Welcome to Longlevens

A warm welcome to our visitors from Longlevens who have travelled from Gloucester for this afternoon's rearranged Bluefin Challenge Cup 3rd Round clash. The first scheduling of this game on January Saturday was postponed due to a waterlogged

This is the first ever meeting between Wootton Bassett Town FC and Longlevens with Longlevens in their first season in the Hellenic League. Last season they won the Gloucestershire County League to achieve promotion to the Hellenic. Longlevens in fact won the Gloucestershire County League in consecutive seasons before making the step up in the pyramid.

Longlevens are going well in their first season at Hellenic League level and currently sit at the top of the table in Division One West, two points ahead of Lydney Town, both having played 18 games. Tuffley Rovers are 6 points behind Longlevens with a game in hand in what is now a three-way battle for the title.

To reach the 3rd Round of this competition Longlevens actually beat their closest league rivals Lydney 3-1 in the Second Round having received a walkover in the First Round over Shortwood United. As well as this cup and the league Longlevens have also gone well in the Floodlit Cup defeating Premier Division Brimscombe & Thrupp and Clanfield from Division One West to make the quarter-final stage of that competition. Goals from George Drewitt, Henry Traas and Steve Robertson did the damage, giving us a 3-0 lead before Newbury scored a consolation goal in the final minute.

Ascot Utd (A)

Despite the 3-1 loss the lads put in a gutsy performance against a side who have made it through to the last 8 of the FA Vase. To go in at 0-0 at half-time was a great achievement and the back four were excellent in the opening 45 minutes against a very prolific front line. Ascot came out in the second half all guns blazing and once they got in front there was only likely to be one winner. The first goal was a sloppy one to concede but to then find ourselves 3-0 down was somewhat harsh on the balance of play. The lads kept trying to play football and got their rewards when young Hugo Vivash netted a late consolation goal. The 16 coming up 17 year-old youngster must have been mortified that the Ascot announcer credited the goal to George Drewitt.

Visiting Ascot is always a pleasant experience. The facilities are first class, a nice smooth pitch, a roomy clubhouse with Sky Sports projected onto a big white wall and an excellent refreshments bar. Interesting to read the comments of the Reading Town Chairman in his programme editorial last week complaining about Reading Town having to travel to Brimscombe and Thrupp. He stated that "it cannot be right that a small club in Gloucestershire (Brimscombe and Thrupp) is in the same league as the likes of Reading Town, Ascot United and Binfield". Not sure what criteria he is using for a small club as Brimscombe averaged 9 more spectators per game last season and again are averaging more than Reading this season, albeit by just one. If it was geography that was the behind his comment then I get his point but having recently visited Brimscombe it is a great ground in a

Opponents - History

Longlevens AFC • Club History

The Club, in its current format, was formed in 1954, although we believe that a Longlevens team had been in existence before the Second World War, but that it folded in 1952, although we have never been able to confirm this through official records.

It was a proud moment for the Club when we were elected to the Gloucestershire County League, in season 2011/12, for I can remember that the aim of the Club, when I first joined forty years ago, had been to reach the County League – it was a long time coming, but the wait made the achievement all the more welcome!



We nearly made it to the County League more than 20 years ago - we had successfully undergone our facilities inspection (which, incidentally, would now be considered woefully inadequate) but being in pole position, we 'blew up' in the final three fixtures and were pipped to the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League (GNSL) title by Berkeley Town, eventually finishing as Runners-Up. However, in 2002/03 we repeated the feat and again in 2006/07, until finally winning Division One in 2008/09, under our current Manager – James French - and since the turn of the century, we had become something of a bench-mark in the GNSL, as we had consistently finished in and around the top five and it was this consistency that helped us win our place in today's County League. At the end of Season 2010/11, we had finished outside of the automatic promotion places, but our consistently strong performance, over a number of years in the GNSL, coupled with a re-structuring of the League and the fact that we had the tenancy of a brand new facility provided by the Gloucester City Council, at Sawmills, in Gloucester, saw us finally make it to the County League.

When we first took over the facility at Sawmills, we were indebted to the management of E.G. Carter and Company Limited (probably better known simply as Carter Construction) because without their input, both financial and with the provision of man-power, we would not have been able to meet the requirements of the County League. Ironically perhaps, it was the creation of the County League itself which enabled us to progress from Premier Division of the North Gloucester League, because the new League created additional spaces in the Northern Senior League and although in 1967/68 we had not finished in the automatic promotion places, in 1968/69 we were elected to the GNSL (the sharp-eyed among you may have noticed a common theme here!)

