Welcome to Kidlington

Hellenic League Years - 2005-06

Kidlington FC • Club History

Kidlington FC was founded in 1909 and played local village football up to WW2. Success was slow in coming, records show their first trophy was achieved in 1929, the Lord Jersey Cup Final against Fritwell. The Lord Jersey Cup was a competition highly prized among the villages in the Cherwell Valley; rivalry was so keen that players had to prove they were residents of the village for whom they played



In 1945, Kidlington moved from village football to play in the Oxford City Junior League, with a good deal of success in both league and cup. By 1951 the Oxfordshire Senior League was entered, where stronger competition was provided by the likes of Witney Town; Morris Motors; Pressed Steel & Thame United.

1953 The Hellenic League formed, the Oxon Senior League immediately lost some of its stronger clubs to the new league. Kidlington won the Senior League title that next season, joining the new league in 1954. Early days in the Hellenic League showed quite clearly the difference in standard. Kidlington maintained a Premier Division place for a time, but spent most of the 60's in Division One. The 70's started with winning the County Intermediate Cup Final, along with two further County final places in the decade. Both epic battles against a very talented Peppard side, who won on both occasions. A squad of good young players produced Kidlington's best ever run in an FA competition, when in 1976-77. Having played every round but one away from home, Kidlington reached the last 16 in the FA Vase, bowing out to Gosport Borough. The nucleus of this side eventually gained promotion back to the Premier Division in 1979-80.

The 80's saw Kidlington return to Division One, the County Cup produced few consistent performances, other than in 1983-84 when Kidlington were 5 minutes away from a place in the final. The early 90's were steady. Season 94-95 brought silverware at last, Martin Bakers' Reserves side did the League/Cup double. An upturn in the first team fortunes occurred when Karl Grossmann assembled a formidable tough tackling side, finishing in the top 6 of Division One in four successive seasons.

The new millennium brought with it a major overhaul to the committee and a new Chairman in Geoff Talboys. In 2004-05, under the guidance of Kevin Walton the first team finish in third place, with it promotion back into the Hellenic Premier Division. With promotion came a struggle with the considerable difference in the standard of football compared to Division One, losing the first twelve games. The season petered out in frustration as the team finished in a relegation position ... however a national non-league re-structure saved them from the dreaded drop.

In 2007 - 2008, first team silverware arrived at Yarnton Road for the 1st time in over 30 years, winning the Floodlit Trophy under the guidance of manager Paul Lee. With additional honours this year from the Reserves, who won Reserve Division One for a second consecutive season, The Youth winning the Oxfordshire U18 Youth Cup, and to cap the season Kidlington Vet's retained their Veteran League crown. Season 2008-09 was again a good one for all our teams. Our 1st Team finished in a very respectable 9th position in the league and had some good cup runs, the Reserves finished 3rd in their league but unfortunately yet again were runners up in the Oxfordshire Intermediate Cup final. 2009-10 came a new Chairman, Lloyd Wray, and new team management, ex-player Gordon Geary was recruited to look after 1st team affairs and Barry Hiles to run the Reserve team.

Season 2010-11 saw the club, under the same management structure, achieve it's most successful season ever. Our best league finish ever, a superb effort by all saw us play a very strong Oxford United team, at the Kassam Stadium in the final of the Oxfordshire Senior Cup. We did win some silverware though, we beat Purton 3-0 in the final of the Supplementary Cup Abingdon Town. Geary and his assistant Appleton decided to quit, December 2011, stating they had taken the club as far as they could. Players Danny Leggett and Christian Perkins stepped forward to guide the club through till the end of the season. This season was very frustrating but owing to some decent early league results the club maintained its Premier division status. Ex-Oxford United striker Paul Berry was appointed manager for season 2012/13, however he resigned after only three matches to pursue alternative opportunities. Gordon Geary was persuaded to come out of retirement and was re-appointed as manager during the second week of the season. Geary managed to assemble a squad with the ability to avoid the dreaded drop achieving a respectable 13th position.

Martin Wilkinson and Chris Peacock took control as Manager and Assistant of the first team at the start of season 2013-14. Under their guidance the club experienced it's highest ever level of achievement in it's Hellenic League history ending the season in 6th place of the Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division. The bar has now been raised and Kidlington will look to surpass that level.





