Welcome to Ardley United

A warm welcome to our visitors from Ardley United who have travelled from Oxfordshire for this evening's UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division clash.

Ardley United are currently 6th in the table, with 62 points from their 33 league games. 20 games have been won, 2 draws and they have suffered 11 defeats. Realistically Ardley are now just challenging Binfield for 5th place in the table. By their own high standards not achieving a 5th placed finish is likely to be a disappointment as Ardley have finished in the top 5 for the last 4 consecutive seasons.

In the corresponding fixture at Ardley earlier in the season we went down 1-2 to a late winner in controversial circumstances. A dubious late penalty award gave Ardley the points. We will certainly be looking for revenge for that disappointing defeat here at the Corinium tonight but this will be another tough game where we will need to be at our best to get anything out of the match.

Senior Section Presentation Night

The Senior Section Presentation evening will be held on Friday 8th May at the Sports Association Clubhouse, Rylands Way. Those attending should arrive at 7.30pm, with the presentation due to start at 8pm. End of season awards will be presented for the First, Reserve, Development and Ladies teams.

Fixture Changes

The UHlsport Hellenic League has made a couple of changes to our remaining fixtures. The game against an inform Brimscombe & Thrupp will now take place on Easter Monday, 3.00pm kick-off. The final game of the season against Flackwell Heath has also been moved, this time to the evening of Wednesday 15th April.

Reserves

The Reserves have lost 6 points and a 10-0 record from the league table as a result of Cheltenham Saracens Reserves dropping out of the league. Unfortunately this has led to a fall in a few league table

places for the Reserves and yet another disappointment of the current Hellenic Reserve divisions. Teams seem to pull out late on in the season every season. I know the Committee have given much thought what we do next season with the Reserves and the Wiltshire County League certainly looks the better option, not only due to the problems highlighted by Cheltenham's demise, but also due to the fact that you get 3 officials appointed by the league. At last the desperate run is over. After 16 consecutive defeats the Development Side won 3-2 away at Vale of Pewsey.

Youth Section

Wootton Bassett Town will have two representatives in North Wilts League Cup finals after the Under 12 and 15 Blue teams triumphed in their semi-finals.

Against Kings Stanley the Under 15 Blue side prevailed 3-2 in a nail-biting contest. Callum Bridges led the way with a brace, while Oliver Sinclair chipped in with a vital goal.

They will now take on double chasing Wroughton Youth in the showpiece after they saw off Old Town United 3-1. Another close encounter should be in the offing. As with semi-final opponents Kings Stanley, Bassett have split their league games against Wroughton this season, each team recording a 2-0 victory.

The Under 12 Blues booked their final place in more routine fashion as they defeated FC Chippenham 3-0. However, they were made to wait to get the goals. Following a goalless opening period, Bassett perked up, finding the back of the net through Oliver Case, Jack Holder and Billy Saunders.

Awaiting Bassett in the final are title favourites Greenmeadow Youth, who defeated Croft Juniors Red on penalties after neither side was able to find the net in either normal or extra time.

Congratulations to both teams and here's hoping there will be some silverware to celebrate on cup final weekend!

Having to put up with all Stuart's doom and gloom about needing x number of points to avoid relegation a few weeks back as you know I decided to play Mystic Meg to see what our prospects were looking like for the end of the season. Whilst I was confident that we would be safe I was still mindful that we could also actually achieve our highest ever position in the Hellenic Premier League. Yes if we finish 12th in the table we would equal our best ever position, finish 11th and it would be our best ever season in the Hellenic League.

Predicting the outcome of the games involving the bottom 9 sides in the division from here until the end of the season low and behold I had us finishing in 11th place.

After a few weeks what is clear is how unpredictable the Uhlsport Hellenic League is. To date I have only managed to get the outcome right in 17 of the 34 games played (a success rate of just 50%)! Opponents - History

Ardley United • Club History

Ardley United formed in 1945 just as the Second World War was ending. From humble beginnings playing mainly in the Lord Jersey Football League, the club has progressed through the Oxfordshire Senior League to Step 5 of the football pyramid in The Hellenic Football League. Under the generous patronage of the Chairman, Norman Stacey, Ardley have flourished since gaining Hellenic League status. Proudly providing one of the finest playing surfaces at this level, plus excellent off pitch facilities for both players and supporters. Added to that the club has earned a reputation for being one of the most hospitable clubs to visit.



In the last 25 years Ardley have won the Oxfordshire Senior League Division One title on three occasions as well as the Junior Shield, also on three occasions. Apart from a barren period between 1973 and 1983 the club has won trophies almost every season throughout it's history. The club were in the "old" Division One of The Hellenic League for six years, winning the league in consecutive seasons 1996/7 and 1997/8.

Also winners of the Division One Cup for four consecutive seasons between 1994/5 and 1997/8, a record of achievement never previously attained and unlikely to be surpassed with the introduction of the combined Premier and Division One Challenge Cup competition. 1997/8 also saw the Ardley Reserve side as Champions of their league, and promotion to Division One of the Reserves section. League restructuring, and facility, requirements towards the end of the 1990's saw Ardley in the new "First Division".

