Editorial & RWBTFC News

Welcome to Cricklade Town

A warm welcome this evening to the players, officials and spectators from Cricklade Town for this Wiltshire Senior Cup tie. We hope all those from Cricklade enjoy their short stay with us today and we wish them a safe journey home.

At the time of writing Cricklade Town are currently second in the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League having won 9 of their opening 12 league fixtures, one game has been drawn and two lost. Those 12 games have yielded 48 goals (average of 4 a game) and includes an impressive 11-0 win over Ludgershall Sports. Ironically one of the two defeats has come at the hands of our Development side, Cricklade losing 4-1 in an evening fixture here at the Gerard Buxton Ground. The other defeat was against current league leader sand defending champions Wroughton. Be under no doubt this is going to be a very tough game and in Devan Bryan and Matty Bennett Cricklade possess two strikers who certainly know where the net is. Both sides feature players who have played for the other side in recent times. In our ranks, Sam Collier and Gio Wrona both played for Cricklade last season helping them finish in 6th place. For Cricklade, as well as Matty Bennett, Lewis Petrie, James Townsend, Dennis Sorrenti and Craig Shand have all played for Bassett. In our Hellenic League era we have played Cricklade Town on 17 occasions, 3 of which have been in this competition. Of those 17 games 8 have been won by Bassett, 3 games were drawn and Cricklade won 6. The 8 wins for Bassett included the 3 games in this competition and we will be hoping for more of the same here tonight. The last two meetings between the two sides both resulted in draws and a tight game can be expected here again tonight as Cricklade look to cause a cup shock by defeating a side that is currently two divisions above them in the pyramid.

Since the last programme we have played 4 times and whilst our brilliant winning streak finally came to an end on Saturday the lads can be proud of their achievement which included some excellent performances. Dealing with each of the four games in turn.

Burnham

We did just about enough in our last home game to defeat a spirited Burnham side. It didn't help that Burnham turned up with an all blue kit and were forced to wear green bibs. Psychologically the bibs gave the impression of a training session and perhaps a bit more effort should have been made to find a spare set of shirts for our opponents to make it seem like a normal game as it could have back fired big style against the bottom side if we had not got the penalty which Dip put away. Three points is three points and it continued our great run, extending the winning run to seven straight games.

Windsor

In contrast to the laboured win on the Saturday, the following Tuesday the whole team put in a tremendous shift to come away with all three points against a very good Windsor side. In a game that was played at a high tempo from start to finish we won 1-0 thanks to a goal from substitute Ben Lodge who got on the end of a Sam Packer cross. Sam had an excellent game and is in a rich vein of form this season. Another having a superb game that night was keeper Dan Lawrence who pulled off three great saves in the first half from the dangerous Windsor strike force which included the former Fulham player Barry Hayles. Dan won my vote for man of the match although it was a night where everyone put in a great shift and it is probably wrong to highlight one or two individuals. I say the Windsor strike force included Barry Hayles, well it did until he picked up his second yellow and was sent off by the referee. Some of those present thought he could have seen red for the first incident and whilst the Windsor home crowd thought the sending-off harsh my view was that the referee got both incidents right. Even though Windsor went down to 10 they kept pushing forward but our defence held firm for yet another clean sheet. Our first league visit to Windsor and what great hospitality we all received on the night, a really nice group of people. I also understand that the burgers on sale were the best tasted at an away game in many a year so one to visit next season if you get the chance.

Clanfield

Now that we have one of the best pitches in the we have probably forgotten that Rylands Way used to be one of the bumpiest pitches in the league, renowned for the "Bassett bobble". Well on the following Saturday it was like going back in time as we visited Clanfield and encountered a very uneven surface that made it hard to play football. This caused a lot of frustration amongst our players as we struggled to create clear cut chances. Resting a few of our players and giving opportunities to others we made hard work of getting through to the next round against Division One West opponents. We were the better side throughout but left it until the 3rd minute of injury time to score the eventual winner. Our prize for this win is a trip to local rivals Fairford Town who we have already knocked out the FA Vase this season. The win on Saturday made it 9 straight wins ahead of a difficult looking trip to an improving Brimscombe & Thrupp side.