Over the years we have added further senior men's sides and we now run four, the other three all participating in the Stroud and District League. In recent years we have added a Ladies side and they have made significant progress in recent seasons and have become an integral part of 'The Club'. Our representation at youth level has been somewhat variable, we have had some very successful youth teams in the past, but these teams have tended to be been transitional and we have not been able to sustain teams at all levels.

However, as part of our plans for achieving Charter Standard Development Status, we implemented a structure that should see a steady influx of youth teams in future seasons, which can only be good for our future and I am glad to report that this season we will be fielding teams from Under 11's through to Under 14's.

In our first season with the County League we were rightly thrilled to reach the final of the Les James League Cup, only to be soundly beaten by Cribbs Friends Life, who did the League and Cup Double that season – we also consolidated our position in the League by finishing half-way.

However, I think it's fair to say that to win the League title last season was - to revert to a well-worn cliché – "beyond our wildest dreams" – especially given where we were in the League in November/December.

Words have been written elsewhere about the trauma surrounding Mark Moore and his near-death experience and miraculous recovery, but we rose from what was almost the darkest hour of our long history, to the very heights of a thrilling run in the League, culminating in the title and so we look with confidence to the future



After a disappointing 3-1 reverse at home against Cirencester, two goals from Justin Hyde – a player who had only recently been called up from the Reserves – earned all three points against Carterton at Rylands Way.

Two days prior to the County Cup final, high flying Yate were held to a 1-1 draw courtesv of a Lee Stoddart strike in the final home match of the season. And their good run of form continued against County League Shrewton United in the showpiece, staged at Melksham's The Conigre as Bassett tasted success in the oldest knockout contest in Wiltshire for only the second time. The Saturday May 5th 2001 edition of the Evening Advertiser carried the following roundup of the match:

"A goal from Lee Stoddart after seven minutes and a penalty from Paul Harper three minutes later gave Wootton Bassett a Wilts Senior Cup Final victory over Shrewton United by 2-0. Shrewton tried hard to get on terms in the second half but the woodwork and some excellent keeping by Richard Stevens prevented them from scoring."

It would wind up being a fitting parting gift from Barry Giles whose successful – albeit brief - spell would come to an end at the culmination of the season, which finished with a pair of losses to Brackley and North Leigh and a 3-1 win at Bicester.

Furthermore, it would be the last hurrah for Lee Stoddart, who would finish the season with 25 goals, twenty of which came in the league. In the summer he would make the switch to Fairford Town bringing an end to what had been a fantastic five years at Rylands Way. And the prolific striker would certainly be missed

Success during the 2000-01 campaign was not just limited to the first team, as the reserves – led jointly by Pete Yeardley and Paul Burke - totally dominated Hellenic League Reserve Division Two West, winning the title by a clear nine points from Almondsbury Town. Most impressively they finished the season undefeated, dropping a mere twelve points all season.

Consistently excellent throughout the season, it was Bassett's stingy defence – a unit that conceded just fourteen league goals - that ultimately ensured a zero remained in the side's loss column. This was demonstrated perfectly in their final match at Letcombe, where a fine performance from 'keeper Jason Hillier made certain the score remained unchanged come full time. In all, over half Bassett's league victories came by a solitary goal, though a fair few hammerings were dished out too.

Their most important run started at the beginning of February. A 0-0 draw with lowly Wantage Town had been disappointing. But the reserves bounced back with seven straight league wins that allowed the team to really stake out an advantage. The title was as good as theirs with five games left to go following a 2-1 win at Easington Sports. That victory increased their lead at the top to fourteen points, meaning only fourth place Almondsbury Town (who eventually ended as runners-up) had any chance of catching Bassett. The final

By now most clubs were suffering from a severe fixture backlog thanks to the appalling weather, and the level of crisis was highlighted in a report in the Advertiser published on March 26th, prior to those two defeats:

"Clubs have been invited to make themselves available to play on Good Friday April 13 and the possibility of playing two matches in one match day. First team followed by reserve match or vice versa, has been offered to assist clubs with a serious fixture backlog. Under Football Association rules double header games may be allowed. The matches would have to be of 80 minutes duration each, an example could be game one kicks off at 2pm, the same clubs could then play game two at 4pm. All these points are subject to review depending on weather and possible further fixture postponements."

That meant the games were to come thick and fast. Initially this seemed to buoy Bassett on as yet another Stoddart brace cemented a 3-1 win against Bicester before a 1-0 victory at Pegasus came courtesy of Turner. Furthermore, a place in the final of the Senior Cup was sealed with another extra time win, this time against County League Cricklade Town – then managed by Alan Clark – in a match played at Highworth. An early own goal put Bassett ahead, however Cricklade equalised deep into injury time. In the first period of extra time, however, Goodwin found the winner to send his side to the final for the second time in three seasons.