With three games to go Bassett journeyed to Winterbourne, who had already wrapped up the league title. But the visitors were to rain on their parade, overcoming a nervy first half performance to deal the champions their first loss since the end of January. After going behind, goals from Bennett, Chris Mills and a Paul Crabtree screamer earned a 3-1 victory. The convincing win meant confidence was sky high, and surely the only way the team could go was up? Then, however, came the heartbreak in the penultimate match, and to make things worse it was delivered by county rivals Trowbridge Town, as Stuart Smedley reported:

"They say all good things have to come to an end, but when they do its feels like a kick in the teeth, it hurts. Just ask Paul Burke's side as a 1-0 defeat away to Trowbridge brought to an end an unbeaten league spell that stretched from the end of January. Dean Barker's initiative was the difference between the two sides as nothing fell Bassett's way. Golden opportunities in the second half weren't taken as Bassett's domination of the last 45 minutes couldn't muster that vital goal. Against the slope, Bassett created a couple of openings early on. First a Paul Crabtree header from 15 vards was saved before Jon Davis blazed just over from 25 yards. On eleven minutes Dan Kovacs looked to have given the home side the lead but a fine save from John Haines, just getting his hand to the ball to palm away, denied him. Three minutes later a surging run from the ever inspirational and gutsy Steve Yeardley ended up in Daniel Barnes upending him in the box but cries for a penalty were waived away. A minute later Barker struck. Michael Barnes played a low curling ball headed for the far post but Barker stuck a leg out, redirecting the ball and wrong-footing Haines who could only get a hand to the ball. A minute later a Matty Bennett free kick was flicked onto Rich Gee at the far post. Gee could only head wide. Trowbridge then squandered three good chances to double the lead. Haines saved from Barker before Yeardley blocked an effort of his that was heading goalwards six yards out. On 34 minutes Ben Gascoyne was caught in possession allowing Kovacs to feed Barker. The goalscorer tried lobbing the oncoming Haines but the ball failed to dip and went just over.

If Burke was frustrated by his sides' first half performance, the second was even more agonizing. Seven minutes in Chris Mills was introduced to add another attacking spark as Crabtree was brought off. Five minutes later a John Magani through ball to Bennett bobbled and Bennett could only fire over from 15 yards before Chris Tricker was booked for dissent. Great intervention from Davis ensured Barker couldn't double his tally as Davis slid to avert a 15-yard shot wide. Mills then failed to connect properly with a Bennett cross and his glancing header went wide before Hemsley had a long range effort deflected inches wide. Steve Bunting replaced Hemsley with nineteen minutes left. In the 74th minute Nathan Hall flicked on a long Gascoyne throw and the ball trickled across the face of goal before going out for a goal kick. Three minutes later a Mills shot from 20-yards was fumbled by mistake-prone Tom Sheppard before eventually being cleared. Bennett tested him from 20-yards with eight minutes left but Sheppard did enough to parry before a mazy Gascoyne run and shot from the edge of the area rolled an inch wide of the right post. Tearle Wonder Goal and Thompson Wonder Save Give **Bassett** Historical Win

Rylands Way, 4th October 2008

An exquisite chip from Phil Tearle to beat the Kidlington keeper in the second period of extra-time followed by a Stewart Thompson penalty save saw Wootton Bassett Town through to the Second Round Proper of the F.A. Vase for the first time in the Club's history.

It was fitting that, in the week that the move to the new ground came closer to reality, it was a product of the Club's expanding Youth Section who scored the winning goal in this important money spinning match. Tearle has played for the Club since he was an Under 10 and is seen by the many youngsters who currently play for the Club's youth set-up as an inspirational figure who has shown that if you are good enough the door to the First Team is open to VOU.

In front of a healthy Rylands Way crowd Bassett started the game well and went in front courtesy of a well taken goal from another youngster, Lee Moulton, on 19 minutes. Following a flowing passing move the ball came to Moulton on the left of the box, he cut inside and put the ball into the far corner of the net giving the Kidlington keeper no chance. A cool finish for a youngster who continues to impress down the left hand side of Bassett's midfield.

Bassett extended the lead a minute later when a penalty was awarded for a foul on Ryan Banks. With regular penalty taker Steve Yeardley away running the Great North Run, it fell to top scorer Shaun Terry to take the kick. Memories of the missed penalty in the earlier round at Buckingham came flooding back but this time Terry made no mistake and fired the kick into the net.

