

Today's Game

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this 2nd Qualifying Round FA Vase tie against Bashley. A warm welcome to the players, management and supporters from Bashley who have made the journey up from the New Forest and South Coast for today's game.

Bashley were once one of the big names in the Southern League and played Swansea City in the Second Round of the FA Cup back in Season 1994-95. Whilst they are now playing at Step 5 they look like a club back on an upward trajectory and at the time of writing these notes they sit in second place in the Sydenhams Wessex Premier Division. This is the first ever meeting between the two sides. If today's game results in a draw the replay will be next Tuesday at Bashley with a 7.45M kick-off.

Flackwell Heath and Virginia Water

Last Saturday saw us secure another excellent win against a very good Flackwell Heath side, the win came at a bit of a cost though as both goal scorers TJ Bohane and Rob Lincoln picked up knocks. TJ was back on Tuesday and hopefully Rob's is not too serious, and he will be back soon. If you weren't there and didn't see Rob's goal I suggest you view the Your Sport Swindon video as it was a great piece of skill to leave one defender for dead with his control and then some intricate footwork to beat the second defender and fire the ball into the corner of the net. As well as scoring twice, the back line also performed well and especially stand-in keeper, veteran Kevin Sawyer who helped us out of a crisis. Two superb saves, especially that one in the second half which I am still trying to work out how he was able to get the elevation to put it over the bar. Sam is clearly demonstrating that he has a great contacts network to bring in these players to deal with issues that arise with player availability.

On Tuesday we made the long trip along the M4 to Windsor for our second visit of the season to Stag Meadow, where Virginia Water play their games as part of the groundshare with Windsor FC. We went down 2-0 but had enough chances early on to be out of sight in the first 20 minutes but unfortunately could not convert and paid the price second half conceding one lucky one and one where we pressed the self-destruct with a silly throw in. To be fair though, over the whole 90 minutes Virginia Water edged it, as they hassled us all game with a tremendous work rate that did not reduce in intensity from start to finish. They were also a really nice club and a great addition to the Premiership. That said I am still trying to get over how much they have to pay Windsor for the use of the ground!

August Player of the Month - Brad Pagliaroli

Congratulations to Brad Pagliaroli, who was named Royal Wootton Bassett Town's first team August Player of the Month. The forward, a summer signing from Letcombe, contributed six goals in eight appearances to finish the month at the head of the team's scoring charts. He was also responsible for setting up a couple of goals for teammates as well. Among his goals were an opening day brace in a 6-1 opening day thrashing of Tuffley Rovers, the winner in a man of the match display away against Leighton Town in the Emirates FA Cup, two well-taken goals in a 4-3 loss at Windsor and a fine strike in a 3-3 draw at Fairford Town. Pagliaroli's attitude on and off the pitch has been impressive too as he has hit the ground running with his new team.

Development Side

The Development side went down to a 6-2 defeat last Saturday in a game probably best described as men (old ones at that) against boys. In league leaders Shrewton's ranks are a couple of players in Jesse Walters and Craig Lewis who were playing in their Western League days back in the early 2000's, when one or other was usually the top goal scorer for Shrewton. Our Development Team manager Paul Gerrish reported that Walters, in particular, was excellent from start to finish despite being in his mid-40's now and was one of the fittest players on the pitch. Trailing 2-1 at half time the killer goal came just after the break and after that there was only going to be one winner as Shrewton scored three more. We did manage a second consolation goal to make the final score 6-2, our goals coming from Josh Bolton and Tyrhys Mifsud.

Our Visitors This Season



Bashley started the season with a 2-0 home win over promoted side Andover New Street, Harry McGrath with both goals. The only league defeat in the league so far this season came the following Tuesday night when they went down 2-1 at Hamworthy United, a side who had finished 5th the previous season, Dan Munday with the Bashley goal.

Bashley made an early exit from the FA Cup losing 2-0 at home to fellow Wessex Premier League side Bournemouth.

Back in league action Bashley picked up a useful point in a 1-1 draw with Wiltshire based side Bemerton Heath Harlequins, Ria Drake with the Bashley goal.