Then came another big win, this time against North Leigh, who were riding high in the league, as described in the Monday April 23rd edition of the Advertiser:

"Wootton Bassett, who have been having a quiet spell of late in the Premier Section, sprang back to life with a 1-0 victory over North Leigh. After an excellent start to their first season, Bassett dropped into the lower half of the table, but the victory over Cricklade in the semi final of the Wiltshire Senior Cup and the win over North Leigh will have given the club a boost before they contest the Wiltshire Senior Cup final against Shrewton United from the Wiltshire League. Bassett had four regulars missing, but dug in and fought well in a goal-less first half in which neither keeper was troubled and most of the action took place in midfield. For Bassett, Lee Marshall and Paul Harper kept a stranglehold on the North Leigh front runners.

After the break honours remained even once again until the 82nd minute, when a good move down the right saw North Leigh concede a corner. Jeremy Newton swung the corner into the six yard box, and in the scramble the ball ran free for Steve Howse who rifled the ball through a crowded goalmouth and into the net, much to the delight of the Bassett faithful. In the closing stages, North Leigh pushed forward in search of an equaliser but the well marshalled Bassett defence stood firm to chalk up three points and move them up the table to 12th spot."

Robbo runs riot as Bassett roll past Reading

Scours Lane, 14th February 2015

Another week, another important 3-1 victory for Wootton Bassett Town.

Paul Braithwaite's team have now triumphed by that score against sides in three of their last five league fixtures, with those triumphs coming against sides in and around them in the bottom half of the Hellenic League Premier Division.

This time Reading Town were the victims, falling to a fine Steve Robertson hat-trick, with the in-form forward's two late goals swinging Bassett's penultimate away fixture in their favour.

While his deadly finishing may have made the vital difference on the scoresheet though, it was an all-round battling Bassett display that proved crucial.

The absence of Dale Richards and James Skinner meant there was an unfamiliar look to the visitors' back line, especially given that Nathan Gambling was utilised as a makeshift left back. But Gambling, operating in unfamiliar territory at the other end of the pitch, did superbly despite arguably having the toughest task of all against the speedy and skilful Sam Bangura.

Across the midfield Bassett worked relentlessly, although there were some hiccups when trying to overplay on a heavy pitch. Then up front Tyler Sheppard proved a menace to the Reading backline in the second half, helping force errors that proved crucial in teeing up Rohertson

'Keeper Luke Kuczynski, continuing to justify his promotion from the reserves, produced another solid performance as well. He made a handful of firm saves, starting with one in the game's twelfth minute when he diverted Bangura's low drive from a tight angle around the post after the winger had juked past Gambling and then George Drewitt.

He was soon involved in a close penalty call when Bangura went tumbling when trying to round the Bassett stopper, but correctly no penalty was awarded. Then on the half hour mark a strong fist sent a stinging Kensley Maloney shot over the bar.

Having survived that passage of pressure from Reading, Bassett then went ahead. From the middle of the park, Henry Traas' played a lofted reverse ball forward that flat-footed home centre half Chris Fabianczyk headed on into the path of Robertson. Assuming possession with just Nathan Silver to beat, the forward made no mistake, taking one touch to steady himself before emphatically burying beyond the Reading 'keeper.

That lead lasted all of seven minutes though as the hosts made Bassett pay for their frustratingly persistent wish to turn with the ball on a chewed up surface. Sheppard was the guilty partner, being robbed of possession deep inside his own half. The ball was eventually worked to Liam Ferdinand, who rolled Drewitt on the edge of the box before arrowing a low strike beyond Kuczynski with the help of the right post.

Prior to the break Silver prevented Robertson from restoring Bassett's advantage with a near post save, and on the balance of play it was arguably fair that the teams went into the interval with nothing separating them.

Once play resumed, the midfield struggle initially continued, with the only chance before the hour falling to Reading's Danny Horscroft, who saw his long range drive batted wide by Kuczynski.

Slowly, however, Bassett gained the upper hand as Reading legs began to get weary. Playing in such conditions, tiredness was always going to be a factor at some stage and the pressure that their visitors began to assert served only to make things worse.

A surging run from Robertson down the left stretched the home defence on 63 minutes, but Callum Wright failed to capitalise, steering his shot from his teammate's cut back over with the help of a deflection.

Wright misfired again soon after as Robertson sent another low cross into the box and Hugo Vivash teed up the central midfielder.