It looked difficult on paper beforehand and so it proved as we encountered yet another tricky pitch as well as a team in form. We had also been the wrong side of a number of decisions from the officials, for a while it seemed that only Bassett players were there to be cautioned, and we let all of this get to us and affect our game. We seemed to then spend most of the rest of the game taking our frustration out on the referee and we need to be a bit more savvy with our approach in future. Shouting at the ref is not going to endear him to us and Brimscombe were a lot smarter than us on the day in this respect, as their team committed as many fouls as ours and got away with some blatant time wasting but did not feel the wrath of the officials. Hopefully we have learnt from this and we will be a bit smarter from now on. We should not get too despondent though one defeat in 10 is pretty impressive form and hopefully we can kick on again and start another winning ruin here tonight. A full match report will appear in the next programme.

Then the following Wednesday Kidlington Reserves visit us in the Floodlit Cup before we meet Longlevens here in the league on the following Saturday. Opponents - History v RWBTFC

Cricklade Town

Cricklade Town joined the Wiltshire Football League in the late 1980's. Starting in Division four of the league they gained promotion to Division three after the 1994–95 campaign when they finished third. The 1996–97 season saw the club gain further promotion when they finished as runners-up in Division two, and this was followed by another runners-up spot and promotion the season afterwards, to the newly formed Premier division. At the end of their third season in the Premier division the club were crowned the 2000–01 champions. Despite this league win the club were denied promotion to the Hellenic Football League due to their ground not meeting the required standards of the league. The following season saw the club finish bottom of the division but they were spared relegation. Two seasons later at the end of the 2004–05 campaign the club finished third, and were promoted to the Hellenic Football League as their application to join the league was successful this time and in Season 2005-06 they played their first season in the Hellenic League Division One West.

Prior to that Wootton Bassett Town had met Cricklade three times in the Wiltshire Senior Cup in recent times. In Season 1999-2000, two goals from Ian Curtis and one from Richard Merchant secured a 3-2 win for Bassett. The two sides met again the following season in the semi-final of the same competition. This time extra time was needed to separate the two sides, but a goal from Mickey Goodwin and an own goal ensured Bassett made it through to the final against Shrewton United. Bassett were to go on and win the competition for the second time in three years. The two sides met again in Season 2002-03 with Wootton Bassett winning comfortably by three goals to nil, two goals from Paul Clegg and one from Gary Ashford doing the damage for Bassett.

Whilst Wootton Bassett had much the better of things in the Wiltshire Senior Cup it was a different story when they joined the Hellenic League as Graham Jackson's side became something of a bogey side for Wootton Bassett. In that first season the two sides met at Cricklade Leisure Centre the week before Christmas and shared the points in a 1-1 draw, Stuart Hemsley with the Bassett goal. The two sides met again just 5 weeks later at Rylands Way and it was Cricklade who left with all three points after a 2-1 win, Matty Bennett with the Wootton Bassett consolation goal.

It was honours even in Season 2006-07 as the two sides met twice in the last few weeks of the season. Goals from Matt Bennett, Chris Mills and Andy White gave Bassett all three points at Rylands Way but in the return 11 days later goals from Stevie Shaw and Scott Large were not enough to give Bassett the points in a 3-2 defeat.

Season 2007-08 was not a good one for Bassett as they lost both games against Cricklade, failing to score in either game as they went down 2—0 at Cricklade and 1-0 at Rylands Way. This started a pattern of one or other side doing the double over the other.

In Season 2008-09 it was Bassett's turn to win both games. The two sides met at Cricklade Leisure Centre on 13th September 2008 and the crowd were entertained in a game that saw eight goals with Bassett prevailing by five goals to three. Hero for Bassett on the day was Shaun Terry who fired a hat-trick with further goals from Steve Yeardley and Ryan Banks. In the return at Rylands in April Steve Yeardley was again on target with Scott Ward also netting in a 2-1 win for Wootton Bassett.

Season 2009-10 and it was again Cricklade's turn to have the better of things, winning by a solitary goal at Cricklade Leisure Centre and then leaving Rylands with all three points following a 2-1 win, Andy Philpott with the consolation goal for Wootton Bassett.

Season 2011-12 continued the sequence of the two sides switching who did the double over whom. Goals from Craig Bowden, Ethan Delaney and Matt Bown gave Dave Turner's Bassett side the points in a 3-1 win at Ryalnds Way. In the return at the Leisure Centre in March two goals from Alex Green gave Bassett the points in a narrow 2-1 win.