Having met Bournemouth already in the FA Cup the two sides met again next, this time in the Hampshire Senior Cup. Once again it was Bournemouth who triumphed but this time round they needed penalties to make it through to the next round. The game had finished 2-2, Harry Morgan and Dan Munday netting for Bashley but Bournemouth won the penalty shoot out 6-5 to do a quick cup double over Bashley.

Next up were another promoted side, Tadley Calleva and Bashley secured a comfortable 4-0 home win thanks to goals from Dan Munday (2), Tony Rolls and Cameron Beard.

A local derby in the Sydenhams Wessex League Cup saw Bashley make it through to the next round after defeating Brockenhurst 3-2 on penalties after the two sides had finished level at 1-1. Bashley had left it late in open play as their equaliser from Sam Jackson came in injury time. Nasim Meddah found Brad Morris breaking on the right and his floated cross into the crowded goal mouth was deposited high into the net by a combination of Jackson's head, shoulder and a Brockenhurst defender. The match went almost immediately to penalties.

Bashley's best result of the season came in the First Qualifying Round of the FA Vase. Once again Dan Munday led the way firing a hat-trick, Nasim Meddah bagged a brace and Jack Smith with the other goal. Last Saturday goals from Lewis Aimson and Harry Morgan gave Bashley a 2-0 home win over Baffins Milton Rovers, a win which lifted Bashley into 2nd place in the Premier Division table.

Visitors - Tourist Information

Introduction to the Village

Bashley is a village in the south of Hampshire, England. It lies in the beautiful New Forest on the outskirts of New Milton and is 2 miles inland from the Solent.

Interesting Facts

Bashley Football Club reached the Second Round proper of the FA Cup in the 1994–95 season, and were hosts to Swansea City to whom they narrowly lost 1–0.

The town has a nearby hamlet to the North called Wootton. With the same spelling as our time could there be some sort of histotic connection? This is where one of the pubs close to the ground can be located (see below).

Famous Residents

In terms of famous residents a search of the internet has not revealed any actually within Bashley itself but there are a number from the surrounding villages and towns in the New Forest area. Jamie Redknapp was born in nearby Barton-on-Sea,

Meanwhile, after retiring from football, Arsenal 1970 cup final hero and forward Charlie George ran a pub in New Milton, the now closed Ashley Hotel.

Nearest railway station

The nearest station to the ground is New Milton which is part of the South Western Railways Network and can be accessed from Waterloo by changing at Brockenhurst. Bashley is a 20-minute walk away; please note that part of the road has no footpath and no street lighting. Exit the station and go up to the main road, Station Road. Turn left, follow the road up past Ballard School, New Milton Cricket Club, across the roundabout and past the garden centre. The ground is on the right, opposite Bashley Rydal Cricket Club. Taxis are normally available from the station.

Nearest Pubs to Ground

The two nearest pubs are the Rising Sun (pictured to the right) which is to the north of the ground in the hamlet of Wootton and The Plough Inn to the East in Hordle. Both pubs get high ratings (4.3 out of 5) and should be well worth a visit.





Things to Do in Bashley

The most obvious thing to do would be to a go afew miles up the road to the seaside at either Barton-on-Sea or Milford-on-Sea. At Milford the New Forest Paddle Sport Company offer the chance to explore the scenic coast line of the New Forest by Kayak or Stand Up Paddle Roard

A little further up the coast is Lymington where it is possible to hire a rib boat and have fun in the Solent. I remember one work team building event on said rib boats where we went over to the Isle of Wight to inspect the Needles close up. It would have been an ideal trip for an earlier FA Cup round but unfortunately a group of match officals ruined that opportunity for a day out at the seaside.

Closer to Bashley is the Sammy Miller Motorcycle Museum. Set up in 1964, after former championship rider Sammy Miller put a few of his old racing motorcycles in the corner of his parts business, and turned into a museum with over 350 machines, one of the largest collections in the world. Unlike most museums with static collections, this is a live museum where the machines are run in classic bike events whenever the opportunity presents itself. There are many awesome machines to discover here: see racing bikes such as the V8 Moto Guzzi. Velocette. AJS Excelsiors, and 100s more in the Racing Hall, which purportedly has the most exotic collection of racing bikes in the world. You can also see the bike on which Sammy raced to third on in the World Championships.