The club worked hard to improve the facilities, which was rewarded with promotion to the Hellenic Premier League in season 2003/4. The following year the club was rewarded for it's achievements being awarded the Hungerford Cup for the greatest improvement in facilities and playing. Further accolade came in the same season on being awarded the Non League Paper's "National Game Award" for the most improved facilities. Season 2006/7 proved to be one of the best in the club's history finishing third in the Premier Division and also winning the Supplementary Cup. Season 2007/8 provided mixed fortunes, the League position was not as great as recent previous seasons, but further success in Cup competition was rewarded with finalist places in both the Floodlit Cup and Supplementary Cup. The Supplementary Cup Final was the last game in charge for manager Dan Still who had guided the team to three seasons of success.

Following Still's departure, the manager's hotseat was filled by Kevin Brock for the start of the 2008/9 season. The ex-Oxford Utd, QPR & Newcastle Utd pro brought his experience as manager of both Oxford City and Banbury Utd to the club and this saw them enter arguably their most successful phase in their history. Achieving league positions of 5th and 7th in his first 2 seasons, Kevin then built a side which would challenge strongly for league honours in each of their next 2 seasons. In addition, the club also won the Bluefin Insurance League Cup in 2009/10 and narrowly lost in the final the following year. The 2013/14 season saw the side register their best league finish as they ended up 2nd having made Wantage Town work hard for their title. By way of consolation they also won the Oxfordshire Senior Cup for the first time by convincingly beating Kidlington 4-0 in the final to realise a long standing dream for their chairman Norman Stacey who has put so much into the club for the past 30 years

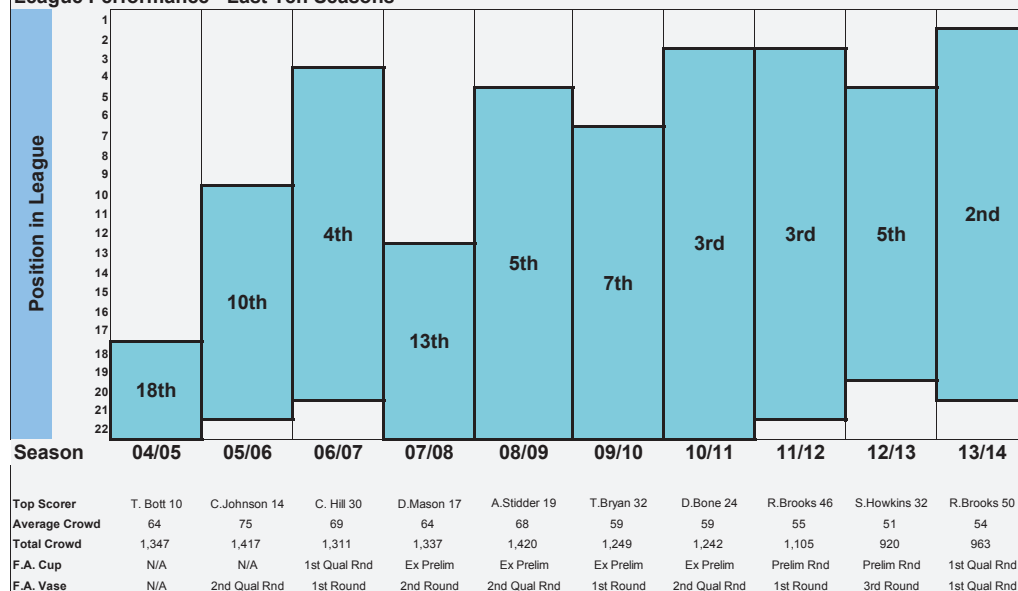

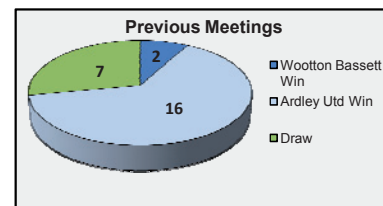
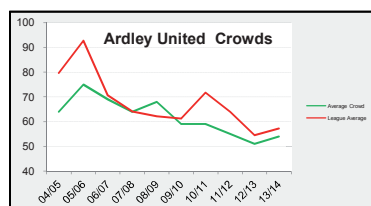

brief lift, but the team's inconsistencies reappeared once more to conclude March as Cheltenham Saracens dished out a 6-0 battering.

That defeat was to be the death knell for Bassett. From the final seven games of the year, a mere seven points were earned. That period began with narrow, yet still extremely disappointing, away defeats to Cirencester (0-1) and Cricklade (2-3). A 1-1 Easter Monday draw at title chasing Trowbridge, thanks to an equaliser from youngster Marcus Neal, and a 3-2 win over Banbury offered some consolation. However, defeats at Lydney (1-2) and in the return fixture against Trowbridge (1-3) as well as on the final day at Hook Norton (0-3) meant the season finished with a whimper. Amongst those defeats, Bassett cruised to a 4-0 win over Clanfield in the penultimate game of the year, but this was scant consolation in a season where another push for promotion, rather than a fall into mid-table mediocrity, was anticipated.

Late penalty puts Bassett in a spot of bother

Corinium Stadium, 2nd November 2013

For the second consecutive week Wootton Bassett Town looked set to claim a point from one of the Hellenic League Premier Division's top three teams only for their hopes to be dashed by a late, controversial winner. This time it was Ardley who claimed the spoils, their 78th minute penalty sealing victory by the odd goal in three.

As gut-wrenching as the defeat was following a commendable performance in difficult conditions, Bassett's sense of frustration will be exacerbated by the fact other results mean they now stand just two points above the bottom four.

Defending against an extremely strong wind in the opening period, Jeff Roberts' team defended stoutly. And although they trailed at the break, it can be seen to be an achievement that Ardley - who boast one of the division's most prolific attacks - had been limited to just the one goal.