The final season when the two sides were to meet each other was Season 2012-13 and the sequence of doubles came to an end as the two sides drew both games, At Rylands in February a Mark Barnes goal ensured as share of the points for Bassett whilst in the return game at the Leisure Centre neither side were able to find the net. This was to be Cricklade's last season in the Hellenic League as they folded just prior to the start of the 2012-14 Season.








Bassett Lodge their eighth straight win

Ben Lodge's goal twelve minutes from time delivered Royal Wootton Bassett Town's eighth straight victory as they edged out ten-man Windsor 1-0.

They now have eight straight wins in all competitions, a run which has seen them amass nineteen goals, while conceding just two as the perfect balance between defence and attack appears to have been struck. Their latest triumph came as a result of another outstanding display. Having been held to a 1-1 draw by Windsor at home on an afternoon when they could be considered lucky to have taken away a point, Rich Hunter's team knew they would be in for a battle in the return fixture in Berkshire. And they were more than ready for the occasion.

Defensively, Bassett were superb, holding firm against a troublesome Windsor attack. At the other end, meanwhile, the visitors posed a threat of their own. Though that would only yield one goal, it was enough to seal another win as Ben Lodge's 78th minute strike proved decisive.

The first was a real lively affair with action coming thick and fast at both ends. There was an opportunity in the opening seconds for Bassett, which fell to Harvey Scholes after the hosts failed to clear but Hugo Sobte was able to hold the attempted lob. Bassett were having the better of the early exchanges, and both Adam Corcoran and Sam Collier had efforts blocked before Windsor came close for the first time as Barry Hayles' effort from Keiron Knight's knock down shaved the outside of the post. The ex-Fulham striker - a physical presence as always - was then booked for an apparent arm in the face of Kieran Diaz-Benitez. The importance of that caution was to be apparent later, but there was to be immediate danger for Windsor from the free kick as Collier steered a shot towards the top right hand corner, which Sobte did well to divert over the crossbar. His opposite number was soon called into action, and Dan Lawrence proved equally up to the task, clawing away Knight's low shot before batting Jon Case's troublesome cross away to safety. His third save of the game proved his best so far. Hayley connected well with a half volley from the edge of the area and, at full stretch, the young Bassett stopper tip over. Another powerful shot, this time from Paul Coyne, tested his reactions once more, though - again - Lawrence was able to make the stop. From the resulting corner, there was a period of panic in the box, with Windsor striking the woodwork for the third time in the match. Finally some respite arrived for Bassett. After seizing upon sloppy play from full back Haydon Clack, Collier was presented with an opening on goal from an advantageous position, but could only fire straight at Sobte. The teams then traded chances before the break as Clack scuffed a shot wide following Knight's set-up play before Sam Packer also failed to locate the target after good combination play with Scholes.

Packer had an opportunity early after the restart; after beating two men, he struck at goal, forcing Sobte to save at his near post. Chances early in the second period were otherwise rare, with the intensity of the first half appearing to have caught up with the players. A Packer header at the far post did force Sobte to be alert before the hour, but the main action was taking place in the referee's notebook. And midway through the half the home side were reduced to ten men when Hayles was adjudged to have caught Corcoran late and received his second yellow of the game. Bassett would end up taking full advantage of the extra man with the clock winding down. Following a quick counter attack Packer, who produced another brilliant display, delivered a cross from the right, which Lodge gambled to meet at the far post and divert in. Windsor's reaction to the goal was to throw an extra man on up front as the experienced Ricardo Cannon entered the fray up front. He could little damage though, his best chance coming when he headed wide from a corner. They ultimately found no way past Bassett's defence and the visitors could ultimately have doubled their margin of victory but the home custodian Sobte was equal to Callum Wright's attempt to find the top corner.

Man of the Match: Dan Lawrence – a series of tremendous saves ensured another clean sheet and the points.

Whether Packs is on or off the pitch, you get the same infectious smile, shrug of the shoulders and do I look bothered look! Dig a bit deeper and you will see a player that recently rejected an offer of £70 per game from a local rival team, and in the very same week could be seen in the club kitchen washing up after the players curry night. He also at 0830 on a Saturday morning turned up to coach our 5 – 6-year olds at community coaching. That to me totally sums up what we are all trying to achieve.