Our Visitors History

Bashley Football Club was founded in 1947 and joined the Bournemouth League in 1950, progressing through the ranks before leaving in 1983 to join the Hampshire League. In 1986 they became founder members of the Wessex League and won the title for the first three years they took part, 1986/87, 1987/88 and 1988/89. In the 1987/88 season, Bashley came to national prominence after an incredible run in the FA Vase, which came to an end they reached the semi-finals, losing narrowly to Emley in the second leg of the semi-final after a 0-0 draw at the Recreation Ground.

Following their third Wessex League title, the club were accepted into the Southern League Southern Division and amazingly won the title in their first season, gaining promotion to the Premier Division. Things almost got even better the following season as Bash led the table for a long period of time and were in contention for promotion to the Conference, but fell away towards the end to finish in fourth place. Sadly, the meteoric rise of the club came to an end as a result of relegation two years later back to the Southern Division.

In the 1994/95 season, Bashley reached the First Round proper of the FA Cup for the first time, and won 1-0 at Chesham to set up a Second Round tie with Swansea at the Recreation Ground. Despite losing 1-0, Lee Walker hit the post in injury time and Richie Paskins had a clear chance which wasn't taken as Bash almost caused a huge upset.

More recently, Bash had established themselves as a mid-table Southern Division side until August 1997 when ex-European Cup Winner Jimmy Case was appointed as manager and Bash were promotion challengers during the 1997-98 season, eventually finishing third and just missing out on a return to the Premier Division, as well as having our record FA Trophy run in this season to the last sixteen, losing narrowly at Conference side Hayes.

Bash came to prominence again when their excellent young midfielder Wade Elliott signed for AFC Bournemouth in January 2000 for £5,000, with Bash receiving further money based on appearances. Wade then progressed to the Championship with Burnley and scored the goal at Wembley that took them into the Premiership and has now moved to Birmingham City.

The 2001/2002 season was notable for a superb FA Trophy run, ended only by finalists, Stevenage Borough of the Conference, with an unfortunate 1-0 defeat. A top six place was achieved in the 2002/03 season, although Bashley were top of the table for a spell in January and February and but for a five game spell in February and March from which they took only one point, would have been challenging strongly for promotion. The season was capped by a first ever Hampshire Senior Cup final, secured by two memorable victories over then Dr Martens Premier Division side Havant & Waterlooville in the two-legged semi-final. The night of the final at Southampton s St Mary's Stadium was another superb occasion for the club despite an eventual 2-1 defeat to Conference bound Aldershot Town after taking a first half lead, and no-one who was there will how close Bash came to defeating their illustrious opponents.

The 2003/2004 season was a relative disappointment after the heights of the previous campaign, with Barry Blankley resigning early on in the season and leading players Paul Sales, Craig Davis and Aaron Cook departing for substantial transfer fees. Bashley narrowly missed out on promotion to the Isthmian Premier Division under new manager John Robson and had to settle for a place in Isthmian Division One, as a result of FA restructuring.

Robson departed as manager at the end of the season, and Geoff Butler was appointed in the summer with Ricky Haysom remaining as his assistant. Bash recovered from losing a number of players in the close-season and made an encouraging start to the new season, chasing a play-off spot and playing some attractive football, but lost key players during the season and had to settle for a mid-table finish.

Butler and Haysom departed during the summer of 2005 and Dave Wakefield took charge as player/manager for the new season. However, after a poor start to the season, both Wakefield and player/coach Andy Darnton were relieved of their responsibilities with Steve Riley taking over as player/manager, following a short spell as caretaker manager, with Eddie Harper as his assistant. An excellent run in the second half of the season took Bash to just outside the play off places, and gave hope that the 2006-7 season would be successful. A number of close season signings gave the Bashley faithful renewed cause for optimism. They were not to be disappointed!

