Todav's Game

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Uhlsport Hellenic League local derby against our near neighbours Shrivenham. A warm welcome to the players, management and supporters from Shrivenham who have made the short journey across town for this afternoon's Bank Holiday encounter.

With the holiday weekend this programme had to go to the printers ahead of Saturday's FA Cup match against Lydney Town so hopefully by the time you read these notes we will have earned our place in the First Qualifying Round. Apologies also for the results, tables and statistics not being fully up to date for this match due to the Bank Holiday Monday scheduling but we will up to date for the next programme.

Our visitors today Shrivenham are back in the Premier Division after a three-season absence and have had a tough to start to life back in the top division. At the time of writing these notes they sit third from bottom with just one point from their opening five fixtures, that coming in a 1-1 draw at home with Virginia Water. Whilst four of the opening five fixtures have been at home, don't read too much into the lack of victories in the opening five fixtures. This is because they have started the season with some really tough fixtures against the top sides in Flackwell Heath, Reading City and Windsor, the latter who they have met twice in those five games. As we saw ourselves recently. Windsor are a very strong side this year. Reading City allegedly have a big budget and Flackwell have been in and around the top of the table for a few seasons now. Be under no doubt that we are in for tough game today, the fact that it is a local derby will in itself mean that the game will be closer than recent form might suggest.

Despite the geographic proximity of our visitors it is surprising to note that we have only met on eight occasions previously with Bassett having the better of things having won four times to just two for Shrivenham, two games having been drawn. We have also had the better of things in recent times, as Bassett have remained unbeaten in the last four meetings between the two sides, winning three and drawing one game. As well as being a local derby both sides have players who have worn the colours of the other club in their line ups today and it is a special welcome back to young goalkeeper Dan Lawrence who played so well for us last season. A warm welcome back also to Chris Jackson, Jack Ellis, Ryan Stanners, Aaron Dainton, Josh Morse, Sam Ockwell. Lewis Waldon, Danny Hale and Lewis Petrie, all of whom have worn the blue and vellow at some time in the past. Our manager Sam Collier has the distinction of managing both teams in the Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division and will be keen to put one over his former club here this afternoon.

Fairford

On Tuesday we travelled to Fairford for the return match with our local neighbours just a week or so after playing them here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground. In contrast to the previous game it was our opponents who raced into a 2-0 lead but thankfully we pulled it back with goals from Brad Pagliaroli, his sixth of the season, and Matty Bennett. We then went in front just before half time, Rob Lincoln scoring with his first goal for the club. Unfortunately, former Bassett player Mason Thompson scored his second of the game just after half time which completed the scoring meaning the points were shared. Whilst disappointing that we again gave away a lead, this was a much-improved result on last season when we lost 4-0 at Fairford and I am sure Sam will look back on this as a point gained rather than two lost. Fairford are a much stronger side than last season and it is pleasing to have secured four points off them

After Leighton Town Away (to the Swindon Advertiser)

Free Saturday Skills Sessions scoop prestigious

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's Free Saturday Skills Sessions have been awarded the Wiltshire FA's Community Project of the Year in the inaugural FA and McDonald's Grassroots Football Awards.

Introduced in September 2012 and overseen by Jeff and Helen Tidy, the sessions provide free skills coaching to four- to eleven-year-old boys and girls of all abilities during school term time.

On top of that, they have also served as an opportunity for young, aspiring coaches to gain experience under the tutelage of a UEFA B licensed coach.

In recognition of their achievements Jeff and Helen were invited, along with the other winners from around the country, to attend last Sunday's FA Community Shield contest between Manchester City and Chelsea at Wembley as guests of the FA.

It was a fitting, deserved achievement for the pair, who are stepping down after six years running the community football sessions.

Their contribution to the club during that time has been significant - something demonstrated by the number of players who have joined Bassett's youth section after attending the Saturday Skills Sessions.

And they have both left a legacy, which the club will seek to maintain.


Both National and County FA awards winners were selected.





Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies will travel to either Warsash Wasps or Bournemouth Sports in the SSE Women's FA Cup first qualifying round.

Competing in the most prestigious national women's cup knockout tournament for the seventh year in a row, Bassett will be searching for only their second ever win in the competition, their only triumph coming back in 2013-14 when they defeated Cheltenham Civil Service 1-0 in the preliminary round.

In the four seasons since then, the Ladies have been knocked out at the earliest opportunity, with a 5-2 home loss against AFC Bournemouth last year.

Standing in their way of progression this time around will be either Southern Region Women's League Premier Division Warsash Wasps or Hampshire County Women's League Division One outfit Bournemouth Sports.

Like Bassett, Warsash finished runners-up in the league during their first season at step six of the women's football pyramid. And that was enough for them to secure promotion too. The Hampshire-based side also had success in the FA Women's Cup. In only their second participation in the competition, they defeated higher level opposition in the form of Ilminster Town in the first qualifying round before succumbing to defeat against Winchester City Flyers.

Bournemouth, meanwhile, finished fifth in the Hampshire County Women's League Division One. The step seven side pulled off an upset in the Women's Cup as well, prevailing 3-1 against step five Keynsham Town Development before narrowly losing 2-1 against Bassett's league rivals FC Chippenham in the second qualifying round.

They will face off in the preliminary round on Sunday 26th August. The winners will then play Bassett in their first qualifying round tie a week later on Sunday 2nd September, with the victors of that match set to receive £375 in prize money as well as a second qualifying round place.

From the Sunday Team

Sunday side set for Division One challenge

After romping to the Swindon Sunday League Division Two title in their inaugural season, Royal Wootton Bassett Town's Sunday team are set to enjoy the challenge of Division One football in 2018-19. The team, managed by Danny Groom and featuring numerous players who have played for the club's youth and senior sections previously, lost just once in the league last season while drawing just two games, and finished with an incredible goal difference of +120. To add to their league crown, they also claimed the Swindon Sunday League Division Two Sportsmanship Prize, proving that they won by playing the game the right way.

However, this coming season is set to be a greater test for the team. But it is one they will relish. Bassett have been promoted to Division One alongside Croft Junior and Highworth Town, who finished third and fourth in Division Two last season, and Division Three winners AFC Mannington. And Bassett will start with a double-header against Highworth, facing the Worthians away to begin their league fixtures on 2nd September before hosting them in the cup a week later.

Alongside those three teams, Bassett will be taking on some of the heavyweights in Swindon Sunday League football. Greyhound have long been one of the league's forces, completing a perfect league season last year, while also reaching the final of the Wiltshire Sunday Cup, a competition they have won on numerous occasions. Last season's Division One runners-up Penhill United will also again be in the mix, as will FC Walcot who knocked Bassett out of the Knockout Cup in 2017-18 before eventually lifting the trophy. Coleshill United and Woodlands Edge round out the nine-team division.

Visitors - Tourist Information

Introduction to the Village

Shrivenham is a large village and civil parish in the Vale of White Horse, about 5 miles southwest of Faringdon. The village is close to the county boundary with Wiltshire and about 7 miles east-northeast of Swindon. Shrivenham is located in Oxfordshire following boundary changes in the 1970's.

One of the most westerly villages in Oxfordshire, Shrivenham nestles in the Vale of the White Horse on the route from Swindon to Oxford. A bypass, built in 1984, ensures that Shrivenham's rural atmosphere is preserved. Elm Tree House, a gracious house built in the style of Inigo Jones, a village school built in 1863 and many lovely thatched cottages border the wide tree-lined main street. The village also has a lot of stone walls, an historic pump and a parish church that is unusual for having been rebuilt in the 17th century.

Interesting Facts

At the end of World War II in Europe, the U.S. Army's Information and Educational Branch was ordered to establish an overseas university campus for demobilised American service men and women. It did this on the Beckett estate at Shrivenham. This, and two campuses in Europe, was set up to provide a transition between army life and subsequent attendance at a university in the USA, and therefore students attended for just one term.