We are not a club that have a single financial backer, we have to achieve any success by all pulling together and having long term sustainable and realistic goals. Far too many modern-day players are quickly criticised for having no commitment or being totally money driven — I just hope at the end of the season this group of players will prove that they have seen the bigger picture and more importantly have enjoyed that experience.

The club has survived for over 120 years now and moving forward we will all be a very small part of that history.

Our duty is simple – ensure that whilst you are the club do your bit to add to that history.

Bassett Progress to 3rd Round of Wilts Cup after Putting Three Past Cricklade Town

Rylands Way, 18th January 2003

Bassett Town came through 3-0 winners seeing off Wilts Premier Division high-flyers Cricklade Town. Compared to Bassett's recent performances this was a below par showing but at least the right result was achieved. Bassett were missing a number of first team regulars in the side due partially to armed forces commitments. This allowed Bassett to once again give First Team starts to youngsters Steve Yeardley and Ben Gascoyne, as well as having new signing Carl Marsh on the bench.

Bassett began the game looking like they would overwhelm their County League opponents and took the lead as early as the 3rd minute, when Paul Clegg latched onto a Ben Gascoyne ball and slotted home. Bassett continued to attack and had a couple of half chances which were dealt with comfortably by Andy Robbins in the Cricklade goal. Cricklade got behind the Bassett defence for the first time in the 29th minute when lan Curtis missed an easy chance after good build-up play by Craig Tonkin and Paul Corcoran. Bassett had already made a couple of defensive errors in the first half and were on the back foot again a minute later when Ian Curtis hit the bar from a Jon Dixon corner. A couple of minutes later Bassett's defence was caught napping yet again when Paul Corcoran missed a one-on-one chance against Bassett 'keeper Rich Stevens. Cricklade continued to have the majority of the play as they sought to get back into the game and Rich Stevens was easily the busier of the two keepers in the first half. Against the run of play a Gary Ashford shot went just over from the edge of the box five minutes before the break as Bassett finally put in an attack of note. There was still time for another Cricklade chance three minutes later when a Charlton shot went just past the post for a goal kick. Bassett went into the break a goal up but could easily have trailed 3-1 based on the balance of play and chances created.

Cricklade came out fighting once again in the second half and they troubled Bassett five minutes after the restart when a Jon Dixon shot from just inside the box was well saved by Rich Stevens. Bassett got back on the front foot after that and in the 56th minute Ben Gascoyne hit the woodwork from a header. Bassett made their first change three minutes later when Danny Clayton was replaced by Mark Hammond. Hammond added some new creativity to the Bassett midfield and they scored a second goal in the 65th minute when Paul Clegg put away a Gary Ashford ball after a great Ben Gascoyne run. Gary Ashford had a chance of his own four minutes later when his shot was saved after another good piece of work by Ben Gascoyne. Bassett brought two-goal Paul Clegg off in the 70th minute; his replacement being Neil Bridges. Bridges nearly made an immediate impact on the game when he put in a telling cross from the left wing but in the end it was comfortably dealt with by Andy Robbins in the Cricklade goal. Bridges had another great chance for Bassett in the 76th minute when he was clean through one-on-one with Andy Robbins but somehow he allowed the keeper to save his shot when it looked certain that another goal would result. Bassett made their final change two minutes later bringing Justin "Ruud van Nistelroy" Hyde on for Ben Gascoyne. Bassett got their third in the 87th minute when Garv Ashford blasted home from the edge of the box. Bassett came through with the win in the end although it wasn't an easy ride. Credit to Cricklade for the way they played, they certainly did not deserve to lose 3-0 and at times looked the better footballing side.

Player Profile

Kieran Diaz-Benitez - Defender



Diaz-Benitez is an athletic full back who joins the club from Cirencester Town. The defender was with Oxford United as a youngster before being released by the Us in April 2016.

He began last season with Purton, and his eight appearances for the Red House outfit quickly earned the attentions of the Southern League Premier Division Centurions.

The defender made his debut in a Red Insure Cup tie away against Banbury United, and his adventurous play stood out in a game which Cirencester lost on penalties.

His performance in that game was enough to

merit an immediate starting spot in the league, and, in a season in which Cirencester would be relegated, the defender was a bright spot for them, appearing 29 times, with only five coming as a substitute. Diaz-Benitez also found the net once, scoring the opening goal in a 2-0 home victory against Dunstable Town.