That came in the 19th minute. It took a fine tip over the bar from Steve Allison (*pictured below in action at Highmoor Ibis*) - forced to adjust his body quickly as the ball's path was altered by the wind - to divert Dean Smith's right wing cross following a neat one-two with Troy Bryan. Yet from the resulting corner the 'keeper was let down by his teammates' frailties at set pieces.



At the near post Ryan Brooks provided a sublime Ibrahimovic-esque flick to Darren Beckett's low corner, which found the bar and Ben Thomas was quickest to react to the rebound, heading in from ten yards.

Chances remained few and far between as Ardley, enjoying the lion's share of possession, probed forward only to be knocked back by a solid Bassett backline.

A further opening did eventually come a minute before the break, and it should have led to the second goal of the game. Bassett's defence froze as a goal kick was headed on, allowing Brooks a free run at Allison. But despite being presented with what appeared to be the easiest of one-on-ones, the Ardley forward scuffed his shot straight at the Bassett stopper.

After the restart the home side survived an early scare when a Beckett free kick fell for Bryan, whose side foot volley was blocked and scrambled wide.

Thereafter, with the wind now blustering behind Bassett, play switched to the other end. But as much as Bassett looked to create chances, they were frequently let down by a forced pass, such as the eagerness to get on level terms.



They were eventually able to do so though midway through the period and were aided in part by the elements. Jack Harding's goal kick caught the wind, travelling just thirty or so yards and Bassett pressure forced Ardley backwards. The ball then broke for Ryan Stanners on the left and his square ball played in Tyler Sheppard (*pictured above*) on the opposite wing, and he beat his

man before emphatically firing past Harding.

Buoyed by this, Bassett continued to press. With quarter of an hour to go a Kyle Rigley free kick bounced around the box before falling for Jordan Roberts, whose shot on the turn from a tight angle was deflected wide.

But three minutes later, the hosts' hopes were burst. From deep on the left wing, Tommy Kinch delivered a free kick into the box, which Brooks controlled. With Brooks having gained half a yard, his marker Craig Bowden gave him a slight nudge in the back that sent the forward sprawling.

It was a soft, borderline penalty, which Steve Howkins coolly dispatched to seal the points and inflict more late pain on Bassett.

Man of the Match: Sam Packer - moved inside to centre midfield for this game, Packer produced one of his best performances so far this season, winning a number of challenges and linking up well with those around him.



Rating: 6/10 - though Bassett's play at times caused them problems given the conditions - especially in the first half, they performed well, limiting Ardley to a handful of chances. Defending from set pieces again let them down, but losing late on was a cruel blow on an afternoon when they arguably did enough to gain a point.

Tytherington failed to clear and the ball fell to Stu Hemsley who struck home easily from ten yards. Dwayne Quinn came close to adding a third just before the break but his glancing header at the far post was headed off the line.

Tytherington stormed out of the blocks in the second period and could have been level even before they had a one man advantage. Four minutes after the restart Richard Evans forced a brilliant point blank save from James Domm, who did well to turn the powerful eight yard effort around the post. From the resulting corner an unmarked Phil Ward headed over from six yards as Bassett were let off the hook. Andy Hallett was cautioned in the 58th minute, two minutes before Bunting's dangerous challenge saw Bassett go a man down. The challenge was hard but not reckless but incited a melee which saw an injured Bunting, who had suffered a broken leg, stamped on by Ward. He received only a yellow though; John Davis was also booked for his part in the events. In the closing stages Paul Burke went with one up front to protect the lead with only ten men.

The lead though was halved on 70 minutes when an unmarked Ward easily headed home a Mark Totterdell corner to ignite an action packed final few minutes. Another Totterdell corner was connected with by Evans but the ball sailed across the face of goal before Quinn did well to deflect a Ward shot over after another set piece. Totterdell continued to find himself heavily involved in the action: after seeing his shot deflected just wide his 81st minute corner was knocked around the area before Evans directed it goalwards only to see Large clear off the line. Substitute Danny Heath almost wrapped the points up after Magani led a quick counter attack but after the forward's through ball sent him clear, Heath placed his effort the wrong side of the post. Peter Holbrook saw two of his efforts go wide, one with help of a deflection before a low effort from Totterdell beat Domm, but Large was there to divert the ball around the post once more. The action didn't stop though as Deans saw a glancing header go just wide.

In the final minute Potts beat the offside trap for once and went down easily after Steve Yeardley had put him under pressure and referee Commander rightly waved play on to preserve a much needed and much deserved three points".

A 5-1 demolition job of Purton closed out the year on a high, placing Bassett eleventh but within touching distance of third place Hook Norton, provided games in hand were won. And although the team was eliminated from the County and Challenge Cups to begin 2007, a Steve Shaw brace ensured the league winning streak continued in a 2-0 triumph at Clanfield. A fortunate point was scraped in a 2-2 away draw with Winterbourne, but the unbeaten streak was then curtailed at Old Woodstock (1-2). Success at Letcombe (2-1) followed, but Pewsey - ever the team to play spoiler, prevailed 2-1 at Rylands Way to temper any new-found optimism. Convincing wins against Ross Town (4-0) and Cricklade Town (3-1) provided a

top fell to Bunting but his long range effort was saved well. Halski almost added a fourth after taking on Gee but Haines managed to tip the low shot wide.”