Missing match reporter Scoop was duly sent a text advising of the second goal and it took two more such texts to convince him; yes Shaun had scored a penalty!

Two-nil to Bassett at the break and in reality Bassett had dominated play with the back three of Chris Oram. Shaun Carter and Luke result beyond doubt but his curled Sharps giving the Kidlington strikers little opportunity in front of goal and the midfield, particularly Tom Richie and Richie Carter in the centre, working tirelessly to close down the Kidlington players, including former Wanderers Wycombe and Doncaster Rovers pro Jermaine McSporran.

The second half saw Kidlington come out all guns blazing but despite a lot of possession and neat passing football Bassett held onto the two goal lead However a harshly awarded free-kick on the edge of the 18 vard box allowed Morgan Williams to fire a free kick into the back of Stewart Thompson's net to make it 2-1 on 50 minutes.

Chris Oram and Shaun Carter continued to deny the lively Kidlington strikers but Bassett were to suffer a setback on 79 minutes just as they thought they were going to get the win. Bassett were slow to react to a ball down the left which allowed Mark Flanagan to get away and bear down on the Bassett goal and Flanagan fired a powerful low drive past Stewart Thomson to send the game into extra-time.

Just when thoughts were turning to a replay on Tuesday up stepped substitute Tearle and that cheeky wonder goal. A ball over the top saw Tearle race away from the Kidlington defence and as the Kidlington keeper came out he deftly chipped the ball over him and into the empty net, cue celebrations not seen at Rylands Way for many a vear

However, within a minute the euphoria had gone as Shaun Carter handled the ball in the Bassett box and the referee pointed to the spot Time for the second hero of the day to step forward. Kidlington's striker fired the penalty low to the left of keeper Stewart Thomson but Thompson had guessed the right way and pulled off a magnificent save

In the second period of extra time Kidlington pushed forward in search of an equaliser but left themselves vulnerable to the break. One such occasion saw Shaun Terry do the difficult bit of turning his defender on the edge of the box and with the keeper way off his line the opportunity was there to put the

shot just went the wrong side of the post. Bassett survived a late scare but clung on for the history making win that sends them into the last 128 in this prestigious national competition. The £1.000 prize money will have gone down well in the Committee Room.

December saw consecutive 3-1 victories to begin the month, the first coming away at Clanfield and the second a home win over Headington. Yet another questionable performance in a local derby followed though as Bassett were held to a 1-1 draw at struggling Cricklade Town, with Hemsley once again coming to the rescue. There was to be little festive joy either as Cheltenham Saracens prevailed by a single goal two days before Christmas and a 1-1 draw at home to Pewsey on the 27th.

January, too, was a mixed bag, but was the turning point of the season for Burke's side. The New Year began with a comfortable 2-0 away victory at Letcombe, with Bennett and Yeardley – from the spot - supplying the goals. Bassett now found themselves in mid-table, seven points behind upcoming opponents Harrow Hill, who had played a single game more. Another penalty from Yeardley also helped Bassett eke out a point, in an entertaining 2-2 draw. In the return match at home to Cricklade, disaster struck as the fourth from bottom visitors to Rylands Way scored late on to win 2-1.

This defeat though was the catalyst for what became an astonishing unbeaten league streak. At the time, Bassett, despite possessing games in hand, were on the outside looking in when it came to the race for promotion; five other teams - Harrow Hill, Old Woodstock, Tytherington, Trowbridge and Cheltenham Saracens - all seemed better positioned for a run at third spot. Unhelpfully, three of the next four games turned out to be draws, the lone win coming at home to Clanfield thanks to a rare goal from Justin Hyde. Going into that contest, the team were in ninth, some 15 points off second place but now with two games in hand over Harrow Hill. After dispatching Purton 2-1 to reach the quarter finals of the Supplementary Cup, Bassett downed Malmesbury, winning 2-0 courtesy of goals from Nathan Hall and defender Rich Gee; for the latter it was only his second ever goal for Bassett, the first having come a week earlier! A tasty affair with promotion chasers Old Woodstock finished 1-1 a week later before Penn & Tylers Green ended Bassett's cup hopes.