As a result of further FA restructuring, Bash found themselves transferred back into the Southern League South and West Division, and enjoyed an unforgettable record-breaking season, winning the league by an incredible 28 points and achieving a rare double century of 102 points and 111 goals, including a spell of 27 League matches unbeaten from October 27th 2006 to March 31st 2007, which was broken only after the league title had been secured. Promotion was an all-round team effort, Bash having the most prolific attack and the meanest defence in the league. Richard Gillespie finished up with 41 goals, the highest total in any of the Southern League divisions, and along the way broke the club all time goal scoring record held by Colin Cummings, which had stood for over thirty years.

Bashley acquitted themselves very well in the Southern League Premier Division the following season, and finished in fifth place at the higher level, despite long term injuries to key players. The 2007-08 season unfortunately ended in disappointment with a 4-1 defeat at the hands of Team Bath in the play-off semi-final, a result that was particularly harsh on Bashley. Again, Bashley's defence was one of the best in the league, whilst Richard Gillespie and Ryan Moss both finished in the top 10 goal scorers in the division.

Moss moved on to Conference South side Dorchester Town, but manager Steve Riley brought in a number of new signings, which allied to the retention of most of the side who had been so successful in the previous two campaigns, left Bashley quietly confident of mounting another assault at the top of the table. Unfortunately, 2008-9 was to be a very different season. For long periods during the winter, Bash were in the bottom four, although a

run of five straight wins right at the end of the season led to a final position of 14th, well clear of the relegation zone.

The summer of 2009 saw the departure of club record top scorer Richard Gillespie to Blue Square South side Eastleigh, having scored 173 goals in 308 appearances. Steve Riley appointed long serving defender Chris Ferrett as player-coach to replace assistant manager Martin Doolan, who had immigrated to New Zealand, whilst the signing of striker Mark Gamble from Farnborough ensured that Bash could enter the 2009-10 season with renewed hope of being competitive in a strong League.

Bashley exceeded expectations in the 2009/10 season, briefly topping the table after a 5-0 win at Tiverton in October. They spent the vast majority of the season in a play-off place, only to surrender their grip on a top five finish on the final day of the season with defeat at Nuneaton. An impressive FA Trophy run saw Bash through to an encounter with Conference National side, Crawley Town, who edged the tie at Bashley Road by the odd goal in five. The campaign provided some tremendous entertainment and although they lost a number of key players at the start of 2010-11, Bash rallied to secure a top half finish by the end of the season, meaning that they could look forward with quiet confidence to the start of the 2011-12 season.

After a good start, however, Bash struggled during the middle of the season and suffered losses to lower ranked opposition in all four cup competitions. A solid run towards the end of the season ensured Premier Division survival, although Steve Riley and Chris Ferrett left the club during the summer to take up similar roles with AFC Totton. Bash appointed the former Basingstoke Town management team of Frank Gray and Gerry Murphy for the 2012-13 season but the side struggled in the lower reaches of the division finishing in 17th place and again going out of all Cup competitions at the first round stage.

2013-14 Major changes within the club structure and a degree of uncertainty led to Club stalwarts Paul Gazzard and goalkeeping legend Stewart Kearn being given the daunting task of re-building the team which necessitated a series of budget cuts. Alas results mainly went against Bashley, several players moved on to pastures new after a mid-season restructuring which also saw Stewart Kearn step down from his management position. Shortly afterwards the experienced John Pyatt from Brockenhurst FC filled the vacant position to undertake the hard task with Paul Gazzard trying to steer the New Forest side away from the relegation zone, with just a handful of wins the club was relegated to the South and West Division.

The exit of players together with a lack of club executives and sponsors put the club in a perilous position. Bashley, despite the actions of loyal fans and supporters who contributed to a 'Save Bashley' appeal which allowed the club to see out the season were very close to being wound up. At the last moment a major re-organisation with the broom firmly brushing many players, staff and helpers into the past which saw Bashley start season 2014-15 on a zero budget with a team of new young players and the return of Andy Darnton as joint manager alongside Graham Speechley-Price.

Darnton resigned his position as manager in mid-October 2014 with Graham Speechley-Price also stepping down to allow Martin Spiers take the reins, Graham concentrated his efforts in a commercial role within the club. Spiers role only lasted a few weeks with Dominic Cuncliffe taking over the hot seat following Spiers resignation towards the end of November 2014. Cuncliffe assistant was Paul Morris who doubled up with Tom Prodomo with assistance behind the scenes from Graham after Cuncliffe resigned his position out of the blue in December.