Something of a resurgence followed cup elimination as two Yeardley penalties and a Bennett strike earned a comfortable 3-0 win over Purton at The Red House before a home draw with Easington Sports (1-1) and by a single score victory against Letcombe courtesy of Chris Mills. Confidence continued to grow with a tricky 4-2 victory in the County Cup over County League side New College and the narrowest of defeats to Hellenic Premier Shrivenham by the odd goal in three in the Floodlit Cup. However, a miserable display in the return fixture against Easington saw Bassett crash to a 4-2 loss, with the damage being done in the opening ten minutes as the home side struck twice in quick succession. The defeat meant Bassett were all the way down in eleventh, eight points off the top three with no games in hand. A Hall goal with under ten seconds gone helped to erase the result from the memories though as reigning champions Winterbourne United were turned over by the same score at Rylands Way. Two high scoring cup victories came next, with Headington being beaten 4-2 in the Challenge Cup before Calne Town were beaten 5-3 on penalties in the County Cup after the two sides could not be separated after a wonderful 120 minutes of football ended 3-3 at Bremhill View.

Yet again, Bassett came crashing back to earth with a 4-0 reverse at the hands of Pewsey Vale. There was yet more misery and frustration as Old Woodstock snatched a win by the odd goal in five. A late Bennett equaliser snatched a point in a high-scoring derby affair at Malmesbury, but the side's poor home form continued against high-flying Lydney Town (1-2) a week later.

Two wins over Christmas, though, offered hope of another late season reawakening – despite Bassett going into the festive period in twelfth, beginning with a marvellous win over Tytherington Rocks in a full-blooded affair that aptly took place on Boxing Day:

“The Christmas period started brilliantly for Wootton Bassett Town, despite seeing Steve Bunting receive a red card on the hour mark, as two first half goals from unlikely sources earned a deserved 2-1 victory away at Tytherington Rocks.

After being reduced to ten men, Bassett rode their luck for the final thirty minutes as at least three Tytherington shots were cleared off the line but the better team won as a dominant opening 45 minutes was enough to ensure victory. The league's top scorer Jimmy Potts was neutralised all game by the Bassett defence as Quinn played him especially well, much to the forward's displeasure.

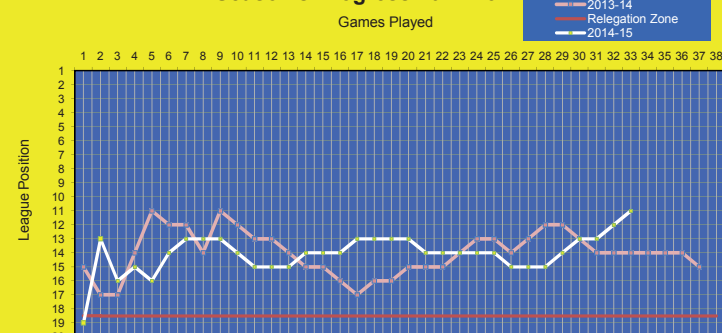
Two minutes in Scott Large struck just wide after good work by John Magani opened up a good opportunity for the youngster. After quarter of an hour the two combined to give Bassett the lead. Magani rolled his marker down the left before Large powerfully headed home the forwards' cross from 10 yards for his first ever Bassett goal. Eight minutes later Magani was the creator once more for Bassett's second. The tricky forward turned his way past two defenders before crossing in from the right.

replay, which although extremely entertaining, ultimately proved fruitless as the club remained starved of success in national competitions:

“For the fifth consecutive season, Wootton Bassett Town failed to progress in the FA Vase thanks to Jesse Walters 109th minute strike after another riveting tie against Shrewton United. Saturday's initial tie produced numerous chances but only two goals. The replay was the same concerning the number of chances both sides had but there were goals aplenty as Shrewton took the game by the odd goal in five.

The first three chances of the game all added names to the score sheet. Two minutes in a low Ben Halski free kick from just outside the box found the bottom left corner after referee Ian Trueman awarded the visitors a dubious free kick. Gavin Cooley doubled the lead on nine minutes when his troublesome cross from the right looped into the top corner after Bassett 'keeper John Haines lost the ball in the lights following Walters' defence-splitting pass. In the 18th minute Shrewton failed to clear Nathan Hall's corner and Matty Bennett redirected the ball into the box where Chris Mills provided a neat back heel and flicked the ball into the back of the net. Mills had the chance to add a second in the 25th minute but he headed a Dwayne Quinn cross straight at Adam Burwell. The backend of the first half produced a flurry of yellow cards, whilst six minutes before the break, great work down the flank from Walters allowed Martin Gowing a shot on goal but he fired wide from just outside the box.

Walters continued causing all kinds of trouble in the second period – on 53 minutes Haines did well to parry away his shot from a tight angle. From Cooley's corner Haines fumbled and was thankful Robin Gorham's shot was cleared off the line. Scott Large replaced Quinn in the 55th minute before a low Mills corner was connected with by Rich Gee's diving header but this was cleared off the line. Steve Yeardley got the equaliser in the 59th minute, firmly heading home from Nathan Hall's cross from ten yards. Tempers continued to flare as Andy Hallett was booked on 73 minutes for a late challenge. Then with three minutes to go a bad foul on Paul Crabtree incited a mini melee in which Yeardley was booked for trying to break it up. Walters almost won the visitors the game in injury time when he caught Haines off his line but his shot from a tight angle found the side netting after he was put under immediate pressure.

The first period of extra time saw only one clear cut chance, which fell to the home side in the 100th minute. Bunting's long throw was flicked on by Tom Messenger at the front post and Mills was able to get a foot to the ball but his effort looped just over.