He began this year with Cirencester, though found himself starting the campaign from the bench. After four appearances – including a lone start in an FA Cup tie against Aylesbury – he switched to Bassett.

Comfortable on the ball, athletic and keen to get forward, he has also previously been on the books at Bristol Rovers.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated in the small market town six miles west of Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established within the town in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in the county of Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the prestigious Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although both ended in defeat. Wootton Bassett Town F.C. folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when the club began playing at the Gerard sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.

Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by local dignitary Major Gerard Buxton for

Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County Senior League with limited success until Season 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. Season 1987-88 also saw the club again reach the final of the Wiltshire Senior Cup but that first win remained elusive. That changed in 1998-99, however, when the Club defeated Pewsey Vale 3-2 in the final at the County Ground and success was again achieved in Season 2000-01 when Shrewton were defeated 2-0 in the final. The First Team, having finished runners-up in Division One West in Season 2012-13, currently play in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League, at Step 5 of the Football Pyramid.

As well as the First Team the Club has always run an adult Development/Reserve team. Since the onset of the new millennium the club has also expanded significantly, with the establishment of a large thriving Youth Section and a very successful Ladies Section. The Ladies side recently did the "double" of being cup winners and securing promotion in the same season. The latest addition to the Club has been the establishment of a Veterans team, so the club now operates 26 teams from under 7s upwards. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town F.C. was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established, with three Youth Section teams touring Holland annually since 2001. This has led to a relationship with amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande, who are based near The Hague.

The club now play their games at the fantastic New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name, the Club continues to thrive as a key part of the community of Royal Wootton Bassett. Season 2017-18 again sees Rich Hunter in charge of the First Team as the Club looks to better its highest ever position in Non-League football the 11th place finish achieved in Season 2014-15. The Club will again be entering the F.A. Cup and F.A. Vase with the Development side playing in the Wiltshire County League.

In This Week From the Archives...

Bassett forced to huff and puff way past Marlborough

Rylands Way, 13th October 2007 v Marlborough, won 1-0

Wootton Bassett Town's performance against Wilts Premier side Marlborough Town was not exactly what was expected after a win against Hellenic Premier pacesetters Almondsbury in the week.

However, with a side featuring nine changes to the starting eleven and a number of key players missing not a lot can be taken from an extremely dreary 1-0 win. After all, the job was eventually done: Bassett weren't embarrassed by lower level opponents and advanced to the next round of the Wilts Senior Cup.

It could have been much different though as Marlborough came out with nothing to lose, putting in a performance that they can be very proud of.

They should have taken the lead on 15 minutes when Brad Mildon raced through the Bassett defence and cut the ball back for an unmarked Dwayne Henry. However, Henry – who trained preseason with Bassett – failed to keep his composure and blazed over from 12 yards.

Nine minutes later, Steve Yeardley powerfully headed a Nathan Perkins corner past 'keeper Dan Fry but was denied by a superb goalline clearance.

What proved the difference between the two sides though was a hiccup between Fry and defender Ryan Keeley, which allowed Lee Stoddart to pounce 29 minutes in.

Andy White played a through ball in behind the defence intended for Stoddart. Fry came off his line looking to hoof clear but his defender ran into him and the ball sprayed loose. The Bassett forward was then left with an easy tap in from 15 yards and made no mistake for his third goal in three games.

The visitors did not allow the goal to cause heads to drop though and continued to throw caution to the wind. And why not?

Twice in the final ten minutes of the first half they came close to equalising. Firstly, Dean Hughes glanced a header across goal and just wide of the left post before Jack Kelly saw a 10-yard volley well saved on the dive by a returning John Haines following a low cross from Nick Woodward.

In between, Steve Yeardley saw an acrobatic bicycle kick go just over before Adam Whitefield headed a Rich Gee cross just wide at the other end. However, Bassett continued to not produce much at all.

Instead the action continued in and around the Bassett box at the start of the second half. Haines – perhaps somewhat eager in his first game back since the middle of last season – almost gifted Kelly a goal after a stupid call to play a goal kick short. The ball went straight to the diminutive Kelly but luckily he shot wide.





