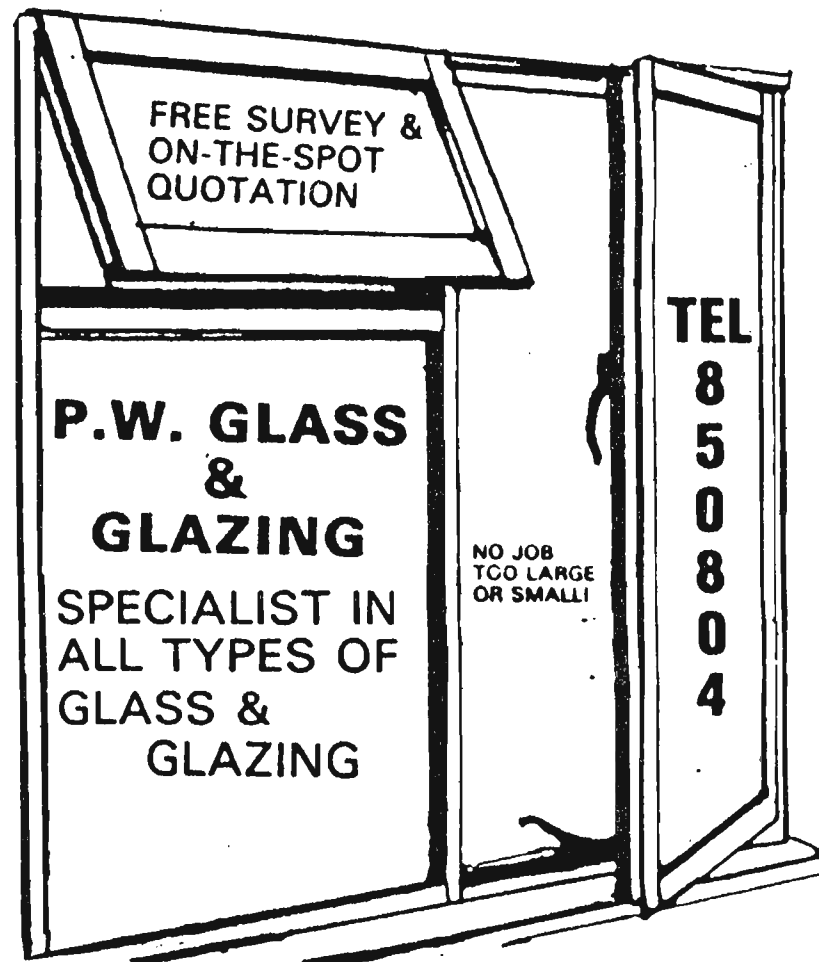

Good afternoon everyone and welcome once again to Rylands Way for the third week running for Federated Homes League action.

This afternoon we have the pleasure to welcome Kidlington, and to their players, management and supporters we extend a warm welcome.

Well last Saturday was a bit of a disappointment when we only managed a 1-1 draw with Viking Sports. I was not able to watch the match (I was in London dodging the Poll Tax riot) but I spoke with manager Mick Woolford and he said that Bassett started the game looking really sharp for the first 15 minutes and it was during that early spell was when Damon York scored the Bassett goal but from that point on Bassett let the game slip from their grasp and allowed Viking Sports to dictate the play. Overall it was a disappointing performance.

The past 7 days have been busy for the Club. Apart from the game here last week against Viking Sports, the Reserves travelled the short distance to Purton on Tuesday night and won 2-1. A good entertaining local derby played on a pitch made difficult by a sprinkling of slushy snow. An early goal in the first half from Ian Scott-Brown gave the Reserves the start they needed and they were able to hold onto the lead until midway through the second half when Bissett scored for Purton to level the scores. The Reserves almost took the lead again following good work by Steve Baker and his centre was well met by Ian Scott-Brown but his well directed header was well saved by former Bassett keeper Neil Twine. But the goal of the game, and the match winner, came in the last few minutes when Rob Fry turned on a pass from Winston Barnes to volley a left foot shot into the net. It was Rob's first goal for the Club, and rounded off a fine performance by the Reserves. The Reserves are not in action again until next Wednesday when they play Malmesbury Vic here at Rylands Way KO 6.15.