Walters 109th minute strike proved to be the winner as his 20-yard first time effort went in under Haines after Bassett had been caught on the break. With two minutes remaining and Bassett frantically searching for an equaliser, a long Gee ball over the



The season starts and ends with Shakira at number one with Hips Don't Lie, featuring Wyclef Jean, and Beautiful Liar, a duet with Beyonce. Manchester United win the Premier League from Chelsea but the Blues get their revenge in the FA Cup defeating United 1-0 in the final. Chelsea also win the League Cup. AC Milan win the Champions League defeating Liverpool 2-1 in the final. Swindon Town are promoted back to the third tier of English football after finishing third behind Walsall and Hartlepool United.

Already used to the feelings of frustration after seeing his side miss out on promotion in the penultimate game of his first year in charge, manager Paul Burke became increasingly acquainted with such sentiments during the 2006-07 season. However, this was not to be because Wootton Bassett Town yet again came within touching distance of a return to the Hellenic Premier Division. Instead, the source of disappointment was that his side – little changed from the previous year, with Ben Gascoyne, who moved up two divisions to join Southern League outfit Cinderford Town, being the only departure of any note - were consistently inconsistent during a disappointing year when hopes were high.

Proceedings started well enough, with a 5-1 thumping being delivered to hapless Ross Town thanks to an own goal and four different Bassett scorers. Yet, signs of what were to come were evident following a topsy-turvy spell that began with a below-par single goal defeat at home against Tytherington Rocks. A John Magani brace and a further strike from team talisman Matty Bennett ensured a brief return to winning ways, as Cirencester United were seen off by the odd goal in five. But this was followed with a midweek trip to Banbury United Reserves that resulted in an embarrassing 5-3 reverse, making an already lengthy return trip that much longer for a perplexed manager. A 2-0 home loss to Hook Norton followed, meaning Bassett had lost the same number of league games at Rylands Way as they had done in the previous season (two) and it was not yet the end of August! Two days later, in a Bank Holiday derby encounter with Malmesbury Victoria, victory seemed assured thanks to a Mark King goal, but a 90th minute equaliser meant the points were to be shared. September began with a nondescript 1-0 home win over Cheltenham Saracens before a trip to Western League side Shrewton United beckoned in the FA Vase. This may have been a welcome distraction from a sputtering league campaign, but without a win in the competition since the club's Vase debut in 2001, expectations were not overly high. But a Steve Yeardley penalty on the stroke of half time earned a replay after a pulsating 120 minutes of cup football. However, in front of a healthy Rylands Way crowd, Bassett could not deliver in the

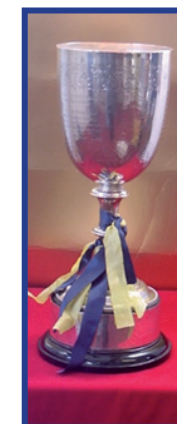

WBTFC History On One Page

Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away. Last season Bassett were managed by Jeff Roberts. Despite assembling a skilful side on paper and paying players for the first time, the side ended the season in 14th place and with a poor discipline record. Ahead of the move into a new ground at Ballards Ash the Club again has a new manager with former Fairford Town manager Paul Braithwaite taking over the management duties.

PREMIER LEAGUE star Wayne Rooney has been splashed across the front pages recently for his unsuccessful, and perhaps unintended, switch to boxing.

The Manchester United forward was seemingly knocked out by former team-mate Phil Bardsley while sparring in his own kitchen, but Rooney is not the first sportsman to switch sports.

Of course, Non-League football is primarily semi-professional so many players have other jobs, but that doesn't stop them dabbling in other sports too.

My colleague Stuart Hammonds recently visited Lord's to catch up with his ex-Sutton United and Bracknell Town team-mate Jon Palmer.

Palmer has since jetted off to South and Central America as captain of an MCC side for a trip that includes a six-day training camp in Suriname, before flying to Panama to compete in the Central America Cricket Championships – a £20 tournament first held in 2006.

The 37-year-old has recently been seen on a football field playing for Badshot Lea, and now he splits his year between the Combined Counties League side and Churt CC.

Palmer said: "It's a real privilege to captain the side. While I was getting paid to play semi-pro, football always took priority and limited me to four or five matches for Churt.

"This season I was captain so played more cricket. The guys at

Badshot have really taken me in though, and I'm enjoying it."

Palmer isn't the only man to swap goalposts for stumps, and vice versa, in recent times. England Ashes winner Steve Harmison took over as manager of Ashington FC earlier this year after hanging up his spikes after the 2013 cricket season.

Meanwhile, Joe Gating is regularly seen turning out for Peacehaven & Telscombe in the Ryman League while donning his whites in the summer for Hampshire. Gating was on the books at Brighton & Hove Albion before being released in 2008, and his batting average of over 27 shows that he's no mug with willow in hand.

Sticking with cricket, South Africa's captain AB de Villiers seemed to excel in any sport he participated in. He was shortlisted for South Africa's junior national hockey and football team, while being the captain of the country's junior rugby side.

Even now, he still holds six South African school swimming records while also holding the record for the 100m dash in South Africa's junior athletics. He was good with racquet in hand too, being a member of South Africa's junior Davis Cup tennis team, and he was South Africa's U19 national badminton champion.