At the start of February 2015 Graham was asked by the Executive to take over as caretaker manager until the end of the season which resulted in Prodomo leaving the club. With the zero budget still in place Speechley-Price battled through to the end of the season with Bashley generally playing well but losing due to small mistakes which everyone will have now learned from. A mighty effort was needed to finish away from the relegation zone, although some good bright performances late on in the season but they were not regular enough, a bottom of the pile and relegation was the result.

Meanwhile Bashley Reserves under the guidance of Andy Howard took the 2014-15 Wyvern League title in fine style showing there is promise ahead for the New Forest Club and an exciting 2015-16 season for the reserves.

The FA gave Bashley a reprieve in May 2015, rather than a drop down to the Wessex League. Southern League football continued at Bashley Road in the South and West Division for the 2015-16 season. A new management team was appointed late June 2015 with ex-Chelsea, Millwall and Leyton Orient player David Stride arrived as manager, assisted by his brother Glen an ex-Bournemouth player. These appointments lasted just a month.

Following the club's AGM, a new Executive consisting of four life vice-presidents and new Chairman elected to bring in their own new management team. This meant a return to Bashley Road for Steve Riley taking over the hot seat assisted by Paul Morris. Following a run of 15 league defeats Riley resigned his position leaving Bashley to look for a new manager.

After a brief spell during the 2014-15 season Tom Prodomo was asked to return to head the first team, towards the end of November. Several good candidates were considered but Prodomo's appointment by the board was considered the best for the future of the club.

Bashley were relegated to the Wessex League following a 201516 season without a single win and a mere two draws. The club now looks forward to new challenges in the future with rebuilding a competitive, strong and self-sufficient club the priority. Prodomo pledged his immediate future to the Bash faithful aiming to start preparations early to get a full season under his belt rather than playing catch up as has been the case over recent seasons.

Player Profile

Rob Lincoln - Forward



Hard-working, with pace and a willingness to take defenders on, Lincoln is an exciting wide player who joins Bassett this summer after splitting time last season between Shrivenham and Purton.


The energetic midfielder began his career in senior football with New College, featuring for them in their final Wiltshire League campaign in 2011-12 as well as their inaugural season in Hellenic League Division One West a season later.

Lincoln made his debut with Shrivenham in 2015-16, scoring once in eight appearances, seven of which came from the bench, for them in Division One West. He then established himself as one of their leading appearance makers a season later, scoring four times in 22 games.


Last season Lincoln netted five times in thirteen games for Shrivenham, before finishing the campaign with Purton in the Wiltshire League where he added seven goals in fourteen appearances.

Playing in the Hellenic League Premier Division for the first time this season, Lincoln has been very impressive. He has claimed a starting role on the left side of Bassett's attacking quarter, and has proved a threat to defence thanks to his speed and close control.

He picked up his first goal in a 3-3 draw away against Fairford Town before scoring an exceptional individual goal to open the scoring in a 2-1 triumph against Flackwell Heath. An unselfish player, Lincoln has also provided a number of assists in Bassett's opening games, setting up two in a man of the match performance in the 4-3 defeat away against Windsor as well as for teammates Josh Shama and Gio Wrona in the 5-3 FA Cup loss at Lydney Town.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande.

Season 2018-19 sees Sam Collier in charge of the First Team.

Blunt-edged Bassett punished for lack of killer instinct

It's one of the oldest truths in football: if you fail to take your chances, you'll fail to win the game. And Royal Wootton Bassett Town discovered that to their cost in a 2-0 defeat away against Virginia Water. In fairness, the better, more composed side over the course of the ninety minutes won the game. But had Bassett not passed up a game's worth of great opportunities in the opening quarter of an hour, then it's likely they'd have taken at least something from the match. In the end, however, two second half goals from the hosts – the first from a well-worked short corner routine, the second a gift from a critical error – proved the difference, forcing Sam Collier and his team to return to Wiltshire empty-handed. How the outcome could have been different though.