Shrivenham has been the site of UK military colleges since 1946 and the establishment of the Royal Military College of Science (RMCS) in the grounds of Beckett Hall. This college is now called the Defence College of Management and Technology, which is part of the Defence Academy of the United Kingdom.

The academy provides higher education for personnel in the British Armed Forces, Civil Service, other government departments and service personnel from other nations.

Famous Residents

No famous recent residents are known. The village's most famous residents are the Barrington family.

Nearest railway station

Nearest Railway station is Swindon.

Nearest Pubs to Ground

The village has three historic public houses: the Barrington Arms, The Crown and the Prince of Wales. The nearest one to the ground is the Barrington Arms (pictured) but all are within walking distance.



Things to Do in Shrivenham

Three attractive looking pubs are certainly a good reason for visiting village along with the picturesque High Street.

St Andrew's church is impressively large for a small village, with parts dating back to the 11th, 12th and 13th centuries. Its many unusual features include the central tower, 18 large clear windows, Tuscan-like tapering columns, magnificent brass chandeliers and hanging pyx. There are many memorials to the Barrington family in the village, important landowners locally in previous decades, who as noted earlier are the most famous residents of the village.

Goals galore, but again Bassett fall short of victory

Royal Wootton Bassett Town produced a fine comeback to overturn an early 2-0 deficit against Fairford Town. But after leading at the break, they ultimately had to settle for a 3-3 derby draw.

For the second time in a matter of days, Royal Wootton Bassett Town produced a fine attacking performance that yielded three goals. But, once again, it did not prove enough for victory. Fortunately, this time it was enough for a point as they drew 3-3 in another exciting derby encounter against Fairford Town.

In contrast to Saturday's defeat against Windsor, it was Bassett who found themselves having to recover from a significant deficit as Lee Smith opened the scoring on Fairford for six minutes before Mason Thompson, with his team's second shot of the game, doubled the hosts' advantage quarter of an hour later.

But Saturday's protagonists Matt Bennett and Brad Pagliaroli struck within three minutes of one another to restore parity. Rob Lincoln then put Sam Collier's team ahead on the stroke of half time, taking advantage of an excellent cross-field ball before tucking away his richly deserved first goal of the season into the bottom corner.

Bassett would have hoped to have received a momentum boost from that go-ahead goal going into the break.

However, they were pegged back soon after the restart as Thompson swept home his second after a shot had initially been blocked on the line.

Though there were chances for both teams thereafter, neither was capable of finding a winner, ensuring that a thrilling spectacle ended honours even.

It was another match that would have thrilled the neutral supporter. But for Bassett it was another game that ended in frustration.

At least this time, they did have something to show for their efforts.

Our History

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande.

Ten minutes later it was two as Windsor were caught on the break. Lincoln worked well with Dale Richards to steal possession deep inside their own half, and proceeded to go on a lung-bursting run that covered three-quarters the length of the pitch. After flying into the box past centre half Victor Ocansey, his cut back found its way to Pagliaroli via Bennett, and Bassett's leading scorer so far this season fashioned enough space to steer inside the near post.

That wasn't the end of the first half action though as Daniel Roberts saw both a tight-angled shot and free header from a well-worked short corner rebound off the upright.

Bassett's goal had certainly lived a charmed life in the opening period. However, the difference between the teams at the break was the visitors' clinical finishing.

But, crucially, that deserted them twice inside the early stages of the second half. Lincoln found himself in behind the Windsor defence but his shot was repelled by Sobte. Pagliaroli then had the chance to cut back for either Bennett or the onrushing Gio Wrona after he had cut inside from the right, but instead opted to open fire from a tight angle and struck straight at Sobte.

Pagliaroli did make no mistake when Lincoln's inside run and through pass set him free to make it 3-0. Yet that advantage ultimately would not be enough.

Windsor's attacking play become more urgent, a flicked header from Roberts being tipped over by Bowers on the hour. And they soon were back in it when Smith raced clear of his marker to head in. Within seconds, their faint hopes of turning the game around were transformed. Dwelling on the ball deep in his own half, right back George Lance had his pocket picked, and Panesar seized on that costly error by blasting home from distance.