The golf course has often proved a popular haven with footballers once they have hung up their boots too. Former Crawley, Oxford United and Oxford City forward Jamie Cook joined the PGA tour last summer, while ex-West Ham captain Julian Dicks turned pro after a brief stint playing in the Ryman Premier for Canvey Island in 2001-02, but was forced to retire due to his dodgy knee and then turned his hand to management with Wivenhoe Town and Grays Athletic.

Perhaps the best – or we could say worst – example is former Chelsea and AC Milan striker Andriy Shevchenko, who ended 40 shots adrift on his pro golf debut in 2013.

So while some are born with an abundance of talent, it seems others are destined for just one sport. They just need to make sure they choose wisely!

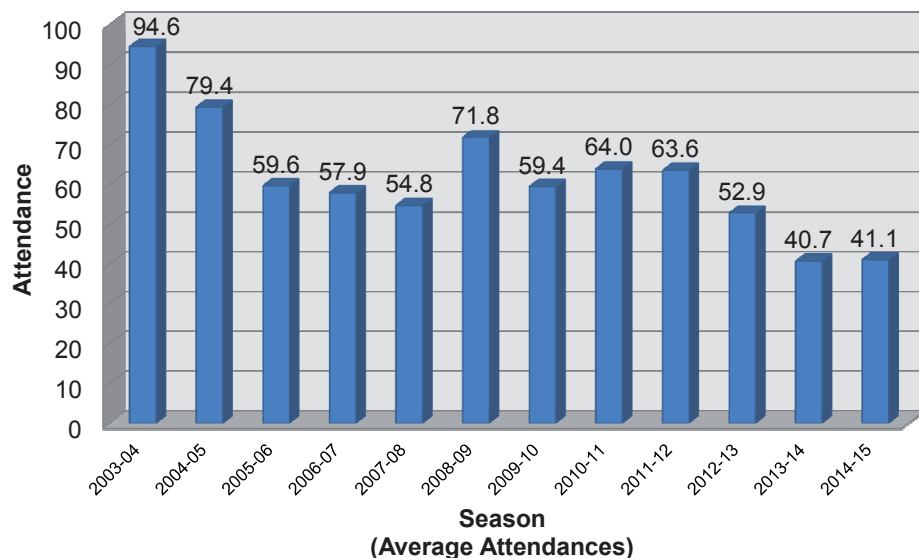

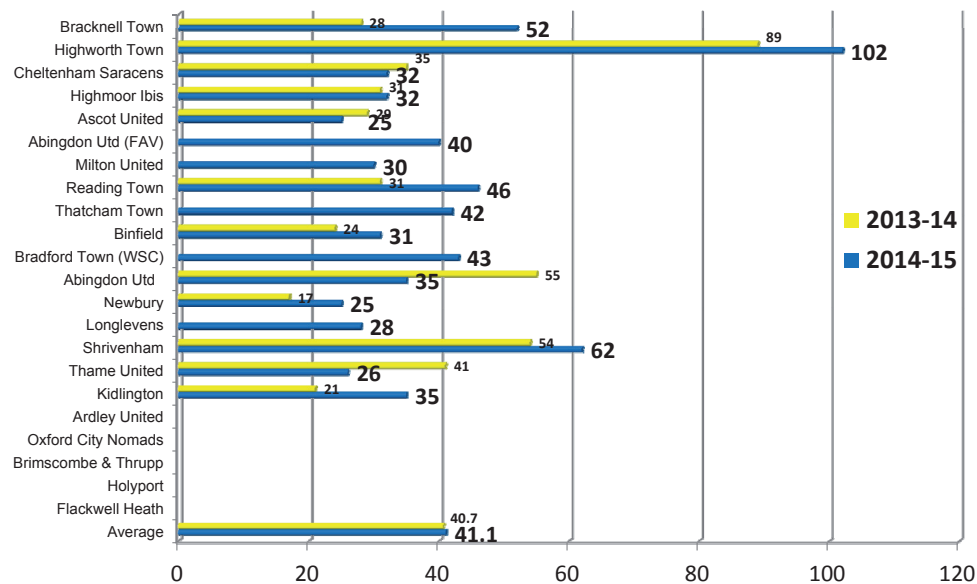

Five star Bassett give Highworth a hiding

The Elms, 17th March 2015

Nathan Gambling scored a second half hat-trick as a rampant team display delivered Wootton Bassett Town an emphatic 5-1 derby victory over Highworth Town.

Thirteen years had passed since Bassett last tasted victory at The Elms, and this victory was made even sweeter as the three points lifted the team into eleventh, above Oxford City Nomads. And with five games – all at home – now remaining in this season, there's a great opportunity to ensure a record high finish in the Hellenic League Premier Division.

Highworth, also have their eyes on a record, that being a place at Wembley in the FA Vase final. With the first leg of their semi-final on Saturday, it was therefore little surprise to see John Fisher field a rotated team. It was by no means weak though; the presence of 'keeper Gary Stevens and top scorer TJ Bohane, two of the main heroes of their superb Vase run, in the starting eleven attested to that.

That selection may have been intended to frighten Bassett. But the visitors were in no way cowed and were on their game from the opening whistle.

With less than two minutes on the dock Bassett were ahead. James Skinner played a short free kick from the left wing to Dan Bailey and the midfielder struck a daisycutter from the edge of the area that Stevens got a hand to but failed to keep out.

It should really have been two in the sixth minute when a blocked Callum Wright effort fell to Gambling, who had just the 'keeper to beat. But Stevens redeemed himself and parried away.