Clever thinking from Wright then deserved better as he played a quick free kick to an unmarked Robertson, but the forward rushed his effort, skewing wide. Traas was the next Bassett player to be let down by his finishing, spooning a shot over from just inside the area after driving inside from the right wing

Eventually a second goal did arrive

With ten minutes left, heavy pressing inside the Reading half forced an errant square pass that Robertson jumped onto. His through ball slipped in Sheppard, who drove into the box before cutting a pass across the six yard box where Robertson slid in to score.

Robertson then almost immediately returned the favour, picking out an unmarked Sheppard in the box, but the ball got stuck in his strike partner's feet, allowing a defender to get back and deflect a shot wide.

However, no mistake was made by Robertson with just four minutes to go as he wrapped up his hat-trick. Jumping on another misplaced pass, he broke down the middle of the pitch, played a neat give-and-go with Sheppard on the edge of the area and prodded beyond Silver into the bottom left corner.

There was still time for a desperate late rally from Reading, but Kuczynski dived low to keep out a Horscroft free kick before Steve Yeardley acrobatically diverted a blasted Chris Ferdinand effort wide.

Had either of those gone in, it still wouldn't have been enough for Reading as Bassett's spirited display had sealed the points.

After another positive stride taken on the road, it's now time for Bassett – with just one away fixture remaining - to take control of the home advantage they have for the remainder of the season.

Man of the Match: Steve Robertson – the forward's ruthlessness in front of goal brought him a deserved hat-trick, while his movement with and without the ball in the second half helped tire out an already flagging Reading defence.

was not to be. Amends were made in the final game of 2000, where a Hall strike earned a point at Carterton Town to ensure Bassett started the New Year in an impressive sixth.

They maintained that position as Stoddart hit a pair of goals either side of half time to seal the points in a come from behind win at Abingdon, before Lee Marshall equalised with quarter of an hour left to snatch a point at Tuffley Rovers. Another draw followed, with Didcot once again being frustrated and unable to score before the Senior Cup quarter final at near neighbours Purton. Bassett's Hellenic League Division One opponents proved more than a handful, and only after extra time did Giles' team ensure progression to the semi finals for the third consecutive year. The Monday January 28th 2001 edition of the Evening Advertiser reported on the match as follows:

"Wootton Bassett reached the semi-final of the Wilts Senior Cup with a 4-1 win over local rivals Purton after extra time. In a lively opening to the game, the two sides created several openings and there were goal-line clearances at both ends, Watkins and Wright missing early chances for Purton. On 24 minutes, Purton took the lead when a good free kick from Micky Heath was hoisted into the box and Courtney Chessell was on hand to head the ball into the net. For the rest of the half, honours remained fairly even.

After the break, Bassett began to get on top and gained a deserved equaliser on the hour when Purton keeper Luke Alford could only fist away a goal-bound effort. The ball fell to Bassett's top marksman Lee Stoddart who made no mistake from close range. Bassett continued to press with Alford making several good stops and with skipper Mark McMeeking marshalling the Purton defence well, the tie drifted into extra time. In the first period, a corner was headed into the net Paul Davis to give Bassett the lead and further goals in the second period from Stoddart and Jon Davis ensured the Hellenic Premier side a place in the semi finals."

January then concluded with a 2-0 home win against Wantage courtesy of goals from defender Paul Davis and the ever reliable Stoddart, who was certainly turning heads in his first season playing at such a level.

February saw Bassett's momentum cease, however. Following consecutive home draws against Fairford (0-0) and fourth placed Brackley (1-1), the first loss of the New Year came against frontrunners Swindon Supermarine, who prevailed at home by the odd goal in three. Struggling Harrow Hill then held Bassett to a 0-0 draw before Shortwood won at Rylands Way by the odd goal in three.

The slide carried on with a 4-1 reverse at Cirencester Academy. A 3-0 home win over Cheltenham Saracens, courtesy of Harper and Jon Davis penalties and a further strike from Newton arrested the decline, but home defeats soon came against Tuffley (2-3) and Supermarine (0-1) as Bassett slipped to eleventh.

trick latching onto a through ball from sub Ben Parsons to score from an acute angle. It was the striker's fifth goal in the last two games."

That resulted was followed with an impressive point at home against Didcot Town in a goalless draw. Stoddart repeated the trick when Bassett visited Yate Town and shocked the recently relegated Southern League side by thrashing them 4-0, defender Lee Marshall completing the scoring.

Four days later though came another crushing loss to Highworth in the reverse fixture at the Elms. Paul Harper found the net for Bassett, but the defence shipped four in a lopsided loss. Cirencester Academy were then to eliminate Bassett from the league Challenge Cup, winning 2-0 at Rylands Way with a certain Shaun Terry scoring one of the goals for the Centurions.