Bassett's defence was now forced to fight a fierce rearguard battle as Windsor continued to open them up. They were fortunate to retain their lead when Masters snatched at a shot, guiding the ball into the clutches of Bowers from six yards out, after Smith had got beyond Richards

A brief respite from Windsor's pressure almost led to a fourth though. Pagliaroli forced an outstretched Sobte to tip away, but the rebound appeared to drop perfectly for Bennett to follow up, but a bobble led to a scuffed strike that the 'keeper gratefully smothered. Smith then got the hosts back on level terms before a fine tackle from Ocansey halted a surging Bennett as the Bassett forward bore down on goal.

If a winning goal was to arrive though, you had the sense it would be for Windsor. And that duly occurred. Roberts chested down a throw in for Thomas and the substitute forward produced a phenomenal volley that Bowers was powerless to do anything about. There was still time left on the clock to Bassett to try and muster a response. But the wind had well and truly been taken from their sails. And the only incident of note from an attempted attack resulted in a red card for Adam Corcoran, who allegedly kicked out at Andrew Ingram after they went up to challenge for a free kick.

The outcome of the game was arguably a fair one. But the gut-wrenching way in which Bassett suffered defeat was hard to stomach.

It's how you respond to setbacks like this that reveal the true character of a team though. And the important week ahead – including derbies against Fairford Town and Shrivenham with an FA Cup tie against Lydney Town in between – will certainly be a test of that.

Furious Windsor comeback stuns Bassett

Windsor came back from 3-0 down to defeat Royal Wootton Bassett Town by the odd goal in seven in a Hellenic League Premier Division thriller.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town saw a three-goal advantage slip as a stunning comeback from Windsor saw the hosts strike four times in a frenzied second half to claim the points in a thrilling advert for Hellenic League football.

From start to finish, the 'Royal Derby' served up a feast of attacking football.

Windsor struck the woodwork four times in an end-to-end opening half, but found themselves 2-0 down at half time as Matt Bennett and Brad Pagliaroli struck for Bassett.

A superb counter attack then resulted in Pagliaroli's second of the game shortly after the restart. That could well have represented his side's fourth, but the visitors had spurned two golden opportunities in the preceding minutes.

Windsor re-grouped though, and grabbed a lifeline when Ashley Smith headed in unmarked from substitute Joshua Masters' cross. Their tails were then wagging when, a minute later, Jeevan Panesar seized on a defensive error and thrashed home an unstoppable 25-yard effort.

The equaliser eventually arrived with just over quarter of an hour remaining as Windsor made their relentless pressure tell. Smith, making a run inside from the right touchline, latched onto Paul Coyne's precise through ball and made no mistake.

They then summoned up a winner in some style as Malachi Thomas' thunderous volley flew into the top corner on 84 minutes.

For Sam Collier's young team, it was a bitter, sickening pill to swallow. No team should go on to lose a game from the position they were in.

But to describe what transpired as a Bassett collapse would be unfair on Windsor, whose attacking display throughout the game was simply sensational.

Their visitors gave as good as they got too. Their performance, particularly in the first half, was a canny one. Having noted how Windsor played in their FA Cup replay at Highworth Town in the week, Collier adopted a 4-5-1 formation, and it functioned well as Bassett looked threatening on the break.

The tone of the game was set in the opening minutes as close-range shots from Panesar and Bennett forced fine reaction saves from 'keepers Hugo Sobte and Alex Bowers.

Windsor then struck the woodwork for the first time on eleven minutes as Smith rose to redirect Keaton August's left-wing delivery across goal and onto the base of the post.

Panesar was next, taking a short free kick from Coyne before smashing a powerful long-range drive off the right upright.

Windsor's constant switching of play was causing Bassett trouble. And one such moment almost brought the opener. The ball was sprayed out to August on the left and he crossed for Matthew Woods, whose close-range attempt was met by an important block from Harrison Gough.