Thirty seconds in a good move in the left corner involving Brad Pagliaroli and debutant Gabriel Silva opened up space, with Gio Wrona eventually squaring for TJ Bohane, whose stabbed effort from the edge of the box forced an outstretched Matt Jones to tip around the post. Wanting to playing the ball out from the back at every opportunity, the hosts were stuttering in the early stages. And their commitment to that style of play almost proved costly in the second minute when Silva picked the pocket of dithering centre half Mike Chambers. Jones came to the rescue though, blocking the forward's tight angled effort. The danger wasn't averted though, and Silva headed narrowly wide from the resulting corner. A rare foray out from the back then presented the Waters with their first opening as Scott Jackson let loose from range, his low bouncing drive forcing an awkward parry around the post by Charlie McGready.

Bassett were the side firmly on top at this stage though. And on nine minutes Josh Shama acrobatically shot wide after Adam Corcoran had headed down a Bohane cross. A minute later, clever skill from Pagliaroli allowed him to cut inside two defenders and break into the box, but Jones was on hand to repel his effort. Shama then recycled the loose ball into the box, with Bohane heading inches over from twelve yards. It was ultimately a period of play Bassett were left to rue. Virginia Water settled down into a tidy rhythm, playing neat football, while also giving their visitors little time when in possession. It didn't help Bassett that by impatiently trying to rush the ball forward they were prone to carelessly ceding possession back to their hosts. Still, Virginia Water were only really troubling Bassett from set plays. Finn Evered headed straight into the hands of McGready from a Steve Williams corner, before a short corner out to Josh Hill on the edge of the area resulted in a powerful drive being spilt by McGready and headed away off the line by Corcoran. Another training ground routine then resulted in the same defender getting in the way of Jake Baker's hooked attempt. At the other end, Bassett continued to fail to find their range. A slip from Silva meant that he was unable to properly latch onto lggy llott's defence splitting through ball and instead shot straight at Jones before Bohane shot low into the path of the 'keeper after a blocked Shama shot fell to the forward.

Early in the second period Shama tried his luck from distance, but narrowly missed the target. And that would prove to be the last decent attempt at goal Bassett had in the game as their disjointed pattern of play continued to let them down. It meant too much was being asked of their defence, and the danger signs appeared when Scott Jackson saw a deflected strike loop just over, the subsequent corner being headed over by an unmarked Chambers.

With close to seventy minutes on the clock, Virginia Water eventually took the lead. Making a darting run from the edge of the area towards the near post, an unmarked Hill was able to connect with Williams' low delivery from the corner. The midfielder appeared to mishit his first time shot, but that wound up being in his favour as the ball looped into the top left corner. They then almost had an instant second as Adam McNamara's shot flew past the post before McGready's fine one-on-one save with his legs denied Baker. But the visitors ultimately gift-wrapped the decisive second. Taking a throw in halfway between his own goal and the middle of the park, left back Jack Stanley decided to try and find his 'keeper rather than taking the sensible option and going down the line.

It was a good ten yards short of his intended target though, and McGready was lucky that Baker, who raced onto the loose ball, remained on his feet when the two made contact outside the box. That allowed the forward to square inside for his strike partner, and though the Bassett 'keeper did his best to chase play down, McNamara kept his cool and tucked the ball away. There was to be no coming back from that self-inflicted hole. And they were fortunate not to concede again when Hill, racing in front of Stanley, steered over from Joe McBride's low cross into the box.

Man of the Match: Adam Corcoran – was solid in the centre of defence alongside Steve Yeardley, winning the majority of his aerial battles and helping snuff out some dangerous looking counter attacks when Bassett were caught with too many men committed forward.

Bassett beat bogey side

A fine individual strike from Rob Lincoln and a second half header from TJ Bohane, as well as some outstanding goalkeeping from the veteran Kevin Sawyer, secured a 2-1 victory against Flackwell Heath.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town have rarely enjoyed success against Flackwell Heath. In twelve league meetings prior to their opening encounter of the 2018-19 Hellenic League Premier Division campaign, Bassett had triumphed just once against the Buckinghamshire outfit, with three draws providing the only other positives. Indeed, their last seven league meetings had all ended in defeat

But, thanks to an outstanding effort across the pitch, Bassett finally got to taste a second victory against their perennial bodey side as Sam Collier's team prevailed 2-1. A superb, individual effort from Rob Lincoln and TJ Bohane's snap second half header provided the goals they needed, while a diligent defensive display - and two brilliant saves from veteran 'keeper Kevin Sawyer - limited the Heathens to a solitary strike.