Giles' team would then go unbeaten in three games during October. Jeremy Newton scored twice in a 2-1 home win against Abingdon United, popping up in the 83rd minute to grab the winner. A fine point was earned at Almondsbury courtesy of goals from Harper and a first for Nathan Hall. The double was then completed against Milton thanks to a solitary Hall strike, which lifted Bassett into the heady heights of the sixth.

The team's fine form continued into the penultimate month of the calendar year, although things did not look as though they would begin well when Bassett found themselves 3-1 down at home against Pegasus Juniors midway through the second half. Further compounding the situation was the fact 'keeper Rich Stevens had been sent off, with defender Jason Edwards replacing him between the sticks. Undeterred though, Giles' team fought back, securing the win thanks to late strikes from Mick Goodwin, Paul Davis and Stoddart, who fired home the winner with nine minutes remaining.

It was then onto the Wiltshire Senior Cup – the last remaining knockout competition of the year for Bassett after their elimination from both league competitions. And things got off to a fine start against Amesbury Town as Ray Burroughs summarised in the Tuesday November 21st 2000 edition of the Evening Advertiser:

"Wootton Bassett booked a place in the second round after a comfortable 6-0 victory over Hampshire League side Amesbury Town. In a scrappy first 45 minutes Lee Stoddart finally gave Bassett the lead ten minutes before the break. The half-time cuppa then worked wonders for the home side who completely dominated the second half and added five more goals courtesy of Richard Merchant, Lee Marshall, Micky Goodwin and Nathan Hall (2), the latter spoiling a good performance by being sent off in the last five minutes."

The unpredictable weather meant it would not be until the middle of the next month that the team took to the field again, and when they did they showed signs of rust. Trailing bottom side Wantage Town by a goal at the break, Bassett contrived to concede two more at the beginning of the second period. Stoddart managed to peg the hosts back with a brace, but it

New signing Ben Parsons opened his Bassett account on the half hour, and three minutes later a Martin Edwards pile driver doubled the advantage; the hosts salvaged a goal following a deflected free kick but the visitors held on.

Bassett soon crashed back down to earth though with a second heavy defeat of the season against a near neighbour to begin September. This time the perpetrators were Highworth Town, who eased to a 4-0 win at Rylands Way. A Paul Davis own goal got things going, whilst Andy Brien was sent off for the hosts later on. The team had 'keeper Daryl Simms to thank for the score not becoming any worse as he saved a penalty on an otherwise miserable afternoon. Fairford then ensured Bassett's first foray into the Floodlit Cup lasted all of ninety minutes as they triumphed 3-1, Stoddart grabbing the consolation for Giles' team. Four days later at Shortwood United, his brace put his team 2-1 to the good, but a late collapse saw a second victory of the season slip through Bassett's grasp, the Nailsworth-based side prevailing 4-2.

Showing the team's character, Bassett bounced back from their third straight defeat in some style. Leading the way was the free scoring Lee Stoddart, who would take his scoring tally into double figures before the end of the season's second month. Two hat-tricks in the space of three games did the trick, beginning with one in a 4-1 home stuffing of Harrow Hill, as described by the Evening Advertiser on Monday September 18th 2000 under the headline "Lee's Three of the Best":

"Lee Stoddart fired a hat-trick as Wootton Bassett recorded their third win of the season in the Hellenic Premier section. Bassett's ace marksman proved too hot for tenman Harrow Hill, hitting his treble after the break. Visitors Harrow Hill, who defeated second in the table Highworth Town earlier in the season, started confidently despite Bassett's Jeremy Newton going close on a couple of occasions early in the game. Bassett began to see more of the ball as the game progressed and took the lead in the 27th minute when Newton took the ball into the box, beat two defenders and drilled the ball past the visitors' keeper James French. Harrow, stung by the reverse, pushed forward for the rest of the half and got a deserved equaliser five minutes before the break. John Bowdler took a free-kick from outside the box and his powerful shot flashed past home keeper Richard Stevens.