HIGHWORTH Town's Hellenic League campaign has now hit record-breaking status after they took an iron grip on the Premier Division with a 3-1 victory at nearest rivals Flackwell Heath on Saturday. I WAS fortunate to be at the recent Soccerex conference in Manchester where Non-League football came under the spotlight in a session featuring club chairmen and renowned Spanish football journalist Guillem Balague.

The timing of such a panel discussion was appropriate, for the much-publicised events at Billericay Town have commanded considerable attention and provided plenty of talking points. Billericay for the Football League? We have seen very bold ambitions coming from Non-League clubs in the past, notably in Essex where "crash and burn" stories are not uncommon – witness the tale of Grays Athletic.

Can a club of the size of Billericay reach and sustain a place in the Football League? There are reasons why a certain size of club does not naturally climb to that level, and many have found their natural home long ago. More often than not, that status will not change dramatically unless there is the sort of inflated investment that propels a club sky high. In some ways, it's no different to the big-time, where perpetual under-achievers Chelsea and Manchester City were suddenly thrust forward because of a massive shift in the financial structure of the club.

When the Football League was created in 1888, it was on the back of the industrial revolution with the clubs coming from Lancashire and the Midlands. The game was the recreation of the mill towns of the north and central England, so there was a certain logic in professionalism taking root amid the smoking chimneys and factories. Most became large towns and cities and generally, the pecking order in football has belonged to locations with sizeable populations, hence clubs like Manchester United and Liverpool have been "big" for decades. There are some remarkable exceptions, but there is some correlation between population and football success.

For football clubs to flourish, you invariably need critical mass, in terms of people who are interested in the club, and money. Some clubs have one or the other, but the real giants of the sport have both. You could also make a case that one needs the other, unless inflated investment creates a lop-sided model that can rarely go beyond the short-term. Unless you are an Oligarch, an oil-man or, in today's environment, from China, throwing in huge sums of money cannot be sustained.

If you look at the more recent Football League new boys, there are clubs from relatively small towns that have worked their way up the ladder – Fleetwood (26,000), Morecambe (35,000) and of course, the most curious case in Forest Green Rovers (8,000). Others such as Stevenage (88,000), Crawley (110,000), Cheltenham (117,000), Wycombe (124,000) and Accrington (55,000) play more to the theory that big towns equal bigger clubs. Billericay has a population of 28,000 and is, essentially, a town of commuters, many of whom will have allegiances to London clubs. It's a nice, aspirational town whose football club has enjoyed success in the past, especially in the 1970s when the FA Vase was won three times.

Automatic promotion has undoubtedly been good for ambitious clubs and a succession of new Football League members have been created since 1987 when Scarborough replaced Lincoln City. Not all have lasted the distance, but Non-League, over the past 50 years, has provided some wonderful moments for the Football League. Since 1967-68, the League has lost clubs like Wrexham, Aldershot, Workington, Barrow, York, Bradford Park Avenue, Torquay, Tranmere and Leyton Orient. At the same time, Non-League clubs like Barnet, Wigan, Cambridge United and Morecambe have all risen through the ranks. So the landscape can change and the amount of churn in the Football League proves that clubs can rise and fall. The question is, how should that be achieved – organically or artificially?

If, as pointed out at Soccerex, Non-League is "the essence of football", then surely creating something "artificial" goes against the grain? As we have seen in Europe this summer, paying vast sums of money for a player can trigger off a spiral that makes football even more of an unrealistic financial model than it currently is.

Some Non-League clubs are already paying far too much money to their players. The danger is that in pursuit of "the dream", a dangerous precedent could be set and the economics of Non-League football could be blown out of all proportion, and that would surely create more "crash and burn".

A hat-trick from Callum Flay helped Royal Wootton Bassett Town Under 15 Yellows to their third successive league victory in North Wilts League Division Three as they defeated Stratton Youth 4-2. Below par Bassett eke out seventh straight win

Despite a disappointing performance, Royal Wootton Bassett Town made it seven straight wins as they defeated bottom side Burnham 3-1 in the Hellenic League Premier Division.

It's often said that it's the sign of a good team when you win despite not playing well. However, Royal Wootton Bassett Town will be hoping to avoid another performance like the one they produced in a 3-1 victory against Burnham.

While Bassett's winning streak extended to seven games, their play was poor as they sought to overplay and created more problems for themselves than should have been the case against a side currently occupying bottom spot in the Hellenic League Premier Division.