In a rather frantic opening, Highworth – whose play was sharp in the final third – carved out two chances. The first saw Darren Smart arrow a low shot from twenty yards just wide of the left post before Bohane rose to head a Liam Edmondson cross onto the bar.

Bassett quickly re-established authority though. Gambling was soon again denied at point blank range by Stevens as he flicked a shot towards goal following a driving run and cross from Dale Richards.

Then just before the half hour an expertly worked move doubled the lead. Steve Yeardley picked up possession on the right and burst inside before playing a pass into Gambling. With this back to goal, the forward steered a neat pass around the corner to strike partner Steve Robertson, who struck firmly into the bottom right corner.

Again the advantage should have been extended further, but once more Stevens kept his side from being dead and buried before the break with a pair of saves at Robertson's feet.

That meant that, although in a commanding position, Bassett were one wobble away from an uncomfortable half time team talk. They duly suffered one, their grievances with Olly Ballinger – who dished out five yellow cards to the visitors as half time approached – serving to distract them from the task in hand.

And Highworth made their pressure count as James Skinner handled from a corner and Bohane sent Kurtis Sharkey the wrong way.

With a handful of players one misstep away from an early shower, it was imperative that Bassett refocused once the whistle to start the second half was blown.

To their credit, they returned to the field sharp and determined to restore their two goal lead.

In fact, a quick-fire double from Gambling made it 4-1 by the hour to effectively decide the outcome.

His first came after a stunning, ruthless counter. Bassett broke decisively from a Highworth corner that failed to beat the first man. Yeardley clipped a diagonal ball for Skinner to race onto. He then threaded a pass through to Gambling, who buried beyond an exposed Gary Eggleton, a half time substitute.

Almost immediately from kick off Highworth conceded possession, and to compound matters for the hosts, Robertson was wrestled to the ground inside the box by Gareth Davies, who received his marching orders. From the spot Gambling coolly stroked home.

With the extra man, Bassett pressed high against a Highworth defence who were forced into frequently giving the ball away. Using this extra possession, the visitors stroked the ball around with further confidence, and numerous attacks could, and perhaps should, have made it five much earlier.

In the end it wasn't until the final kick of the game that Bassett made it a handful of goals for the evening as a poor touch from Eggleton when receiving a backpass was seized upon by Gambling and he completed his hat-trick by slotting in from a tight angle.

Bassett – five games unbeaten in the league – are now rolling. The goal is now to keep that momentum going right until season's end.

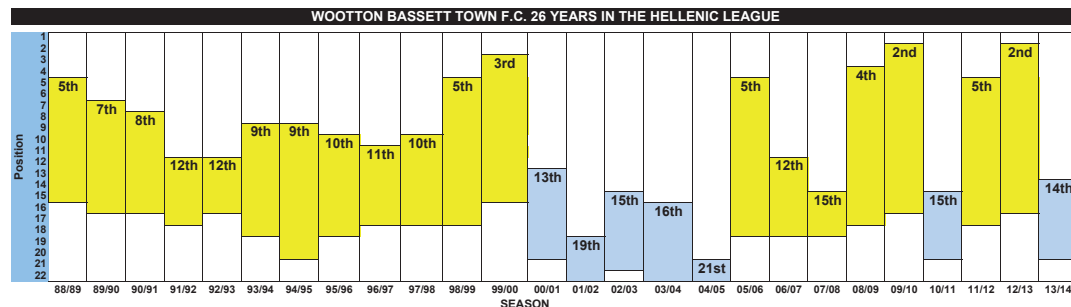

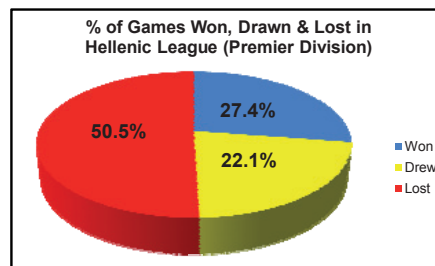
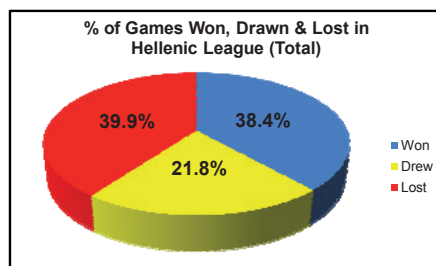

Tribulation At Reading Town
27th March 2015

Reading Town FC players have allegedly come close to "striking" after a row over money with the club's owners.

In a week where manager Stuart Plumridge resigned, it has been said that players were planning to refuse to play against Brimscombe and Thrupp last Saturday after claiming they had not received any expenses since before Christmas. But a late payment from owners, the Battersea and Wandsworth Trade Union Council Trading, appeased the players sufficiently enough and the majority took to the Scours Lane pitch last Saturday. They lost 3-2 but gave a reasonable performance against a strong and in-form visiting side.

Club chairman Kevin Brandstatter has since assured the players they will be paid - but only for legitimate expenses. He revealed that the

BWTUC had originally given the team a weekly budget, but their auditors told them to change the practice, and only pay receipted and signed out-of-pocket expenses, Brandstatter said: "The first claims were received in February and they will be paid a month later following normal BWTUC procedures. To avoid fraudulent claims I was required to check and validate each of them. In a business like ours, it is not possible to receive a claim one day and pay it a day or two later."

He added: "The club do not pay players' wages. If we did then the HMRC would be asking questions, and not just about this season, but previous seasons as well."