Four minutes after the re-start Bassett regained the lead when a good move out of defence involving Lee Marshall and Richard Merchant enabled Lee Stoddart to drill into the bottom left hand corner of the net. On the hour another good move involving several Bassett players was finished off once again by Stoddart, his powerful drive giving French no chance. Harrow received a further blow midway through the half when they lost influential defender Martin Read, sent-off for a second bookable offence. From then on Richard Stevens in the Bassett goal was hardly bothered. His side took control of the game and six minutes from time Stoddart completed his hat-

What was going on in the world

The season kicked off with Robbie Williams at the top of the charts with Rock DJ. The summer Olympics take place in Sydney Australia, whilst the UK is hit by a foot and mouth crisis. Wikipedia, the internet encyclopaedia, is launched. Manchester United win the league finishing ten points clear of second placed Arsenal. The Gunners also suffer the agony of losing the FA Cup Final, going down 2-1 against Liverpool. The Anfield team, meanwhile, completed a unique treble, also adding the League Cup and UEFA Cup titles. Leeds United reach the Champions League semi-finals, while Swindon Town finish 20th in the third tier of English football, avoiding relegation by just one point. The season ends with S Club 7 at the top of the charts with Don't Stop Movin.

It was great timing that the first full season of the new Millennium coincided with the dawning of a new era for Wootton Bassett Town as they were set to take their bow at Hellenic Premier Division level.

There was certainly a buzz of excitement within the club heading into the campaign - and justifiably so – as evidenced by the following report published in the Evening Advertiser's non league season preview on Thursday 17th August 2000:

"Wootton Bassett Town, who finished in third place in Division One last season, have been promoted to the Premier Division and are facing a tough task. During the close season the club has installed floodlights and seating to a small stand. Secretary Rod Carter said: "The seats came from the County Ground at Stratton Bank end. "The new floodlights were a self financing venture with help from the Football Association and grants from other organisations. We have a new hospitality room and PA system and we are raring to go."

Manager Barry Giles said: "All of last season's squad has re-signed and new faces to the squad will include Ben Parsons from Purton, Phil Penning from Calne Town, Paul Patel from Highworth and Jason Edwards and Daryl Simms from Swindon Supermarine. "Former manager of Pewsey Vale Tony Lockyear is club coach together with Mick Byrne. It is going to be a tough season for us but if prolific scorers from last season Lee Stoddart and Paul Harper find the net regularly hopefully we will be able to compete with the senior sides in the section."

Barry Giles' team, however, would receive a rude awakening in their opener against local rivals Fairford Town, who romped to a 6-0 victory. Bassett were competitive for the opening twenty minutes or so, but two goals before the break from their hosts crushed any confidence as the side fell victim to an attacking masterclass.

They bounced back though a few days later at home against Milton United. Things didn't start well at all, with the Miltonians racing into a two goal lead inside 23 minutes. However, goals from Paul Patel and Lee Stoddart rescued a point. After a single goal reverse at home



Wiltshire Senior Cup

The Wiltshire Senior Cup was first competed for back in 1896-97 when Swindon Town were the winners. The Robins have gone on to win the competition nine times, including six straight titles after its inception. With their progress in the professional game it is a long time since Swindon have competed in the competition. Wootton Bassett Town's first success in the competition was to come at the turn of the century when they made the final in 1902-03, losing to Warminster Town, Bassett made the final again the following season doing down to Swindon Town Reserves in the final. It would be 84 years before Bassett would again grace the competition's showpiece when in 1987-88 they made the final to this time lose against near neighbours Purton. Finally in 1998-99 Bassett won the cup when they defeated Pewsey Vale in the final after extra time. This success was repeated two seasons later with a win over Shrewton United. Since this win the best the Bassett faithful have had is a couple of semi-final appearances. Last season Bassett went out in the Second Round, losing 2-3 at home against Bemerton Heath Harlequins.

The competition was won by Melksham Town for the second season running, and seventh time overall. This time there was no controversy (in 2012-13 they had won after having been knocked out in an earlier round only to be re-instated due to their opponents playing an ineligible player). In the final, the game ended 3-3 after extratime against Bradford Town, but Melksham won the cup on penalties.

Three quarter final ties were played on Saturday 13th December and two went to extra time. The game settled in normal tie saw Bradford Town defeat Bassett 2-0 with Sam Jordan the difference between the two sides with his clinical finishing. Highworth Town and Melksham were level at two a piece after ninety minutes but it was the Hellenic side who scored the extra time winner to make it through to the semifinals. In the other tie there no goals in 90 minutes between Laverstock & Ford and Corsham Town but Laverstock scored two without reply in the extra half hour to make it through to the last four. The game between Warminster and Amesbury is scheduled for December 20th.

WBTFC History On One Page

Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.



Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away. Last season Bassett were managed by Jeff Roberts. Despite assembling a skilful side on paper and paying players for the first time, the side ended the season in 14th place and with a poor discipline record. Ahead of the move into a new ground at Ballards Ash the Club again has a new manager with former Fairford Town manager Paul Braithwaite taking over the management duties.