Bassett made the most of a well-executed attack to take the lead on the half hour mark though. Wrona picked out Rob Lincoln with a cross-field pass, and after cutting in from the left the winger's daisy-cutter of a shot came back out off the post. The initial rebound fell for Kai Robinson, whose effort was blocked, but Bennett was on hand to pick up the pieces and buried home from a tight angle.

CLUB HISTORY

Shrivenham Football Club was formed in 1900 and just eight years later the infant club became one of the founder members of the North Berks League. Success in the early years was hard to find but after winning the Second Division crown at the end of the 1994-95 campaign, two Division One Championships were to follow - in 1997-98 a season which also included the club winning the Charity Shield, and again in 2000-01, which after completing the required ground improvements, saw the club promoted to Uhlsport Hellenic League Division One West at the second time of asking.

With our inaugural Hellenic League season ending with a creditable twelfth placed finish a period of building began and after gaining some stability in the league, a further title winning season followed in 2004-05 and the club gained promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division by winning the league by a single point in what was unarquably the most amazing season the club had ever experienced.

A club record breaking eighth place finish was recorded in 2007-08 – the highest league place the club has achieved to date, however a gradual decline began and despite avoiding relegation after finishing bottom of the table in 2012-13, just two seasons later relegation was confirmed after a nineteenth placed finish and a decade of Hellenic Premier League football brought a tough era to an end.

Two seasons of mid-table mediocrity ensued, however the club appointed a new Chairman ahead of the 2017-18 campaign and the introduction of a new management team soon followed as the club began rebuilding its ambitions and the bid to return to the Hellenic Premier Division.

That goal was achieved at the first attempt as an amazing 12-game unbeaten run to the end of the season found the club in second place, and in an exciting final day which saw promotion rivals Easington Sports in third place, needing a result at home and Shrivyy without a fixture, Sports suffered the heartache of defeat against midtable Letcombe and Shrivyy clung on to gain promotion.

New targets have now been set as the club embark on maintaining their Hellenic Premier League status as progress both on and off the field continues to gather pace.







Royal Wootton Bassett Town boss Sam Collier felt his side's failure to "defend as a team" cost them victory in the Hellenic Premier Division derby against Fairford Town.

The two sides played out a 3-3 draw in what turned out to be a thrilling derby encounter for the neutrals – but Collier felt once his side took the lead, they should have gone on to win the match.

Bassett though got off to the worst possible start as Fairford raced into a two-goal lead courtesy after just 20 minutes with strikes from Lee Smith and Mason Thompson.

The lively Matt Bennett pulled one back for Bassett on the half hour and just three minutes later the visitors were level when Brad Pagliaroli fired home from the edge of the box.

Bassett completed a fantastic comeback just before the break when Rob Lincoln's first goal of the season edged them in front on the stroke of half-time.

Sam Collier's side failed to start the second half as they finished the first and allowed Fairford back into the match when Thompson grabbed his second goal of the game as he clinically finished a sloppy Bassett clearance.

Both sides had chances to win the game although Fairford arguably had the two best ones with Dan Bailey crashing a bullet of a shot off the Bassett bar and Robbie James heading agonisingly wide from a corner with the last moment of the match.

"I'm disappointed really," said Collier. "We came here hoping to get the three points and stop the little rot that we are in.

"We knew they would come out and have a go at us. We were very sloppy in the first 20-25 minutes. We didn't get out of the traps, we were still in the changing rooms.

"I didn't think we defended well as a team. We invited them on a bit.

"It's probably a fair result, I think they deserved a point. We'll probably look back at the end of the season and think 'that was a good point'."

Bassett return to action on Saturday when they host Lydney in the FA Cup before facing another local derby on Monday when they take on Shrivenham at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground.

No Place Like Home

"There's no place like home."

For many of us, our local grounds are like a second home; they bring comfort and a familiarity, and if you're lucky a comfy seat with a choice of cold or hot beverage. Which is a nice thought for me to imagine when I travel on the train to NLP towers on an uncomfortable chair and without the option of a beverage.