Brandstatter said that the club's expenditure each week is between £500 and £600 more than their income and the shortfall is being met by donations from the BWTUC. And he said that will continue for the rest of the season. BWTUC only took over the club last summer, but were shocked by the amount of debts left them by the previous directors. They also faced immediate extra bills of renovating the pitch, along with repairs to the car park outside the ground and floodlights. The GMB (trade union) Southern Region came on board as sponsors, but once again the club struggled to find other backers.

Poor results on the pitch failed to generate extra income through the turnstiles and each home game incurs a loss once the match officials, bar staff and the programme printers have been paid. Club officers have been forced to dig into their own pockets to keep the team going, but the chairman says they will all be reimbursed in time.

The club's CEO Natalie Newby, who works for the BWTUC, has revealed that discussions have even place more than once about closing the club down. However, Brandstatter appears to have calmed the storm by informing Town that the BWTUC will continue to keep the club afloat for the rest of this season and next season as well. But he has warned changes will need to be made in a bid to make them more self sufficient.

The chairman has rarely been seen at Reading's matches in recent weeks, but said he would be attending this Saturday's home fixture with Newbury. Town will be seeking to end a run of six successive defeats, the latest of which came by a 2-0 scoreline away to Oxford City Nomads on Thursday.

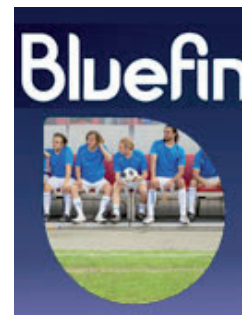

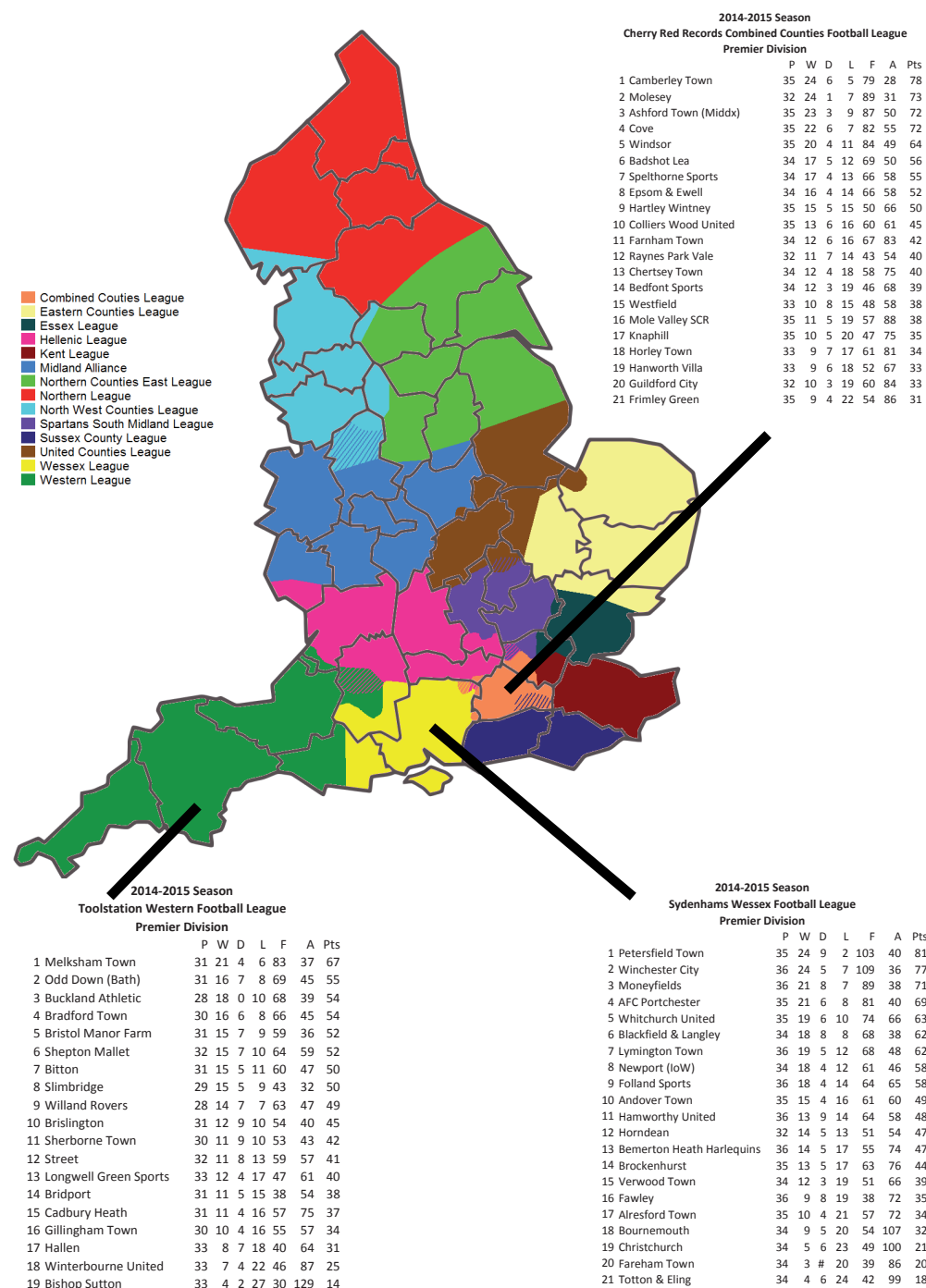