Bassett pay price for sloppy seconds

Racecourse Ground, 10th February 2015

A sloppy start to the second halfsomething that has been a regular downfall for Paul Braithwaite's charges so far this campaign - set Wootton Bassett Town on their way to a 3-1 away defeat at Ascot United as the high-flying Yellamen proved too strong.

Bassett had held their hosts, fresh off their FA Vase triumph on Saturday, in check during an evenly contested opening period.

After a slow start by both teams, the visitors had the first opportunity to take the lead when Henry Traas pounced on a poor Rob Saunders free kick and broke forward at pace. He fed a crossfield pass to Dan Bailey, who cut inside Saunders on the left edge of the area but, instead of attempting to shoot, he sought to pick out Tyler Sheppard with a backheel that failed to come off. Callum Wright also came close, but he spun a 25-yard first timer narrowly over from a short Nathan Gambling corner.

At the other end, Jon Keough's glancing header from Matt Cooper's corner was headed off the line by Callum Wright (pictured below), while Leon Yarnie headed onto the bar. Two corners in quick succession then resulted in Jon Bennett's shot on the turn being deflected wide before a neat flick at the near post from Lee Boon to connect with the second looped over



However, a failure to get out of the blocks following the restart soon led to Yarnie steering in from close range, as the troublesome Ascot forward put away his side's third chance in just four second half minutes.

Really they should have been ahead before then, with Jon Bennett firing over from twenty yards before Yarnie was denied by a fine point blank Luke Kuczynski save after Cooper had slid in a low cross to the unmarked frontman in the centre of the box

Bassett could only ride their luck for so long though, and Yarnie made no mistake when again finding himself with too much room inside the visitors' penalty area.

From then on there was only going to be one winner. The value Ascot placed on possession and their excellent use of space had already forced Bassett to tear around the pitch. And with a deficit to try and overcome, the added exertion meant legs tired quickly and space opened up even more for the home team

It could have been before the hour when Bennett burst through the Bassett defence only to see Kuczynski race off his line and parry at his feet.

When the second did arrive with twelve minutes remaining it came in style. Cooper's left wing cross was headed only as far as Jesse Wilson on the edge of the box and the central midfielder set the ball to partner in crime Saunders, who dispatched a stunning volley into the top corner.

Five minutes later Ascot had a third as Ian Brooks planted a header from an inswinging Cooper corner beyond Kuczynski.

A fourth went begging when Rob Gier spooned over while unmarked after a swift counter attack in the game's dying stages.

That allowed Bassett to grab a consolation, much to home 'keeper Chris Grace's frustration. George Drewitt drove forward out of defence before sending a ball into the left corner for Gambling to run onto. The forward then cut the ball back across goal to Joe Hiscock, whose weak shot was fumbled into the path of onrushing substitute Hugo Viveash and he stroked home from close range.





Match Reports

Bassett head to a vital victory

Corinium Stadium, 7 February 2015

In a fiery, tempestuous affair, Wootton Bassett Town picked up a crucial three points as they outfoxed Newbury to secure a 3-1 victory.

If any game Paul Braithwaite's side have played this year was to be classed as a 'must win' then this was it.

Having seen their advantage over the sides below them eroded in recent weeks, Basset have become reeled into a battle at the bottom of the Hellenic League Premier Division. And with Newbury – two places and five points behind going into the contest – visiting the Corinium Stadium, a result was necessary to restore some of that cushion that had been lost.

While goals from George Drewitt, Henry Traas and Steve Robertson (pictured below) achieved that aim, Bassett are not yet out of the woods. But they are in a damn sight better position than they would have been had they fell to a defeat.



Newbury, on the other hand, are slowly losing touch. Now eight points off Bassett, it will be hard for them to overcome that deficit with just seven matches remaining.

The importance of this encounter was not lost on the visitors. But this led to a performance weakened by an overzealous, undisciplined approach, which only got worse when they found themselves two down after just 25 minutes.

It was Newbury who had the game's first chance after just one minute when Dave Perry shot straight at Luke Kuczynski after an awkward bounce prevented James Skinner from clearing Danny Lachacz's cross and the ball squirmed free.

Yet Bassett were the team who made their early opportunities count. With nine minutes on the clock, an inswinging Nathan Gambling corner was not attacked by the visitors' defence as it sailed across the face of goal and Drewitt made the most of this, stabbing home from close range at the left post.

Another set piece led to the second. This time it was Nathan Hawkins who served as provider, sending forward a free kick from deep, which Traas met with a bullet of a header on the edge of the area that flew into the bottom corner and left Newbury 'keeper Chris Waller rooted to the spot.