The game was sixteen minutes old when Bassett took the lead in style. Adam Corcoran delivered a cross-field ball, which Lincoln brought down expertly with his chest. His control also got him clear of his marker on the left wing, allowing the winger to break towards the goal. Closed down by another defender on the edge of the area. Lincoln produced a sublime piece of skill to fashion up enough space to shoot, and he made no mistake, firing low into the bottom right corner.

The teams were evenly matched though, and Flackwell eventually levelled just after the half hour mark when they caught the hosts out on the break and an unmarked Leius Sinclair swept

That equaliser provided the visitors a boost of confidence as half time neared and they would have led going into the break were it not for Sawyer's brilliance as he saved low from a free kick, somehow being able to divert the ball over the bar.

It was a set piece that provided what eventually proved to be Bassett's winner. Brad Pagliaroli's deflected free kick was tipped away by 'keeper Aaron Watkins. The save wasn't enough to bat the ball to safety though, and a sliced attempted clearance struck Lincoln, looping back into the six-yard box where Bohane was on hand to produce a poacher's finish and flick a header into the back of the net.

Fighting to again restore parity, Flackwell sought to throw everything they had at Bassett. But they failed to find a way through, their best chance coming when Sawyer thwarted a one-onone opportunity with another fine stop.

Late on the visitors also felt aggrieved that they weren't awarded a penalty. But in fairness it would have been a harsh award, with Bassett, deserving of another hard-fought three points, ultimately able to see out a stoppage time period that seemed to last an eternity.





Barmy Non-League Happenings

23 years on from the landmark introduction of the Bosman rule, last week saw another instance of player power carving into football's status quo with Denmark players holding a strike over their commercial rights. The holdout by the likes of Christian Eriksen, Kasper Schmeichel and Lasse Schone was the result of an in-house conflict between players and the Danish FA over their own individual sponsor deals and the national team sponsor, Hummel. The dispute saw the Danish FA resort to calling up players from the third tier of its football pyramid as well as futsal players for the international friendly against a full-strength Slovakia side. All the talk was whether the Denmark FA (DBU) could save face and reach a middle ground before the match in Trnava as well as a competitive match which followed against Wales. For the first match, they couldn't. Ticket prices for the Slovakia game were slashed to €1 and, with little to be expected from their team, Denmark's makeshift side was defeated 3-0. Which isn't exactly a drubbing by any means for a team hastily assembled like a Frankenstein. Humiliation for the DBU was averted in time for the UEFA Nations League clash with Wales on Sunday.

Out of a situation spawned from the politics of sports business, let's not forget that the players from the third tier have a national team cap. When speaking to players from our own lower leagues who have won England C honours, they describe it as a 'very proud moment' to represent your country and a 'privilege'.

Here are three other times football has been downright barmy.

Robert Hoyzer and Germany's referee fixing scandal - 2005

German official Robert Hoyzer came under the microscope from the powers at the DFB after a cup match involving Hamburg and Paderborn when he awarded two penalties and also sent off a Hamburg player. Having initially pleaded his innocence, Hoyzer then confessed to being complicit in a £1.1m scandal which went beyond the German Cup and also affected the Bundesliga 2 and third division Regionalliga leagues. An organised crime faction from Croatia as behind the rigging of the betting market which threatened the integrity of the FIFA World Cup Germany was set to host less than 12 months on from the court proceedings against Hoyzer and other officials and players implicated in the scandal. Hoyzer was banned from football for life and sentenced to two-and-a-half years in prison, while five others were also handed custodial sentences.

Roy Keane slurs manager Mick McCarthy ahead of Ireland's World Cup in Japan - 2002

A difference in opinion which derailed Ireland's World Cup preparations for the World Cup in Japan and South Korea. Midfielder Keane saw no reason to bite his tongue over the way manager Mick McCarthy had led to team to only the third World Cup in the country's history.