On Wednesday of this week, the 1st XI travelled to play Cirencester Town under flood-lights. Bassett started the game in determined mood and worked hard to create chances and within the first 15 minutes good goal scoring chances fell to Colin Valters but unfortunately he was unable to convert them. Ken Regan was unlucky not to score with a header following a good cross from Colin Valters after 18 minutes, and that was the pattern of the play for the first half - Bassett creating chances but not being able to put the finishing touches to the good moves created. The second half started with Cirencester having more of the play and but for a good save at the foot of his post by Mark Ayres after 8 minutes, Cirencester may well have taken the lead. Bassett then took more control of the game and both Damon York and Ken Regan were unlucky not to score following some good work by Colin Valters down the right flank. Again it was Colin Valters who, using his quick turn of pace, provided the cross that eventually lead to Damon York scoring from close range to take his tally this season to 18. Bassett continued to work hard to create chances but were unable to increase the score line and when victory look almost certain, Cirencester were awarded a penalty in what must have been the time added on by the Referee. They duly converted the spot kick to level the scores. Once again disappointment for Bassett who had worked really hard throughout the game and to be perfectly fair deserved the 3 points.

On the Under 12 scene, the boys are playing in the Semi Final of their League Cup at Down Ampney next Tuesday, 10 Apr. If you made the journey to watch them, I know you would not be disappointed because, as I have said before, John Drury has moulded a very useful team of young boys, who hopefully should mature into very good players for years to come.

Thanks for your support again today and lets hope we have a more fruitful afternoon than we did last Saturday and of course last Wednesday.

Don't forget that we have games here over the Easter Holiday. On Saturday, 14 Apr, the Reserves play Melksham Town Res KO 3.00. On Easter Monday it's a hectic day for the Club. In the morning, KO 11.00am, the Club is hosting the Advertiser Cup Final between Greatfield United and Steele Davis (Swindon). With the amount of supporters expected for that game, an early arrival is strongly recommended to avoid missing the KO. In the afternoon, KO 3.00pm, the 1st XI travel to Clanfield to play Chipping Norton in the Semi Final of the Federated Homes League Division 1 Cup - so why not make a full day of it - Adver Cup Final in the morning and then Clanfield in the afternoon.

OUR VISITORS

Our visitors today, Kidlington, who are members of the Oxford FA come to us today currently placed 2nd in the League having earned 44 points from the 23 games played so far and in the process have scored a total of 44 goal and conceded 21.

This is our second meeting of the current season. Less than a month ago when we travelled Kidlington they beat us by the single goal, which was the first time that they had earned any points whatsoever from us. In the two fixtures played last season, Bassett did the double over them by winning 2-0 at Kidlington on 8 Oct and then only 2 weeks later in the return fixture, Bassett were the winners by the odd goal in a 7 goal match.

At the end of last season Kidlington finished in 11th place on 35 points having won 10, drawn 5 and lost 13 of the 28 fixtures having scored a total of 41 goals and conceding the high tally of 57.

It doesn't take much to work out that Kidlington are having a much better season this time round so today is going to be a tough game for Bassett - but if Bassett can show the same type of commitment as they did against Cirencester in mid-week, I am sure that Kidlington are going to find that they will be tough nut to crack.

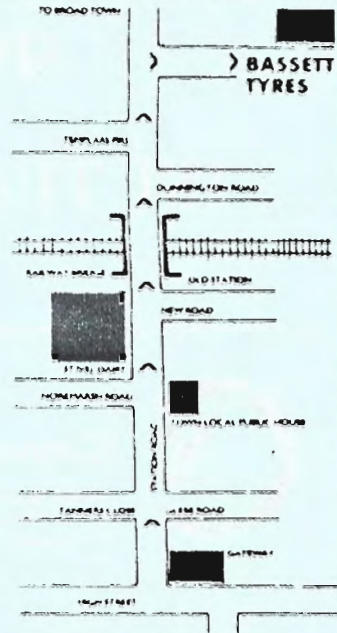