Now the sole focus was the league and boy did Bassett attack it with gusto with just nine games remaining. One of the best goals Rylands Way will ever see, scored by Ben Gascoyne following a mazy, powerful run, was the highlight of a crushing 3-1 triumph over Cheltenham, with Bennett and Hemsley notching the others. Bennett then scored a hat-trick to cap off a 5-0 demolition job of hapless Ross Town before a frustrating 2-2 draw at Cirencester followed as numerous chances went astray. That result meant Bassett had virtually to win out if they were to bounce straight back into the Hellenic Premier. Such a daunting challenge did not seem to faze Burke's troops though. And this was epitomised by the 1-0 win earned deep in the Forest of Dean against Harrow Hill. A delicious Hemsley free kick proved decisive but it was a gutsy all-round display that earned victory, not least from Haines, who came out of the game battered and bruised, but with that all important clean sheet to his name. A slice of luck helped them past Letcombe at home as a second half own goal gifted Bassett a win by the odd goal in three and closed the gap to third place Tytherington to a single point. Purton were then swept aside, with three goals in the final twenty minutes separating the sides to move the team up three places to fourth in a congested promotion battle.

be a matter of time before the dangerous Bennett would showcase his ability in front of goal.

The second half didn't start the way Bassett wanted though, as Mark Edmonds was brought off injured and replaced by Moses Greene with only five minutes gone before Christchurch were awarded a penalty and Quinn sent off. In the 54th minute Steve Yeardley dragged down Billy Puckett just inside the box and Barry awarded a penalty before sending off the ill-disciplined Quinn for swearing at the forward. The luck was with Bassett though, as Puckett, just 16 years of age, dragged the penalty left of the goal. On 75 minutes substitute Craig MacLaren made a much needed tackle to deny Puckett a chance to redeem himself before Jack Dodd replaced Jon Davis, a sub Bassett could have done with, considering what would happen with ten minutes left. After parrying a Matt Czastka corner, Haines ran to try collect the ball but heard something tear in his knee forcing Yeardley to take over between the sticks. Yeardley dealt with his first action in goal comfortably, saving from Czastka. Bassett then began pressurising the Christchurch defence with MacLaren heading just over before Bennett struck with a 20-yard volley past the outstretched arms of Gareth Barfoot, forcing extra time.

It took a valiant defensive effort from Bassett to keep Christchurch from stealing a win – solid tackles from Gee, MacLaren, Tom Messenger and even Yeardley ended good chances for the Dorset side. Simon Atkins forced a comfortable save from Yeardley in the first period before Martin Lawrence shot wide. Bassett dodged a bomb with four minutes to go when a corner from the right fell to Tom Hughes ten yards out and with an open goal in front of him. His powerful effort looked destined to go in but bounced back out off the bar and was cleared to force a replay on Tuesday night."

Sadly, such a display could not be reproduced in the replay, which saw the Dorset side win by a solitary goal scored early in the match and Yeardley sent off for an alleged stamp on an opposing player midway through the second period. The game though saw Paul Hawkins make his debut between the sticks, and until Haines' return in February, he held the fort admirably and was arguably the unheralded hero of the season. Bassett redeemed themselves with a much needed league win days later, with Hemsley providing the only goal of what was a one-sided derby at The Red House against Purton. The home side's blushes were spared by an outstanding display from Swindon Town legend Fraser Digby, who donned the gloves in order to play alongside his son, Josh. There was to be another drop in form though as October became November. Penalties were needed to see off Cirencester United in the Challenge Cup, before Bassett scraped a victory at home to lowly Ross Town by the odd goal in three. Three consecutive defeats followed, but luckily only one of them came in the league – a home defeat to Cirencester, which sandwiched a convincing County Cup loss to Corsham Town, and a drubbing against Winterbourne in the Challenge Cup.

crowd, Bassett took a point as another Hemsley goal was cancelled out by a second half penalty for the visitors. Once again though, the Jekyll-and-Hyde start to the season continued with a woeful display away to Old Woodstock Town resulting in a 1-0 reverse and another headache for Burke as forward Moses Greene receiving a red card for an elbow just a quarter of an hour after he had been introduced into the game.

The side bounced back from that defeat to record two tricky league wins on the spin. Firstly, an inspired performance from Haines limited Tytherington Rocks, who boasted the freescoring Jimmy Potts amongst their ranks, to a single goal as Bassett recorded a 2-1 victory. Goals for the home side that day came from Yeardley – unsurprisingly from the penalty spot – and Greene either side of the break. A trip to Hook Norton meant the games were not getting any easier, but a workmanlike performance and strikes from Tucker and youngster Mark King, who provided a fine, solo finish, ensured a 2-0 win. Another local derby was next, this time at home to Malmesbury Victoria, and once again Bassett failed to come up trumps against one of their nearest neighbours as a first half Tom Messenger strike was cancelled out early in the second half. That point was very nearly lost, but in the final stages a superb save from Haines spared the hosts' blushes. This result left Bassett with just eleven points from their first eight games, putting them a fair distance off the early pacesetters.