Last weekend on the journey to the office the train was filled with West Ham United fans on their way to the top-flight match against Bournemouth. By chance, I got speaking to a chap sat opposite who had an Irons jacket on and he began talking about how he is a season ticket holder at West Ham but also goes to watch Dagenham & Redbridge 'four or five times a season'. Two teams with a proud tradition and standing in their community, but a case of David and Goliath. "The bigger they are the harder they fall." Well, not exactly in this case.

Ever since the city of London won the bid to host the 2012 Olympics I have followed the story of what the government and the Greater London Authority planned to do with the stadium in Stratford long after Mo Farah and Jessica Ennis had graced it. After the 16 days of sporting excellence were showcased to the world, focus switched to whether Jeremy Hunt, sport minister at the time, and Mayor Boris Johnson could get the right deal for the taxpayer by finding a tenant who would prevent the stadium from turning into a defunct patch of overgrowth and stinging nettles. Could they do it? Absolutely not. As of a year ago, £783m of taxpayers' money had been spent on the stadium with an annual bill of £20m invoiced for security and cleaning and a host of other services. So bad was the deal struck by the ground owners' London Legacy Development Corporation (LLDC) with West Ham, they appealed against a granted Freedom of Information Act request to have the tenancy contract made public. This after it was known that West Ham would pay £2.5m-a-year in rent over a 99-year lease. Promotions followed for Hunt and Johnson, West Ham's co-owners sold Upton Park after 110 years on Green Street, while the Daggers sold top goalscorer Oli Hawkins to Portsmouth for an undisclosed fee after relegation to the National League.

Joined by fellow East Londoners Leyton Orient in dropping to the fifth tier, some fan groups have labelled the tenancy agreement as 'state aid'. The sum of £2.5m a small drop in the Premier League club's well of riches. I brought this up with the man on the train who said he and a lot of other supporters had failed to analyse what their board was selling them with the move. I asked him whether it must be painful watching football in a stadium built for athletic purposes when Upton Park offered such a good atmosphere. So why not swap his season ticket in 2019 for one at the Daggers? "They need to start winning games if they want to get more than 1,500 through the gate," he said. "Go where you feel at home, you're not a 400m hurdler are you?" I loked.

Diary of Wiltshire League Division One Title Winning Season - Wootton Bassett Town 1987-88

Saturday 19th September 1987 Aldbourne Park 1 Wootton Bassett Town 1

Headline: Spoils shared in fine game

The spoils were shared on Saturday in a fine game fought out by arch rivals Aldbourne Park and Wootton Bassett. Aldbourne Park, created last vear with the merger of Aldbourne and Park, play very much as the traditional Park sides, looking to get the ball forward guickly and unsettle teams with their fitness and physical presence. Bassett on the other hand prefer to play the ball to feet and the clash of styles proved interesting to watch. It was Aldbourne who started off the more positive, their lively winger Wright causing Bassett some early problems. As Bassett gradually settled the pattern of the game emerged as a hard physical battle where chances were going to be hard to come by.

Bassett failed to really open up the home defence in the first half, though McKay in midfield was constantly probing for an opening. Aldbourne had the best chance of the half when, following some more good work by Wright, a goal bound header from a corner was cleared off the line by Harrison. The second half proved to be just as competitive, indeed, perhaps a little too competitive as the names of M. Johns for Bassett and Woosnam for Aldbourne both went into the referee's book.

Bassett opened the scoring seven minutes into the second half with a soft goal. Following a period of Bassett pressure McKay crossed the ball into the box. The home defence hesitated to clear and the ball bounced into the far corner of the net. Bassett held the lead until 10 minutes from time when a lack of concentration allowed O'Driscoll through. His lob over Rees in the Bassett goal was going to be turned in by the Aldbourne centre forward when he was pulled back by M.Johns, Roberts converted the resulting penalty. A draw seemed the fairest result, and although Bassett will be disappointed not to have won, they should be pleased to come away with a point against one of the championship contenders.

1987-88 Revisited