Further boosting the hosts, the deficit served to distract Newbury from their game, though Curtis Angell did have a chance to reduce arrears, but snatched at a shot from a tight angle.

They were fortunate too not to fall further behind when a thumping long range drive from Tyler Sheppard had Waller beaten only to crash off the right upright.

Given how well they were having things, Bassett would have been disappointed to hear the half time whistle. They re-emerged as a jittery unit too, the significance of holding on to their lead no doubt heavy on their minds.

A fine reaction save from Kuczynski inside the second period's opening 120 seconds kept the lead at two. With the defence stretched, the 'keeper pushed out a Lachacz cross only as far as Danny Langford, who produced a snap shot from 12 yards, but Kuczynski sprung back to his feet and acrobatically tipped around the post.

With Newbury increasingly frustrated, the game took a sour turn just after the hour when, after the referee had already blown his whistle for a Bassett free kick, the visitors' player-manager Callum Willmoth flew into Tyler Sheppard with a shocking two-footed lunge and somehow only received a yellow.

Thereafter the rate at which Newbury collected cautions far exceeded the number of shots on target they were able to muster, not least because the Bassett defence

Yet Bassett were the team who was firmly standing its ground made their early opportunities despite needing to be alert for long count. With nine minutes on the periods

The best they could come up with was Ben McCready's curling 30 yard free kick, which Kuczynski scrambled across goal and steered around the post.

And again Bassett made them pay. With six minutes left, Steve Robertson received a Skinner free kick into feet on the edge of the box and rolled his man before bending a crisply struck left-footer beyond Waller

Although Newbury did get a reply in fluky circumstances when Cellyn Crook fired into an empty net from thirty yards after a Kuczynski punch landed at his feet, the points were Bassett's.

On the Edge Over the past few weeks or so I, as a referee, have been quizzed, or

even challenged, over certain decisions given or not given when fans have been watching their own team from the terraces or witnessing scenes of disparity on the television. Of course when it's a case of relating incidents involving their own team and more to the point against their team it can become a 'one sided' argument in favour of their club who they felt had been 'hard done by' and this being the reason why defeat became reality but the true value of what happened not made clear or even over emphasised to try and prove the referee wrong. Of course the offside Law and its interpretation will always become a contentious issue and thoughts of a differing nature regarding correctness will always become a talking point. Amazingly that part of the game has not been the issue but the talking points have been what constitutes a 'handball' offence, what is deemed a 'dive' and in a more obnoxious manner how do referee's differentiate between what is 'obvious' or 'otherwise' when deciding upon a goal scoring opportunity, especially, in regard to the former as this would lead to a 'red' card whereas as in the latter it may be just a 'vellow' or even nothing more than a foul. It is not as simple as just deciding whether the offence occurred during a promising attack the referee has to consider more definitive circumstances such as (a) Distance between the offence and the goal

- (b) The likelihood of the player being or remaining, in control of the ball
- (c) The direction of play
- (d) More importantly, the location and number of defenders in the vicinity.

Some fans think the offence must occur in the penalty area to describe the offence with the word 'obvious', not so, denying an opponent an obvious goal scoring opportunity can become reality outside the penalty area with the above mentioned examples considered. Unfortunately fans compare incidents without taking into account the real meaning of OBVIOUS; it's not just comparing the acts of foul play but to bear in mind the necessities mentioned. Diving, or simulation, will always be an open book simply because it rests solely on the shoulders of the referee to decide, we have seen both sides where it has been analysed both correctly and incorrectly again a difficult decision for the referee. All I can say a dive in hope of 'conning' the referee and the game in general, is a despicable act if cases of deception is proved and we do not want this to escalate in this game we love and the book should be thrown at the culprits, all I can say this intrusion into the game was rarely seen in my active days. Handball will always be a contentious issue, this offence, alleged or otherwise, certainly stirs up the emotions of many, yes, including referees whose opinions can differ as well. It's the old adage that explains this offence when being challenged 'was it ball to hand or hand to ball' the second opinion deemed to be correct and rightly so but is it that easy. Intentional is probably the operative word and it would be true to say obvious cases are rarely challenged but when similar happens in the penalty area then for some reason players think that's different especially by a defender i wonder why!! Looking at some incidents of alleged handball players are trying to deceive (successfully at times) by circumventing Law by using their body to propel the arm making it appear accidental such as dropping the shoulder rather than a distinct movement of the arm and this is when comments of a dissenting nature become apparent. We often hear the word 'accidental' what is accidental? We ask again that has to be in the opinion of the referee, Diving, Obvious or otherwise, intentional, accidental who really wants to become the man in black, well I loved it and I know many more who also have the same thoughts. Happy whistling and watching