The next month saw Bassett play just one league game as the cup fixtures came thick and fast. Despite a solid performance, there was to be an early exit in the Floodlit Cup as Hellenic Premier side Slimbridge defeated their visitors 2-0. Next up was the FA Vase, and a daunting tie at home to Wessex League Christchurch. In an epic Rylands Way cup contest – something the Paul Burke-era would become synonymous with, Bassett survived going down to an early goal and losing 'keeper Haines to a serious injury to force a replay in a match which also saw two red cards and a missed penalty for the visitors. Stuart Smedley reported on the club website:

"With Christchurch leading 1-0 in the dying seconds, and with 'keeper John Haines in an ambulance on his way to hospital with a knee injury, a rasping effort from Matty Bennett levelled the scores and ultimately forced a replay as Bassett's grit and determination showed in an epic FA Vase 2nd Qualifying Round match. It was a game that had it all – two red cards, a missed penalty and a brilliant display for 40 minutes by a 9-man Bassett side.

However, the day didn't start well with Dave Roberts heading in from eight yards to give Christchurch the lead in the 10th minute. Dwayne Quinn was booked in the 21st minute for a rugby tackle, saving Bassett from going two down before an elbow on Richard Gee from Christchurch captain Chris Swan produced the first red card of the day, Bert Barry having no option but to dismiss Swan. On 34 minutes Haines made one of the saves of the season, using his legs to deny Roberts a second after Lewis Till had gotten in behind the Bassett defence and squared for the unmarked Roberts. Wessex League Christchurch were looking nervy with 10-men and it only looked to

What was going on in the world

On the eve of the season the IRA announces it is officially ending its violent campaign for a united Ireland and will instead pursue its goals politically. As the season comes to its climax France is hit by a series of student riots that lead President Jacques Chirac to repeal new labour laws. James Blunt is top of the charts as the season commences and the season ends with the best selling single of 2006 at the top in the form of the aptly name Crazy by Gnarls Barkley. The top film in the cinema during the season is Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire. Liverpool win the FA Cup final on penalties after a six goal thriller with West Ham. Jose Mourinho's Chelsea win the Premier League some eight points ahead of Manchester United. There is success in Europe for Middlesbrough, who reach the UEFA Cup final where they lose to Seville. Swindon Town finish second bottom in the third tier of English football and are relegated to what is now Coca Cola Division Two. In the summer's World Cup in Germany, England get knocked out by Portugal on penalties in the quarter finals, while Italy ultimately triumph, beating France in a final famous for Zinedine Zidane's headbutt.

2005 was the year that bouncebackability – a term coined by Iain Dowie during his days as Crystal Palace boss – found its way dictionary. And in the season that began in that year, Wootton Bassett Town embodied the essence of the freshly formulated noun as they sought promotion straight back into the Hellenic Premier Division.

The summer began with the promotion of Paul Burke from reserve team manager to that of the first team, bringing trusted assistant Bryan Wood along with him. Often in non-league football, changes at the top can lead to mass exodus of players, but by promoting from within, Bassett were able to avoid this, ensuring the young, talented nucleus of the squad built by predecessor Pete Yeardley remained. The likes of Steve Yeardley, Ben Gascoyne, Matty Bennett, Steve Bunting and Rich Gee certainly proved their worth in Bassett's first season back at step six, but it was to be two goalkeepers - John Haines and Paul Hawkins - who made the most telling impression in an exciting, yet ultimately heartbreaking season.

The year began in a less than ominous fashion though as Bassett came away with nothing on a glorious summer afternoon away to Headington Amateurs. The script of the match bore a striking resemblance to how game after game had turned out for Bassett a year prior: it was lost by a single goal, there were numerous chances that went begging and - to confound matters - new signing Steve Tucker was dismissed for violent conduct. However, Bassett's home opener turned out much differently. 3-1 down on the hour mark to Winterbourne United, midfielder Stuart Hemsley turned the game on its head, scoring two near-identical goals from long Chris Mills throw-ins, before a thumping effort from defender Lee Marshall won the game deep into injury time. However, little momentum was taken from the win, and in the weekend's game at Pewsey Vale – played in a front of a bumper crowd as part of the Ground Hop weekend - Burke's side fell 2-1 to their Wiltshire rivals, Hemsley being Bassett's lone protagonist. Another county rival - this time Trowbridge Town - were the next to visit Rylands Way, and in another entertaining game played in front of a healthy home



Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the champion-ship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.



Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away. Last season Bassett were managed by Jeff Roberts. Despite assembling a skilful side on paper and paying players for the first time, the side ended the season in 14th place and with a poor discipline record. Ahead of the move into a new ground at Ballards Ash the Club again has a new manager with former Fairford Town manager Paul Braithwaite taking over the management duties.

While they will be slightly disappointed not to have taken all three points. Wootton Bassett Town will feel a sense of satisfaction with the point earned in a 2-2 draw against high-flying Thame United.

Goals from Joe Hiscock and Nathan Gambling earned Bassett that point. which moves the team back up to 13th, with games still in hand over Holyport and Milton United, the two teams immediately below in the table

It was a match going into which Paul Braithwaite's charges were underdogs. Bassett have not had much success this season against the teams currently occupying the upper half of the Hellenic League Premier Division, having amassed just five points against those sides headed into this clash. 





On the Edge - The View of a Former Leading Referee

After 50years of being active within the game of football either as a referee or as an assessor at the high echelons of football and to now be on the other side of the fence either standing on the terraces or sitting quietly in the stand, one is bound to get a different perception of the game but this comes from the vociferous fans and not what I perceive of the game myself. I am amazed (or should I be) at the ignorance shown by the public in response to the on-field action, but then I am reminded they pay their entrance fee so they are free to voice their opinions. Who can argue with that, certainly not me, but I can argue with the true facts relating to Law when fans are showing their feelings unfairly at the referee, his assistants and indeed me. Being known at local level I have often had an accusing finger pointed in my direction with such comments like 'your mate(referee) is having a nightmare 'or' does your mate know the Laws of the Game' but of course said in a more blunt manner. 'Are you sure ref followed by 'get a grip ref are common insults heard not only by the fans but also the 'dug-outs' and I have to say nine out of ten times the referee has seen to be correct. I am sure if fans digested the Laws of football and to the rights and wrongs they would be amazed if not confused. I am not putting blame solely on the fans as there has been an occasion when I quietly have to agree with the disenchantment shown by them and players alike and perhaps it may be a worthwhile exercise for referees also to freshen up their knowledge and minds and browse

In saying all this I suppose it's what makes the game so interesting and something to enlighten a Saturday night in the local pub or club with different opinions voiced unfortunately the issues of dispute always puts the referee at the centre of attention, blaming them, but never the players or the opinions of the fans. Recently I was challenged by a senior committee man of a respected club playing at a high level of football, blaming the referee for a situation that for me was laughable, when I heard the full story, but he was serious. Two players clashed, one from each side, who had to leave the field of play due to injuries incurred, the opposition player recovered quicker than his counterpart and was allowed back into the action at the first opportunity. The mentioned committee member questioned this by saying in the name of fairness; the referee was wrong in allowing this as both players should come back into the game together. So all I could say to him was if your players injury was to take 10 minutes should the opposition player have to wait that long? You have guessed right the answer was yes. Word's from me in answer to that are unprintable.

I have to say it's not all 'doom and gloom' involving the fans as on occasions I have to agree with their sentiments. One particular fan approached me in a sensible manner and said 'why should a defender be sent off for a deliberate hand ball to prevent an obvious goal scoring opportunity when a forward can try and undermine the referees integrity by deliberately hoping to score a goal with his hand/arm and not receive the same punishment. Of course he was referring to the recent Hull City v Newcastle game on 31st January when this act to deceive was clearly seen and the culprit was amazed when it was disallowed. It is simply a cautionable offence for handball in accordance with the Laws of the Game but I could see where the fan was coming from. It was muted to me by a spectator the insignificant value of the yellow card when to follow in the footsteps of the Rugby world and send the player to the 'sin bin' for ten minutes would be a better deterrent. As much as I do not agree with other sports disciplines I do agree with this idea and I am sure less yellow cards would be shown with players realising the cost to their team. Life is never dull when football becomes the topic of conversation and long may it last.