In a row at a pre-tournament training camp, Keane ranted at McCarthy in front of his team-mates calling the manager "a liar" and a "f****** w******. Goalkeeper Shay Given described the exchange as a "a total destruction of Mick, personally and professionally". Keane was sent home from the camp in disgrace and wouldn't feature at the World Cup. Draws against Cameroon and Germany and a 3-0 win over Saudi Arabia led to the Irish progressing to the Round of 16, where they met Spain and lost on penalties 3-2. McCarthy was sacked after the tournament and Ireland have failed to reach a World Cup since.

10 players sent off after mass brawl - Vitoria v Bahia, 2018

There's something about South American football and short-fused tempers. No surprises then when a yellow card was brandished within the first minute of play between Brazil top-flight rivals Victoria and Bahia. Despite a flurry of yellow cards nothing appeared out of the ordinary during a first-half display which saw Vitoria hold the lead 1-0 at the interval. This was the first time in three seasons sets of supporters from both teams were allowed to attend the match. But it was on the pitch not in the stands that the match would descend into chaos. Four minutes into the second half a converted penalty by Bahia's Vinicius led to a 'crude' celebration in front of the opponent's supporters, something Vitoria goalkeeper Fernando Miguel didn't take too kindly to. And after confronting Vinicius he was backed up in violent ways by his team-mates who unloaded punches on their opponents. The furore was brought under control after 16 minutes when the referee dismissed a total of eight players; five from Bahia and three from Vitoria. Incredibly, the match went on but it would not last the full 90 minutes as on the verge of the 80th minute as two more players were shown red cards, reducing Vitoria to six players and leading to the match being abandoned.

With the FA Cup there were no league games in the Southern League last weekend. In the FA Cup there were mixed fortunes for Wiltshire based sides. Melksham Town lost 4-1 at home against Merthyr Town. Their chances of victory realistically disappeared after Warren Maident's sending off which saw the game swing in Merthyr's favour. Merthyr had taken the lead on 76 minutes through Kerry Morgan just before Maidment picked up his second yellow card of the match. Merthyr immediately went 2-0 up and rthen scored a third. Whilst Jon Davies smashed a 25 yard free kick to get one back for Melksham the game was put beyond doubt when Corey Jenkins scored his second of the game for Merthyr. Meanwhile Swindon Supermarine were the biggest winners of the round smashing Woodbridge Town 7-1. Supermarine were 2-1 at the at the interval of this first qualifying round tie, thanks to goals from Stuart Fleetwood and Josh Parsons. However, after a stern word from manager Lee Spalding at the break, Supermarine burst into life and thumped their visitors with five further goals to progress to the next round. In the Sydenhams Wessex Amesbury returned to winning ways with a 1-0 home success over Verwood Town. A good win also for Downton who defeated Whitchurch United to move into 8th spot. Laverstock & Ford playing in the League Cup lost 4-3 at home to United Services Portsmouth. Usual mixed bag of results in the Western League as Warminster Town continued their great start to the season with a 7-1 away win at Bristol Telephones. The win lifted them into 2nd spot in the table just a few months after their potential relegation scare. A good win also for Calne Town who won 3-0 at home against Ashton Backwell. Chippenham Park lost for the fourth time this season, beaten 4-1 at home by Keynsham Town whilst Devizes Town were 2-1 home winners over Wincanton. Corsham Town lost their first game of the season when they were beaten 1-0 away at Sherbourne Town.

Bassett created further chances, perhaps the best falling to Ackrill whose header was well tipped over by the keeper.



Old Manor opened the second half more positively and within 10 minutes had taken the lead, Ackrill got caught in two minds and only ended up in handling the ball in the box, Tutton converting the penalty.

Bassett could have fallen further behind had it not been for the alert Rees who came off his line quickly to save from Rushton.

To Bassett's credit they remained patient and slowly regained control, equalising, again through a sharply taken chance from Frost.

The winner came 10 minutes from time when a cross from Peter York was bundled in by McKay at the far post. Damon York had a chance to wrap it up but, following a fine move from Bassett, he fired inches wide.







